



# A Message from our Pastor Fr. Bob Cilinski



"Here I am. You called me."

My dear parishioners,

This Sunday we enter "Ordinary Time." Christmas with its glitter and excitement is behind us and Lent followed by the glory of Easter is in the future. In this "ordinary" time we reflect on the everyday ministry of Jesus. God enters the ordinary moments of our lives and truly makes them extraordinary.

We are ordinary human beings, but something extraordinary happened when we were baptized. St. Paul describes this when he says that ordinary human beings are members of Christ; their bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit!

We do not recognize Christ in the ordinary moments and ordinary people of our lives. John the Baptist almost missed God when He came calling. We do not hear the voice of God calling so we need to attune our ears and adjust our sights. When God calls we should respond, "Here I am. You called me."

## John Henry Cardinal Newman gives us this reflection:

God has created me to do him some definite service. He has committed some work to me which he has not committed to another. I have my mission. I may never know it in this life, but I shall be told it in the next.

I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons. He has not created me for naught. I shall do good. I shall do his work. I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place while not intending it – if I do but keep his commandments.

Therefore, I will trust him. Whatever, wherever I am. I can never be thrown away. If I am in sickness, my sickness may serve him; in perplexity, my perplexity may serve him; if I am in sorrow, my sorrow may serve him. He does nothing in vain. He knows what he is about. He may take away my friends, he may throw me among strangers. He may make me feel desolate, make my spirits sink, hide my future from me – still he knows what he is about.



# APPALACHIA HOME BUILDING SPECIAL COLLECTION - JANUARY 20/21

On the weekend of January 20/21, the Knights will be speaking at all the Masses asking for your help to continue their home building effort in one of the poorest counties in our country. For the last 23 years, the Nativity Knights and Nativity Parish have partnered with the Appalachian Construction Crew operating out of Bellevue, Nebraska, to build one or two homes in McCreary County, Kentucky, which is rated as one of the top counties in this country for income below the poverty level. Throughout the year both crews raise money to offset the cost of approximately \$100,000 to build the home. Last year, costs continued to rise because of inflation and the three-bedroom home cost \$107,000. With the generosity of Nativity Parish, Nativity has raised over \$100,000 in past collections and is the main funding source for the annual home building effort. Without Nativity's support, the home building effort would have ceased in 2005. Last year, the combined crews built a home for the Creekmore family. The family had a total income of approximately \$26,000 and the family of three lived in a rundown trailer with significant mold and electrical issues. We are trying to exceed our past collection efforts to reach \$110,000, but we can't do it without your help. This will be the 26th home built by Nativity and the Knights.

This year Good Shepherd Chapel in Whitley City selected the Perry family of two to receive the next home. The family lives with grandparents for child support while the father works. The new home will be built on a lot next to the grandparents. The family's total income is \$21,000. Over a very compressed two weeks in June, the combined crews will build a 1,100SF, three-bedroom home, complete with porches, heating/AC, appliances, and a septic system -- the family assists if they are able. A handyman prepares the foundation and because of county requirements, we must hire local electricians, HVAC specialists, and plumbers who work side-by-side with our crews to complete the home which has significantly added to our costs. Nativity will again provide new complete beds for all the family members.

Please help if you can, but above all pray that we may be able to continue this important mission! The Knights will be collecting at all the church exits after all the Masses - checks may be made payable to Nativity Catholic Church but annotate Appalachia Home Building on the check and your church envelope number to facilitate posting to your account. Please consider electronic giving if at all possible; Appalachia Home Building is one of the designated charities. 
# KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS COUNCIL 7992 BASKETBALL FREE THROW CHALLENGE



Jesus says: "Come and see what? His love? His healing power? His supernatural ability to answer our prayers? Whatever we're looking for, the reason we're seeking it is because we don't yet have it.

Jesus is the fulfillment of every promise by God the Father. Jesus is the fullness of love, the provider of mercy, the divine healer, the perfect mediator of all our prayers and concerns, and everything else we truly need. So, why does it feel like something is still missing? Why do our lives feel incomplete? Why do our prayers seem unanswered?

The answer is revealed in what happened after Peter began to follow Jesus. We read about it in Samuel's

response to God's invitation. We proclaim it in the Responsorial: "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will."

Peter was privileged to witness first-hand the wondrous miracles of Jesus. He personally experienced God's love through the gentle eyes of Jesus, the tone of kindness in his voice, and the forgiveness that was visible in his smile.

Yet with all of this, Peter did not really find all that he was



looking for (remember how easily he felt afraid or confused or uncertain) until he was on the giving end of it. He didn't discover the fullness of Jesus until Jesus was no longer present in the flesh and Peter accepted the call to continue Christ's earthly

ministry.


The same is true for us who have never seen Jesus' actual eyes or heard his actual voice. We find what we're seeking when we give it to others. Why? Because then we discover that we really had it all along! This is the miracle of "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will."





La vida de fe, una gran Aventura La vida cristiana es una vida apasionante, de retos imposibles que sólo son posibles de lograr con la ayuda de un Dios todopoderoso

Llámame y te responderé; te mostraré cosas grandes y secretas que tú no conoces. Jeremías 33:3

Es del dominio público que hay que tener un propósito en la vida, una causa, un proyecto, una pasión, un rumbo específico, a fin de vivir una vida plena, no inútil y sin sentido. De modo que algunos se dedican al arte, otros a la política, otros a deportes extremos, otros a la acción social, otros a la ecología, otros a escribir libros, otros a la familia, etcétera.

Pero hay una clase de personas que han decidido encontrar el propósito divino para su vida, más allá del propósito humano, terrenal. La Biblia, desde su primer libro (el Génesis) está lleno de historias y ejemplos de gente que estuvo en contacto con Dios, bajo diferentes empresas o circunstancias, quienes tuvieron vidas apasionantes, con un propósito eterno cuyo legado persiste hasta nuestros días. El cristianismo es la continuación y culminación de todo ello.

Si bien, en el Antiguo Testamento, todavía Cristo no estaba presente, el plan de Dios ya estaba trazado desde el principio, y fue anunciado a la humanidad a través de los profetas (mayores y menores) de las Escrituras. El Espíritu Santo ya coexistía con el Padre y con el Hijo en las regiones celestes, como una Trinidad.

Adán, Noé, Moisés, Abraham, Josué, David, Salomón, Daniel, Ruth, Isaías, Jeremías, Ezequiel, Juan el Bautista, Pedro, Pablo, Juan, María y José, María Magdalena, etcétera, son personajes cuyas historias nos impactan cuando leemos la Biblia. En general, la gente que no conoce las Escrituras ni la vida cristiana, piensa que es un libro simplemente histórico, referencial, genealógico y doctrinal. La Biblia es todo eso y más, pero mucho más allá de todo eso la Biblia es la fuente principal de revelación de Dios al hombre, junto con el Espíritu Santo que nos enseña todas las cosas.

La vida cristiana es una vida apasionante, de retos imposibles que sólo son posibles de lograr con la ayuda de un Dios todopoderoso, cuyo amor es inconmensurable, quien entregó lo que más amaba: a su Hijo unigénito, para darnos redención. La vida cristiana para muchos puede parecer absurda, o pueden tener una idea de que la santidad es algo aburrido, una pérdida de tiempo o algo fanático, irracional y fantasioso.

Pero la vida de santidad es una vida llena de exigencias y retos cada día, en donde negarnos a nosotros mismos, a los deseos de la carne y la renuncia al pecado son la meta y la prioridad, a fin de poder permanecer en comunión con el Creador, y con Jesús, nuestro Maestro y Salvador, quien nos dijo que permaneciéramos junto a Él pues lejos de Él nada podemos hacer. La vida cristiana tiene como propósito el amor, la expansión del evangelio, el establecimiento de la paz, la restauración de vidas perdidas, la sanidad de los enfermos, la reconstrucción de familias, la salvación de las almas, la justicia divina en la tierra, la vida de plenitud. No sé si pueda existir algo más importante que eso.

Puede parecer una utopía bajo la opinión y la visión social. Pero es una realidad tan clara para quienes la vivimos, que sólo puede explicarse como una vida sobrenatural, de total dependencia en Dios. La humildad, la renuncia a los placeres del mundo, el sacrificio y el servicio a los demás son el propósito medular de los creyentes verdaderos, aquellos que lo han dejado todo para tomar la cruz y seguir a Cristo.

Hay gozo, pasión, plenitud, milagros, pero también hay dolor, sacrificio, persecución en la vida cristiana. Sin embargo, ésta es una vida llena de sentido porque nos transforma de manera individual, primeramente. Y luego nos lleva al servicio a los demás, a dar nuestra vida no sólo por una meta personal y egoísta, sino por una causa comunitaria, compasiva, constructiva, donde el amor es el motor y el amor es algo que provoca milagros inimaginables.

Una vez escuché a alguien decir que aún en el supuesto de que el cristianismo fuera un "cuento", como muchos creen, no se imaginaba poder tener una vida mejor o más plena que seguir a Jesucristo. Yo apenas comenzaba a andar en este camino. Treinta y tres años después puedo decir que tenía toda la razón: la vida cristiana es una vida que vale la pena vivir, y no puede haber otra más intensa, llena de sentido y fruto que ésta.

Jesús está en medio de los hombres, pero no es conocido por estos. No se le puede descubrir con una simple mirada. Se requieren unos ojos movidos por la fe. Sólo desde ella puede llegarse al fondo de la personalidad humano-divina de Jesús.

Se trata, pues, de una mirada especial. Por lo que sea, en un momento dado, esta mirada se da en nuestra vida; caemos en la cuenta de que, delante de nosotros, tenemos algo que se sale de lo normal, algo en lo que Dios se hace fuertemente presente. Y, tras detenernos en nuestra consideración, descubrimos esa presencia que se dirige a nosotros. Y, entonces, con razón, podemos exclamar que hemos visto al Señor

Es algo que va más allá de la visión y la experiencia sensible o física. Se trata de una experiencia, de un descubrimiento personal. Le sucede a Juan Bautista: "Al ver Juan a Jesús que venía hacia él, exclamó: Este es aquel de quien yo dije: Tras de mí viene un hombre que está por delante de mí, porque existía antes que yo." Aunque Juan estaba esperándolo, se encuentra con Él de manera casi imprevista, en un momento no elegido por él. La fe, ya desde aquí, es un completo regalo que nos viene de arriba.

Pero, para que sea completa, la fe necesita ser compartida. Primero, con aquel que nos la anuncia. "Y Juan dio testimonio... yo he visto, y he dado testimonio de que este es el Hijo de Dios". Después, con aquellos que han recibido el mismo descubrimiento. Sabemos que eso fue lo que hicieron los discípulos que oyeron el testimonio de Juan: fueron y vieron dónde moraba Jesús. Y ahí se consolida su fe y su seguimiento, que, a su vez, se hace vida y testimonio para otros muchos.

Todo esto ha tenido lugar en la vida de todos los que nos consideramos cristianos. De una manera u otra, todos hemos recibido la fe por el testimonio de las personas que nos rodean. Pero, ¿nos hemos sentido tocados vitalmente por ese anuncio? ¿hemos valorado, repensado, profundizado el mensaje que se nos ha transmitido? ¿hemos personalizado la fe, haciéndola decisión propia? Aquí se encierra toda una tarea de reflexión, estudio, conocimiento, análisis... de eso que llamamos fe. No es algo que, sin que pongamos nada por nuestra parte, prenda en nuestra vida después de sernos anunciada y transmitida. Aquí se encierra todo un tiempo (mucho) dedicado (diariamente) a dialogar con el Señor, que es el objeto y el centro de nuestra fe. Sinceramente, ¿actuamos así los que nos decimos cristianos? Y, además, es necesario compartirla, contrastarla... con aquellos que también han llegado a la fe. Aquí hay mucho de experiencia compartida, de análisis comunitario, de celebración eclesial... La fe se nos da en el seno de un pueblo de creyentes, para que la vivamos en su seno. Sinceramente, ¿actuamos así los que nos decimos cristianos?

Por último, la fe hay que contagiarla. La de otros dependerá de nuestro anuncio y testimonio. Aquí hay mucho de vida coherente, de valores defendidos, de proclamación... en la familia, en el trabajo, en la diversión... con los familiares, con los amigos, con los alumnos, con los compañeros de trabajo, con los vecinos... Un cristiano que no propague su fe y la guarde para sí mismo, no es cristiano. Sinceramente, ¿actuamos así los que nos decimos cristianos?

Este es el Cordero de Dios, el Hijo de Dios, el Salvador. Anúncialo con valentía después de conseguir el convencimiento que da el estudio, la oración, la vida comunitaria.

La misión de Juan Bautista Cristo no amenazó a nadie, sino que se convirtió en alguien que simplemente amaba y quería la salvación para todos.

Marcos, el Evangelista que este año nos tomará de la mano para ir conociendo y viviendo el Evangelio, la Buena Nueva de salvación, comienza este día su mensaje, poniéndonos al frente de una manera directa y precisa, a Jesús, el Cristo, el Hijo de Dios como la Buena noticia de liberación. La Buena nueva consiste precisamente en que Jesús de Nazaret, engendrado en el tiempo en un oscuro pueblecito en las inmediaciones de la gran Jerusalén es precisamente el Cristo, el Mesías, el ungido, el que traería consigo la salvación y la paz para todos los hombres: "Aquí llega el Señor, lleno de poder, el que con su brazo lo domina todo, como pastor apacentará su rebaño: llevará en sus brazos a los corderitos recién nacidos y atenderá solícito a sus madres".

Pero si eso fuera todo, eso no sería noticia, pues Cristo murió en la cruz, víctima de un juicio injusto y lleno de maldad. Lo bueno viene cuando se asegura que Cristo es el Hijo de Dios y que por lo tanto y por su entrega, por su amor y su sacrificio por todos los hombres, el Padre lo resucita y lo hace sentar a su derecha. Es el Señor de todos los tiempos, de todos los continentes y de toda la historia. El profeta Isaías instaba entonces a preparar el camino al Señor que llega: "Sube a lo alto del monte, mensajero de buenas nuevas para Sión, alza con fuerza la voz, tú que anuncias noticias alegres a Jerusa-lén. Alza la voz y no temas; anuncia a los ciudadanos de Judá: "Aquí está su Dios".

Éste es entonces el personaje que anunciaba San Juan el Bautista, aquél ante quien se sentía pequeño pues él era sólo un enviado, un precursor, que tenía que anunciar precisamente la llegada del verdadero Enviado, el Mesías, el Salvador. Él consiguió entonces el primer milagro de la Salvación que el Señor traería a la tierra: alejar a los hombres de su vida rutinaria, en medio de una sociedad que no funcionaba como tal, un mundo de pecado y de maldad, en la capital Jerusalén y sus alrededores.

El Papa Benedicto XVI lo decía la semana pasada al describir el panorama de las ciudades postmodernas: "Las ciudades donde la vida se hace anónima y horizontal, donde Dios parece ausente y el hombre el único amo, como si fuera él el artífice y el director de todo: construcciones, trabajo, economía, transportes, ciencias, técnica, todo parece depender sólo del hombre. Y a veces, en este mundo que parece casi perfecto, suceden cosas chocantes, o en la naturaleza, o en la sociedad, por las que pensamos que Dios pareciera haberse retirado, que nos hubiera, por así decir, abandonado a nosotros mismos".

Pero la verdad es que Dios no abandona a su pueblo, sino que envía precisamente a su Hijo pero no para visitarnos, sino para quedarse con nosotros, haciéndose uno más entre nosotros, formando parte de nuestra vida y de nuestro entorno.

El Bautista hizo el milagro de convertir a los hombres, de bautizarlos con un bautismo de penitencia, de agua, en el Jordán, presagiando el bautismo en fuego, en el Espíritu Santo de Dios. Y pudo hacerlo porque el Bautista encarnaba en su propia vida lo que pedía a gritos a los demás. Les hablaba a los hombres con crudeza, con mucho realismo y cuando no conseguía mover a los hombres, no se detenía en la amenaza de castigos terribles para los morosos ante la salvación. Cristo, aunque se dejó bautizar por el Bautista, teniendo que hacer cola para acercarse a él, cambió la técnica usada por el Bautista para convertir a los hombres a la salvación de Dios. Cristo simplemente amaba y quería la salvación para todos. Y si la salvación ya está aquí, si Cristo ya ha llegado, ¿por qué no salir a su encuentro en cada uno de los que él vino a salvar, a los desprotegidos, los pobres y los que son tratados injustamente?


