APPALACHIA HOME BUILDING SPECIAL COLLECTION - JANUARY 25/26

On the weekend of January 25/26, the Knights will be speaking at all the Masses asking for your help to continue their home building effort in one of the poorest counties in our country. For the last 24 years, the Nativity Knights and Nativity Parish have partnered with the Appalachian Construction Crew operating out of Bellevue, Nebraska, to build one home in McCreary County, Kentucky, which is rated as one of the top counties in this country for income below the poverty level. Throughout the year both crews raise money to offset the cost of approximately \$110,000 to build the home. Last year, the three-bedroom home cost \$103,000. With the generosity of Nativity Parish, Nativity has raised over \$100,000 in past collections and is the main funding source for the annual home building effort. Without Nativity's support, the home building effort would have ceased in 2005. Last year, the combined crews built a home for the Perry family. The family had a total income of approximately \$21,000 and the family of two lived with the father's parents.

We are trying to exceed our past collection efforts to reach \$120,000. We have added approximately \$20,000 to our goal to expand our outreach efforts in the county to help more families in addition to the family receiving their new home. Our outreach efforts will include hygiene kits for ~270 children; help with home repairs; and vouchers to help with utility and medical bills.

This year Good Shepherd Chapel in Whitley City selected the Tucker family of three to receive Nativity's 27th home. The grandmother is raising two teenage grandchildren. The new home will be built on a lot next to the trailer they are renting. The family's total income is \$30,500. Over a very compressed two weeks in June, the combined crews will build a 1,100SF, three-bedroom home, complete with porches, heating/AC, and appliances--the family assists if they are able. This will be our first home that connects directly to the city sewer system and will not require a septic system. A handyman prepares the foundation and because of county requirements, we must hire local electricians, HVAC specialists, and plumbers who work side-byside with our crews to complete the home which has significantly added to our costs. Nativity will provide new complete beds for all the family members.

Please help if you can, but above all pray that we may be able to continue this important mission! The Knights will be collecting at all the church exits after all the Masses—*checks may be made payable to Nativity Catholic Church but annotate Appalachia Home Building on the check and your church envelope number to facilitate posting to your account.* Please consider electronic giving if at all possible; Appalachia Home Building is one of the designated charities. Nativity Catholic School Awarded International STEM distinction

The Catholic Diocese of Arlington is proud to announce Nativity Catholic School, which serves preschool through eighth grade in Burke, Virginia, has been recognized as a 2024-25 STEM School of Excellence by the International Technology and Engineering Educators Association (ITEEA).

Nativity is the only new school in Virginia to receive this honor, and one of only two in the state to have been awarded the distinction this year.

"Thanks to the dedicated leadership of Principal Maria Kelly and the strong support of pastor Msgr. Bob Cilinski in partnership with parents, Nativity Catholic School offers students a faith-filled education focused on academic excellence. We in the diocese are proud of Nativity's recognition as a School of Excellence and look forward to their continued success, "said Bishop Michael F. Burbidge.

Mark Harrell, director of ITEEA's STEM Center for Teaching and Learning, praised Nativity's academic strength. *"We at ITEEA are incredibly proud of and grateful to Nativity Catholic School for its dedication to fostering STEM literacy for all students. Your hard work and commitment to excellence is truly inspiring. We celebrate your achievements and look forward to seeing the amazing things you will continue to accomplish,"* said Harrell.

In total only 34 schools, elementary through college both in the United States and abroad, received the award. 





The theme for the 2025 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity was approved by the Catholic Church's Dicastery for Promoting Christian Unity and the Faith and Order Commission of the World Council of Churches, in collaboration with the ecumenical monastic community of Bose in Italy.

The entire passage chosen for reflection is John 11:17-27, where Jesus arrives in Bethany and raises Lazarus from the dead. A part of that story is the encounter between Jesus and Martha, at the end of which Martha confesses faith in Jesus as the Messiah and Son of God. This year's theme was chosen in recognition of the 1700th anniversary of the First Council of Nicaea (325), at which the words "I believe" were chosen to anchor the Creed as an instrument of universal Christian unity.

Is 42, 1-4. 6-7; Sal 28; Hch 10, 34-38; Lc 3, 15-16. 21-22

Como el pueblo estaba expectante y andaban todos pensando en sus corazones acerca de Juan, si no sería él el Cristo, declaró Juan a todos: "Yo os bautizo con agua; pero está a punto de llegar el que es más fuerte que yo, a quien ni siquiera soy digno de desatarle la correa de sus sandalias. Él os bautizará en Espíritu Santo y fuego. Todo el pueblo se estaba bautizando. Jesús, ya bautizado, se hallaba en oración, se abrió el cielo, bajó sobre él el Espíritu Santo en forma corporal, como una paloma; y vino una voz del cielo: "Tú eres mi hijo; yo hoy te he engendrado."

Lc 3, 15-16. 21-22

Luego de haber celebrado el nacimiento de Nuestro Salvador, la fiesta de la Sagrada Familia y la celebración de María Madre de Dios con la cual dimos gracias a Dios por el año que terminó y por el año que se iniciaba, con la celebración que hoy día la Iglesia nos concede, que es el bautismo de Cristo; nos presenta a través de este primer domingo ordinario la vida del hombre nuevo, la vida de la nueva humanidad que surge de las aguas del bautismo y que sobre todo se inicia por la persona de Cristo; pues como dirá el evangelio: "...Tú eres mi hijo, mi amado, en quien me complazco..."

De esta manera por eso tanto la segunda lectura como el evangelio se complementan en cuanto nos hablan del sentido del bautismo, pues es a través del bautismo que nos hemos incorporado al pueblo de Dios, a la vida nueva que Cristo con su muerte de cruz y su resurrección de entre los muertos inaugurará para todos los hombres.

En la primera lectura se anuncia a Jerusalén, y a través de ella a toda la humanidad, el consuelo de que el tiempo de la salvación ha comenzado ya: "... Mirad, aquí está vuestro Dios...". El Salvador viene en "gloria" y "con fuerza", pues la obra redentora de Jesús vencerá y dominará toda la historia del mundo; pero por otra parte viene con la solicitud de un pastor que lleva en brazos a sus corderos y cuida de las ovejas madres: esta unidad de poder y cuidado amoroso l muestra como el Dios encarnado, hecho hombre; sólo Dios es quien reúne estos dos atributos en una unidad perfecta, La segunda lectura nos sitúa allí donde se ha realizado ya la obra salvífica de Jesús: "...él se entregó por nosotros..."; y donde el bautismo cristiano, el llamado "baño del segundo nacimiento", nos permite participar en el primer bautismo (de agua) y en el último bautismo (de sangre) de Jesús. De nuevo aparece el Cielo abierto sobre los cristianos bautizados, y Dios revela todo su amor al hombre. La gracia del Padre aparece para traernos la salvación a todos los hombres; no en razón de nuestras obras de justicia, sino en virtud de su inmensa misericordia. El propio Jesús es llamado "Salvador", y al mismo tiempo "nuestro gran Dios"; y a través del bautismo se opera la renovación por el Espíritu Santo que es derramado sobre nosotros por medio de Jesucristo, para nuestra justificación y santificación, que nos hará dignos de obtener la vida eterna tan ansiada y esperada. Este milagro de la teofanía en el bautismo de Jesús se continúa en la Iglesia en todos los tiempos. Es así que el evangelio nos dice que Jesús se deja bautizar con el pueblo que quiere la conversión y la purificación de sus pecados, es un gesto que contiene en sí algo profundamente misterioso; es como si quisiera, ya en su primer acto público, manifestar su solidaridad con todos los pecadores. Más tarde acogerá a los suyos en su Iglesia con el bautismo cristiano, mediante la humillación de una inmersión en agua como element de muerte y regeneración; Jesús no quiere imponer a los suyos nada que él mismo no haya hecho. Y si el bautismo ha de ser realmente un ser sepultado con él en su muerte y un resucitar con él a una nueva vida imperecedera, entonces este primer bautismo es ya para él una obligación anticipada de cara a su propia pasión y resurrección: todo lo que acontece entre el bautismo y la cruz está encuadrado por un sentido y un acontecimiento unitario. El bautismo del Jordán es para Jesús un bautismo "con Espíritu Santo", el de la cruz será un bautismo "de fuego"; el primero es solidaridad con los pecadores que han de purificarse, el segundo será la extinción a sangre y fuego de todo el pecado del mundo. Sobre este acontecimiento del bautismo de Jesús aparece el cielo abierto y Dios se da a conocer como trinitario: el Padre que envía confirma a "...su Hijo, el amado, el predilecto...", que cumple por libre amor la voluntad trinitaria de salvación; el Espíritu Santo aparece en forma de paloma entre el Padre, en el cielo, y el Hijo que ora en la tierra: transmitiendo al Hijo la voluntad del Padre y llevando al padre la oración del Hijo. Todo entre el bautismo y la cruz-resurrección corresponderá a esta forma aquí visible de la decisión salvífica del Dios unitrino. Luego de haber celebrado estas fiestas de Adviento en toda su plenitud y fuerza, y al celebrar hoy el bautismo de Cristo, que significa para nosotros Nuestro nacimiento a la vida recreada por Nuestro Salvador, el Señor nos conceda vivir nuestra vida cristiana en la actitud del Bautista, para que cuando demos testimonio de nuestra vida podamos decir que no somos nosotros sino es Cristo al que debemos acoger cada día. Pues, tantas veces, sin darnos cuenta robamos la gloria de Dios atribuyéndonos sus dones como si fueran actitudes nuestras y por eso el Bautista invita a su audiencia a mirar a Cristo, pues nosotros que por el bautismo hemos sido constituidos como sacerdotes, profetas y reyes de Cristo y al mismo tiempo a ser en nuestra vida luz, sal y fermento, lo seremos en la medida que digamos como san Pablo: "... No soy yo sino es Cristo que habita en mí...". Los invito a rezar de una manera particular por todas aquellas personas que a través de sus vidas nos han llevado al encuentro de Cristo y a través de esta labor que han realizado en beneficio nuestro nos han llevado a las aguas de la regeneración para junto con Cristo participar de esta vida nueva con el Padre y de esta manera las palabras del evangelio resuenen en nuestro corazón: "...Tú eres mi en quien me complazco...", porque con la ayuda y la gracia del Espíritu Santo podremos vivir la voluntad de Dios en nuestra vida en toda su radicalidad. Y de esta manera ser agradecidos y gratos a Dios porque el sentido de nuestra vida consiste en que Dios con nosotros realice su voluntad como la manifestó en Cristo.
