



"If you knew the gift of God, and who is saying to you 'give me a drink' you would have asked him and he would give you living water." - John 4:10

My dear parishioners,

Reflection

When the Israelites passed through the waters of the sea into freedom, they were saved from slavery. Even so, they grumbled against Moses, harshly criticizing him for leading them into the wilderness to die. Despite their complaints, God was faithful. At the Lord's command, Moses struck a rock and water issued forth.

Jesus described God's life-giving presence with the image of a "fountain springing up from within." He offered this gift to a nameless woman who represents all God's people whose lives are as dry as a stagnant cistern.

Jesus reveals our inner need for the living water of the Spirit. With the Elect preparing for baptism, we repent of our own thirst for power, prestige, or possessions. Whatever blocks the love of God from being poured into our hearts must be uncovered and healed. Then we can drink deeply from the life-giving springs of grace.

<u>For Reflection:</u> What do I need from God to satisfy my spiritual thirst? Am I aware that I am walking with the elect on their journey of faith this Lent?

We rejoice with our Elect and Candidates in our parish who will receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. We journey together from the desert to the fountain of new life that Jesus brings to us and pray for one another.

This weekend Bishop Burbidge consecrated our new Altar. I am grateful for your generosity which provides this new beauty to our worship and inspires us to live out our baptismal call as disciples of Jesus. May our new sanctuary remind us of God's presence in our midst and of our dignity as the daughters and sons of God. May we always proclaim the sacredness and dignity of every person.

LENTEN FAST AND ABSTINANCE


Catholics 14 years of age and older are obliged to abstain from meat and those 18-59 are obliged to fast (1 full meal and 2 smaller ones to maintain strength) unless medical or serious reasons exist. All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence, Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence

On This Date in Nativity History 16 March 2020

The coronavirus pandemic came into public awareness in late January 2020; by mid-March, it was obvious that drastic measures had to be taken to avoid a public health disaster. And so, across the country, in community after community, people began to lock down in their own homes to avoid contagious contact. On Monday, March 16, Arlington Bishop Michael Burbidge announced precautions to be taken in view of the spread of the covid -19 virus. Effective immediately, all public celebrations of the Mass were cancelled throughout the Diocese, an unprecedented measure. Churches were to remain open for those who wish to pray so long as they followed safe distancing practices and did not exceed ten persons. At Nativity, school leaders were the first to be challenged by the lockdown. School administrators had already begun to plan for a shutdown of schools before Friday, March 13; on Friday morning Virginia Governor Ralph Northam closed all schools for two weeks (an order that he was soon to extend to cover the rest of the school year). So, that day all available parish personnel allowed to enter the school, including the clergy and building maintenance staff, went through every desk in every classroom, putting each student's belongings into plastic bags labeled with the student's name. All these bags were then gathered outside the school so that families could drive by and pick up their child's bags. Those not gathered in this way were delivered to each family's home by the school Registrar and Administrative



Assistant, Shannon Murphy (photo). The following Monday and Tuesday were declared "snow days," and then classes went online for the rest of the school year. This historical note is the 40th of a weekly Bulletin feature leading up to Nativity's fiftieth anniversary, 11 June 2023.

Below is a description of each panel from left to right:


Feed the Hungry - Wheat and grapes, simple foods but also the physical signs of the Eucharist. Give Drink to the Thirsty - A drink of flowing water and the waters of Baptism. Shelter the Homeless - A door Jesus said, "I AM the door, I stand at the door and knock." Clothe the Naked - A robe, a ring, and sandals are physical clothing, but also the symbolic items the father gave the prodigal son.

Visit the Sick - A red cross and oil representing physical visiting, keeping vigil, and spiritual anointing. Visit the Imprisoned - Chains and bars are physical restraints that can also represent the prison of sin. Bury the Dead - A funeral pall draped over coffin, the Easter Candle, and prayers for the dead.

"The Stations of the Cross are a 14-step Catholic devotion that commemorates Jesus Christ's last day on Earth as a man. The 14 devotions, or stations, focus on specific events of His last day, beginning with His condemnation. The stations are commonly used as a mini pilgrimage as the individual moves from station to station. At each station, the individual recalls and meditates on a specific event from Christ's last day." www.catholic.org/prayers/

A Message from the Nativity Creation Care Ministry

Posted on our website at https://nativityburke.org/service/creation-care/ under Resources, is the annual Lenten Creation Care calendar, created by Virginia Interfaith Power & Light (VAIPL). VAIPL collaborates among people of faith and conscience to grow healthy communities by advancing climate and environmental justice. The calendar provides weekly themes and daily actions for the seven weeks of Lent. The theme for Week 4 is "Environmental Justice Lightens the Load. What is environmental justice?

While Pope Francis never uses the phrase "environmental justice" in his 2015 encyclical "Laudato Si', on Care for Our Common Home," he makes references to cases that fit it: health hazards to the poor from exposure to atmospheric pollutants; developed countries exporting solid waste and toxic chemicals to developing countries; multinational companies employing less stringent environmental standards than in their home countries.

The line, "Hear both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor," from Laudato Si' has become a central tenet in Catholics' approach to environmental issues. Environmental destruction, including that which accompanies warming global temperatures, impacts poor and marginalized communities often first and more acutely. Care for creation is a moral obligation, in particular to the poor and to future generations. What can you do this Lent to make a difference?

Hos 6:1-6 Ps 51:3-4,18-21ab Luke 18:9-14 What do you thirst for? Thirst happens when we lack something vital. Water is essential for survival, and our bodies signal us when it's time to drink fluids to stay healthy.

Likewise, water is necessary for our spiritual survival, albeit a different sort of water – the living water, which we first received from the baptismal water that purifies us for eternal life.

The Holy Spirit is the Giver of Life. One of the biblical symbols that represents the presence of God's Spirit is life-giving water. Therefore, we can surmise that Jesus wanted to give the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Samaritan woman. Why? It would still be a while before the Holy Spirit descended upon everyone at Pentecost.

She needed the truth; the Holy Spirit is Truth, and Jesus wanted to give her what she needed for salvation and then share this new life with the people around her.

We only get thirsty when we haven't

had enough to drink. Spiritual thirst shows itself in many forms: addictions, loneliness, despair, frustration, self-indulgence, or any other feeling or behavior that's triggered when we lack something that we need or want. And why would we lack anything spiritually? Because, like the woman at the well, we sometimes fail to realize that Christ is with us. We need to receive a spiritual healing.

How does God give us this healing? He pours his love into us with all sufficiency, but to drink of it, we have to listen openly, like that woman, ready to be changed by the truth.



Reflect & Discuss:

- † In the first reading, why did a physical thirst turn into a sin? How does this happen today?
- † In Romans 5, grace and hope are mentioned as gifts we receive when we have been "justified by faith" (i.e., when we've repented of our sins and sought forgiveness). How do grace and hope quench our thirsts? How do they help us resist sin?
- The woman at the well eagerly received what Jesus said. Even though he confronted her about her sins, she drank it all in and then, without shame, excitedly told others about her encounter with the Messiah. What need was filled by the truth? What does this teach about how we can help others hear the truth?

Lenten Activity:

What sin or unhealthy habit do you need to overcome so that Jesus is free to quench your thirsts? What will you do this week to hand it over to Christ?

Sentimos que no nos falta lo necesario para vivir y, en un sentimiento encontrado, percibimos que nos falta siempre un "algo" para ser felices. Es entonces cuando, Jesús, entra en acción. No nos ofrece el agua embotellada o etiquetada que el negocio nos vende. Jesús, consciente de la sed del hombre, esa sed que no es apagada por la frescura del agua corriente, nos lleva a una fuente que calma nuestra ansiedad y sed de Dios. Entre otras cosas, sentarse junto al pozo de Jesús, implica –además- sentarse frente a la verdad de uno mismo. Y, esto, ¡cuánto nos cuesta!

En él nos sentamos para escuchar la Palabra; para ponernos en paz con Dios por el sacramento de la reconciliación; para recibir el pan de la Eucaristía o para compartir, lo mucho o lo poco que tenemos, con los más necesitados.

Frente a un mundo hambriento y sediento de lo superfluo, la Samaritana, representa esa parte interior, que todos nosotros poseemos, y que está llamada a despertar, cuidarse y descubrirse por el encuentro personal con Jesús.

Actitudes de espíritu propias de la cuaresma cristiana


Teófilo Cabestrero, cmf - Martes, 17 de febrero de 2015 Vivir la cuaresma como entrada en la resurrección de Cristo, a través de la participación y asimilación de sus sufrimientos y su muerte, incluye una serie de actitudes de espíritu, entre las que cada comunidad y cada creyente debe discernir las que ha de encarnar sobre todo, según el estado de su fe. Citemos algunas:

- 1. **búsqueda sincera del verdadero Dios viviente**; realista y profunda; superando ideas falsas y purificando la fe. Hasta aceptarle en su auténtico papel en la propia vida personal, familiar, social:
- 2. descubrir a Jesucristo como "salvador" efectivo, como única solución definitiva de la propia existencia, de la existencia de todos y de toda la historia. Conocerle mejor y aceptarlo más vivamente;
- 3. **sincera conversión**; con todas las consecuencias; cambio de mentalidad y de vida en lo que haga falta. Abrir el alma, la fe, la esperanza, el amor y la vida, al dinamismo de la muerte y resurrección de Cristo; y, a su luz y con su fuerza, purificar, quemar, arrancar lo que sea preciso arrancar en el propio vivir egoísta;
- 4. sellar el encuentro con Dios en Cristo y con los hermanos, en los sacramentos de la pascua de Cristo: confesión hecha a fondo; redescubrimiento y renovación del propio bautismo; eucaristía viva y fraterna;
- 5. vitalizar las "prácticas religiosas", el culto: sinceridad y vida: encuentro siempre nuevo con Dios, con Cristo, con los hermanos:
- 6. Ilevar a la vida diaria la fe y la vivencia de los sacramentos y del culto: amar de verdad, servir, ayudar, solidarizarse con los demás, especialmente con los que sufren y con los más necesitados; vivir al impulso del Espíritu de Cristo que es el amor sin límites, y comprometerse en la acción de promover a los hombres hacia la libertad, la justicia, la paz, la dicha y la verdadera existencia que corresponde a la dignidad humana; hacer que, a través de nosotros, actúe en el mundo la muerte y la resurrección de Cristo; vivir todo eso de forma que nuestra fe, nuestro amor y puestra acción, pos sitúen responsablemente en la Iglesia.

nuestra acción, nos sitúen responsablemente en la Iglesia responsable y servidora del mensaje y el amor de Cristo; procurar no agriar más las distancias y divisiones dentro de la Iglesia, no contribuyendo ni a la parálisis de la Iglesia cómodamente situada, ni a la disgregación de la Iglesia en grupos sectarios; siendo, más bien, fermento de unidad futura en la fraternidad de la Iglesia que vive pobre para los pobres en el incesante don de sí por el Espíritu del amor sin límites.

- -No pienses que, en todo, llevas la razón. La conversión exige un cambio de corazón, de mente, de actitudes: humildad.
- -Reza un poco más. La meditación es saludable e, incluso, necesaria para el ajetreo que llevamos. ¿Cuánto hace que no te has retirado en un silencio prolongado en el interior de una iglesia?
- -Confiésate. Uno, desde dentro, no puede ver la fachada de su propia casa. El sacramento de la reconciliación te hará ver la grandeza que Dios ha puesto en ti y la fragilidad que, sin querer o queriendo, existe en ti.
- -Haz una obra de caridad. No caviles con los que están en la distancia. A veces, el ayudar a los que nos quedan lejos, se puede convertir en válvula de escape para no comprometernos con los que tenemos cerca.
- -Ama a la Iglesia. Nunca como hoy necesita de cristianos y de católicos que arrimen el hombro. Recuerda la palabra de Jesús: "Rema mar adentro". Tus manos son necesarias.
- -Defiende con pasión y con convencimiento tus motivaciones religiosas. Si almuerzas, en el trabajo, o comes en un restaurante ¿sabes que puedes dar testimonio de lo que eres? ¿Cómo? Guardando vigilia: una imagen o un gesto vale más que mil palabras!
- -Vive con más austeridad estos cuarenta días. Márcate un pequeño programa para que, la Cuaresma, deje en ti poso abundante.
- -No caigas en la tentación de pensar "lo de la Cuaresma es una tontería". Cuando no tenemos razones o no queremos entrar por un camino, buscamos mil excusas. ¿Jesús no se merece un acompañamiento especial camino del Calvario? ¡Piénsalo!
- -Si estás enojado con alguien, no lo dudes, pide perdón. Si no te lo aceptan tu habrás cumplido y, el peso de la conciencia, no residirá tanto en ti cuanto en aquellos que no ejercieron la misericordia contigo. ¡Te sentirás muy bien!
- -¿Tienes rencor contra alguien? ¿Estás decepcionado con alguien por algo? ¡Olvídalo! Da un paso hacia adelante. Si Dios, siendo como somos, nos perdona. ¿Cómo no vamos a ofrecer en la misma medida, el perdón y la comprensión a los que nos rodean?
- -Manifiesta públicamente tu fe. Promueve, con signos y palabras, lo que dices creer. Invita a alguien a la Eucaristía. Incluso, si llega la hora del Angelus, rézalo. Tal vez te miren...lograrás, entre otras cosas, ser diferente. Serás bienaventurado;
- -No dejes de acudir cada domingo a la Eucaristía. Sin ella, a muchos cristianos, les ocurre lo mismo que aquel beduino: "pasaba por una fuente y, mirándola, no quise beber; más adelante exhausto y sin fuerzas....me di cuenta de lo necio que fui por haber despreciado aquel manantial de agua fresca" ¡Feliz Cuaresma
