



My dear parishioners,

REFLECTION

The prophet Samuel was sent to anoint the one chosen to be king of Israel, but God saw something no one else did. Although Samuel scrutinized the seven sons of Jesse of Bethlehem, none were accepted as the one to anoint. When the youngest son, David the shepherd boy, was presented to Samuel, everyone assumed that he too would prove unworthy. Yet God did not look at external qualifications; God looked into the heart. God is the true shepherd of our souls. As a shepherd guides and corrects the erring sheep, so God cares for us. When we stumble in the darkness and cannot find the way, God shows us the path to life.

Sometimes we think we have insight into the ways of God, but our spiritual blindness is worse than having no sight. The blind man's sightlessness was an accident of birth. Our blindness is the consequence of sin. With the elect, our blindness is uncovered and healed and we can live as children of light. Washed in the pool of baptism, anointed with the Chrism of Salvation, and fed at the table of the Lord, we too can say, "Once I was blind. Now I can see."

For Reflection: Am I able to recognize areas of spiritual blindness in my life? Who helped open my eyes to see Jesus?

The New Mosaic Panels of the Seven Corporal Works of Mercy, below find a description of each panel from left to right:

Feed the Hungry - Wheat and grapes, simple foods but also the physical signs of the Eucharist.

Give Drink to the Thirsty - A drink of flowing water and the waters of Baptism.

Shelter the Homeless - A door Jesus said, "I AM the door, I stand at the door and knock."

Clothe the Naked - A robe, a ring, and sandals are physical clothing, but also the symbolic items the father gave the prodigal son.

Visit the Sick - A red cross and oil representing physical visiting, keeping vigil, and spiritual anointing.

Visit the Imprisoned - Chains and bars are physical restraints that can also represent the prison of sin.

Bury the Dead - A funeral pall draped over coffin, the Easter Candle, and prayers for the dead.

On This Date in Nativity History 22 March 2020

On this date, Nativity celebrated its first live stream Sunday Mass. The celebrant was Father Bob Cilinski, and the other priests concelebrated. The Mass was celebrated at 11:00 am in the school chapel in order to restrict the number of people present. The Mass was streamed via the work phone of Nativity's Social Media Coordinator, Mary Castellano, who propped the phone on some books she found in the Nativity School teachers lounge. Before this Sunday Mass, the participants did a trial run from the chapel the preceding Friday. The following is an account of how those first Masses were accomplished, written by Mary Castellano.



"On March 16, 2020, the Diocese of Arlington shut down all public worship to prevent the spread of the novel Coronavirus. I remember Nativity's Monday Morning Communications Meeting just before the shutdown.

When Fr. Bob presented the sad news of the situation, uncertainty hung in the air like a dense fog, and everyone felt it. He looked at everyone in the room and asked, "What are we going to do now...?" At that point I had conducted one successful live stream on Facebook, so naturally I felt confident enough to say, "We'll live stream it on Facebook!" Trust me when I say that I had no idea what I had just signed myself up for... "In March and April of 2020, only 10 people were allowed in one room at a time to prevent the spread of the Coronavirus.



We decided to host the Facebook Live Masses in the School Chapel to limit the number of people who could attend. I set up the live stream using my work phone

which was propped up on a tiny 4 inch phone stand on top of a stack of giant textbooks on top of a mobile standing desk (very professional). I pointed the phone at the altar and gently rotated the top-most book to simulate a smooth transition between the altar and the lectern for the Liturgy of the Word (again, very professional). The nice thing about my work phone, a Google Pixel 2 XL, was that it picked up sound very well, but sometimes too well. Just before I hit "GO LIVE" on Facebook, we did an out loud countdown so the others in the room knew when they needed to stop their personal conversations. Imagine Sister Donatella standing in the chapel, socially distanced from everyone else, counting down on her fingers, "3-2-1! Shhh..." And that's how our Facebook Live Masses began."

This historical note is the 41st of a weekly Bulletin feature leading up to Nativity's fiftieth anniversary, 11 June 2023.





Posted on our website at https://nativityburke.org/service/creation-care/ under Resources, is the annual Lenten Creation Care calendar, created by Virginia Interfaith Power & Light (VAIPL). VAIPL collaborates among people of faith and conscience to grow healthy communities by advancing climate and environmental justice. The calendar provides weekly themes and daily actions for the seven weeks of Lent. The theme for Week 5 is "Cultivating Peace from Nature."

Several of this week's daily entries focus on Tuesday's International Day of Forests. "Livestock, and the farming needed to feed them, are the most significant drivers of global deforestation. (When) we bypass the beef (both meat and dairy), we are doing our small part to protect our ecosystems. Palm oil is in just about every product in the supermarket, and the growing demand is a main driver of rainforest destruction in Indonesia. Find three items you use with palm oil, and pick a palm oil-free alternative for next time."

Lastly, this week, "take a contemplative walk around your neighborhood, park or nearby wooded area. Listen and look for signs of the Creator's touch on your journey."




NO HANDS BUT YOURS MINISTRY



Saturday March 25 ANNUNCIATION OF THE LORD

Isaiah 7:10-14; 8:10 Ps 40:7-11 Hebrews 10:4-10 Luke 1:26-38 Conversion is a process. The blind man in the Gospel reading exemplifies this journey into faith. Notice that at first he did not go to Jesus. Jesus came to him. The man responded by waiting to see what would happen and then by obeying Jesus.

Conversion begins when Jesus seeks us out and we make ourselves available to his touch. He then opens our eyes to the truth, but we don't immediately understand.

When the man's neighbors asked about his cure, he did not yet understand who Jesus was; he thought of him as just a man.

Then, the pressure of listening to the Pharisees argue about who Jesus was caused him to give it more thought. He concluded that Jesus must be a prophet.

As the Pharisees treated him more roughly and raised the possibility of expelling him from the synagogue if he claimed that Jesus was the Christ, he began to wonder whether it might be true. Their reasons for hating Jesus became the eye-openers that cured his spiritual blindness.

Finally, Jesus sought him out again, this time to minister to him in response to the mistreatment he had suffered from the Pharisees. In this act of caring, the man could see who Jesus really was. Conversion – the purification of our spiritual vision – takes place in the fire of our sufferings as we recognize the concern that God has for us.



Reflect & Discuss:

- In the first reading, God makes it clear that he sees what we cannot see when we're focused on external evidence. Think of a time when you looked deeper or beyond the obvious. How did that change you?
- In Ephesians 5, we read that we have become light in the Lord. Name some of the good fruits that come from the ability to see what Jesus is doing in your life.
- † The Gospel reading illustrates that those who think they can see the truth are very often blind, and those who acknowledge their blindness become able to see clearly. Why does this happen? How has it happened to you?

Lenten Activity:

Name areas of your life where there is confusion from a lack of understanding. Perhaps you're having a hard time seeing the good in someone. Maybe you're worried about the future. What will you do this week that will help you see it from God's perspective?

¿SERÁ QUE NOSOTROS NO VEMOS? IV Cuaresma Javier Leoz

El cuarto domingo de la Cuaresma incita a la alegría. Cuando Jesús es, además de agua viva, luz en el sendero, todo está abocado al optimismo, al entusiasmo. En definitiva, la proximidad de la Pascua, nos lleva a contemplar la luz que espera detrás del fracaso aparente de la cruz.

Todos los días, y no hay día que transcurra sin uno de ellos, ocurren pequeños milagros a nuestro alrededor. Alguien, con cierta razón, llegó a decir: "no hay motivos para no creer, todo lo que acontece por insignificante que sea, es inspiración divina".

¿Que cuesta percibir la intervención de Dios, y su presencia, en todo aquello que hacemos, tocamos o somos? Puede ser. ¿Pero, no será que estamos más ciegos de lo que creemos y, que precisamente por eso, porque no vemos con nitidez, nos cuesta agradecer los dones, los regalos, los grandes o pequeños prodigios que Dios obra en nuestra vida, salud, trabajo, etc?

Estamos tan metidos en oscuridades y en problemas que, sin quererlo, todo ello se convierte en gigantescas cataratas que nos impiden ver, juzgar y actuar con claridad, a la luz de la fe, en los acontecimientos de nuestra existencia.

*El ciego de nacimiento, cuando vio, confesó públicamente lo que sus padres no se atrevían: el poder y la acción de Jesús. ¡Cómo vamos a confesar nosotros, la luz del Señor, si preferimos marchar por túneles que conducen al desencanto, al desenfreno fruto de nuestra ceguera espiritual!

*El ciego de nacimiento fue valiente. No le tembló el pulso a la hora de indicar la fuente de su luz; el causante de la recuperación de su visión: Jesús de Nazaret. Pero claro, el ciego, recuperó la vista. ¿No será que, nosotros, permanecemos en una constante ceguera o miopía espiritual que nos impide confesar la presencia de Jesús, su fuerza, su mano, su Palabra o su importancia en nuestras vidas?

*El ciego de nacimiento fue agradecido. No sabemos si era pobre o rico, alto o bajo, prudente o primario, abierto o cerrado.....lo que si sabemos es que, Jesús, le proporcionó aquello que más necesitaba: la luz. Nosotros, por el contrario, ¿qué pedimos a Dios? ¿Luz para conocer, o fuegos de artificio para disfrutar? ¿Comprender las cosas tal como son o maquillaje para observarlas según nuestro propio interés? ¿Encontrar a Dios en el día a día de nuestra vida o buscar explicaciones en la ciencia para dejarlo en la orilla?

Demos gracias a Dios, por supuesto, porque nuestros ojos contemplan las grandes o pobres maravillas del mundo. Pero, al hilo del evangelio de hoy, recordemos también que "no hay mayor ciego que aquel que no quiere ver". Y aquí podemos estar nosotros: Cuando nos empeñamos en no sentir a Dios. Cuando vemos una cruz y no reflexionamos sobre la historia tan humana y tan divina que esconden sus dos maderos. Cuando escuchamos la Palabra de Dios y nos deja indiferentes y ciegos en lo nuestro. Cuando nos preguntan sobre nuestra fe y respondemos "eso es cosa de los curas, de la Iglesia, de los catequistas.."

El mundo cuanto más se aleje de Dios, más se acercará a su autodestrucción. Entre otras cosas porque la visión de Dios aporta las fuerzas y energías necesarias para trabajar a favor de la dignidad integral (no interesada) del ser humano. Y, entre otras cosas, porque un mundo autocomplaciente, egocéntrico y con cataratas espirituales lo único que hace es elegir el camino equivocado que le llevará a constantes y graves tropiezos.

Ser ciegos en el conocimiento de Jesús, de Dios, de su Palabra es una afección mucho más grave que ser ciegos para reconocer los colores.

¿Crees en mí? Nos pregunta Jesús en este domingo de la alegría. ¿Qué le contestamos? Empecemos por decirle: ¡Señor que te vea! ¡Y, luego, daré gracias por conocerte, por verte y por curarme de tantas dolencias que afectan a mi pensamiento, corazón, alma o espíritu! ¡Señor, que te vea! ¡Y, luego, dame la fuerza necesaria para defender tu señorío frente aquellos que dicen que, las cosas en la vida, ocurren por casualidad o por simple azar.

Jesús está conmigo, Dios está conmigo Meditaciones para toda la Cuaresma Cuarto domingo de Cuaresma. Reflexionar si nuestro corazón está realmente puesto en Dios o en nuestros criterios humanos.

Cuando Jesús habla de los contrastes tan profundos que hay entre el modo de entender la fe por parte de sus contemporáneos, y la fe que Él les está proponiendo, no lo hace simplemente para que nosotros digamos: ¿Cómo es posible que esta gente teniendo tan claro no entendiesen nada? Jesús viene a fomentar en todos nosotros un dinamismo interior que nos permita cambiar de comportamien-

to y hacer que nuestro corazón se dirija hacia Dios nuestro Señor con plenitud, con vitalidad, sin juegos intermedios, sin andar mercadeando con Él.

La mentalidad de los fariseos, que también puede ser la nuestra, se expresa así: "Yo soy el pueblo elegido, por lo tanto yo tengo unos privilegios que recibir y que respetar". Sin embargo, Jesús dice: "No; el único dinamismo que va a permitir encontrarse con la salvación no es el de un privilegio, sino el de nuestro corazón totalmente abierto a Dios". Éste es el dinamismo interior de transformarme: orientándome hacia Dios nuestro Señor, según sus planes, según sus designios.

Esto tiene que hacer surgir en mi interior, no el dinamismo del privilegio, sino el dinamismo de humildad; no el dinamismo de engreimiento personal, sino el dinamismo de ser capaz de aceptar a Dios como Él quiere.

Una conversión que acepte el camino por el cual Dios nuestro Señor va llevando mi vida. No es un camino a través del cual yo manipule a Dios, sino un camino a través del cual Dios es el que me marca a mí el ritmo.

Lo que Jesús nos viene a decir es que revisemos a ver si nuestro corazón está realmente puesto en Dios o está puesto en nuestros criterios humanos, a ver si nosotros hemos sido capaces de ir cambiando el corazón o todavía tenemos muchas estructuras en las cuales nosotros encajonamos el actuar de Dios nuestro Señor.

Más aún, podría ser que cuando Dios no actúa según lo que nuestra inteligencia piensa que debe ser el modo de actuar, igual que los contemporáneos de Jesús, que "se llenan de ira, y levantándose lo sacan de la ciudad", o cuando nuestro corazón no convertido encuentra que el Señor le mueve la jugada, podríamos enojarnos, porque tenemos un nombramiento, porque nosotros tenemos ante el Señor una serie de puntos que el Él tiene que respetar. Si pretendemos que se hagan las cosas sólo como yo digo, como yo quiero, ¿acaso no estamos haciendo que el Señor se aleje de nosotros?

Cuando nosotros queremos manejar, encajonar o mover a Dios, cuando no convertimos nuestro corazón hacia Él, poniendo por nuestra parte una gran docilidad hacia sus enseñanzas para que sea Él el que nos va llevando como Maestro interior, ¿por qué nos extraña que el Señor se quiera marchar? Él no va a aceptar que lo encajonen. Puede ser que nos quede una especie de cáscara religiosa, unos ritos, unas formas de ser, pero por dentro quizá esto nos deje vacíos, por dentro quizá no tenemos la sustancia que realmente nos hace decir: "Jesús está conmigo, Dios está conmigo."

¿Realmente estoy sediento de este Dios que es capaz de llenar mi corazón? O quizá, tristemente, yo ando jugando con Dios; quizá, tristemente, yo me he fabricado un dios superficial que, por lo tanto, es simplemente un dios de corteza, un dios vacío y no es un dios que llena. Es un dios que cuando lo quiero yo tener en mis manos, me doy cuenta de que no me deja nada.

Debemos convertir nuestro corazón a Dios, amoldando plenamente nuestro interior al modo en el cual Él nos quiere llevar en nuestra vida. Y también tenemos que darnos cuenta de que las circunstancias a través de las cuales Dios nuestro Señor va moviendo las fichas de nuestra vida, no son negociables. Nuestra tarea es entender cómo llega Dios a nuestra existencia, no cómo me hubiera gustado a mí que llegase.

Si nuestra vida no es capaz de leer, en todo lo que es el cotidiano existir, lo que Señor nos va enseñando; si nuestra vida se empeña en encajonar a Dios, y si no es capaz de romper en su interior con esa corteza de un dios hecho a mi imagen y semejanza, «un dios de juguete», Dios va a seguir escapándose, Dios va a continuar yéndose de mi existencia.

Muchas veces nos preguntamos: ¿Por qué no tengo progreso espiritual? Sin embargo, ¡qué progreso puede venir, qué alimento puede tener un alma que en su interior tiene un dios de corteza!

Insistamos en que nuestro corazón se convierta a Dios. Pero para esto es necesario tener que ser un corazón que se deja llevar plenamente por el Señor, un corazón que es capaz de abrirse al modo en el cual Dios le va enseñando, un corazón que es capaz de leer las circunstancias de su vida para poder ver por dónde le quiere llevar el Señor.

Dios no nos garantiza triunfos, no nos garantiza quitar las dificultades de la vida; los problemas de la existencia van a seguir uno detrás de otro. Lo que Dios me garantiza es que en los problemas yo tenga un sentido trascendente.

Que el Señor se convierta en mi guía, que Él sea quien me marque el camino. Es Dios quien manda, es Dios quien señala, es Dios quien ilumina. Recordemos que cuando nosotros nos empeñamos una y otra vez en nuestros criterios, Él se va a alejar de mí, porque habré perdido la dimensión de quién es Él, y de quién soy yo.
