A Message from our Pastor Fr. Bob Cilinski





My dear parishioners,

Despite the violence and disruption in Haiti, we are looking forward to breaking ground on the 14th Nativity Village development this year. Nativity Village at Bois-Louroux. Situated between Cap Haitien and the Dominican Republic border, on the north coast of Haiti, the Bois-Louroux project can go forward because conditions in northern Haiti are much calmer than they are near the capital of Port-au-Prince, where gang violence has wreaked havoc on daily life.

When Fr. Richard Martin, Nativity's former pastor, began Operation Starfish in 1998, he could not have thought that his simple idea of saving 50 cents a day during the 40 days of Lent could make such a difference. He wanted to make the Lenten sacrifice more meaningful and help us turn toward the poor. Today, more than 1,500 families in Haiti are living in decent homes, with clean water, sanitation, health care, schools, and small businesses. Operation Starfish has also changed lives in Jamaica, Honduras, and the Dominican Republic.

Fr. Martin's spirit has guided this beautiful ministry for 26 years and continues to inspire us as we make a difference, one family at a time. It has been a blessing for me to have been able to travel to Haiti and see first-hand the good that our parishioners are doing. It has also been a privilege to be able to bring Operation Starfish to Jamaica and Honduras.

I am deeply grateful to Fr. Martin and parishioners for paving the way and so generously supporting this ministry. Our commitment to each other and to the poor brings the Easter spirit of hope to all we encounter. Our Nativity star shines brightly wherever we go.

On this, the 10th anniversary of Fr. Martin's return to God, let us recommit ourselves to making a difference. Let us bring our belief, our practice, our being Christ to others, and our prayer to bear on the needs of the world around us. Let us be thankful for the opportunity to serve God's children, across the street and around the world.

#### OPERATION STARFISH 1998 – 2024 MAKING A DIFFERENCE FOR 26 YEARS



"When we encounter a poor person, we cannot look away, for that would prevent us from encountering the face of the Lord Jesus" - Pope Francis

For 26 years, the Nativity Catholic Church community has looked toward the poor, across the street and around the world. Here at home, several parish organizations reach out to those in need, following the Gospel call of Matthew 25 to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, and visit the sick and imprisoned. Operation Starfish, our international ministry to the poor, began in 1998, with Fr. Richard Martin's vision to make the Lenten sacrifice more meaningful. By the time Fr. Martin died in 2014, our parish, working with Food For The Poor, had developed 9 Nativity Villages in Haiti and 3 greenhouse projects in the Dominican Republic.

When Fr. Bob Cilinski became Nativity's Pastor, he led an Operation Starfish mission trip to Haiti in 2015 to dedicate Good Shepherd Village in memory of Fr. Martin. He also broke ground on a new medical facility – the "Operation Starfish Clinic," in Good Shepherd Village. Fr. Cilinski returned to Haiti in 2017 to bless the new homes in Nativity Village at Despuzeau and to break ground for a new school there. Fr. Cilinski also initiated Operation Starfish mission trips to Jamaica for Nativity's College and Young Adult Ministry.

Today, there are 13 Nativity Villages in Haiti with a 14th planned for 2024. 1,552 families live in new homes, with clean water, sanitation, education, healthcare, and small businesses. Fish4Hope and Stella Marina have grown out of Operation Starfish to provide specialized aid in fish farming and midwife support. Operation Starfish has provided health centers, hurricane and earthquake relief, large scale reforestation, agricultural projects, deep sea fishing co-ops, cholera relief, hospital equipment, food security, medical student scholarships in Jamaica and Haiti, sewing co-ops, primary school scholarships, and vocational training. We are keeping our gaze firmly fixed on the poor, as Pope Francis calls us to do.

Presently, the people of Haiti are bearing unbelievable violence and turmoil. They are struggling in their day-to-day lives with a lack of food, fuel, and basic needs. Most of this violence is centered around the capital, Port-au-Prince, in the southern part of the country. Our Nativity Villages, for the most part, are intact; gangs have not attacked or infiltrated. Northern Haiti is calmer, so much of our work has shifted to this part of the country.

In 2024, we plan to begin development of Nativity Village at Bois-Louroux, our 14th Nativity Village. We will also continue to fund the operation of St. Anthony Clinic, support our school scholarship program, fund midwife training and ship birthing and newborn kits. We will also continue our medical scholarship programs in Jamaica and Haiti. Thank you for your continuing strong support for this year's Bishop's Lenten Appeal (BLA). As of April 25, our pledges and donations amount to \$794,874, but with only about 17 percent of registered families pledging. If you have not yet participated, the Easter Season is still a great time to make a sacrificial offering at any amount that works for you and your family. 



May 5, 2024: Acts 10:25-26,34-35,44-48 | Ps 98:1-4 | 1 Jn 4:7-10 | Jn 15:9-17

Pray: My Lord and my God, abide in me, dwell in me, work with me, and love others through me so my joy will be complete. Amen.

#### Know Christ, Love Christ, and Love Christ in Others.

"Love one another as I have loved you," says Jesus. At the heart of all Christian faith are the words of the apostle John, who says that God's very being is love. "God is love, and whoever remains in love remains in God and God in him." In today's Gospel, Jesus says, "You are to love one another....it is I who chose you."

Has God chosen us to love everyone? Some people are easy to love, especially those who act and think like us. At times, though, it can be difficult to show love towards family and friends we generally like, let alone those outside our circle of friendship. Why is this? The main reason we have trouble loving others is sin, both ours and the sin of those we are trying to love. Without the power and grace of God, we can be very selfish. Without God's grace, it's easier for us to love ourselves and prioritize our own time, wants, needs, and narrow-minded wills than to love others through the eyes of God, whose holy will is always in our best interest.

Jesus never promised that love would be easy. He showed love and compassion to everyone, even those who mocked and hated Him. He embodied love in all His words and deeds, showing love back to those who hurt Him and those nobody else seemed to care about. He especially loved the poor, vulnerable, marginalized, and excluded. Jesus was unafraid to show love by setting



healthy boundaries, sharing hard truths with the lost, and giving correction and forgiveness to those who repented to direct them on the right path.

God's love is divine, and we are mere humans with too much reliance on our feelings and selfish

attitudes, so how can we possibly love everyone as God commands? God demonstrated His love for us through the ultimate sacrifice of Jesus, His only Son, who suffered, died, and rose again to save us. He showed us that love is a sacrifice of ourselves for others. The more we know Jesus, the more we love Him, and we will want to love Christ as reflected in the faces of others. Every time we receive Christ's Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the Holy Eucharist and we trust in the Holy Spirit to guide us, Jesus strengthens us to love as He loves.

- How can you give the love of Christ to someone this week? How can we love others by sharing Christ's truth and hope?

Cristo está vivo! No lo dejes en el sepulcro... Reflexiones Pascua Para muchos Cristo ha perdido su actualidad, no tiene nada que enseñar a los hombres tan avanzados de hoy. Por: P. José Luis Richard | Fuente: Catholic.net

La memoria del hombre no es infalible. Existe la famosa curva del olvido: después de aprender algo, poco a poco el tiempo lo oscurece y confunde y quizá hasta lo borra.

Algo así parece que ha pasado con la imagen de Cristo. Ha sufrido esa misma curva del olvido. Muchos hombres aún distinguen una imagen más o menos clara de Cristo aunque algo desfigurada. Otros la ven ya un poco borrosa. Algunos la han perdido. Hoy Cristo nos pregunta la opinión que de Él tiene el mundo como aquel día preguntó a sus discípulos en Cesarea de Filipo: ¿Quién dice la muchedumbre que soy yo?



También nosotros tendríamos que responderle: "los hombres dicen que eres Elías o uno de los antiguos profetas". Hablan de Cristo como si se tratara de un monumento histórico o de un personaje legendario. Para muchos hombres Cristo ha perdido su actualidad. No ejerce atractivo en el mundo. Su doctrina ha pasado de moda. No tiene nada que enseñar a los hombres tan avanzados de hoy.

Otros comparan a Cristo con Juan el Bautista. Lo creen demasiado sobrio y dificil, demasiado austero. Les parece demasiado exigente y su doctrina muy pesada para los hombres de hoy. O quizá ellos son demasiado cómodos y buscan llegar a la cima sin moverse ni sudar. Ciertamente reconocen la validez de su doctrina pero no se animan a hacerla propia.

Preferirían alcanzar a Cristo más fácilmente. Ser virtuosos, pero sin esfuerzo. Desearían que Cristo no hubiera hablado de cruz, que se hubiera limitado a contarles esas cosas tan bonitas del cielo, del banquete, de los lirios del campo...

En cambio, Pedro exclama, jubiloso, su experiencia de Cristo: Tú eres el Cristo, el Hijo de Dios vivo.

No sabe bien todavía cómo ha llegado a esa conclusión pero su corazón asiente a lo que acaba de decir. Al inicio él había seguido a Cristo atraído por su liderazgo, su personalidad. El rostro de Cristo irradiaba alegría y atractivo. Nadie como Él de íntegro: buscaban prenderlo pero no encontraban falta alguna en él. Ninguno tan recio y varonil y, al mismo tiempo, tan cariñoso con los niños y bondadoso con los enfermos y pecadores. Sabía apreciar mejor que nadie la belleza de una flor, del lago, del cielo...

Después Jesús había confirmado su fe incipiente con imponentes milagros, le había enseñado, orientado... incluso le había corregido varias veces. También le había puesto a prueba alguna vez, pero su amistad se había mantenido firme: "Señor, ¿a quién iremos? Sólo Tú tienes palabras de vida eterna" (Jn 6, 68).

Y ahora que Jesús se enfrenta con la hostilidad y el rechazo y ha tenido que abandonar Jerusalén, él le vuelve a reiterar su fe y su adhesión. Pero en esta ocasión, sus palabras denotan ya mayor profundidad y emoción: Tú eres el Cristo, el Hijo de Dios vivo.

Tres experiencias de Cristo. Tres fotos. Pero válida sólo la que sacó Pedro. Los otros se la sacaron a un fantasma, no al Cristo auténtico.

Cristo está vivo. No luchamos por una figura histórica solamente. Como hace veinte siglos, Él es motivo de amor y de odio. Contra Él chocan las olas de la humanidad y en Él se dividen las vidas de los hombres.



## Four steps to inner peace

In the Catholic tradition, developing inner peace is deeply intertwined with spiritual practices and faith in God's plan This journey involves key elements that help us find serenity and resilience amidst life's challenges.

Prayer is fundamental. Through regular prayer, we communicate with God, seeking guidance and strength. Heartfelt prayer fosters a deep sense of connection with God, helping us to alleviate anxiety and promote tranquility.

Sacraments are vital. Participation in the sacraments, especially the Eucharist and Reconciliation, are direct encounters with God's grace, which cleanse,



Jesus appeared to the Apostles on the mountain in Galilee to give them their final instructions. They were to go forth, baptize, and make disciples, and to teach what they had been taught. These are our instructions, too. Once we meet Jesus and experience His love for us, we can't keep Him to ourselves. We must proclaim Him.

Jesus also revealed to the Apostles, and to the crowd gathered with them, that God is a Trinity -Father, Son, and Holy Spirit - three Divine Persons united in love. The belief that God is three, yet one, is distinct to

May 20 - Mary, Mother of the Church (2018). On the Cross, Jesus gave us His mother to be our mother (John 19:27). Even in Heaven, she prays and cares for us as our spiritual mother.

May 21 - St. Cristóbal Magallanes and Companions (1937). Fr. Christopher Magallanes was part of the Catholic Action Movement in Mexico, resisting the anti-Catholic Mexican government. Despite great persecution, he established a seminary at Totatiche. He and his companions were martyred.

St. Dominic, who founded the Dominican Order, promoted the



Rosary and credited praying the Rosary with ridding the Church of the Albigensian heresy. Pope St. Pius V attributed the


miraculous victory of Christian forces at the Battle of Lepanto in 1571 to the Rosary. Since then, many popes have urged us to pray this prayer.

The repetitive nature of the Rosary's prayers, such as the Hail Mary, fosters a meditative state that can lead to a sense of peace. This repetition is not just a mnemonic device but a way to quiet the mind and open the heart to God's guiding voice. Moreover, praving the Rosarv is also a way to seek Mary's intercession. As the Mother of Christ, her proximity to Jesus is seen as a powerful aid in bringing our prayers before God.


