Did you know?

Our Nativity Rosary Ministry distributes an average of 8,000 mission rosaries a year to foreign missions and to our parish and local community groups. We also collect Old and Broken rosaries. If you have rosaries to donate there is a grey box at the back of the church where you can place your rosaries, or medals.

(no large crucifixes or written materials, please)

These rosaries are sorted, cleaned, and repaired and then sent to the foreign missions. If a rosary cannot be completed, we use the parts for chaplets and any parts not used are buried in the ground.

What you may not know is that our rosary ministry receives packages and boxes with Old and Broken rosaries, thanks to our website, from all over the United States. In the last few years, we have recycled hundreds of repaired beautiful rosaries. If we are to continue, we will need your help to learn to repair old rosaries. You will be taught what you need to know. The day and time for 2 meetings will be decided by the group in the month of March. Once you learn our system you can work from home. Think of a "mountaintop experience" you've had. What generated it? Did it change your life forever or was it just a momentary high?

In Biblical symbolism, a mountain represents getting close to God. Did your mountaintop

experience bring you closer to God?

It was at the top of Mount Tabor where Jesus revealed the glory of his Godliness to his closest friends. Called a "high mountain" in scripture, Mount Tabor is, in reality, not huge. What was huge is the event that took place there – and why.

The three disciples who witnessed Christ's transfiguration greatly benefited from seeing his glory revealed, because someday they would be commissioned to take over his earthly ministry.

The Father told them, "This is my n to him." As we listen to Jesus, it is we

beloved Son; listen to him." As we listen to Jesus, it is we who are now transfigured.

Lent is meant to be a mountaintop experience for each of us. If we follow Jesus up the mountain, his light will consume any darkness within us. The more we listen to his teachings and apply them to our daily lives and ministries, the more we become like him. And the more we become like Jesus, the more our lives are transfigured by his light, and the more our lives then transfigure the world around us.

As the first reading tells us, Abraham did not withhold his



son from the Lord; God the Father did not withhold his Son from us.

Likewise, we must not withhold the Son from the people we encounter. Whether it's by an evangelizing word or a helping hand, or a compassionate and

attentive ear, or the generous giving of mercy and forgiveness or money or time, we are Christ's hands and feet and voice in the world today. We are his earthly body. We are the answers to people's prayers.

We have been empowered through our baptisms to shine with the glory of Christ's love. We have all been commissioned to continue his earthly ministry. May the experience of Lent take us to new heights of union with Christ and his mission!

Reflect & Discuss:

- Identify one area of your life that you would like Jesus to transfigure. What do you need to do to repent of it? How do you need to change (with God's help) so that others see more of Jesus?
- Share the story of a time when you let Jesus change you. How difficult was it to be transfigured? Why did you want to make the change? How did it impact others?

La Escritura nos habla por un lado de un corazón que se resiste a Dios y por otro lado de un corazón que se adhiere a Dios. Mi corazón se resiste a Dios cuando no quiero ver su gracia, cuando no quiero ver su obra en mi vida, cuando no quiero ver su camino sobre mi existencia. Mi corazón se adhiere a Dios, cuando en medio de mil inquietudes, vicisitudes, en medio de mil circunstancias yo voy siendo capaz de descubrir, de encontrar, de amar, de ponerme de delante de Él y decirle: "aquí estoy, cuenta conmigo".

Jesús en el Evangelio nos presenta esta elección, entre resistencia del corazón y la adhesión del corazón como una adhesión por Él o contra Él: "El que quiera seguirme que se niegue a sí mismo, cargue su cruz cada día y se venga conmigo." Una conversión que no es solamente el cambiar el comportamiento; una conversión que no es simplemente el tener una doctrina diferente; una conversión que no es buscarse a sí mismo, sino seguir a Jesucristo. Esta es la auténtica conversión del corazón.

Jesús pone como polo opuesto, como manifestación de la resistencia del corazón el querer ganar todo el mundo. ¿Qué prefieres tú? ¿Cuál es la opción de tu vida, cuál es el camino por el cual tu vida se orienta, ganar todo el mundo si no te ganas a ti mismo?, pero si has perdido a base de la resistencia de tu corazón lo más importante que eres tú mismo, ¿cómo te puedes encontrar?. Solamente te vas a encontrar adhiriéndote a Dios.

Deberíamos entrar en nuestra alma y ver que estamos ganando o qué estamos perdiendo, a qué nos estamos resistiendo y a quién nos estamos adhiriendo. Este es el doble juego que tenemos que hacer y no lo podemos evitar. Nuestra alma, de una forma u otra, se va a orientar hacia adherirse a Dios, automáticamente está construyendo en su interior la resistencia a Dios. El alma que no busca ganarse a sí misma dándose a Dios, está automáticamente perdiéndose a sí misma.

Son dos caminos. A nosotros nos toca elegir: "Dichoso el hombre que confía en el Señor, éste será dichoso; en cambio los malvados serán como paja barrida por el viento. El Señor protege el camino del justo y al malo sus caminos acaban por perderlo": ¿Qué camino llevo en este inicio de Cuaresma? ¿Es un camino de seguimiento? Me dice Nuestro Señor: ¿Eres de los que quieren estar conmigo, de los que quieren adherirse a Mí? ¿O eres de los que se resisten?

Dejar que Cristo entre en el corazón

Meditaciones para toda la Cuaresma

Viernes después de Ceniza. La conversión no es simplemente obras de penitencia. La conversión es el cambio del corazón.

El tema del corazón contrito, de la conversión del corazón es el tema que debería de recorrer nuestra Cuaresma. Es el tema que debería recorrer toda nuestra preparación para la Pascua. La liturgia nos insiste que son importantes las formas externas, pero más importantes son los contenidos del corazón. La Iglesia nos pide en este tiempo de Cuaresma, que tengamos una serie de formas externas que manifiesten al mundo lo que hay en nuestro corazón, y nos pide que el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo hagamos ayuno, y que todos los viernes de Cuaresma sacrifiquemos el comer carne. Pero esta forma externa no puede ir sola, necesita para tener valor, ir acompañada con un corazón también pleno.

El profeta Isaías veía con mucha claridad: "¿es lo que Yo busco: que inclines tu cabeza como un junco, que te acuestes en fango y ceniza?" Dios Nuestro Señor lo que busca en cada uno de nosotros es la conversión interna, que cuando se realiza, se manifiesta en obras, que cuando se lleva a cabo, tiene que brillar hacia fuera; pero no es solamente lo externo. De qué poco serviría haber manchado nuestras cabezas de ceniza, si nuestro corazón no está también volviéndose ante Dios Nuestro Señor. De qué poco nos serviría que no tomásemos carne en todos los viernes de Cuaresma, si nuestro corazón está cerrado a Dios Nuestro Señor.

La dimensión interior, que el profeta reclama, Nuestro Señor la toma y la pone en una dimensión sumamente hermosa, cuando le preguntan: ¿Por qué ustedes no ayunan y sin embargo los discípulos de Juan y nosotros si ayunamos? Y Jesús responde usando una parábola: "¿Pueden los amigos del esposo ayunar mientras está el esposo con ellos?" Jesús lo que hace es ponerse a sí mismo como el esposo. En el fondo retoma el tema bíblico tan importante de Dios como esposo de Israel, el que espera el don total de Israel hacia Él.

Esta condición interior, el esfuerzo por que el pueblo de Israel penetre desde las formalidades externas a la dimensión interna, es lo que Nuestro Señor busca. El ayuno que Él busca es el del corazón, la conversión que Él busca es la del corazón y siempre que nos enfrentemos a esta dimensión de la conversión del corazón nos estamos enfrentando a algo muchas veces no se ve tan fácilmente; a algo que muchas veces no se puede medir, pero a algo que no podemos prescindir en nuestra vida. ¿Quién puede palpar el amor de un esposo a su esposa? ¿Quién puede medir el amor de un esposo a su esposa? ¿Cómo se palpa, cómo se mide? ¿Solamente por las formas externas? No. Hay una dimensión interior en el amor esponsal del cual Jesucristo se pone a sí mismo como el modelo. Hay una dimensión que no se puede tocar, pero que es también imprescindible en nuestra conversión del corazón. Tenemos que ser capaces de encontrar esa dimensión interior, una dimensión que nos lleva profundamente a descubrir si nuestra voluntad está o no entregada, ofrecida, dada como la esposa al esposo, como el esposo a la esposa, a Dios, Nuestro Señor.

La conversión no es simplemente obras de penitencia. La conversión es el cambio del corazón, es hacer que mi corazón, que hasta el momento pensaba, amaba, optaba, se decidía por unos valores, unos principios, unos criterios, empiece a optar y decidirse como primer principio, como primer criterio, por el esposo del alma que es Jesucristo.

Sólo cuando llega el corazón a tocar la dimensión interior se realiza, como dice el profeta, que "Tu luz surgirá como la aurora y cicatrizarán de prisa tus heridas, se abrirá camino la justicia y la gloria del Señor cerrará tu mancha". Entonces, casi como quien ve el sol, casi como quien no es capaz de distinguir la fuente de luz que la origina, así será en nosotros la caridad, la humildad, la entrega, la conversión, la fidelidad y tantas y tantas cosas, porque van a brotar de un corazón que auténticamente se ha vuelto, se ha dirigido y mira al Señor.

Este es el corazón contrito, esto es lo que busca el Señor que cada uno de nosotros en esta Cuaresma, que seamos capaces en nuestro interior, en lo más profundo, de llegar a abrirnos a Dios, a ofrecernos a Dios, de no permitir que haya todavía cuartos cerrados, cuartos sellados a los cuales el Señor no puede entrar, porque es visita y no esposo, porque es huésped y no esposo. El esposo entra a todas partes. La esposa en la casa entra a todas partes. Solamente al huésped, a la visita se le impide entrar en ciertas recámaras, en ciertos lugares.

Esta es la conversión del corazón: dejar que realmente Él llegue a entrar en todos los lugares de nuestro corazón. Convertirse a Dios es volverse a Dios y descubrirlo como Él es. Convertirse a Dios es descubrir a Dios como esposo de la vida, como Aquél que se me da totalmente en infinito amor y como Aquél al cual yo tengo que darme totalmente también en amor total.

¿Es esto lo que hay en nuestro corazón al inicio de esta Cuaresma? ¿O quizá nuestra Cuaresma está todavía encerrada en formulismos, en estructuras que son necesarias, pero que por sí solas no valen nada? ¿O quizá nuestra Cuaresma está todavía encerrada en criterios que acaban entreteniendo al alma? Al huésped se le puede tener contento simplemente con traerle un café y unas galletas, pero al esposo o a la esposa no se le puede contentar simplemente con una formalidad. Al esposo o la esposa hay que darle el corazón.

Que la Eucaristía en nuestra alma sea la luz que examina, que escruta, que ve todos y cada uno de los rincones de nuestra alma, para que, junto con el esposo sea capaz de descubrir dónde todavía mi entrega es de huésped y no de esposo.

Pidamos esta gracia a Jesucristo para que nuestra Cuaresma sea una Cuaresma de encuentro, de cercanía de profundidad en la conversión de nuestro corazón.

NO TODO ES BONITO

2º cuaresma (B) Javier Leoz

Hemos comenzado con el rito de la ceniza nuestro camino hacia la Pascua y, al hacerlo, como Santiago, Pedro y Juan, necesitamos apartamos por lo menos del ruido, superficialidad y "más de lo mismo" para prepararnos a la muerte y resurrección de Cristo. Sólo así, si lo hacemos así (eucaristía, oración, vigilia, caridad, contemplación) llegaremos a la Semana Santa con una actitud distinta: no es vacación sino devoción.

1. Mirar a nuestro alrededor es caer en la cuenta de muchos rostros desfigurados o deprimidos porque tal vez, hace tiempo, dejaron de sentir y de escuchar aquello de "tú eres mi hijo amado".

De nuevo, en este segundo domingo de cuaresma, Jesús nos invita a reemprender el camino junto con El. No será una senda fácil ni de respuestas a la carta. Pero, como siempre, nos lanzará a la cruda realidad ayudados de su mano y sobrecogidos si, de verdad, hemos intentado tener una experiencia profunda de El y con El.

A nadie nos gusta la cruz pesada; a ninguno nos seduce el final de un camino dibujado con el horizonte de las espinas o del dolor. Preferimos, y hasta echamos en falta, una vida más merengada y con éxitos, sin llantos ni pruebas, sin lamentos ni zancadillas, tranquila y sin sobresaltos. Todos sabemos...que no siempre es así.

El anuncio de su pasión y muerte, por parte de Jesús, nos trae a la memoria la inquebrantable fe de los recientemente asesinados 20 cristianos coptos o el testimonio de tres ancianas cristianas de Irak: "¿Por qué nos matáis si sólo damos amor?". Y, aquí, se ponen las cartas sobre la mesa: nosotros acostumbrados a una fe costumbrista y, aquellos, a una fe radical llevada hasta el martirio. ¡Casi nada!

2.El domingo pasado, Jesús en el desierto, nos recordaba que —la tentación- avanzará en paralelo con nosotros, pero que nunca nos faltará la fuerza de Dios para darle batalla y progresar hacia la victoria. Hoy, con su Transfiguración, da un paso más: nos toma de su mano y nos lleva a un lugar tranquilo (por ejemplo la Eucaristía o la misma Palabra de Dios) para que nos vayamos configurando con El, meditemos sus enseñanzas o reconstruyamos de nuevo ese edificio espiritual y hasta corporal que las prisas, el agobio, el egoísmo, el individualismo y la superficialidad han demolido.

También nosotros somos testigos de la Resurrección de Cristo. No estamos en el monte Tabor como meros espectadores o marionetas. Nuestra presencia, aquí y ahora, en la oración o en los sacramentos, nos debe de empujar a ser algo más que simple adorno, en la misión o en el apostolado que llevamos entre manos. ¡Qué más quisiéramos, como Pedro, construir tiendas lejos del ruido y de los dramas de la humanidad! Pero, el Señor, si nos lleva a un lugar apartado, es para que comprendamos y entendamos que vivir en su presencia en esta vida, es un adelanto de lo que nos espera el día de mañana: la Gloria de Dios y el compromiso activo en el día a día.

Hoy, con el evangelio en la mano, podríamos preguntarnos si en algún momento (ante los amigos, enemigos, cercanos o lejanos) hemos dado firme testimonio de nuestra fe. O si, tal vez, por miedo al rechazo hemos preferido esconder la fe en el bolsillo como se hace con una tarjeta de crédito.

La fe no es algo bonito (aunque tenga sus expresiones estéticas, artísticas y musicales). La fe es algo que, cuando uno lo lleva hasta sus últimas consecuencias no deja indiferente a nadie: ni al que la profesa ni al que la observa.
