My dear parishioners,

When you walk into a Catholic Church one of the first things you see is the Crucifix in a very prominent place. It is often a beautiful work of art. It is the scene of Jesus' death. He died... for our sins. He has taken our sins and nailed them to the wood of His cross. Because of that cross we no longer stand accused or condemned. Christ paid the price and debt for our sins and established a new covenant of love with us.

This is the covenant that Jeremiah spoke about, "that all from the least to the greatest shall know me says the Lord, for I will forgive their evildoing and remember their sins no more." The Divine Mercy Novena is prayed nine days prior to Divine Mercy Sunday, so that is beginning on Good Friday, March 29th. The Novena will be prayed daily after the morning Mass or Morning Prayer Service, except on the Easter weekend, when the Novena prayers are said at home (check schedule).

"I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that they may draw there from strength and refreshment and whatever grace they have need of in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death" (Diary, 1209).



Statement from Bishop Burbidge Chairman of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities regarding IVF Issues

Each person's life is a unique gift and has immeasurable value from the moment of conception and it is for that precise reason that the Catholic Church cannot condone procedures such as in vitro fertilization (IVF) that result in a loss of life at a massive scale. In response to the growing attention to assisted reproductive technologies, Bishop Burbidge, as chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities, spoke about the gift of life. Recognizing the desire to have children is good and given the challenges many couples face, Bishop Burbidge called for greater focus on ethical treatments addressing the root causes of infertility. Additionally, other approaches that may be sought by some couples seeking to expand their families, such as foster care and adoption, should be offered more support. The chairman's full statement follows:

"The national conversation in the news about laws related to in vitro fertilization and other technologies creates an opportunity and a necessity to speak about protecting the gift of life itself. Each of our lives has immeasurable value from the moment of conception. In this way, we know that the deeply-rooted desire to bring about new life by having children is good. As priests and bishops, we grieve with and accompany in hope and love the increasing number of families suffering with an experience of infertility. We also encourage restorative, often-overlooked, treatments that can help to address the root causes of infertility.

"It is precisely because each person's life is a unique gift that we cannot condone procedures that violate the right to life or the integrity of the family. Certain practices like IVF do both, and they are often not effective even for their own purposes.

"Children have a right to be born to their married mother and father, through a personal act of self-giving love. IVF, however well-intended, breaches this bond and these rights and, instead, treats human beings like products or property. This is all the more true in situations involving anonymous donors or surrogacy. This of course does not mean that our brothers and sisters who were conceived by IVF are somehow 'less than' anyone else. Every person has immeasurable value regardless of how he or she was conceived – and that applies, absolutely, to all children created through IVF, the majority of whom have not been and may never be born.

"The fact is that, in the IVF industry, many embryos are never transferred to a mother's womb, but are destroyed or indefinitely frozen, and, of those who are transferred, only a fraction survive to be eventually born. All told, there are millions of human beings who have been killed or potentially permanently frozen by this industry. This cannot be the answer to the very real cross of fertility challenges. In efforts to bring about new life, we cannot turn our face from the many more lives that are cut short and extinguished in the process."

Bishop Burbidge was joined by three other bishop chairmen in a letter to the U.S. Senate on February 28, opposing the Access to Family Building Act and similar legislation that would greatly widen the use of various problematic assisted reproductive technologies nationwide. 
Fast from Water Waste and Pollution: March 22 is World Water Day. The UN's key messages for the day are: "Water can create peace or spark conflict. When water is scarce or polluted, or when people struggle for access, tensions can rise. By cooperating on water, we can balance everyone's water needs and help stabilize the world.

Prosperity and peace rely on water. As nations manage climate change, mass migration and political unrest, they must put water cooperation at the heart of their plans.

Water can lead us out of crisis. We can foster harmony between communities and countries by uniting around the fair and sustainable use of water – from United Nations conventions at the international level, to actions at the local level."

The Maryknoll Office for Global Concerns notes that: The word "water" is cited forty-seven times in Pope Francis' encyclical, Laudato Si'. This demonstrates the great value and concern Pope Francis places on water as a sacred and essential part of life. 'We have forgotten that we ourselves are dust of the earth (Genesis 2:7),' the pope says in the second paragraph of Laudato Si', 'our very bodies are made up of her elements, we breathe her air and we receive life and refreshment from her waters.' Water is essential to life but most of us take it for granted. Its crucial importance rarely comes to mind when we reach for a glass of water. Most humans will perish after three days without drinking water and it is central to maintaining life on our planet. 

During his public ministry, Jesus told his disciples from the start that anyone who wished to be a follower of his must renounce himself and take up his cross every day to follow him.

As "his hour" drew nearer and the Holy Will of his Heavenly Father was just around the corner, Jesus once again told his disciples in no uncertain terms that to follow him would mean to take up their own crosses and be willing to suffer and die for the love of others. Jesus challenged his disciples to live lives of selfless service to others then, and his challenge continues for us now.

What a beautiful image Jesus gave us of the grain of wheat! According to the Catechism, "The grain of wheat points to the Holy Eucharist in which the Sacrifice of Christ becomes really present. As we die to ourselves in union with him, especially in the Sacrament of the Eucharist, we

become other christs." (CCC 2731)

As we submit our hearts to the Lord and give our lives as disciples of Christ, every one of us is called in many ways to share in the joys and sorrows of Christ. Just as at different seasons of our lives we are given different crosses to bear, we are also called to different ways to serve others. When we serve others, Christ works in us and through us. We can be Jesus to those he puts in our paths to help.



We can see Jesus in those we serve.

Sometimes it is easier than other times, but we must remember that Jesus is reflected in us when we are serving. Sometimes God uses our acts of faith and charity to break open seeds in other souls as well.

APRENDE TU FE

El equilibrio no está de moda Pareciera que nos han impuesto vivir con angustias, tensos, siempre como explotando

Hace un tiempo me he puesto a pensar, viendo algunas actitudes de muchas personas, en dónde está el equilibrio, es decir, el que uno sea "equilibrado" en el momento de actuar, de pensar, de hablar. Y me di cuenta de todo lo que nos cuesta vivir de esa manera. Pareciera que lo que resalta y debe ser así, son los excesos, los gestos muchas veces extravagantes, las conversaciones hasta violentas si se quiere, y como que eso llama más la atención.

Es más, esos son los modelos que muchas veces se nos presentan. O si no bastaría con preguntarnos y observar: ¿Cómo son los "héroes" que se nos presentan? Miremos en la literatura moderna, en el cine, en las historias televisivas, en la música, donde aparecen supuestos "héroes" que se transforman en ídolos, y en casi todos se da una constante: actúan en forma desaforada, violenta, exaltados, con hasta excesos de vitalidad; y en muy pocos casos el "héroe de turno" se muestra como un ser equilibrado, maduro, sólido sicológicamente.

Basta con ver cuáles son los "ídolos" a quienes siguen los jóvenes, donde generalmente nos damos cuenta que muchos de ellos "actúan" de esa manera, y que sin dudas en su vida serán personas más "tranquilas y equilibradas", y toda esa manera llamativa de actuar no es otra cosa que eso: una "actuación".

Me pregunto por qué razón nos cuesta tanto seguir y admirar a alguien digamos "moderado", equilibrado, que habla y no grita y no gesticula de manera exagerada.

¿Cuál será el motivo para que alguien sea admirado, para que triunfe, necesite ser "extravagante", "raro"?. Parece que sólo pueden triunfar los que actúen de esa manera.

Pienso que quizás confundamos la serenidad con la apatía, el aburguesamiento, y en realidad se puede ser feliz de una manera también calma, y el hecho de ser equilibrado no necesariamente tiene que ver con vivir angustiado ni desalentado.

¿Cuál es la verdadera personalidad, la verdadera madurez? Pareciera que nos han impuesto vivir con angustias, tensos, siempre como "explotando", pensando que ser "vital" es sinónimo de excesos, de cierta "neurosis", como si esos fueran los verdaderos "grandes".

Y la verdad, que para mí son Grandes en serio aquellos que aman el silencio, los que trabajan sin desalentarse, quien tiene paciencia y sabe esperar y no vive en el "ruido" permanente.

Grande e idolo es quien es capaz de tener un corazón abierto y disponible para los demás, quien no necesita vivir "aturdido", el que trabaja constante y silenciosamente esforzándose por construir cada día desde su lugar, un mundo

En fin, el verdaderamente Grande es lo contrario a lo que muchas veces nos muestran quienes quieren ocupar ese lugar de "modelos" para el hombre de hoy.

no nos va a costar leer los planes de Dios, que no nos va a costar ir entendiendo exactamente qué es lo que Dios me quiere decir? Constantemente, para todos nosotros, la vida se abre como una especie de obscuridad en la que tenemos que ir realizando y caminando.

"No hay más Dios que el de Israel". ¿Sabemos nosotros que El es el único Dios y que por lo tanto, Él es el único que nos va llevando a lo largo de nuestra existencia por sus caminos, que no son los nuestros? Estos caminos a veces coinciden, a veces pueden llegarse a entender, pero no siempre es así. Cada uno de nosotros, en su vocación cristiana, tiene un camino distinto. Si pensamos cómo hemos llegado cada uno de nosotros al conocimiento de Cristo, nos daremos cuenta que cada uno tuvo una historia totalmente diferente; cada uno tuvo una historia muy particular. Y aun después de nuestro encuentro con Cristo, incluso después de que hemos llegado a conocerlo, la historia sigue una aventura. Y si nuestra historia no es una aventura, quiere decir que hemos hecho lo que estaba a punto de hacer el general asirio: marcharse. Marcharnos porque no entendimos los planes de Dios y preferimos manejarnos a nuestro antojo, manejarnos según nuestra comodidad. Nos marchamos pensando que a este Señor no hay quien lo entienda y perdemos la oportunidad de experimentar y saber que el único Dios, es el Dios de Israel.

Jesús, en el Evangelio, viene a recalcarnos precisamente que es Dios quien elige, quien se fija, quien llama y que es Él quien sabe porqué permite los caminos por los cuales nuestra vida se va desarrollando. Es Dios quien lo hace, no nosotros.

El ejemplo de las muchas viudas que había en Israel y Dios se fijó en una y el ejemplo de los muchos leprosos que había en Israel y Dios escogió precisamente a uno que ni era de Israel, nos deja muy claro que es Cristo el que manda. Nosotros tenemos que atrevernos a ponernos ante Dios con una sola condición: la condición de estar totalmente abiertos a su voluntad. De nada nos serviría conocer grandes hombres, de nada nos serviría conocer grandes personajes si no aprendemos la lección fundamental que estos grandes hombres vienen a dejarnos: la lección de estar siempre dispuestos a leer la letra de Dios, de estar siempre dispuestos a entender el camino por el cual Dios nos va llevando. Recordemos que Él sabe cuál es.

Los que vivían en el mismo pueblo de Jesús rechazan el modo de ser de Cristo y lo que hacen es alejarse de su vida. Solamente se puede tener a Cristo cerca cuando se tiene el alma abierta. Cada vez que nuestra alma se cierra a la generosidad, a la entrega, a la fidelidad, a la disponibilidad, en ese mismo momento, nuestra alma está alejando a Cristo de nosotros.

¡Qué serio es que pudiéramos ser nosotros los responsables de que Cristo no estuviese verdaderamente en nuestra vida! ¡Qué serio es que pudiéramos ser nosotros los causantes de que nuestra vida estuviese vacía de Cristo! Hay que ser muy exigentes con uno mismo. Hay que tener una gran disciplina interior, que a veces nos puede faltar. La disciplina que nos hace, en todo momento, seguir el camino concreto con el cual Dios nuestro Señor va marcando nuestra vida.

¿Estamos dispuestos a entenderlo? Solamente vamos a estar dispuestos a entenderlo si hay en nuestra vida la característica que hay en todos los hombres que quieren verdaderamente encontrarse con Dios: estar sediento de Dios, que da la vida. Estar sedientos de Él es el único modo que va a haber para que nuestra alma encuentre siempre, y en todo momento -a través de las circunstancias, de las personas, de los ambientes, de las dudas, de las caídas, de nuestras debilidades— a Dios; si realmente somos, tal y como lo dice el salmo: "Como un venado que busca el agua de los ríos, así cansada, mi alma te busca a ti, Dios mío".

El alma que tiene sed de Dios pasará por lo que sea: estará en obscuridades, tendrá dificultades, caídas, miserias, pero encontrará a Dios y Dios no se apartará de él. Podrá encontrarse con el Señor, no importa por qué caminos, pues esos son los caminos del Señor y Él sabe por dónde nos lleva. Lo único que importa es tener sed de Dios. Una sed que es lo que nos autentifica como personas de cara a nuestros hermanos los hombres, de cara a nuestra familia, de cara a nuestro ambiente, de cara a nosotros mismos.

No es cuestión de entender las cosas. No es cuestión de saber que mi vida tiene que estar realizada, manejada y ordenada de determinada manera, sino que es cuestión de tener sed de Dios. El alma que tiene sed de Dios va a permitir que sea Dios quien le realice la vida. Y el alma que va a realizarse apartada de Dios, significa que no tiene, verdaderamente, sed de Dios. Podrá ser muchas cosas —podrá ser un magnífico organizador en la Iglesia, podrá ser un excelente conferencista, podrá ser un hombre de un gran consejo espiritual—, pero si no tiene sed de Dios, no estará realizando la obra de Dios.

Ahora veámonos a nosotros mismos en nuestra organización, en nuestro trabajo, en nuestro esfuerzo, en nuestra vocación cristiana y rasquemos un poco, a ver si en nuestro corazón hay verdaderamente sed de Dios. Si la hay, podemos estar tranquilos de que estamos en el camino en el que hay que estar. Podemos estar tranquilos de que estamos en la ruta en la cual hay que ir. Podemos estar tranquilos porque tenemos en el corazón lo que hay que tener. No tendremos que tener miedo porque esa sed de Dios irá haciendo que la luz y la verdad de Dios se conviertan en nuestra guía hasta el Monte del Señor. Es un camino que requiere estar dispuestos, en todo momento, a querer entender lo que Dios nos pide. Estar dispuestos, en todo momento, a no apartar jamás de nuestro corazón a Jesucristo y mantener siempre viva en nuestro corazón la fe del Dios que da la vida.
