

APPALACHIA HOME BUILDING SPECIAL COLLECTION - JANUARY 25/26

On the weekend of January 25/26, the Knights will be speaking at all the Masses asking for your help to continue their home building effort in one of the poorest counties in our country. For the last 24 years, the Nativity Knights and Nativity Parish have partnered with the Appalachian Construction Crew operating out of Bellevue, Nebraska, to build one home in McCreary County, Kentucky, which is rated as one of the top counties in this country for income below the poverty level. Throughout the year both crews raise money to offset the cost of approximately \$110,000 to build the home. Last year, the three-bedroom home cost \$103,000. With the generosity of Nativity Parish, Nativity has raised over \$100,000 in past collections and is the main funding source for the annual home building effort. Without Nativity's support, the home building effort would have ceased in 2005. Last year, the combined crews built a home for the Perry family. The family had a total income of approximately \$21,000 and the family of two lived with the father's parents.

We are trying to exceed our past collection efforts to reach \$120,000. We have added approximately \$20,000 to our goal to expand our outreach efforts in the county to help more families in addition to the family receiving their new home. Our outreach efforts will include hygiene kits for ~270 children; help with home repairs; and vouchers to help with utility and medical bills.

This year Good Shepherd Chapel in Whitley City selected the Tucker family of three to receive Nativity's 27th home. The grandmother is raising two teenage grandchildren. The new home will be built on a lot next to the trailer they are renting. The family's total income is \$30,500. Over a very compressed two weeks in June, the combined crews will build a 1,100SF, three-bedroom home, complete with porches, heating/AC, and appliances--the family assists if they are able. This will be our first home that connects directly to the city sewer system and will not require a septic system. A handyman prepares the foundation and because of county requirements, we must hire local electricians, HVAC specialists, and plumbers who work side-by-side with our crews to complete the home which has significantly added to our costs. Nativity will provide new complete beds for all the family members.

Please help if you can, but above all pray that we may be able to continue this important mission! The Knights will be collecting at all the church exits after all the Masses—checks may be made payable to Nativity Catholic Church but annotate Appalachia Home Building on the check and your church envelope number to facilitate posting to your account. Please consider electronic giving if at all possible; Appalachia Home Building is one of the designated charities. 



A message from the Nativity Creation Care Ministry

The Magic of Winter Trees: Making a Deeper Connection. Winter is a lovely time to get to know your trees better. Dreams of warmer days are lovely, but if you have trees in your yard or a nearby park, winter might also be the time to learn how to appreciate and protect their incredible beauty. When our trees are bare of leaves, you can visualize more clearly their beautiful shapes, identify some species characteristics and assess their health status. If you haven't taken a long walk or hike in the winter before, it's time to bundle up and head out on the trail. Even if you aren't an experienced birder, it's often easier at this time of year to observe hawks, owls, or other raptors at work. Smaller birds can be spotted searching tree bark or leaf litter for insects and berries, and mammals often make a long-distance appearance as they look for food. Native evergreens or the lovely persistent leaves on oaks and beeches provide beautiful color among the gray tree trunks. While you may not want to linger for contemplation, if you walk gently, there is a type of forest bathing you can experience surrounded by the still, silent trees in the chilly air. One of the loveliest things you can see in a winter forest is found by looking up to the sky: it is in this season that you can see how the tree canopy develops—trees grow side-by-side leaving a path around each canopy's branches so that sunlight may reach down to the forest floor. This is called canopy shyness.

So, if you want to learn about trees, to more closely observe nature and to find quiet time for spiritual reflection about God's creation, winter is a magical time to spend outside in the stillness and beauty of the forest. Invitaron a Jesús a las bodas Autor: P. Raniero Cantalamessa, ofmcap Isaías 62, 1-5; I Corintios 12, 4-11; Juan 2, 1-11

El Evangelio del II Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario es el episodio de las bodas de Caná. ¿Qué ha querido decirnos Jesús aceptando participar en una fiesta nupcial? Sobre todo, de esta manera honró, de hecho, las bodas entre el hombre y la mujer, recalcando, implícitamente, que es algo bello, querido por el Creador y por Él bendecido. Pero quiso enseñarnos también otra cosa. Con su venida, se realizaba en el mundo ese desposorio místico entre Dios y la humanidad que había sido prometido a través de los profetas, bajo el nombre de «nueva y eterna alianza». En Caná, símbolo y realidad se encuentran: las bodas humanas de dos jóvenes son la ocasión para hablarnos de otro desposorio, aquél entre Cristo y la Iglesia que se cumplirá en «su hora», en la cruz.

Si deseamos descubrir cómo deberían ser, según la Biblia, las relaciones entre el hombre y la mujer en el matrimonio, debemos mirar cómo son entre Cristo y la Iglesia. Intentemos hacerlo, siguiendo el pensamiento de San Pablo sobre el tema, como está expresado en Efesios, 5, 25-33. En el origen y centro de todo matrimonio, siguiendo esta perspectiva, debe estar el amor: «Maridos, amad a vuestras mujeres como Cristo amó a la Iglesia y se entregó a sí mismo por ella».

Esta afirmación –que el matrimonio se funda en el amor- parece hoy darse por descontado. En cambio sólo desde hace poco más de un siglo se llegó al reconocimiento de ello, y todavía no en todas partes. Durante siglos y milenios, el matrimonio era una transacción entre familias, un modo de proveer a la conservación del patrimonio o a la mano de obra para el trabajo de los jefes, o una obligación social. Los padres y las familias eran los protagonistas, no los esposos, quienes frecuentemente se conocían sólo el día de la boda.

Jesús, sigue diciendo Pablo en el texto de los Efesios, se entregó «a fin de presentarse a sí mismo su Iglesia resplandeciente, sin que tenga mancha ni arruga ni cosa parecida». ¿Es posible, para un marido humano, imitar, también en este aspecto, al esposo Cristo? ¿Puede quitar las arrugas a su propia esposa? ¡Claro que puede! Hay arrugas producidas por el desamor, por haber sido dejados en soledad. Quien se siente aún importante para el cónyuge no tiene arrugas, o si las tiene son arrugas distintas, que acrecientan, no disminuyen la belleza.

Y las esposas, ¿qué pueden aprender de su modelo, que es la Iglesia? La Iglesia se embellece únicamente para su esposo, no por agradar a otros. Está orgullosa y es entusiasta de su esposo Cristo y no se cansa de tejerle alabanzas. Traducido al plano humano, esto recuerda a las novias y a las esposas que su estima y admiración es algo importantísimo para el novio o el marido.

A veces, para ellos es lo que más cuenta en el mundo. Sería grave que les faltara recibir jamás una palabra de aprecio por su trabajo, por su capacidad organizativa, por su valor, por la dedicación a la familia; por lo que dice, si es un hombre político; por lo que escribe, si es un escritor; por lo que crea, si es un artista. El amor se alimenta de estima y muere sin ella.


Pero existe una cosa que el modelo divino recuerda sobre todo a los esposos: la fidelidad. Dios es fiel, siempre, a pesar de todo. Hoy, esto de la fidelidad se ha convertido en un discurso escabroso que ya nadie se atreve a hacer. Sin embargo el factor principal del desmembramiento de muchos matrimonios está precisamente aquí, en la infidelidad. Hay quien lo niega, diciendo que el adulterio es el efecto, no la causa, de las crisis matrimoniales. Se traiciona, en otras palabras, porque no existe ya nada con el propio cónyuge.


A veces esto será incluso cierto; pero muy frecuentemente se trata de un círculo vicioso. Se traiciona porque el matrimonio está muerto, pero el matrimonio está muerto precisamente porque se ha empezado a traicionar, tal vez en un primer tiempo sólo con el corazón. Lo más odioso es que a menudo es el que traiciona quien hace recaer en el otro la culpa de todo y se hace la víctima.

Pero volvamos al episodio del Evangelio, porque contiene una esperanza para todos los matrimonios humanos, hasta los mejores. Sucede en todo matrimonio lo que ocurrió en las bodas de Caná. Comienza en el entusiasmo y en la alegría (de ello es símbolo el vino); pero este entusiasmo inicial, como el vino en Caná, con el paso del tempo se consume y llega a faltar. Entonces se hacen las cosas ya no por amor y con alegría, sino por costumbre. Cae sobre la familia, si no se presta atención, como una nube de monotonía y de tedio. También de estos esposos se debe decir: «¡No les queda vino!».

El relato del Evangelio indica a los cónyuges una vía para no caer en esta situación o salir de ella si ya se está dentro: ¡invitar a Jesús a las propias bodas! Si Él está presente, siempre se le puede pedir que repita el milagro de Caná: transformar el agua en vino. El agua del acostumbramiento, de la rutina, de la frialdad, en el vino de un amor y de una alegría mejor que la inicial, como era el vino multiplicado en Caná. «Invitar a Jesús a las propias bodas» significa honrar el Evangelio en la propia casa, orar juntos, acercarse a los sacramentos, tomar parte en la vida de la Iglesia.

No siempre los dos cónyuges están, en sentido religioso, en la misma línea. Tal vez uno de los dos es creyente y el otro no, o al menos no de la misma forma. En este caso, que invite a Jesús a las bodas aquél de los dos que le conozca, y lo haga de manera —con su gentileza, el respeto por el otro, el amor y la coherencia de vida- que se convierta pronto en el amigo de ambos. ¡Un «amigo de familia»!




