A Message from our Pastor Fr. Bob Cilinski



"For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through Him"

- John 3:17

My dear parishioners,

Today the church celebrates Laetare Sunday. We are the religion of the resurrection, but our symbol is the cross. In the midst of Lent, we speak of joy.... the joy of the resurrection. It's a crucified joy. If the Son of Man be lifted up, He will draw all to himself. We rejoice in the Lord! It's the wisdom of the church to maintain our joy in the middle of Lent for in the end, sin is forgiven and death is conquered.

In the gospel of John we are told how much God loves the world. That love is shown in the sending of his Son. Nothing, not even death on the cross, is too much of a price to pay for the redemption of the human family.

Some see God as one to be feared... one who is angry with the world. This can be a great obstacle to a healthy spiritual life. St. Paul experienced the richness of God's mercy in his conversion from darkness to light. Paul was overwhelmed by the wealth of God's favor and compassion. He spent the rest of his life proclaiming the person of Christ crucified through whom we have been given eternal life.

Next week there will be a special opportunity to experience the healing presence of Christ during a Holy Hour and Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament with meditations and songs led by Mark Forrest on Wednesday March 20th at 7:00pm in the church. There is something powerful that happens when we pray in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. You will be touched by Christ's Word and Sacrament.

Our Lenten Penance Service is Thursday March 21st, from 6:30-8:00pm. Twenty three priests will be available for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It is a beautiful way to prepare to renew our baptismal promise at Easter. When we are asked at Easter to renounce Satan, his evil works and empty promises, our answer can be a thoughtful, strong and heartfelt "I Do."

Let us continue to pray for one another as we journey together to the Easter Sacraments, especially remembering our elect and candidates.

Did you know?

Our Nativity Rosary Ministry distributes an average of 8,000 mission rosaries a year to foreign missions and to our parish and local community groups. We also collect Old and Broken rosaries. If you have rosaries to donate there is a grey box at the back of the church where you can place your rosaries, or medals.

(no large crucifixes or written materials, please)

These rosaries are sorted, cleaned, and repaired and then sent to the foreign missions. If a rosary cannot be completed, we use the parts for chaplets and any parts not used are buried in the ground.

What you may not know is that our rosary ministry receives packages and boxes with Old and Broken rosaries, thanks to our website, from all over the United States. In the last few years, we have recycled hundreds of repaired beautiful rosaries. If we are to continue, we will need your help to learn to repair old rosaries. You will be taught what you need to know. The day and time for 2 meetings will be decided by the group in the month of March. Once you learn our system you can work from home. 
This weekend many dioceses in the United States will observe the traditional Lenten practice of almsgiving by participating in The Catholic Relief Services Collection.


A Message from the Nativity Creation Care Ministry

Fast from Food Waste: Food waste is a big deal says Yale Climate Connections with about 30 percent of the food produced globally wasted every year and close to 40 percent in the United States. Here are a few tips from the Ignatian Solidarity Network to begin to reduce your food waste this Lent:

Make a meal and shopping plan every week, shopping your kitchen first to see what you already have—maybe even keep a kitchen inventory. Look up food scrap recipes to use up food you have left in your fridge. Institute weekly leftover night and come up with fun new meals from your leftover food. Buy loose produce, making it more likely you will use all of it before it spoils.

Learn more about composting at home or take your compost to the transfer station or farmer's market. Composting prevents the release of methane gas by keeping food out of the landfill. The composting process allows food to break down in a way that stores carbon in the soil that is produced. When the compost is ready, it can be used to enrich plants in your own garden, reducing the need for fertilizers. Even if you don't garden, there are often people in your community who would love to use the compost you generate.

Here at Nativity School, we spent the whole month of February spreading Kindness all around ... around our





God's love is more than we can ever imagine. Through God's infinite and merciful love, He sent his only beloved Son, Jesus, to Earth to teach us how to love. He sacrificed his Son to suffer and die a cruel death on the cross to save us from eternal death and damnation for our sins and the sins of Adam and Eve. He sent the Holy Spirit to guide us out of darkness and promised that if we believed, we would be rewarded with true happiness in heaven.

What an amazing gift this is! Through our faith and commitment to Jesus, we can be assured that God, who knows everything about us, including our faults and imperfections, loves us and promises us salvation rather than judgment for our failings!

But what is meant by the words "everyone who believes in Him?" The action word "believes" is much more than merely saying, "I accept Jesus as my Lord and Savior." Real belief in Jesus involves turning one's life over to Jesus and His teachings. It means

making Jesus the center of our lives. It's a commitment to surrender one's selfish ways and to love others the way Christ loves.

It is still true today that many people continue to stay in the darkness rather than have their sins exposed in the light. Sometimes it is self-denial and they are afraid to confront their own sins. Other times, they don't want to admit to others that they are struggling. They fear that changing will be too hard. If only they would trust our most gracious and merciful God, who forgives and restores our souls when we offer our lives to Him.



We show belief when we come into the light and see, accept, and live in the truth of Jesus and His teachings. When we are true believers, our works of love will be Christ-like. Those who believe in Christ love Him and want to be like Him. Our good works will be done out of pure love and gratefulness for our God. Our belief – our faith in Christ – will go hand in hand with our actions – our works – to save us, and we will reach out to bring the Good News to others, too.

La dieta de la Cuaresma ¿Por qué no aprovechar el ayuno para quitarme los kilitos extra? Por: Germán Sánchez Griese | Fuente: Catholic.net

Nos encontramos en plena Cuaresma y varios amigos y amigas lectoras nos han escrito preguntánpueden aprovechar el ayuno cuaresmal para iniciar una dieta.

Dificil cuestión es ésta. ¿No estaremos confundiendo, como se confunde en la ortografía española la gimnasia con la magnesia? Si la Iglesia me impone el ayuno, ¿por qué no lo aprovecho, lo cumplo y de paso me quito unos kilitos extra y así estreno una nueva figura, un nuevo look el Domingo de Resurrección?

¿Para qué nos sirve el ayuno? ¿Es sólo una medida para pasar hambre, para privarnos de nuestros caprichos, de aquello que nos sobra? Entendido con esta mentalidad el ayuno cuaresmal se equipararía a las así llamadas dietas: junto con la dieta de la luna, la dieta de yogurt y fruta, la dieta de carbohidratos o la antidieta, podríamos inaugurar la dieta de la cuaresma. Fácil, sencilla y barata: pescado, menos pan, menos grasas, menos carbohidratos. Bajamos unos kilos y de paso cumplimos con el precepto que nos manda la Iglesia. ¿Se podrá?

Temo decirles a mis lectores que la respuesta es negativa. Que no es así de fácil, que no puedo aprovechar la barata de "pague uno y llévese dos", que no puedo "matar dos pájaros de una pedrada". Son dos cosas diversas, si bien es cierto que el efecto es el mismo. ¿Qué tiene de malo aprovechar el ayuno en la Cuaresma para comenzar una dieta? Aclarémonos: no tiene nada de malo, pero las finalidades son distintas, y casi me atrevo a decir, diametralmente opuestas.

Una dieta tiene como finalidad rebajar el peso que nos sobra. Algunos siguen la dieta por motivos médicos y otros la siguen por motivos no tan médicos, es decir por vanidad, para lucir mejor delante de otros, para causar envidias y querer ser el centro de atracción de su núcleo social. La finalidad de la dieta le dará su color moral, es decir la hará buena o mala bajo el punto de vista moral. Si sigo una dieta por motivos médicos, estoy haciendo un acto moralmente bueno. Si persevero en el adelgazamiento porque quiero agradar a mi esposo, sentirme bien conmigo misma para transmitir un poco de paz, de felicidad a mi familia y a los que conviven a mi lado, es un acto moralmente bueno, aceptable. Pero si sigo una dieta sólo para que me admiren, me envidien y hasta para provocar en otros deseos no tan castos... pues digámoslo claro, no es un acto moralmente bueno. Los resultados son los mismos, pero la intención es muy distinta.

Con esta misma óptica podemos considerar la diferencia entre el ayuno que propone la Iglesia en Cuaresma y la dieta que puedo seguir por motivos médicos o por motivos personales, dejando la connotación moral al juicio de cada uno y cada una, de acuerdo a los principios antes enunciados. El ayuno cuaresmal, como todos los ayunos promulgados por la Iglesia tiene como finalidad perder peso delante de Dios. Perder peso espiritual, se entiende. El ayuno implica una actitud de fe, de humildad, de total dependencia de Dios. Se recurre al ayuno para prepararse para el encuentro con Dios, (cf. Es 34, 28; 1Re 19, 8; Dan 9, 3); antes de afrontar una tarea dificil (cf. Jc 20, 26; Est 4,16) o suplicar el perdón de una culpa (cf.1Re 21, 27); para manifestar el dolor causado por una desdicha doméstica o nacional (cf. 1Sam 7, 6; 2Sam 1, 12; Ba 1, 5); pero el ayuno, inseparable de la oración y de la justicia, está orientado sobre todo a la conversión del corazón, sin la cual, como denunciaban ya los profetas (cf. Is 58,2-11; Ger 14, 12; Zc7,5-14), no tiene sentido.

El ayuno en Cuaresma nos propone no sólo la privación voluntaria de algún alimento durante algunos días específicos, sino también la privación de algún gusto de alguna distracción (ir al cine, dejar de ver televisión durante un tiempo, etc) con el único objeto de volver nuestro corazón hacia Dios. No es la privación lo que importa. Lo más importa es que mediante esa privación volvamos nuestro corazón hacia Dios y nos preparemos para vivir con Él los misterios de la pasión, muerte y resurrección de su Hijo Jesucristo nuestro Señor. Sólo así el ayuno cobra verdadero sentido. Cada privación es una llamada para dirigir nuestro corazón a Dios. Me privo de este dulce, de este chocolate, o de fumar, para que mi corazón pierda peso y no esté tan atado a las cosas materiales.

Los efectos exteriores pueden ser los mismos entre quienes escogen seguir una dieta y los que optan por vivir el ayuno cuaresmal. Ambos al final estrenarán un nuevo look para el domingo de Resurrección. Pero, ¿cómo estará el corazón de cada uno de ellos? En un caso, habrá un corazón más lleno de Dios y en otro caso tendremos un corazón completamente alejado de Dios por el pecado. ¿Cuál de los dos corazones quieres estrenar esta Pascua de Resurrección?

IV Domingo de Cuaresma, Ciclo B. ¡Tanto amó Dios al mundo! Autor: P. Raniero Cantalamessa, ofmcap 2 Crónicas 36, 14-16. 19-23; Efesios 2, 4-10; Juan 3, 14-21)

¡Tanto amó Dios al mundo!

En el Evangelio de este domingo encontramos una de las frases absolutamente más bellas y consoladoras de la Biblia: «Tanto amó Dios al mundo que dio a su Hijo único, para que todo el que crea en él no perezca, sino que tenga vida eterna».

Para hablamos de su amor, Dios se ha servido de las experiencias de amor que el hombre tiene en el ámbito natural. Dante dice que en Dios existe, como atado en un único volumen, «lo que en el mundo se desencuaderna». Todos los amores humanos conyugal, paterno, materno, de amistad—son páginas de un cuaderno, o chispas de un incendio, que tiene en Dios su fuente y plenitud.

Ante todo Dios, en la Biblia, nos habla de su amor a través de la imagen del amor paterno. El amor paterno está hecho de estímulo, de impulso. El padre quiere hacer crecer al hijo, empujándole a que dé lo mejor de sí. Por ello dificilmente un padre alabará al hijo incondicionalmente en su presencia. Teme que se crea cumplido y no se esfuerce más. Un rasgo del amor paterno es también la corrección. Pero un verdadero padre es asimismo aquel que da libertad, seguridad al hijo, que le hace sentirse protegido en la vida. He aquí por qué Dios se presenta al hombre, a lo largo de toda la revelación, como su «roca y baluarte», «fortaleza siempre cerca en las angustias».

Otras veces Dios nos habla con la imagen del amor materno. Dice: «¿Acaso olvida una mujer a su niño, sin compadecerse del hijo de sus entrañas? Pues aunque ésas llegasen a olvidar, yo no te olvido» (Is 49, 15). El amor de la madre está hecho de acogida, de compasión y de ternura; es un amor «entrañable». Las madres son siempre un poco cómplices de los hijos y con frecuencia deben defenderles e interceder por ellos ante el padre. Se habla siempre del poder de Dios y de su fuerza; pero la Biblia nos habla también de una debilidad de Dios, de una impotencia suya. Es la «debilidad» materna.

El hombre conoce por experiencia otro tipo de amor, el amor esponsal, del cual se dice que es «fuerte como la muerte» y cuyas llamas «son flechas de fuego» (Ct 8, 6). Y también a este tipo de amor ha recurrido Dios para convencernos de su apasionado amor por nosotros. Todos los términos típicos del amor entre hombre y mujer, incluido el término «seducción», son empleados en la Biblia para describir el amor de Dios por el hombre.

Jesús llevó a cumplimiento todas estas formas de amor, paterno, materno, esponsal (¡cuántas veces se ha comparado a un esposo!); pero les añadió otra: el amor de amistad. Decía a sus discípulos: «No os llamo ya siervos... a vosotros os he llamado amigos, porque todo lo que he oído a mi Padre os lo he dado a conocer» (Jn 15, 15).

¿Qué es la amistad? La amistad puede constituir un vínculo más fuerte que el parentesco mismo. El parentesco consiste en tener la misma sangre; la amistad en tener los mismos gustos, ideales, intereses. Nace de la confidencia, esto es, del hecho de que confio a otro lo más íntimo y personal de mis pensamientos y experiencias. Ahora: Jesús explica que nos llama amigos, porque todo lo que él sabía de su Padre celestial nos lo ha dado a conocer, nos lo han confiado. ¡Nos ha hecho partícipes de los secretos de familia de la Trinidad! Por ejemplo, del hecho de que Dios prefiere a los pequeños y a los pobres, de que nos ama como un papá, de que nos tiene preparado un lugar. Jesús da a la palabra «amigos» su sentido más pleno.

¿Qué debemos hacer después de haber recordado este amor? Algo sencillísimo: creer en el amor de Dios, acogerlo; repetir conmovidos, con San Juan: «¡Nosotros hemos creído en el amor que Dios nos tiene!» (1 Juan 4, 16).

4º Domingo de Cuaresma - B Evangelio de la Misa: Jn 3,14-21 Esperanza cristiana

Luminosas y esclarecedoras palabras las que se ofrecen a la reflexión de los cristianos. Cristo es presentado como quien vino a salvar lo que estaba perdido, y además a que no perezca ninguno que humilde y sinceramente acepte la fe en el Hijo del Hombre. El no ha venido a condenar a nadie, sino a salvar al mundo y ofrecerle la vida eterna. Es, pues, un mensaje cargado de alegría y optimismo, como la Iglesia procura siempre transmitir a lo largo de la historia. Otras interpretaciones pesimistas o condenatorias de lo humano y de lo terreno son ajenas al mensaje cristiano de todos los tiempos. (Hoy puede leerse el pasaje evangélico del Ciego de nacimiento, ciclo A)

Señor, que te mostraste como nuestro Salvador y con un mensaje henchido de esperanza y alegría. Me encanta escuchar y meditar estas palabras:

"Tanto amó Dios la mundo, que entregó a su propio Hijo, para que no perezca ninguno de los que creen en El, sino que tengan vida eterna".

"Porque Dios no mandó su Hijo al mundo para condenarlo, sino para que el mundo se salve por El".

Me hablas, Señor, de perdón, de vida, de salvación, de entrega, de fe. Palabras que me infunden paz, sosiego, optimismo y esperanza. No puedo por menos de sentirme agradecido por tus palabras, y por ese panorama que me abres para mi vida de cristiano, que quiere santificarse y vivir como hijo de Dios. A la vez que yo quiero vivir esta vida divina de tu gracia y de tu amor, y con ese optimismo cristiano, te pido que sepa testimoniarlo en mis relaciones con los demás, y que todos los cristianos proclamemos a todos los vientos que la Iglesia es fuente de vida, camino de paz y concordia, hogar de amor y familiaridad, escuela de optimismo y alegría, de justicia y santidad. Sin duda hay algunos cristianos embargados por la pena, el pesimismo, la critica amarga, y la desesperación por falta de fe auténtica, y de sentido humano y sobrenatural. Señor, que seamos todos sensatos y humildes, prudentes y "avispados" para no caer en esas tentaciones. Al contrario, que siempre me deje guiar por la fe y el amor de Dios, y nunca me falte el sentido sobrenatural de la vida.


