A Message from our Pastor Fr. Bob Cilinski



My dear parishioners,

Twenty-six years ago, Fr. Richard Martin, then Nativity's Pastor, had the inspiration to make our Lenten sacrifice more meaningful by focusing on the poor. A basket was placed in the church vestibule and parishioners contributed what they saved during Lent to build homes for needy people in Haiti. We called this beautiful gesture "Operation Starfish," after the story that teaches us that we can make a difference, one person at a time.

Today, we can look back and see just how much of a difference we have made. Our 13th Nativity Village development is nearly complete. More than 1,500 families now live in new homes in Haiti, because we cared. Fresh water fish farms are teeming with tilapia and basa. Ocean fishing co-ops bring food and business opportunities to several villages. Doctors are serving others in Jamaica after we supported their education. Another medical student is nearing graduation. More than 20,000 birthing and newborn kits have gone to new mothers in Haiti from our Stella Marina ministry and 150 midwives receive training every 2 months. Sewing centers and clinics in Haiti and a new clinic in Honduras are helping communities with jobs and healthcare. Hundreds of children are in Nativity Village schools. Three greenhouse complexes are operating in the Dominican Republic. Leper patients have support and hope at Cardinal Leger Leper Hospital. Together with Holy Spirit School in Annandale, we completed a reforestation project in Haiti in 2023. And we have done so much more...

But there is always more to do. In 2024 we plan to complete Nativity Village at Bas-Fossé and start a new development called Nativity Village at Bois-Louroux. In spite of the violence and turmoil in Haiti, we are able to work in the northern part of the country on a smaller scale. We will begin this new community with 20 new homes this year. In 2025 we will build another 20 homes, install a water distribution system, and put in solar street lights. Small business development will follow. Also in 2024, we will continue supporting scholarships, vocational training and healthcare. Food For The Poor is arranging for the Catholic Church to take over the operation of our Nativity Village schools in northern Haiti in the near future, and CEPUDO is now operating the new clinic we built in Honduras in 2023.

This Lent we will continue our long-standing tradition of placing a basket in the vestibule of the church. Any gifts placed in the basket will be shared with Operation Starfish and Catholic Relief Services (CRS). If you specifically designate either Operation Starfish or CRS, your designation will be honored.

Our principle Operation Starfish collection will take place this year on the Sixth Sunday of Easter, May 5, 2024. There will be a second collection on that Sunday at all the Masses. May 5 this year is the closest Sunday to the 10th anniversary of our late Pastor, Fr. Richard Martin's return to God. Fr. Martin loved the poor and founded Operation Starfish here at Nativity in 1998. We have a parish tradition of taking the annual Starfish collection during the Easter season on the Sunday closest to Fr. Martin's anniversary. Let's keep making a difference, one family at a time.

OPERATION STARFISH 1998 – 2024 MAKING A DIFFERENCE FOR 26 YEARS

Lent, 2024 at Nativity Catholic Church marks the 26th year of Operation Starfish, our international ministry to the poor. Begun in 1998, with Fr. Richard Martin's vision to make the Lenten sacrifice more meaningful, Operation Starfish has created an unmatched opportunity to encounter the poor and make a difference in their lives. By the time Fr. Martin died in 2014, our parish, working with Food For The Poor, had developed 9 Nativity Villages in Haiti and had completed projects in the Dominican Republic, Jamaica and Honduras.

When Fr. Bob Cilinski became Nativity's Pastor, he led an Operation Starfish mission trip to Haiti in 2015 to dedicate Good Shepherd Village in memory of Fr. Martin. He also broke ground on a new medical facility – the "Operation Starfish Clinic," in Good Shepherd Village. Fr. Cilinski returned to Haiti in 2017 to bless the new homes in Nativity Village at Despuzeau and to break ground for a new school there. Fr. Cilinski also initiated Operation Starfish mission trips to Jamaica for Nativity's College and Young Adult Ministry.

Today, there are 13 Nativity Villages in Haiti and in 2024, we will break ground on our 14th village project – Nativity Village at Bois-Louroux. Like the earlier villages, Bois-Louroux will provide clean water, sanitation, education, healthcare and small businesses. We are truly "sowing seeds of hope" as Pope Francis calls us to do.

As we enter our 26th year of service, the people of Haiti continue to deal with gang violence, failed government, hunger and disease. Because of this, we have shifted our primary focus to northern Haiti, where conditions are better, and we have reduced the scope of our projects. Our commitment to our sisters and brothers in Haiti has not diminished. We will not abandon them. This past year we completed one school in Nativity Village at Bas-Fossé and a second is under construction. The housing at Bas-Fossé is nearly complete, with 75 new homes. We funded the operation of St. Anthony Clinic, supported our Nativity Sewing Centers and school scholarship program, funded midwife training and shipped birthing and newborn kits through our Stella Marina ministry. We also continued our medical scholarship program in Jamaica.

Operation Starfish also built a new clinic in El Celirio, Honduras last year to serve the medical needs of 3,500 people. A Honduran charity called CEPUDO is handling operation and staffing of the clinic. Nativity will send a delegation on a mission trip to Honduras this July to see the clinic, meet the staff and community, and survey needs for another possible project.

Please join us in Lenten prayer and sacrifice as we begin a new year of Operation Starfish!

All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence, Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence.

Catholics 14 years of age and older are obliged to abstain from meat and those 18-59 are obliged to fast (1 full meal and 2 smaller ones to maintain strength) unless medical/serious reasons exist.

A Message from the Nativity Creation Care Ministry

Fast from Energy Waste: Could you consider ways to reduce fossil fuel use in your life? Natural gas, oil, and coal are fossil fuels—non-renewable energy sources and produce greenhouse gas emissions. Consider cleaner forms of transportation: Walk, ride your bike, use public transportation. Petition and lobby Congress to support mass transit construction, higher miles per gallon standards for trucks, and more incentives for hybrid/ electric vehicles. Obey the speed limit when driving. Every 10 mph faster reduces fuel economy by about 4 miles per gallon, regardless of vehicle size. Check your tire pressure. Low tire pressure means high energy/fuel consumption. To save money and energy at home, caulk and weatherstrip around doors and windows to plug air leaks. Remove one light bulb in your house and live without it during Lent as a reminder of the luxury of having electricity.

Did you know?

Our Nativity Rosary Ministry distributes an average of 8,000 mission rosaries a year to foreign missions and to our parish and local community groups. We also collect Old and Broken rosaries. If you have rosaries to donate there is a grey box at the back of the church where you can place your rosaries, or medals. (no large crucifixes or written materials, please)

These rosaries are sorted, cleaned, and repaired and then sent to the foreign missions. If a rosary cannot be completed, we use the parts for chaplets and any parts not used are buried in the ground.

What you may not know is that our rosary ministry receives packages and boxes with Old and Broken rosaries, thanks to our website, from all over the United States. In the last few years, we have recycled hundreds of repaired beautiful rosaries. If we are to continue, we will need your help to learn to repair

Pro-Life Corner Open Letter from Bishop Burbidge

President Biden has made abortion the centerpiece of his campaign. At a rally in Manassas, VA, he advocated for codifying Roe v. Wade into law. It is incredibly devastating to know President Biden would place "choice" over his sacred duty to protect life. President Biden's rally took place just four miles from the Manassas Mother of Mercy Free Medical Clinic, where Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Arlington offers free prenatal care to pregnant women in need and their unborn children. In the year after the Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health decision, the Diocese of Arlington delivered \$877,000 in free medical care to more than 1,000 women. Going further, the diocese also provided rent and utilities assistance, nearly 400,000 diapers, and 4,000 cans of formula to families in need.

Despite what this administration claims, taking the life of an innocent child is never a "choice." Women who are facing unexpected or difficult pregnancies deserve assistance that affirms and supports life - not destroy it. Abortion remains the preeminent civil rights issue of our time, yet, just yesterday, the Biden administration announced renewed efforts to increase access to medically unsafe prescription abortion pills. This is clearly not about women's health.

The Diocese of Arlington and the entire pro-life movement will remain steadfast in ensuring parents facing unexpected or challenging pregnancies have the support they need to choose life for their unborn children.







"You know what I'm talkin' about Church? I mean, are y'all walking with me Church? Surviving our history physically, mentally, emotionally, morally, spiritually, faithfully, and joyfully – our people developed a culture that was African and American"[...] and, despite all of this, [...] Blacks [...] are still struggling [...] still trying to find home in the homeland and home in the Church." (Sr. Thea Bowman's Address to the U.S. Bishop's Conference June 1989).

The Black Catholic experience is robust. It is ripe with beauty, brimming with joy, and spurred by heartfelt passion and religious devotion. However, part of the story comes from the communal ability to maintain these qualities amidst prejudice, fear, ignorance, and ultimately, sin. Sister Thea's words challenge us, as a Church, to not stand still amidst racial tension. Rather, she asks that our "next step" be to "walk with" her and the Black community, to face and absorb the rich and complex journey of what it means to be Black, American, and Catholic. Within our Diocese, the City of Alexandria has become a repository of African American culture and history due to its complicated and unique role within our nation's struggle with racial issues. That is why today we take Sr. Thea up on her challenge to walk with her, the Black community, and Jesus Christ so that the entire human family can find their "home and homeland in the Church."

PLACES TO VISIT

St. Joseph Catholic Church in Alexandria. Established in 1915, this beautiful church welcomes people of all races and nationalities and many are drawn by its friendly atmosphere and African-American talent for liturgical expression.

Alexandria African American Heritage Memorial Park. The park was established in 1995 and includes a one-acre 19th century cemetery, sculptures, and wetlands.

Edmonson Sisters Sculpture & Historical Marker. Erected by the city of Alexandria in 2010, this sculpture depicts the Edmonson sisters who were enslaved until freed in 1848.

Freedom House Museum. Once the largest and most successful domestic slave trading firm in America, this building has been converted into a museum that tells the story of the slave trade and those who suffered because of it.

Contrabands and Freedmen Cemetery. A burial ground for countless people who found refuge in Alexandria when the Union occupied it. Black Union soldiers were also buried here until they demanded the honor of being buried in Soldiers' Cemetery.

The Pauline Bookstore. A Catholic shop run by the Daughters of St. Paul right here in Alexandria. Be sure to drop by and get something to commemorate your trip!

Ps 119:1-2,4-5,7-8 Mt 5:43-48 Today's Gospel reading shows us the first thing that Jesus did after his baptismal anointing in the Jordan River: He wrestled with temptation.

His baptism had marked the moment of his

complete surrender to the Father's will. As he arose from the water, he began a new life of ministry.

The Father responded by telling him that he was very pleased, and the Holy Spirit filled his humanness. Jesus as God already had the Holy Spirit (he and the Spirit were the same God), but Jesus the fully human Son now came fully alive in the Spirit. We can imagine how this experience in the Jordan River gave him the feeling of an elated spiritual high. And the next thing that happens is an attack of the devil.

The same pattern repeats itself in our lives. As soon as we experience new growth in our faith, or a new calling to do the Father's will, we run smack into a situation that tests the strength

and sincerity of our faith. However, if this didn't happen, how would we find out that we've spiritually matured? How would we know that we are ready to make a significant difference for the kingdom of God?

Sometimes without consciously thinking it, we decide that if we're going to be tested and we might lose, wouldn't it be better not to start something new? Well, that's another temptation!

Lent is the perfect time to examine the temptations that we



face every day and turn them into new growth that will strengthen our faith.

Every time we face a sin and seek God's forgiveness, we become stronger. And if we take

it a step farther by walking into the confessional with it, we also receive powerful graces directly from Jesus, through the priest, that will render temptations much more powerless.

And this makes us more useful to God in the mission of conquering evil in the world and helping his kingdom spread into the lives of the people around us.

Think of temptations as blessings in disguise: Use them as opportunities to become more like Jesus and grow powerful in the faith.

- + How well do you recognize temptation?
- + How quickly do you rely on the faith that God has given you to say no to the devil's tricks?
- Describe a time when you experienced a spiritual high and then faced a strong temptation. How did you handle it?
- What role did (or will) Jesus play in overcoming this temptation?

Sí, porque, ¿quién le contó al paralítico que Jesús se encontraba en una de aquellas casas de planta baja? ¿Quién le hizo llegar la noticia que su vida clavada a una camilla, como la del leproso o la suegra de Pedro, podría cambiar de la noche a la mañana?

¿A quién se le ocurrió la brillante idea, en un intento desesperado por llegarse hasta Jesús, de abrir en círculo un tejado y desprender a través de él la camilla con el paralítico?

Ni más ni menos que aquellos cuatro hombres que, haciendo de buenos samaritanos, o de jinetes del mal ajeno, transportaron con sus manos, desde la distancia de la parálisis hasta el encuentro con la vida, al paralítico.

- -No era pues uno el que creía; eran cinco
- -No era uno el que se fiaba; eran cinco
- -No era uno el que buscaba a Jesús; eran cinco
- -No era uno el que estaba paralizado; uno quería andar algo, y los otros cuatro, tal vez, un poco mejor. Porque sin la ayuda de los cuatro ¿Qué hubiera pasado?
- 2. La fe se vive mejor en comunidad. Y, con fe viva, los cinco fueron al encuentro de Jesús. Y, a los cinco, reconocíó el Señor la grandeza y la profundidad de su fe. Una vez más, la comunidad empuja, alienta, reza y ayuda a llevar la cruz. ¿Somos nosotros alentadores, rezadores, y camilleros de las debilidades de los demás? ¿Hacemos palanca y abrimos agujeros en los tejados de aquellas personas que necesitan un poco de aire para respirar o una ventana por la que poder descubrir un horizonte para sus vidas?

Como cristianos, como confidentes y amigos de Jesús, no podemos dejar que el personal se las apañe solo. Siempre, en una cruz, hay lugar y espacio para una mano. Y cuántas cruces que no pueden salir de sus vías dolorosas porque no encuentran personas bien dispuestas y decididas a empujar. Cuántas, de esas cruces, tan sólo escuchan lamentos o....eso no es cosa mía.

3. Que el evangelio de este día, incluso gráficamente, nos ayude y nos estimule a abrir nuestras iglesias, y por supuesto a visitarlas. Nuestra conciencia, al ver una iglesia abierta, nos tendría que hacer sentir que, el Señor, está dentro, esperándonos, aguardándonos para curarnos de tantas cosas.

¡Qué pena los templos cerrados por mil excusas no del todo ciertas! ¿No será ya el momento de abrir los boquetes de las puertas para posibilitar encuentros con la fe, conversaciones con el silencio, posibilidades al perdón, encuentros con la oración, diálogos con el crucificado? Si; ya sé que alguno me dirá que para hablar con Dios no hace falta recurrir al templo. Pero ¿no os parece que estamos escasos de tranquilidad y sosiego en el entorno que nos movemos?; No os parece que es casi un milagro -por no decir un privilegio- el encontrar un espacio que nos facilite la reflexión y la contemplación? Ojala que, como esos cuatro camilleros, también nosotros -los padres de familia, los catequistas, los sacerdotes, tantos y tantos grupos comprometidos en la vida de la Iglesia- seamos capaces de tener la valentía suficiente y el desparpajo necesario para empujar a todo paralítico que salga a nuestro encuentro (tibios o fríos en la fe) y llevarles al encuentro de la palabra de vida eterna. Merece la pena intentarlo.



Las clases medias de la santidad Además de los santos de primera hay por el mundo algunos santos de segunda y bastantes de tercera Por: José Luis Martín Descalzo | Fuente: Razones para el amor

Joseph Malegue -ese gran novelista cristiano que en España no ha sido ni siquiera traducido- dejó a medio escribir una novela cuyo título era el mismo que yo he puesto a este artículo. Y en ella -por los pocos fragmentos que se conocen- desarrollaba una idea ya varias veces apuntada en sus obras anteriores: que para profundizar en los fenómenos religiosos no hay que explorar sólo en el alma de los grandes santos, de los santos de primera, de los aristócratas de la santidad, sino que «las almas modestas contaban también; contaban además las clases medias de la santidad».

Nada más cierto. Porque tal vez estamos demasiado acostumbrados a trazar una distinción excesivamente neta entre la santidad y la mediocridad. A un lado estarían esas diez docenas de titanes del espíritu que tomaron el evangelio por donde más quemaba y realizaron una vida incandescente. Al otro estaríamos nosotros, los que vegetamos en el cristianismo.

Y ésta es una distinción, además de falsa, terriblemente desalentadora. Pensamos: como yo no tendré jamás el coraje de ser un Francisco de Asís, vamos a limitarnos a cumplir y a esperar que Dios nos meta al final en el cielo por la puerta de servicio. La santidad se nos presenta así como una zarza incombustible, imposible no sólo para nosotros, sino incluso para cualquiera que viva en nuestras circunstancias. Además, pensamos para agravar las cosas, los santos hacen milagros y nosotros ya tenemos bastante con no hacer pecados. La solución es la siesta.

Pero, si abrirnos con más atención los ojos, vemos que además de los santos de primera hay por el mundo algunos santos de segunda y bastantes de tercera. Esa buena gente que ama a Dios, esas personas que, cuando estarnos con ellas, nos dan el sentimiento casi físico de la presencia viva de Dios; almas sencillas, pero entregadas; normales, pero fidelísimas. Auténticas clases medias de la santidad.

Quien más, quien menos, todos hemos encontrado en el mundo dos o tres docenas de almas así. Y hemos sido felices de estar a su lado. Y hemos pensado que, con un poco más de esfuerzo, hasta nosotros podríamos parecemos un poco a ellas. Y sentirnos que este tipo de personas sostienen nuestra fe y que, en definitiva, en su sencillez, son una de las grandes señales de la presencia de Dios en la Iglesia.

Yo he conocido a muchos de estos santos de tercera o segunda -empezando por mis padres- a quienes no canonizaría. Incluso me daría un poco de risa imaginármelos con un arito en torno a la cabeza y ellos se pondrían muy colorados si alguien se lo colocara. Pero, sin embargo, me han parecido almas tan verdaderas, que en ellas he visto siempre reflejado lo que más me gusta de Dios: su humildad.

Creo que de esto se habla poco. Y, no obstante, yo creo que tiene razón Moeller cuando escribe que «el centro del cristianismo es el misterio de esta humildad de Dios». Es cierto: en el catecismo nos hablaron mucho del Dios todopoderoso y a veces llegamos a imaginarnos a un Dios soberbio, cuajado de pedrerías, actuando siempre a través de milagros y hablando con voz tonante. Pero la realidad es que, cuando Dios se hizo visible, todo fue humilde y sencillo. Se hizo simplemente un hombre a quien sus enemigos pudieron abofetear sin que sacara terribles relámpagos del cielo. Un Dios que es humilde en su revelación, hecha a través de textos también humildes, difíciles de interpretar, expuestos a tergiversaciones, mucho menos claros de los que escribiría un matemático perfeccionista. Un Dios humilde en su Iglesia, que no construyó como una elite de perfectos, sino como una esposa indefensa y mil veces equivocada, tartamudeante y armada con una modesta honda y unos pocos guijarros frente al Goliat del mundo. Humilde también en la tierra en que quiso nacer, en esa Palestina que ni es un prodigio de belleza física ni un paraíso de orden, una especie de Suiza del espíritu.

«El Señor de la gloria -escribe también Moeller- no ha querido ni el poder ni la nada, ni el trueno ni el silencio del abismo, pues el poder tiránico a la sombría nada son lo contrario del amor. El amor quiere la dulzura humilde y gratuita, no se defiende, ofrece de antemano su cuello a los verdugos y, sin embargo, es más poderoso que la muerte y mil torrentes de agua no podrán extinguir el fuego de la caridad. El amor quiere también la vida, la dulce vida; el amor da la vida y no la nada.»

Por eso a este Dios humilde le van muy bien los santos humildes y pequeños, los santos del aprobadillo. Y es una suerte que nos permite no desanimarnos a quienes tenemos un amor de hoguera (¡o de cerilla!) y jamás llegaremos a su amor de volcán.

Incluso el camino hacia Dios está muy bien hecho. Es como un monte al que hay que subir. Y tiene dos caminos: uno de cabras, que va en derechura desde la falda a la cima, escarpado, durísimo, empinadísimo, y un camino carretero, que sube también, pero en zigzag, dando vueltas y vueltas en espiral hacia la cumbre.

Los santos, los verdaderos santos, suben por el de cabras, dejándose la piel en las esquinas de las rocas. Ellos lo dan todo de una vez, viven hora a hora en la tensión del amor perfecto.

Pero los demás temblamos ante ese camino. No porque no tengamos pulmones para ello -porque los santos no tienen mejor «madera» que nosotros, sino porque somos cobardes y le damos a Dios trozos de amor, guardándonos en el zurrón buenos pedazos de amor propio.

Naturalmente, a quien Dios le dé el coraje del camino de cabras, que San Pedro se lo bendiga y multiplique. Pero, en definitiva, lo que importa es subir, lo necesario es amar, aunque sea con un amor tartamudo. Y, entonces, bendito sea el camino carretero.

Con la ventaja, además, de que, en cada vuelta del camino, el camino carretero se cruza un momento con el de cabras: son esos instantes de verdadera santidad que todos, por fortuna, tenemos. Hay incluso veces en las que -sobre todo en la juventud- nos atrevemos a hacer algún trecho por la senda de cabras, aunque luego regrese la flojera y volvamos a tomar el camino en espiral. Bien, lo importante es seguir subiendo, seguir amando, aunque se haga mal.

Lo que no hay que olvidar es que, al final de la escalada, cuando ya se está cerca de la cima, los dos caminos, el carretero y el de cabras, desaparecen. Y entonces ya sólo queda la roca viva. Por la que sólo se puede subir con guía. O llevados en brazos. Como Dios nos llevará a todos en el último repechón que conduce al abrazo en la muerte.


