A Message from our Pastor Fr. Bob Cilinski



REFLECTION

The Lord commanded the people to be holy, "For I the LORD your God am holy" (Lv 19:2). The essential ingredients of holiness are love, mercy, kindness, and compassion. For example, we can admonish people if we are offended by their actions, but we cannot take any sort of revenge. God doesn't deal with us this way, and neither should we deal with each other this way.

Paul reminds us that the spirit of God dwells in us in the same way that God dwells in the most sacred place of the temple. If the temple of God is holy, how much more holy are we? This should give us no cause to boast but make us all the more humble.

Jesus shows us that the way of love is non-retaliation and nonviolence. In a world trapped in an endless cycle of "an eye for an eye" (Mt 5:38), Jesus asks us to forgo vengeance. Instead, he tells us, we should place no limits on love. We should not make a pretense of holiness but be transformed by the holiness of God.

For Reflection - Do I bear God's love even to my enemies? Do I pray for those who harass or maltreat me?

On This Date in Nativity History October 1, 2018

On October 1, 2018, Nativity parishioner Staff Sergeant Ronald Shurer of the United States Army was awarded the Medal of Honor, the nation's highest military award for valor above and beyond the call of duty. The award was presented to Sergeant Shurer by President Donald J. Trump in a ceremony at the White House attended by about 250, including Nativity Pastor Father Bob Cilinski.

Staff Sergeant Shurer was recognized for "conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of life" during a combat engagement in Afghanistan's Shok Valley on April 6, 2008. As the senior medic for a Special Forces Team, Staff Sergeant Shurer was called upon to go to the aid of a number of wounded Special Forces troops. Staff Sergeant Shurer was under fire from enemy forces for more than hour and was himself wounded. He repeatedly moved through enemy fire and over extremely rough and mountainous terrain to rescue and treat five wounded American troops and then to move them to safety, often shielding them with his own body during the evacuation.

Staff Sergeant Shurer was born in Alaska in 1978 and spent his youth in Washington State where both his parents were stationed at McChord Air Force Base near Tacoma. In 2001, he graduated from Washington State University with a degree in business administration. Following the terrorist attacks on 9/11, Staff Sergeant Shurer enlisted in the U.S. Army and trained to be a Special Forces medic. He was deployed to Afghanistan with the 3rd Special Forces Group from November 2007 to May 2008 in Operation Enduring Freedom. After he left the Army in 2009, Staff Sergeant Shurer began a career with the Secret Service. He was diagnosed with lung cancer in 2017 and died May 14, 2020, at Washington's Sibley Memorial Hospital. He was survived by his wife, Miranda, and sons Cameron and Tyler, seen in the photo below with President Trump and Vice President Mike Pence.

On February 24, Russia initiated military action against Ukraine with attacks throughout the country. 

Dear parishioners,

In January we began the sanctuary renovation of our church as part of our parish 50th Anniversary celebration. A large screen was erected to cover the sanctuary area during the renovation. A temporary altar and tabernacle has been placed in front of the screen for our prayer and worship. Daily and Sunday Mass will continue to be celebrated in the church. The renovation is scheduled to be completed by March 11, 2023.

WHAT ARE WE RENOVATING ?

<u>THE SANCTUARY FLOOR:</u> The current sanctuary floor is chipped and stained and cannot be restored. There is also an electrical outlet coming out of the steps with red tape as a caution to all. The new sanctuary floor will be a cream color marble floor with border inlets that will enhance the beauty and safety of the altar area.

<u>THE ALTAR</u>: The altar, on which is effected the Sacrifice of the Cross made present under sacramental signs, is also the table of the Lord to which the People of God gather to participate in the Mass, and it also is the center of the thanksgiving that is accomplished through the Eucharist. In every church there should be a fixed altar. The current altar of wood and stone does not line up with the center aisle and has electrical outlets coming out of it in the back. Since we are now going to have a marble floor, the new altar will be built with a dignified cherry stain wood and marble inlets to coordinate with the new marble floor. It will contain relics of various saints.

<u>THE AMBO:</u> The current ambo (pulpit) will be replaced by a cherry wood stain and marble ambo. The design of the new ambo will match the altar as a way of expressing the unity of the Word of God in the Scripture and the Word of God in the Eucharist. There is also a practical motivation for the design of the new pulpit. The current ambo provides little room for the lectionary and homily notes. We also must carry a step stool to the ambo when our children are reading. The renovated ambo will have a shelf for liturgical books and a step installed that can be pulled out when needed by a lector.

<u>THE TABERNACLE:</u> A principal feature of the renovation is the moving of the tabernacle to the center of the sanctuary underneath the Crucifix. This design placement calls attention to the centrality of the Eucharist in our faith. As Pope John Paull II said,

"We are the Church of the Eucharist." Visually when you walk into the church, your eyes will be drawn to the Altar, Tabernacle and Crucifix in unity on the same axis in the center. These liturgical sacred items will be architecturally what they are spiritually, the axis of our lives.

<u>PRESIDERS CHAIR:</u> Another liturgical change after the Second Vatican Council was the use of the Presiders Chair for the principal prayers of the Mass. As such, we have designed a chair that fits the overall design of the sanctuary. It will be placed on the side wall where the current tabernacle is located. New chairs for the deacon and altar servers are being made. The current chairs are over 30 years old, have served us well, but are in need of an upgrade.

<u>MOSAIC PANELS:</u> We are adding seven mosaic panels on the right side of the church behind the choir section to echo the seven stained glass windows on the left. These mosaic panels will depict the Seven Corporal Works of Mercy, beautifully displaying Christ's command to care for those in need, a charism of Nativity parish. This will highlight the scripture from Matthew 25 when Jesus describes how we will be judged. It will be a teaching reminder to any who say: "*If its not on the final exam, I don't want to study it.*" Pope Francis has called us "to be a church for the poor." These seven mosaics will also provide a balance visually in the church.... and in our lives.

The cost of this renovation is \$640,000. To date, through the generosity of parishioners, we have raised over half that amount. More are considering a pledge or using our monthly building envelope. If you would like to help contribute, please go to our parish website or call the parish office.







Saturday February 25 Isaiah 58:9b-14 Ps 86:1-6 Luke 5:27-32 Mercy is the key to understanding this Sunday's Gospel reading. Think of love as the front door to people's hearts. When they close it, mercy is the love that sneaks in through the back door.

In ancient times, if someone gouged another person in the eye, the victim could gather his clan

and punish him by wiping out his aggressor's clan. So God gave his people a law that brought them closer to love: If someone hurts your eye, you may do nothing more than the same to him. It was still unloving, but at least it was fair.

When Jesus came onto the scene, he raised the standards: If someone hurts you, don't play fair; give that person love.

When people sin against us, they don't understand that they're closing their hearts to God and his love. But if we give them love, we give them God through a back door.

This does not mean we are to remain in harm's way. But if we continue to give them love – even if only from afar – we bring God and his healing into the situation.

If someone steals from you or

demands something from you unjustly, you can't stop his greed but you can stop him from sinning against you: Let it go, give it to him. And as an act of generous love, give him more! I know it doesn't feel right, but this is what Jesus says *is* right. Divinely right.

If someone asks you to do a chore for her because she's lazy, prevent it from becoming a sin of cruelty; gladly do what she asks and volunteer to do more.




This plan of Jesus demonstrates, through us, that God's love is superior to everything else. It proves that love conquers evil.

This is what it means to be perfect. Perfection in the Bible means the fullness of love – complete, unlimited, merciful love.

Reflect & Discuss:

- Think of a time when God showed you mercy even though you didn't deserve his love. What did it feel like when he gave you his love anyway? How did it change you?
- Who is currently sinning against you? What good deeds can you do simply and easily even before he or she asks for forgiveness?
- Describe a time when you did a good deed to someone who caused you difficulties. What kind of impact did your efforts make? If you're not aware of good results yet, how did it help you experience God's love?
- + How can stopping an abuse be done as an act of love?





2.Se suele decir que, las imitaciones, son siempre malas. Pero, la vida de un cristiano, debe ser un imitar las actitudes, pensamientos, obras y deseos de Cristo. Por lo tanto, abrirnos sin desmayo y sin miedo, mirar hacia el cielo cuando se nos hace sufrir en la tierra, meditar la gran lección que Jesús nos da en la cruz (su amor universal) pueden ser perfectamente unos claros síntomas de que queremos vivir según El y que, entre otras cosas, deseamos ansiar (llevándola a la práctica) la perfección cristiana: en el encuentro con numerosos prójimos, manifestarles (y hasta asombrarles e impresionarles) por la viveza y sinceridad de nuestro amor.
