

Greetings and happy new year! It was wonderful getting to see many of you last Christmas. I was profoundly blessed by our Lord to receive the opportunity to go on pilgrimage to the Holy Land with my classmates from December 27 through January 6. In summary, getting to walk



the footsteps of Jesus, Mary, Joseph, the Apostles, and the earliest disciples was absolutely life changing for me. The trip was truly an experience of renewal, especially as I approach ordination to the priesthood in 4 short months!

Two brief highlights from the pilgrimage: getting to see the sunrise at the Sea of Galilee and visiting the pit in which Jesus was imprisoned the night before His death under the High Priest Caiphas' house. I was brought to tears (honestly, throughout the entire pilgrimage) witnessing the very sunrise Jesus would have seen. It was from the Sea of Galilee that He called His first Apostles, and in this moment I felt as if He were renewing His call for me to follow Him with my life. In the pit of his imprisonment, I got to proclaim Psalm 88 and reflect on how Jesus willingly chose to enter into the darkness of Good Friday -- and therefore chooses to enter into the moments of darkness that we encounter ourselves. We are never alone and are constantly pursued by a loving God.

In Bethlehem I especially prayed for all of you, Nativity Parishioners, and all of your intentions from the Church of the Nativity (attached photo) that is built above the site in which the Savior of the World was born that first Christmas day. May the Lord continue to bless all of you and your loved ones. See you all during Holy Week. Please stay in touch!

On This Date in Nativity History 25 February 1998



On 25 February 1998, Ash Wednesday began Father Richard Martin's second Lenten season as Nativity pastor, and he made it memorable by launching the giving campaign that eventually became Operation Starfish. The story began with a late evening stroll by Father Richard Martin and his dog, "Pete," when Father began to speculate: What if each family in the parish would forego one order of French fries? What if they would subtract one topping from their weekly pizza? How much money could they raise to help those in need? Fr. Martin couldn't believe the numbers when he calculated them: 2,500 families saving just 50 cents a day for the 40 days of Lent could donate \$50,000 to make a difference in the lives of the poor. What a significant result from such an insignificant sacrifice! This simple program of sacrifice was far more successful than Fr. Martin predicted. That first year, Nativity parishioners raised over \$67,000! They decided to use the funds to build 27 simple houses in Haiti, the poorest nation in the Western Hemisphere, working through the international Christian charity, Food For The Poor, Inc. The name, "Operation Starfish," came in the second year. In February 1999, a dozen Nativity parishioners accompanied Fr. Martin on a mission trip to Haiti, to see for themselves what had been done. Despite the progress in the first project, the Nativity parishioners knew there was much more to be done. At a reflection meeting the Virginians spoke of being overwhelmed with the scope of the problem. "How can we possibly make a difference?" one asked. Searching for an answer, Fr. Martin told his parishioners the now well-known story of the young boy and the starfish. A parishioner spoke up after Fr. Martin finished the story. "Why don't we call our work 'Operation Starfish'?" he asked. Heartened by the Starfish story, and renewed by their mission trip, Church of the Nativity parishioners recommitted themselves to helping the poor, at home as well as in Haiti. As of late 2021, Nativity had provided some \$7.6 million in funding and \$2.6 million in goods-in-kind to build more than 1,500 homes in Haiti. The program has now expanded far beyond home construction to include schools, clinics, deep-sea fishing equipment, scholarships for medical training, and much more. The number of people whose lives have been improved by Starfish is incalculable but surely runs in the many tens of thousands.

This historical note is the 36th of a weekly Bulletin feature leading up to Nativity's fiftieth anniversary, 11 June 2023.



Dear parishioners,

In January we began the sanctuary renovation of our church as part of our parish 50th Anniversary celebration. A large screen was erected to cover the sanctuary area during the renovation. A temporary altar and tabernacle has been placed in front of the screen for our prayer and worship. Daily and Sunday Mass will continue to be celebrated in the church. The renovation is scheduled to be completed by March 11, 2023.

WHAT ARE WE RENOVATING?

THE SANCTUARY FLOOR: The current sanctuary floor is chipped and stained and cannot be restored. There is also an electrical outlet coming out of the steps with red tape as a caution to all. The new sanctuary floor will be a cream color marble floor with border inlets that will enhance the beauty and safety of the altar area.

THE ALTAR: The altar, on which is effected the Sacrifice of the Cross made present under sacramental signs, is also the table of the Lord to which the People of God gather to participate in the Mass, and it also is the center of the thanksgiving that is accomplished through the Eucharist. In every church there should be a fixed altar. The current altar of wood and stone does not line up with the center aisle and has electrical outlets coming out of it in the back. Since we are now going to have a marble floor, the new altar will be built with a dignified cherry stain wood and marble inlets to coordinate with the new marble floor. It will contain relics of various saints.

THE AMBO: The current ambo (pulpit) will be replaced by a cherry wood stain and marble ambo. The design of the new ambo will match the altar as a way of expressing the unity of the Word of God in the Scripture and the Word of God in the Eucharist. There is also a practical motivation for the design of the new pulpit. The current ambo provides little room for the lectionary and homily notes. We also must carry a step stool to the ambo when our children are reading. The renovated ambo will have a shelf for liturgical books and a step installed that can be pulled out when needed by a lector.

THE TABERNACLE: A principal feature of the renovation is the moving of the tabernacle to the center of the sanctuary underneath the Crucifix. This design placement calls attention to the centrality of the Eucharist in our faith. As Pope John Paull II said, "We are the Church of the Eucharist." Visually when you walk into the church, your eyes will be drawn to the Altar, Tabernacle and Crucifix in unity on the same axis in the center. These liturgical sacred items will be architecturally what they are spiritually, the axis of our lives.

PRESIDERS CHAIR: Another liturgical change after the Second Vatican Council was the use of the Presiders Chair for the principal prayers of the Mass. As such, we have designed a chair that fits the overall design of the sanctuary. It will be placed on the side wall where the current tabernacle is located. New chairs for the deacon and altar servers are being made. The current chairs are over 30 years old, have served us well, but are in need of an upgrade.

MOSAIC PANELS: We are adding seven mosaic panels on the right side of the church behind the choir section to echo the seven stained glass windows on the left. These mosaic panels will depict the Seven Corporal Works of Mercy, beautifully displaying Christ's command to care for those in need, a charism of Nativity parish. This will highlight the scripture from Matthew 25 when Jesus describes how we will be judged. It will be a teaching reminder to any who say: "If its not on the final exam, I don't want to study it." Pope Francis has called us "to be a church for the poor." These seven mosaics will also provide a balance visually in the church.... and in our lives.

The cost of this renovation is \$640,000. To date, through the generosity of parishioners, we have raised over half that amount. More are considering a pledge or using our monthly building envelope. If you would like to help contribute, please go to our parish website or call the parish office.





Hebrews 11:1-7 Ps 145:2-5,10-11 Mark 9:2-13 The Jewish religious authorities of Jesus' day were often literalists in their interpretation of the Law of God. Jesus, however, gave a deeper meaning to the Law. He placed his focus on the *goal* of the Law: Love.

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus explains that we fail to fulfill the Law when our so-called obedience isn't motivated by love.

Jesus completely fulfilled the true meaning of the Law. In doing so, he took upon himself our disobedience and died for us in the most generous gift of love.

As his followers, we also are to be generous with love. Obeying all the commandments – truly obeying them – requires loving God with our whole heart, all the time, and loving others as ourselves.


Jesus explains how to transform literal interpretations of God's laws into the Law of Love. In each example, he shows that we are to choose the most loving approach to every problem, no matter how difficult.

His first topic is anger: Sinful anger is judgmental and we are judged by this sin. Jesus provides the remedy: Go and do whatever is necessary to be reconciled. This, he points out, is even

more important than worshiping God. How genuine can our worship be if anger has replaced love in our hearts, since God is love?

Another example is lust, which is a counterfeit of love because it treats others as objects. And divorce from a valid marriage is a failure to love as Christ loves, who taught that love makes sacrifices and endures hardships. Remarriage, he says, furthers the sin because it's unloving to the spouse of the original union.

Jesus extends this teaching to every area of life. Breaking an oath is unloving. Lying and never intending to keep the commitment is unloving. In fact, the entire Sermon on the Mount,



of which this Gospel reading is a part, explains how to love.

Reflect & Discuss:

- † Were you ever treated unlovingly because of another person's legalism? How did that experience hide the true nature of Jesus?
- † What habits do you have that are unloving toward yourself? How do they affect others?
- † Recall a time when someone treated you unfairly but you responded with an act of love. How difficult was it to give that love? What were the results?
- Name common ways that Christians fail to obey God. What did Jesus do to make up for those failures? For example, how do you suppose Jesus treats unborn babies who've been aborted or miscarried?







Dice una conocida sentencia: "Una cosa no es justa por el hecho de ser ley. Ha de ser ley porque es justa". El hombre, que anhela su propia libertad (sin más límites que la propia conciencia) está inclinado a rechazar todas aquellas normas, o mínimas pautas, que vayan en contra de esa idea: yo soy dueño de mi vida, de mi historia y de todo lo que pienso y realizo. ¿O no es así? ¿No hay una práctica rebeldía del hombre contemporáneo a todo lo que se le impone como ley?

1.El evangelio de este domingo VI nos viene estupendamente. Frente al "todo vale" que, en cierta manera nos propaga el mundo, Jesús nos dice el "pero yo os digo".

-Frente al aborto (porque el ser humano es dueño de su propio cuerpo), el Señor nos recuerda que —el 5º mandamientosigue tan vigente como lo conoció y escuchó Moisés: "¡No matarás! "Y que, la vida, viene de Dios y, sólo Dios, puede disponer de ella.

-Frente al olvido o la marginación de los más mayores (cuando la sociedad afirma que ya han cumplido), el Señor nos trae a la memoria el 4º punto de lo revelado por Dios en el Monte Sinaí "honrarás y respetarás a tus padres".

-Frente a la opulencia (en contraste escandaloso con los países más pobres), en este día de Manos Unidas que lucha por el desarrollo de los pueblos más desfavorecidos y hambrientos, el Señor nos lleva al segundo mandamiento: "amarás al prójimo como a ti mismo".

-Frente al intento de absolutizar leyes y normas que siendo indignas se exigen a todas las personas sin derecho a objeción de conciencia (como recientemente reclamaba el Papa Benedicto XVI), Jesús nos recuerda que, sólo Dios, es digno de ser adorado y de ser tenido como suprema ley a favor del hombre.

2.La Palabra de Dios, sus leyes, no son ningún adorno para la humanidad. Es la constatación de un hecho real: muchos de los que creemos en el Señor no tenemos orientada suficientemente, y con fortaleza cimentada, nuestra vida en el Reino de Jesús. Dios, y es así, no es ningún adorno: si su Ley fuera cumplida..muchos dramas del mundo serían superados. Jesús no quiere esclavos de su Reino. Hay un dicho que dice algo así "la letra con sangre entra". La ley del Señor, desde

el momento en que está sustentada en el amor, requiere discípulos libres (no obligados), con luz propia (no con imitaciones), con sal y picante (no derretidos o vencidos). A nadie se nos obliga a creer y, por lo tanto, cumplir la voluntad de Dios, esperar en El y en sus promesas nos lleva a la siguiente conclusión: vivir según Dios es un gran regalo. Un privilegio que el Señor nos recuerda en el evangelio que acabamos de escuchar.

Cristo que sabe cómo se está con Dios metido en el corazón, desea para nosotros lo mismo: la felicidad auténtica. ¿Y cómo se alcanza? Sirviéndole con alegría y con prontitud, con entusiasmo y con diligencia, con perfección y con humildad. Iba un peregrino camino de Compostela y, en un anochecer, mirando hacia las estrellas preguntó: "Señor; ¿qué quieres de mí? Vivo según tu Palabra y camino por tus sendas. Te busco…y no sé si acabo de encontrarte. Una voz, desde lo más profundo del silencio le contestó: "te quiero a Ti".

Esta es la ley del Señor. Sus mandamientos están encaminados precisamente hacia ello: a un encuentro real, misterioso y

personal entre Dios y el hombre.

Éste es un asunto complejo. Tiene una viva vertiente humana. Y una no menos viva dimensión eclesial. Veamos de ordenar algunos datos:

El número de bautizados casados sacramentalmente que se divorcian y vuelven a unirse en un una nueva relación matrimonial es cada vez más grande. Las estadísticas alarman. Tras



ellas están las personas reales de carne y hueso, de inteligencia y corazón.

- La ruptura de un matrimonio, basado en el amor, no es indolora. Normalmente no es un capricho efímero. Detrás de una separación hay una historia de amor convertida en historia de sufrimiento. Hay heridas personales. Hay sentimientos de fracaso. Y mucho dolor.
- En casos extremos la separación se hace inevitable. Es una obligación para salvar la propia salud personal y evitar males mayores. En otros muchos casos de separación hay uno que es abandonado.
- La sociedad actual no favorece una cultura de la fidelidad, del esfuerzo, de la gratificación a largo plazo. Exalta con fruición la infidelidad y la inestabilidad. ¡Pero todavía sigues con el mismo! La poligamia y la poliandria sucesivas se nos presentan como éxito y logro en los iconos sociales y culturales.
- La comunidad cristiana siente el dolor de estos cristianos separados, divorciados y casados de nuevo; son miembros de la misma; a veces amigos y familiares. Se siente en conflicto: por una parte está la amistad, la convivencia, la pertenencia a estas personas; por otra, está la necesidad de ser fieles a la palabra de Jesús: "lo que Dios ha unido no lo separe el hombre" Mt 19,5-6). La comunidad cristiana se ve envuelta en un conflicto. La autoridad de la palabra de Jesús y el amor a los hermanos.
- La comunidad cristiana entiende que los casados, divorciados y casados en un nuevo matrimonio civil, siguen siendo cristianos. Muchos de ellos siguen siendo personas de oración; meditan la Escritura, educan a sus hijos en la fe; están comprometidos en la lucha por la justicia y la solidaridad. Participan en la eucaristía. Pero no están en plena comunión objetiva con la palabra de Jesús. Por eso justifica la exclusión de estas personas de la comunión eucarística. Entiende la Iglesia que en la Eucaristía se actualiza el amor fiel, único, indisoluble y redentor de Jesús. Ese amor esponsal que se celebra está en contradicción con la ruptura de la promesa de fidelidad y compromiso que han hecho los divorciados
- El matrimonio civil como relación de amor estable y fiel, como mutua ayuda y proyecto de vida, es una realidad humana muy valiosa y positiva. No es lícito devaluarlo como concubinato. En cuanto relación de amor comprometido y dialogante, tierno y fecundo, es reflejo del Dios -amor. Es una realidad con alcance religioso. "Todo el que ama ha nacido de Dios y conoce a Dios. Quien no ama no ha conocido a Dios" (1Jn 4, 7-8)".

- La exclusión de la plena comunión eucarística no es un juicio sobre las personas; menos aún constituye su descalificación o culpabilización. No es un castigo ni una discriminación. Las personas son respetables, aun
- cuado sus decisiones fueran equivocadas o contrarias a la praxis cristiana. Cada uno es responsable último de su propia vida ante Dios. La capacidad de rectificar los propios errores o de convertirse de sus pecados es admirable humanamente.
- La misericordia salvadora de Dios es universal. Dios ama a todos y cada uno. Es el suyo un amor incondicional. Ofrece siempre una esperanza de futuro, de crecimiento en la fe y en el amor.
- La iglesia no puede mantener a estas personas sin salida. Tiene que ofrecer un camino hacia la plena comunión. ¿Cómo ayuda la Iglesia a estas personas? ¿Cómo muestra su amor materno? ¿Cómo sufre y ama la comunidad cristiana junto con estas personas? ¿Realmente les muestra que el yugo es suave y la carga ligera?

La llamada Angel Moreno - Viernes, 20 de enero de 2017

Estamos en los primeros domingos del Tiempo Ordinario, tenemos ante nosotros el año apenas estrenado, y la Palabra de Dios nos propone el pasaje evangélico de

la llamada de los primeros discipulos, y su actitud inmediata de seguir a Jesús, dejando redes, casa, familia...

Puede parecer una escena irreal, porque es difícil comprender que de una forma tan inmediata alguien pueda decidir una opción totalmente radical. Debemos interpretar que el texto evangélico compendia el relato. Seguro que los pescadores de Gallea ya habrían tenido noticias de Jesús de Nazaret, y que la opción de seguirlo no es posible sin sentir históricamente la llamada.

De una u otra manera, en el discernimiento vocacional para las distintas formas de vida cristiana, debe haberse registrado un sentimiento de llamada, con la concurrencia de circunstancias objetivadoras que ayuden a comprender la opción de vida como una obediencia y no como una decisión inventada.

Solo cuando se ha registrado el paso del Señor por nuestras vidas cabe arriesgarse en el seguimiento evangélico, porque de lo contrario, sería difícil superar una posible crisis vocacional si no se encuentra razón trascendente por la que ser fiel. Esto vale para la vida consagrada y para la vida matrimonial. El relato se hace eco de una profecía sobre el territorio en el que Jesús ejerce su misión. Este dato de fijar la vocación en un lugar concreto también es importante, porque a la hora de recordar la llamada es luminoso poder fijarla en tiempo y lugar, como les sucedió los discipulos de Juan el Bautista, cuando se encontraron por primera vez con Jesús, se dieron cuenta que era la hora décima, hacia las cuatro de la tarde.

He leído una expresión que resume muy bien el sentido de nuestra vida: "Soy amado y llamado, por eso existo" (José A. García). Si esto es principio y fundamento, que diría san Ignacio de Loyola, también sirve a la hora de cimentar la propia vocación.

¿A qué te sientes llamado? ¿Cuándo y dónde percibiste el paso del Señor por tu vida? ¿Tu modo de vida responde a una obediencia, o es un proyecto independiente, que tú te has impuesto?


