A Message from our Pastor Msgr. Bob Cilinski



"Rejoice and be glad; your reward will be great in heaven." (Luke 6:23ab)

My dear parishioners,

Luke's gospel is often referred to as the "gospel of the poor." If taken very literally Luke's version of the Beatitudes begins.... "Blessed are the poor." Luke gives a high priority to widows, the lost, foreigners, lepers, women, children, outcasts, the humble and meek and those who have very little. His is the gospel of mercy and compassion.

Pope Francis wrote to the Catholic Bishops of the United States on February 10 to: "Encourage, along with the lay faithful, our continued care for immigrants and refugees who have not committed any serious or violent crimes but have fled their own land for reasons of extreme poverty, persecution and war that places them in a state of vulnerability.

Recognizing the right of a nation to protect its borders, enacting laws should be done remembering the dignity of men and women and entire families. Let us continue to work closely with migrants and refugees and avoid unnecessary suffering to our brothers and sisters, proclaiming Jesus Christ who gave His life for the salvation of all.

God will richly reward all that you do for the protection and defense of those who are considered less valuable, less important, or less human. We ask Our Lady of Guadalupe to protect families who live in fear due to migration and/or deportation and build a society that is more respectful of all."



### A message from the Nativity Creation Care Ministry

Wood frogs are an amphibian species with a broad distribution in North America. They have a distinct black marking across the eyes and are unique in their ability to freeze over the winter their breathing and heartbeat actually stop. Adults live in our local woodlands, hibernating during the winter in leaf litter. In the spring, they are one of the first frogs to visit ponds and vernal pools to mate and lay eggs—sometimes as early as Valentine's Day! When you hear a quack-like call from your local woods, it may be the start of breeding season for one of God's interesting creatures! Wood frogs are an important part of local food webs, consuming insects, slugs, snails, worms and spiders while falling prey themselves to hawks, foxes, raccoons and other predators.

Because amphibians like wood frogs absorb a significant amount of water through their skin, they are particularly vulnerable to pollutants and toxins in our water from runoff. Reducing or eliminating your use of pesticides and herbicides, avoiding oil and other fluid leaks from vehicles, washing vehicles only at car washes and picking up after pets will all help improve the cleanliness of our waterways and the health of God's creatures who are as dependent on clean water sources as we are.

When we experience warm days in late February and early March, take a walk near a local pond or vernal pool and see if you can see or hear a wood frog or spring peeper! It's time for a nature lesson about tadpoles and metamorphosis! And, let's take care of "Sister Water"!



### **Pro-Life Corner**



March for Life Recap: Nativity's MFL event kicked off with a beautiful Mass for Life celebrated by Msgr. Bob. All 38 of us boarded the bus and we prayed the Pro-life Rosary on the way there.

We took various group pictures, such as in front of the Washington Monument and the U.S. Capitol, and attended the Rally. Diana Huynh captured a focused Fr. Bresnahan and Nativity banner-carrying Darren Randall in this iconic MFL pose below. There were many inspiring and hope-filled Rally speeches towards ending the scourge of abortion and about the dignity of life. Senate Majority Leader Thune spoke first, saying *"We stand here today... to remind people of the great truth upon which our country was founded—all men and women are created equal and endowed by their creator with certain inalienable rights and that among these are the rights to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness."* 

Speaker of the House Johnson noted that "As one of his first official acts, President Trump just freed and pardoned nearly two dozen wrongfully imprisoned pro-life activists. And I don't know if you saw his executive order on gender, but it defines life as beginning at conception rather than birth." Gov. DeSantis took the stage. "The sanctity of life does not depend on poll results ... It's an enduring truth and it represents the foundation of our society." Rep. Smith spoke of pregnancy centers being "under siege by politicians" and called for the defunding of Planned Parenthood. "Today, we recommit to exposing abortion methods, which the other side never wants to talk about. To a society that has chosen to be blind to the realities of brutally dismembering helpless babies with sharp curettes, knives, and the kids we know feel pain... and also the poisoning of babies, starving them to death with the abortion pill." Lila Rose, reminded pro-lifers that they have "the power to change minds at the dinner table, on campuses, at soccer games." President Trump (who spoke via pre-recorded message) thanked the marchers for showing "extraordinary love and compassion" for preborn children, and said, "We will work to offer a loving hand to new mothers and young families... and we will support adoption and foster care. We will protect women and vulnerable children under my leadership. A reformed Department of Justice will finally investigate ... attacks on churches and crisis pregnancy centers and we will *bring perpetrators to justice.*" Vice President Vance then took the stage. "The task of our movement is to protect innocent life. It's to defend the unborn and it's also to be pro-family and pro-life life in the fullest sense of that word possible ... and truly believes that the benchmark of national success is not our GDP number or our stock market but whether people feel that they can raise thriving and healthy families in our country." Vance also spoke about Trump's endorsement of the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act ... and spoke of how the government will no longer direct FBI raids on the homes of pro-life activists or put pro-life activists in prison. He spoke of Trump's pardoning the pro-lifers imprisoned. #### Qué puedo hacer para fortalecer mi fe? 6 consejos prácticos para fortalecer mi fe cuando siento que flaquea

En nuestro camino de vida es común encontrarnos con momentos en los que la fe flaquea. Momentos en los que todo parece ir bien y cuando menos lo pensamos, renacen las dudas. Cuando esto suceda debemos buscar los medios para afrontar el sentimiento de pérdida o confusión y poner manos a la obra. Estos son algunos consejos que pueden ayudarnos a fortalecer nuestra fe y regresar a ella.

#### 1. Busca respuestas a tus dudas

Muchos nos hemos encontrado con dudas, pequeñas o grandes. Acerca de aquello en lo que creemos, y no tiene nada de malo, al contrario, es totalmente natural. Hay que verlo como una oportunidad para fortalecer nuestra convicción de fe.

Lo importante aquí, no es el hecho de hacerse preguntas, sino de buscar respuestas y saber donde hacer la búsqueda, pues no todos los sitios web o libros tienen la mejor respuesta. Te recomiendo buscar en el Catecismo de la Iglesia como primera medida, también puedes acercarte a un sacerdote o guía espiritual para que te ayude a aclarar el panorama o acudir al testimonio de diversos santos. 2. Pide a Dios que aumente tu fe

Suena un poco obvio, pero en ocasiones olvidamos acudir a Dios en estos momentos, lo dejamos de lado. En los evangelios encontramos una bella aclamación dirigida a Él: ¡Señor, creo pero aumenta mi fe! (Mc 9, 14-29), es una expresión confiada en que el Señor, en su infinito amor, va a escuchar nuestro clamor y acrecentará nuestra fe.

No es tan sencillo como parece, pero Dios nunca falla. Podremos estar atravesando por duras pruebas, pero Él no nos olvida. Busca un momento del día para dedicarle estas palabras, sincerar tu corazón, reconocerte débil y pedirle ayuda. Perseverar en la oración, aunque parezca complicado, es un aspecto que no podemos dejar de lado.

3. Realiza un examen de conciencia

En aquellos momentos en que tambalea la fe, es fundamental hacer una evaluación decómo estamos viviendo. Es necesario saber si este decaimiento espiritual se debe a alguna situación de pecado en que hayamos caído. Además, es necesario, acercarnos a la confesión conscientes de que por medio de ella, recibimos la gracia para ser cada vez más fieles al Señor.

Erróneamente se cree que realizar un examen de conciencia, se trata de ponernos en el banquillo de los acusados, pero en realidad, esta es una excelente herramienta que nos sirve como reflejo de lo que somos en determinado momento.

4. Vive la caridad

No hay mayor alegría en el corazón del hombre que la de poder demostrar su amor a los demás por medio del servicio. Te recomiendo acercarte a un centro de salud o una fundación y donar un tiempo de voluntariado, visitar a un enfermo de tu comunidad, ayudar a alguien que esté pasando hambre, acompañar a quien se encuentra solo.

Estas son solo algunas formas de entregarnos a otros y una poderosa arma contra la desesperanza o la desilusión.

5. Busca dirección espiritual

Te recuerdo que no podemos caminar solos, es necesario que haya alguien que nos acompañe, aliente y corrija en el camino. Buscar dirección espiritual te ayudará a encontrar la luz del Espíritu Santo, refugiarse en él nos servirá de bastón en el proceso de fe y conversión. Si estás pasando por un momento de crisis de fe, una experiencia de dolor o culpa, o incluso un momento de acción de gracias a Dios, un encuentro con tu director espiritual es totalmente enriquecedor, sentirás cómo es el mismo Señor quien te acoge, escucha y aconseja.

6. Recuerda aquellos momentos en que tu fe ha sido más firme

Es bueno recordar y volver a vivir esos momentos que han permitido que tu fe crezca y se haga más fuerte, pues en ellos encontrarás las pautas para recuperarte en este bello camino hacia Jesús. Es importantísimo que nunca olvides, que no estás solo, sino que tanto la fuerza del Espíritu como la compañía y apoyo de tus hermanos en la fe, están contigo.

Repite diariamente en tu oración personal: ¡Señor, creo pero aumenta mi fe! No temamos pedirle con urgencia a Dios que nos socorra. La fe es una gracia, una gracia que transforma nuestras vidas y la forma en que vemos el mundo. Como gracia que es, es necesario pedírsela a Dios continuamente.


De modo más radical, sorprende descubrir que el amor llegó a nosotros precisamente cuando estábamos lejos, cuando el pecado nos había herido, cuando no lo merecíamos. Yo curaré sus extravíos, los amaré sin que lo merezcan... dice el Señor por medio del profeta Oseas (cf. Os 14,5).

San Pablo lo recordará con palabras bañadas en el fuego del Espíritu: En efecto, cuando todavía estábamos sin fuerzas, en el tiempo señalado, Cristo murió por los impíos -en verdad, apenas habrá quien muera por un justo; por un hombre de bien tal vez se atrevería uno a morir-; mas la prueba de que Dios nos ama es que Cristo, siendo nosotros todavía pecadores, murió por nosotros (Rm 5,6-8).

A partir de esa certeza, convertida en experiencia, arranca mi condición cristiana, en la que se unen el amor a Dios y el amor al prójimo: Nosotros amemos, porque Él nos amó primero (1Jn 4,19).

Sí, soy cristiano desde su Amor y para amar. Soy cristiano porque me abro, cada mañana, cada minuto, a la certeza de su cercanía y su misericordia. Soy cristiano cuando empiezo a acoger, con gozo y esperanza, a Jesús, Hijo de Dios e Hijo de María.







