



My dear parishioners,

Twenty-five years ago, Fr. Richard Martin, then Nativity's Pastor, had the inspiration to make our Lenten sacrifice more meaningful by focusing on the poor. A basket was placed in the church vestibule and parishioners contributed what they saved during Lent to build homes for needy people in Haiti. We called this beautiful gesture "Operation Starfish," after the story that teaches us that we can make a difference, one person at a time.

Today, as we commemorate the 25th anniversary of Operation Starfish, we can be very proud of what has been accomplished:

12 completed Nativity Villages in Haiti, with more than 1,500 homes

A 13th Nativity Village being developed in Haiti, with another 75 homes

3 fresh water fish farms

3 ocean fishing co-op's in Haiti and 1 in Honduras

4 medical student scholarships in Jamaica and 1 in Haiti

20,000 birthing and newborn kits shipped by Stella Marina

150 midwives being trained every 2 months

3 sewing centers where women learn to design and make clothing

3 clinics serving thousands of people

3 greenhouse complexes in the Dominican Republic

1 million pair of new underwear from Hanes Brands, Inc.

And much more...

While we have accomplished much, there is always more to do. Pope Francis says "Poverty calls us to sow hope..." Here at Nativity we plant seeds of hope across the street and around the world. We do it with your help, during Lent, and especially during our annual Operation Starfish Weekend, which will take place May 6 - 7, 2023.

In 2023 we will continue our commitment to the people of Haiti with construction of homes, water system and 2 schools in Nativity Village at Bas Fossé. We will also provide for the operation of St. Anthony Clinic in Nativity Village at Prolongé and support school scholarships, sewing centers and a reforestation project, all in Haiti. In addition, we will build a new clinic in the village of El Celirio, Honduras, where one nurse, working out of her pickup truck, is trying to provide healthcare to 3,500 people. Nativity will fund the construction, while Food For The Poor and their partners will be responsible for staffing and operation. And we will continue to support our medical student scholarship program in Jamaica.

During Lent we will continue our long-standing tradition of placing a basket in the vestibule of the church. Any gifts placed in the basket will be shared with Operation Starfish and Catholic Relief Services (CRS). If you specifically designate either Operation Starfish or CRS, your designation will be honored.

Our major Operation Starfish collection will take place this year on the Fifth Sunday of Easter, May 7, 2023. There will be a second collection on that Sunday at all the masses. May 7 this year is the closest Sunday to the 9th anniversary of our late Pastor, Fr. Richard Martin's return to God. Fr. Martin loved the poor and founded Operation Starfish here at Nativity in 1998. We have a parish tradition of taking the annual Starfish collection during the Easter season on the Sunday closest to Fr. Martin's anniversary.

Let's keep making a difference, one family at a time.



On This Date in Nativity History March 1991

In this month, Nativity celebrated the groundbreaking ceremony to begin construction of the parish's Spiritual Formation Center. In the beginning, the building housed the religious education program, which had formerly been held in the church, with movable chairs, tables, and partitions. Under these conditions, the entire arrangement had to be taken down each week after the final CCD class of the week, and the chairs placed again as they would be for the next day's Mass. The new building gave the religious education program a permanent home. Of great importance, this new building made it possible to remodel the church and install permanent pews and sanctuary. Dear parishioners,

In January we began the sanctuary renovation of our church as part of our parish 50th Anniversary celebration. A large screen was erected to cover the sanctuary area during the renovation. A temporary altar and tabernacle has been placed in front of the screen for our prayer and worship. Daily and Sunday Mass will continue to be celebrated in the church. The renovation is scheduled to be completed by March 11, 2023.

WHAT ARE WE RENOVATING?

THE SANCTUARY FLOOR: The current sanctuary floor is chipped and stained and cannot be restored. There is also an electrical outlet coming out of the steps with red tape as a caution to all. The new sanctuary floor will be a cream color marble floor with border inlets that will enhance the beauty and safety of the altar area.

THE ALTAR: The altar, on which is effected the Sacrifice of the Cross made present under sacramental signs, is also the table of the Lord to which the People of God gather to participate in the Mass, and it also is the center of the thanksgiving that is accomplished through the Eucharist. In every church there should be a fixed altar. The current altar of wood and stone does not line up with the center aisle and has electrical outlets coming out of it in the back. Since we are now going to have a marble floor, the new altar will be built with a dignified cherry stain wood and marble inlets to coordinate with the new marble floor. It will contain relics of various saints.

THE AMBO: The current ambo (pulpit) will be replaced by a cherry wood stain and marble ambo. The design of the new ambo will match the altar as a way of expressing the unity of the Word of God in the Scripture and the Word of God in the Eucharist. There is also a practical motivation for the design of the new pulpit. The current ambo provides little room for the lectionary and homily notes. We also must carry a step stool to the ambo when our children are reading. The renovated ambo will have a shelf for liturgical books and a step installed that can be pulled out when needed by a lector.

THE TABERNACLE: A principal feature of the renovation is the moving of the tabernacle to the center of the sanctuary underneath the Crucifix. This design placement calls attention to the centrality of the Eucharist in our faith. As Pope John Paull II said, "We are the Church of the Eucharist." Visually when you walk into the church, your eyes will be drawn to the Altar, Tabernacle and Crucifix in unity on the same axis in the center. These liturgical sacred items will be architecturally what they are spiritually, the axis of our lives.

PRESIDERS CHAIR: Another liturgical change after the Second Vatican Council was the use of the Presiders Chair for the principal prayers of the Mass. As such, we have designed a chair that fits the overall design of the sanctuary. It will be placed on the side wall where the current tabernacle is located. New chairs for the deacon and altar servers are being made. The current chairs are over 30 years old, have served us well, but are in need of an upgrade.

MOSAIC PANELS: We are adding seven mosaic panels on the right side of the church behind the choir section to echo the seven stained glass windows on the left. These mosaic panels will depict the Seven Corporal Works of Mercy, beautifully displaying Christ's command to care for those in need, a charism of Nativity parish. This will highlight the scripture from Matthew 25 when Jesus describes how we will be judged. It will be a teaching reminder to any who say: "If its not on the final exam, I don't want to study it." Pope Francis has called us "to be a church for the poor." These seven mosaics will also provide a balance visually in the church.... and in our lives.

Posted on our website at https://nativityburke.org/service/ creation-care/ under Resources, is the annual Lenten Creation Care calendar, created by Virginia Interfaith Power & Light (VAIPL). VAIPL collaborates among people of faith and conscience to grow healthy communities by advancing climate and environmental justice. The calendar provides weekly themes and daily actions for the seven weeks of Lent. The theme for Week two is Being Mindful of Waste. Do we think about the waste we generate and how to reduce it? What types of waste could we reduce? Food waste, plastic waste, water waste? Do we take care to recycle correctly rather than wishcycling? Do we take our glass to the purple bins for repurposing in our local area? Choose one area of waste to reduce during Lent—perhaps see how much plastic you can eliminate in your life by, for example, using a reusable water bottle only, packaging leftovers in glass or beeswax and shopping with reusable produce bags.

We pray, "Sustainer of all, keep us ever mindful of our place on earth...and let us treat it with reverence as we are called to care for your creation."







Deuteronomy 26:16-19 Ps 119:1-2,4-5,7-8 Matthew 5:43-48 How do you deal with temptation? That's the personal challenge given to us by the Word of God on the first Sunday of Lent. And so we begin our journey with Jesus, traveling to the holiest place we can reach at this point in our lives.

This Lent is like no other. Last year, you had different needs, different areas of growth, different levels of insight and understanding. Much has happened since then, and all of it is a preparation for what the Lord is going to do in your life right now.

What victory do you need? What needs to be resurrected? To get there, Jesus will lead you through the cross of penance and self-denial, into his tomb, and out into God's light where his love provides healing and new life.

During Lent – and every time we make sacrifices and connect our sufferings to the Passion of Christ –

we follow Jesus to the cross and to resurrection. This involves seeing our own crosses in a new light, for the Calvary Road is the only way to reach the victories that we yearn to experience.

If we want Easter to be more than just a holiday of colored eggs, chocolate bunnies and big dinners, we have to make Lent more than just 40 days of enduring an annoying, obligatory sacrifice, eating meatless pizza on Fridays, and going to an occasional extra event at church.

If we want to experience the power of resurrection, we have



to experience the power of mourning and repenting from our sinfulness. In other words, we have to experience the powerlessness of death – the death of our selfishness, the death of our worldliness, the death of our behaviors that are

not like Christ's.

Reflect & Discuss:

- † In the story from Genesis, what did Adam and Eve need to die to (let go of, put aside, or reject) in order to resist the Original Sin? Why didn't they?
- † In the reading from Romans, we hear about the abundant grace and the gift of justification that Jesus provided to each of us when he died on the cross. How does this grace and justification give us life? In other words, how does God help us to resist sin?
- Looking at the Gospel passage, what did Jesus have to die to in the desert so that he could say no to temptation?

Lenten Activity:

What can you do this week to die to self? For example, think of a good deed you can do that's the opposite of what your selfishness wants you to do.



Believe in God

Believing in God means more than just saying He exists. Believers serve God, give time to Him, and put Him first. Spend more time in prayer this Lent, shed some possessions, perform works of charity and you will act on your baptismal promises.

"'Yet even now,' says the LORD, 'return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments'"

(Joel 2:12)

Preparing hearts for Easter joy

Lent is the Church's gift to us to help prepare our hearts for Easter by purifying our hearts,

opening up to love, and putting love into action.

Purifying our hearts: Every heart yearns for love, yet only God's love can truly satisfy that yearning. The goal of Lenten penance is to purify ourselves of whatever blocks us from God's love or closes our heart to others. This can include excessive social media, materialism, gossip, or sinful habits like lust or deceit. From what does your heart need to detach so there's room for God and

Why Do Catholics Do That

Many churches cover statues and crucifixes in red or purple cloth for the final weeks in Lent, traditionally known as "Passiontide." The veils are visual cues that we're entering into a solemn time and remind us that sin separates us from God.

This helps to build anticipation for Easter when the statues are unveiled and we are restored to Him.

Lastly, the veils symbolize that heavenly glories are hidden in this life, but will be revealed when we enter eternity.

Cultivating a "holy hospitality"

Jesus asked us to make others feel welcome, seen and loved while they're with us. "Holy hospitality" is vital to building community around Christ. Try these tips:

Sit and listen: When Jesus visited with his dear friends, Martha, Mary, and Lazarus, He observed that Martha was so distracted and focused on her own concerns that she merely served Jesus instead of connecting with Him personally (Luke 10:41-42). Prepare for guests like Martha did, but enjoy them like Mary - with complete attention.

Fill your conversations with faith: A "holy hospitality" is a faith-informed one. The Samaritan woman's life changed when

> she encountered Christ (John 4:14-15) because He told her the Good News of salvation. Ensure your conversations are uplifting and reflect your hope and optimism for eternity.

Open your circle: Jesus ate with tax collectors and public sinners - those considered unpleasant. "Holy hospitality" means your social circle is

In this Gospel passage, a beloved friend of Jesus' was fatally ill and his sisters sent


urgent word to Jesus to come immediately. Jesus delayed, and Lazarus died, but this would not be His ultimate fate. Jesus had something else in mind for Lazarus and his family.

When He finally arrived, Martha didn't demand Jesus raise Lazarus from the dead, although she acknowledged His power to do so. Even though her brother's body had been in the tomb for days and the decay had begun in earnest, her trust in Jesus was complete. She knew that God's love

is more powerful than death and left the outcome in His hands.

> God never leaves us in our troubles but uses them to draw us closer to Him. Martha's generous trust in God's will rested on her close friendship with Christ, Whatever He thought would be best

was best. God's timing is not ours, yet everything He does - even when He does it -is for our good. Martha's trust in Jesus was rewarded in the most magnificent way. Ours will be, too.



Don't assume you are strong enough for a "little" temptation, Run immediately to the refuge of Jesus' sacred heart for protection

"Bear with yourself with great patience." Saints aren't made overnight. See yourself as God does beloved. Be patient and keep trying.

"Do not neglect interior mortifications." Withhold a biting remark, give up a luxury for the day, cut down on screen time. Sacrifices for love are powerful.

"Shun murmurs like a plague." Gossip is never in God's service. False accusations and rumors that hurt reputations are Satan's favorite tools. Don't indulge.

"Always fight with the deep conviction that I am with you." Our courage comes from being rooted in God (John 15:5). Recall God's loving presence throughout the day: "Jesus, I trust in you!"

Feasts & Celebrations

March 9 - St. Frances of Rome (1440). Although she preferred a life of service, St. Frances' wealthy parents required that she marry. With her sister-in-law, Vannozza, St. Frances formed a group of women dedicated to serving the poor, all while caring for her family.

TENTADOS A TODO!

1º de Cuaresma Javier Leoz

Hemos iniciado esta marcha, lenta y reflexiva, hacia la Semana Santa. Ojala sea en verdad un tiempo de tonificar y rehacer aún más nuestra amistad con el Señor.

Estamos en un momento decisivo para la fe. Al igual que a Jesús, también a nosotros constantemente, desde muchos aleros del mundo, se nos invita a desertar. Al abandono. A la duda. Se nos enseña todo un mar de libertades, cuando en realidad, luego todo aquello se convierte en un fango de esclavitud.

Este primer domingo de la Santa Cuaresma nos hace caer en la cuenta de lo importantes que son los "espacios" de Dios en medio del mundo. No hace falta alejarse hasta el desierto más remoto para encontrarse cara a cara con Dios. Hoy, aquí, ahora, en este momento....dos grandes fuerzas, dentro de nosotros, están conviviendo. Están luchando. Es la fuerza del bien, que viene toda ella de Dios, y es la inclinación a lo fácil, que todos sabemos (cada uno en particular conoce) desde donde se nos insta a reverenciarlo aunque sea a costa de vender o nuestra conciencia o incluso nuestra dignidad de hijos de Dios.

Esta Iglesia, queridos amigos, es un inmenso desierto cuaresmal en cual nos podemos perder para estar a solas con Dios. Para poner a punto lo que somos, lo que tenemos y lo que soñamos ser. La cuaresma, y ese es su secreto, no es sino el grito de Dios en medio del mundo a través de Jesús. ¿Cómo perder de vista este aspecto? ¿Cómo puede ser posible que existan cristianos que han dejado desertizar su existencia por no haber acudido al oasis de la fe y del amor de Dios?

2. No hay día, y todos somos testigos de ello, en que no asome una tentación por algo, de alguien y con algo. ¿Por qué será, que en cambio, no somos tentados a permanecer firmes en nuestro amor a Dios? ¿Dónde está nuestro amor primero? ¿Dónde hemos dejado a Dios?

¡Tentados a todo, menos a lo más importante! Y es así. Dios, siendo el centro de todo; del universo, de la tierra, del mar y del mismo hombre, es sometido una y otra vez al intento sistemático de alejarlo del mundo. Miércoles de Ceniza: ¿Otra vez la Cuaresma?

Suena la trompeta y, cual pregonero, la Iglesia hace su llamada un año más: "El Reino de Dios está cerca. Convertíos y creed en la Buena Noticia". El tono de la invitación es fuerte, profético. Mas el grito, quizás no consiga despertar un interés proporcional a la gravedad de su mensaje. La llamada anual a la conversión, por conocida, quizá pase inadvertida.

Parafraseando la curiosa y provocadora campaña publicitaria de la revista cristiana Reinado Social 21, podríamos lanzar este slogan: "Todo cristiano celebra la Cuaresma. Puedes negar la realidad o mirarla de frente".

En muchas de nuestras sociedades, las referencias religiosas, desde hace tiempo, son cosa de minorías. Si no de minorías, lo religioso hace tiempo que ha pasado a la esfera privada e íntima de muchas personas que, de una forma u otra, hacíamos más visible la fe. Hoy todo sucede muy a prisa. Nuestros calendarios son medidos y rigurosos. La actividad es tan frenética como rutinaria. Estamos sometidos a una especie de rodillo que hace que muchos no acertemos a distinguir unos tiempos de otros. Pareciera que no hay más que tiempo de trabajo y tiempo de descanso, días laborables y festivos.

Hablar de la Cuaresma en una sociedad sin apenas referencias religiosas, tan secular, pareciera no tener casi sentido. Incluso a nosotros los creyentes, hombres y mujeres de este tiempo, la Cuaresma nos puede resultar incómoda, como si se nos hubiera introducido una piedra en el zapato.

Un tiempo fuerte

Sin embargo, ahí está, persistente, año tras año, la dichosa Cuaresma. Persistente como la herida de la nostalgia de Dios que anida en muchos de nuestros corazones. Celebrar la Cuaresma constituye un signo de identidad de nuestra fe. Vivir y celebrar la cuaresma es reconocer -además de nuestra pertenencia a una tradición-, que en nuestra valoración del tiempo hay un espacio para Dios; que para nosotros es Alguien importante, muy importante. Es, sencillamente, reconocer que no todos los días ni todos los tiempos del año son iguales. Cuando uno quiere hay tiempo para todo. Hay tiempo para la fiesta y para el duelo; tiempo de carnaval y de penitencia; tiempo para recogerse y para explotar de alegría; tiempo para la serenidad y para la acción. ¿Acaso no va a haber tiempo, también, para Dios? No tener en nuestra vida tiempo para Dios es un síntoma. O Dios pinta algo en nuestras vidas, o el no dedicarle tiempo alguno anuncia que más bien pinta poco. Quizá nos hemos alejado algo de él y sentimos su nostalgia. Quizá ni nos lo hemos planteado. Sin embargo, una vez más somos invitados a vivir un tiempo fuerte. ¿Lo aprovecharemos? La Cuaresma llama a la puerta y nos ofrece una oportunidad: que nos preparemos para acoger el misterio de la muerte y resurrección del Señor que celebraremos, dentro de cuarenta días, en el Triduo Santo. Es la invitación a vivir un tiempo para cambiar el corazón y su perspectiva; un tiempo para cambiar nuestra mentalidad autosuficiente y dejarse reconciliar con Dios (2Co 5,20-6,2). Es tiempo para hacerse más "oyentes de la palabra" y dejar que la gracia fluya y actúe en nosotros. Al culminar la Cuaresma podremos celebrar la Pascua con toda verdad y dejar que ésta ilumine toda nuestra vida con su luz. No se trata de recordar algo del pasado. Se trata de hacer actual y presente a Alguien que configura nuestra vida, a Aquél que es capaz de arrastrarnos con la fuerza de su resurrección y hacer vida en nosotros lo que muchos creían muerto. Es el tiempo propicio y maravilloso para encontrarse con este Dios compasivo y misericordioso (Joel 2, 12-18).

Se trata de la conversión

Es una cuestión de fondo, no de superficie. No es maquillaje. No valen los retoques que dejen la vida casi intacta. Tampoco se trata de un reajuste ni de una reforma de comportamientos puntuales. Se trata del centro de la persona, de su corazón. "Rasgaos el corazón, no las vestiduras..." (Joel 2, 12-18). No se trata de algo que hayan de hacer los demás. Se trata de mí, de ti, de nosotros. Se trata de nuestra Iglesia y de cada uno de sus miembros. No se trata de crear otra persona u otra Iglesia. Se trata de que esas personas o esa Iglesia sean "otras", más afines al Dios del Reino, que tiene su rostro en Jesús. Se trata, en definitiva, de volver a Dios sin olvidarse de los hombres. No se trata de cuestiones morales principalmente. Antes que nada, nos convertimos a Alguien. Después vienen las consecuencias de haber descubierto su rostro. Ese Alguien está con nosotros realizando el gran milagro del encuentro. Por eso no es una cuestión de simple esfuerzo. La gracia de Dios nos acompaña y colabora con nuestra pequeñez.

Nos conocemos. Sabemos de qué barro estamos hechos. Por experiencia sabemos que sin Él, por nosotros mismos, no podemos. Sin Él, sin su gracia, en vano se cansan los albañiles. Él es el más interesado en nuestra propia vida y conversión. Él es el más interesado en llevar su plan adelante en nosotros.

Por ello hay que confiar. No dar nunca nada por perdido. Ni en nosotros ni en los demás. Ni en nuestra vida ni en la vida de la Iglesia. Él nos acompaña y, si nos dejamos, obrará el milagro en nosotros. No es algo hecho y conseguido de una vez para siempre. Es como la vida misma, que nos sorprende y nos pone delante nuevos retos y situaciones a las que hemos de adaptarnos. La vida de fe es igual. A nuevos retos, nuevas respuestas. Eso sí, con la mirada puesta siempre fija en Él. Con Él, acertamos. Sin Él, quizá andamos más perdidos que acertados.

La ceniza es el signo de que queremos hacer este camino cuaresmal. Al recibirla, nos abrimos a la gracia de Dios. Quizá al culminar la cuaresma experimentemos el gozo de la conversión. Si nuestra vida se ha modelado un poquito más por los valores del Evangelio, si nos hemos visto tocados por la debilidad hacia los pobres y hemos experimentado lo bien que estamos cuando estamos a solas con Dios, habrá merecido la pena. La Iglesia nos propone unas prácticas cuaresmales. Estas han sido, tradicionalmente, muy válidas por tantos y tantos creyentes de todos los tiempos. Cada uno habrá de actualizarlas en su vida y aplicarlas a su situación. El ayuno, la limosna y la oración nos ayudarán a acercarnos a Dios y a los demás. Junto con ello, quizá también sea un tiempo propicio para acercarse más a su Palabra y dejarse transformar por ella. La Eucaristía los domingos nos irá acompañando y alimentando en este itinerario. ¡Quién sabe! Quizás hasta nos veamos sorprendidos por lo que es capaz de obrar la gracia de Dios en nosotros. No descartes acercarte al sacramento del Perdón. Dios, bien lo sabes, te espera con sus brazos abiertos. Pero, sobre todo, sé honesto contigo y con Dios. Escucha tu interior y abre tu corazón. ¿Dispuesto a comenzar








