"Do not be saddened this day, for rejoicing in the Lord must be your strength" - Nehemiah: 810

My dear parishioners,

The people of Israel finally returned from their exile. Ezra, the priest, reads to them from the Torah and preaches. It lasted half a day. When he ended, the people rejoiced not because it was over but that now his words and teaching helped them rediscover their common roots and the truth of who they could be in the Lord, a truly chosen people.

Today we celebrate "Word of God Sunday" established by Pope Francis. Every Mass has two main parts: the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. APPALACHIA HOME BUILDING SPECIAL COLLECTION - THIS WEEKEND

On the weekend of January 20/21, the Knights will be speaking at all the Masses asking for your help to continue their home building effort in one of the poorest counties in our country. For the last 23 years, the Nativity Knights and Nativity Parish have partnered with the Appalachian Construction Crew operating out of Bellevue, Nebraska, to build one or two homes in McCreary County, Kentucky, which is rated as one of the top counties in this country for income below the poverty level. Throughout the year both crews raise money to offset the cost of approximately \$100,000 to build the home. Last year, costs continued to rise because of inflation and the three-bedroom home cost \$107,000. With the generosity of Nativity Parish, Nativity has raised over \$100,000 in past collections and is the main funding source for the annual home building effort. Without Nativity's support, the home building effort would have ceased in 2005. Last year, the combined crews built a home for the Creekmore family. The family had a total income of approximately \$26,000 and the family of three lived in a rundown trailer with significant mold and electrical issues. We are trying to exceed our past collection efforts to reach \$110,000, but we can't do it without your help. This will be the 26th home built by Nativity and the Knights.

This year Good Shepherd Chapel in Whitley City selected the Perry family of two to receive the next home. The family lives with grandparents for child support while the father works. The new home will be built on a lot next to the grandparents. The family's total income is \$21,000. Over a very compressed two weeks in June, the combined crews will build a 1,100SF, three-bedroom home, complete with porches, heating/AC, appliances, and a septic system -- the family assists if they are able. A handyman prepares the foundation and because of county requirements, we must hire local electricians, HVAC specialists, and plumbers who work side-by-side with our crews to complete the home which has significantly added to our costs. Nativity will again provide new complete beds for all the family members.

Please help if you can, but above all pray that we may be able to continue this important mission! The Knights will be collecting at all the church exits after all the Masses - checks may be made payable to Nativity Catholic Church but annotate Appalachia Home Building on the check and your church envelope number to facilitate posting to your account. Please consider electronic giving if at all possible; Appalachia Home Building is one of the designated charities. 

La única fuerza capaz de cambiar el mundo Autor: Mons. Ciriaco Benavente Mateos San Lucas 1-1-4; 4, 14-21:

Es un hecho recurrente que cada cierto tiempo algunos periódicos se creen obligados a servirnos noticias sensacionales sobre Jesús. Documentos editados y manejados por los estudiosos desde hace siglos se nos presentan como recién desenterrados de las arenas del desierto, como nuevos y extraordinarios hallazgos sobre Jesús, que vendrían a poner en tela de juicio todo lo afirmado hasta ahora. A veces hasta se presentan como textos ocultados por la Iglesia con no sé que secretas intenciones. Lo grave es que esto se lance al mercado de un público que no distingue lo que es la investigación científica de la noticia sensacionalista que sólo pretende vender.

Uno ya conoció hace años la imagen de un Jesús a lo Che-Guevara. Hoy, en tales supuestos hallazgos, Jesús se parece más a un pacifico revolucionario esotérico. La cosa no es nueva; ya en los primeros tiempos circularon relatos apócrifos, que las mismas comuni-dades cristianas rechazaron como no verídicos. Sólo se aceptaron como verdaderos evangelios los cuatro que conocemos. Y no es por casualidad que éstos sean bastantes más antiguos que los otros, que datan de los siglos segundo, tercero o cuarto.

Leemos hoy el breve prólogo que Lucas colocó al comienzo de su evangelio. Nos habla de cómo otros han emprendido la tarea de rela-tar los hechos transmitidos por los que fueron testigos oculares de Jesús desde el principio: "Por eso yo también, después de investigar-lo todo cuidadosamente desde los orígenes, he resuelto escribírtelo por orden, para que compruebes la solidez de las enseñanzas que has recibido". Es un testimonio precioso sobre la fiabilidad de los evangelios. No se puede olvidar el interés de los discípulos en guardar en la memoria las palabras y los hechos de Jesús y el empeño de trasmitirlos con exactitud. Se trataba de las palabras y los hechos de aquél a quien querían y por y el que acabarían dando la vida, rubricando la fidelidad de su testimonio con la propia sangre. No eran mi-tos o leyendas lo que los miembros de las primeras comunidades querían conocer, sino lo que había sucedido, lo que Jesús había enseñado, sus sufrimientos en la pasión y el transcendental acontecimiento de su resurrección. Éstos relatos se transmitieron primero oralmente. Dos de los evangelistas habían sido discípulos de Jesús. Lucas se incorporaría más tarde. Le encontramos acompañando a san Pablo. En el libro de los Hechos de los Apóstoles cuenta con precisos detalles los viajes en los que acompañó al Apóstol. Por eso, decide conscientemente, a partir de sus investigaciones, ofrecer en su evangelio una exposición fiable para que la comunidad cristiana sepa que su fe se apoyaba en bases sólidas.

Tras el breve prólogo, nos cuenta Lucas que cómo Jesús empieza sus enseñanzas en las sinagogas. No inicia su ministerio en Jeru-salén, la ciudad del templo, de los reyes y de los pontífices, sino en un rincón lejano y olvidado, "la Galilea de los gentiles" como entonc-es decían con desprecio.

Un sábado vino a Nazaret, la aldea donde se había criado. Como era su costumbre los sábados, entró en la sinagoga y se levantó para hacer la lectura. (Lo que hacéis, domingo tras domingo en nuestras misas, tantos buenos cristianos). Encontró el pasaje donde está escrito: "El Espíritu del Señor está sobre mí, porque él me ha ungido. Me ha enviado para proclamar el Evangelio a los pobres, para anunciar a los cautivos la libertad, para dar vista a los ciegos. Para liberar a los oprimidos, para anunciar el año de gracia del Señor". Se trata de una liberación que abarca al hombre entero, que implica además todos los dones de gracia y salvación: Él trae el gran jubileo y el gran júbilo: la presencia de la gracia y de la salvación. Acabada la lectura se permitió hacer una breve homilía. La más breve y la más verdadera jamás pronunciada: "Hoy, entre vosotros, se cumple esta Escritura que acabáis de escuchar". Lucas utiliza doce veces en su Evangelio ese solemne y misterioso "hoy", como si se hubieran detenido todos los relojes. ¿Sigue siendo realidad ese "hoy" de Jesús en medio de nosotros? ¿Le seguimos experimentando como nuestro Salvador, lo siguen experimentando los pobres como buena noticia para su vida?

Es verdad que Jesús no ha abierto todas las prisiones, no ha curado a todos los ciegos, ni a todos los enfermos, no ha quitado de nues-tro planeta todas las opresiones. Pero en su persona y en los signos que hacía se manifestaba que el Reino de Dios estaba presente y operante. En él se revelaba la fuerza del amor, la única fuerza capaz de cambiar el mundo, porque es la única fuerza capaz de cambiar el corazón del hombre. Cuantos se acercaron a él con fe tuvieron la dicha de experimentarlo. ...continua en la proxima pagina

En Jesús se hizo realidad lo que anunciaba. Se ha hecho realidad y se sigue haciendo allí donde hay cristianos ungidos, conducidos y alentados por el Espíritu. A lo largo de los dos mil siglos de cristianismo, ayer y hoy, no han cesado de surgir obras admirables de mise-ricordia que han sido alegría para los pobres. ¡Tantas obras y tantas personas que se han entregado en cuerpo y alma a curar, a ense-ñar, a dar de comer, a llevar la Buena Noticia a los demás! Otras veces han sido voces proféticas las que se han levantado denunciando injusticias y opresiones. ¿Se cumple hoy en nosotros, ungidos también por el Espíritu, la palabra que hemos proclamado?

"Repent, and believe in the gospel" means "Come follow Me and learn from Me to become like Me." For the first disciples, it meant dropping whatever they were doing to spend so much time with Jesus that their whole lives were forever affected.

And this is what it means for you and for me: We have to put aside our own agendas and overly busy schedules to spend more time following Jesus wherever he leads

In the modern world, we have become more dependent on our technological devises than on Jesus. Many of us cannot even go on vacation without remaining accessible to their employers via the cell phone. Somehow, we need to find a way to take a stand against this.


It's one of the social justice teachings of the Church: We are actually called by God to rebel against working on Sundays and other days of rest. Why? Because we need to spend that time with Jesus quietly being restored and re-energized.




Unfortunately, Jesus doesn't walk through the door and circle dates on our calendar and write "Rest with Jesus" on it so that we can plan ahead. We have to follow his lead at a moment's notice – every moment. 




