

#### A Message from our Pastor Fr. Bob Cilinski



"I am the resurrection and the life, says the Lord; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will never die." - John 11:25a, 26

My dear parishioners,

#### **REFLECTION**

The people in exile thought they were as good as dead, yet God breathed life into them. Though they felt as dry as the bones of corpses, they were raised up and marched into freedom. Paul said that the indwelling Spirit raised Jesus from the dead and will give our mortal bodies life.

As the time of Jesus' death approached, he made the incredible announcement: "I am the resurrection and the life" Jesus asks if we believe this. Each of us must summon faith and say: "Yes, Lord, I believe." Jesus shows us that we will not be disappointed by our belief in him.

The raising of Lazarus is a symbol of our own dying and rising in baptism. With the elect we examine those things in our hearts that prevent us from receiving the fullness of life. We ask ourselves whether or not we keep others bound through our anger, bitterness, and unforgiveness. We must make a decision to set them free through forgiveness and mercy. Jesus tells us, "Unbind them and let them go free!"

*For Reflection:* What will loosen my bonds and set me for? How can I bring comfort to the dying and grieving?

"We often get tired of asking for God's forgiveness. But God never tires of forgiving us." - Pope Francis.

Thursday, March 30 is our Lenten Penance Service. 20 Priests will be available throughout the church for individual confessions from 6:30pm - 8:00pm. We are turning Nativity into a "Reconciliation Zone." Come as a family... a beautiful way to prepare for Easter.

#### On This Date in Nativity History 22 March 2020

On this date, the Corona Choir sang at their first Mass. The Choir, composed of Alison Fram, Sara Prince, and Kathryn Stinard, (in the photo, l to r) provided music at Masses throughout the pandemic, until their last Mass, 5 September 2021. Here, Alison Fram answers some questions from the Nativity History Project about the Choir.

NHP: How did the three of you get together and formed the choir? Who suggested it?

AF: When it became clear that public Masses would be suspended in March of 2020, our Masses began to be live-streamed and we had to keep to the 10-person limit. Fr. Bob's idea was to invite Sara, Kathryn, and me to provide music for the liturgies. I had already been asked to be a lector for the Masses, so I was able to join them in singing since I'd already be present for each Mass. NHP: How often did you practice? Had any of you sung in Mass before?

AF: Sara and Kathryn are both directors of Nativity choirs, so they've been an active part of our parish's music ministry. I sang in Nativity's Youth Choir when I was in high school and had recently assisted with singing for some ministry events. When we began singing together, Sara would send out the music lists ahead of time, and we would meet an hour before Mass to practice.

NĤP: Were you concerned about health issues by singing in Mass during those early days of the pandemic? AF: There were a lot of questions and unknowns in the early days, but thank God we remained safe and healthy. We all did our best to keep each other safe and took precautions as needed.

NHP: Anything else of interest to readers?
AF: That first year, we also led the music for all of the Triduum services and Easter, so we met with the priests to review the music and liturgies. The three of us said that it was so surreal to be in the empty Church during Holy Week and Easter, imagining all the people praying along with us and singing with us from their homes.



The New Mosaic Panels of the Seven Corporal Works of Mercy, below find a description of each panel from left to right:

*Feed the Hungry* - Wheat and grapes, simple foods but also the physical signs of the Eucharist.

Give Drink to the Thirsty - A drink of flowing water and the waters of Baptism.

Shelter the Homeless - A door Jesus said, "I AM the door, I stand at the door and knock."

*Clothe the Naked* - A robe, a ring, and sandals are physical clothing, but also the symbolic items the father gave the prodigal son.

*Visit the Sick* - A red cross and oil representing physical visiting, keeping vigil, and spiritual anointing.

*Visit the Imprisoned* - Chains and bars are physical restraints that can also represent the prison of sin.

**Bury the Dead** - A funeral pall draped over coffin, the Easter Candle, and prayers for the dead.

Ezra 37:21-28 Jeremiah 31:10-13 John 11:45-56 Lent is not about suffering and sacrifice. It's a corridor to new life. Good Friday is not about pain and death. It's the door that Jesus opens to invite us into that new life.

Yes, suffering is part of the Lenten journey (which can be experienced at any time of the year). Yes, Lent includes the sacrifices of fasting and abstinence, almsgiving and extra time in church. But these are just vehicles for the trip.

God uses our sufferings (if we let him) to help us grow in compassion, persistence, and ministry. Our sacrifices teach us discipline (which is discipleship) so that we can purify our will and grow stronger in holiness. But the trip is not the destination.

Lent is all about reaching the resurrection: renewing our faith, entering a new life free of old sins, reconciling damaged relationships, and living in the

Spirit of God more than we ever did before.

Which day is more important to your faith: Good Friday or Easter? That horrid day on Calvary was necessary for Easter, but we are living in the resurrection! Catholics are an Easter people. This means that nothing bad can ever happen to us that will not be transformed into blessings if Jesus is the Lord of our lives.

He proved himself to be the Resurrection and the Life by displaying his power over life and death. Now he wants to prove it again – to you and to all those who are watching.



#### Reflect & Discuss:

- † We can personalize the first reading by understanding that God will open our graves (whatever is dead inside of us) and will place his Spirit of Life within us. How does the Holy Spirit help us discover healing and hope amidst daily sufferings?
- In the scripture from Romans, we are reminded again of the Holy Spirit within us. Since the Spirit is alive in you, what affect does this have on your Lenten journey? What is being purified, strengthened, and renewed?
- In the Gospel, Jesus proves his power over death just before he enters Jerusalem and heads toward Calvary. How does this prove to you that your own sufferings and sacrifices will not lead to permanent disaster?

#### Lenten Activity:

What needs to be resurrected in your life? What will you do this week to accept the death of what has ended so that you can prepare for the new life that Jesus is preparing for you?

## ¿SÁCANOS FUERA, SEÑOR!

Nos encontramos en la recta final de la Cuaresma. Tres sugerentes catequesis bautismales, impresionantes todas ellas, han querido incentivar nuestra fe en estos últimos domingos: la samaritana, el ciego de nacimiento y hoy la resurrección de Lázaro.

Y, en las tres instrucciones, un denominador común: JESUS como agua, luz y vida para el creyente.

- ¿Por qué, si Jesús es vida, nos cuesta tanto transmitir precisamente esa idea sobre la fe?

-/Por qué, cuando muchas personas se acercan a nuestras celebraciones, tienen la sensación de que -en vez de savia- ahí se respira rutina, excesiva mecanicidad en los gestos o que no estamos en aquello que celebramos?

Hoy, la resurrección de Lázaro, pone las cartas sobre la mesa: ¡Cristo es la resurrección! El motor que nos empuja a un cambio de mentalidad y de actitudes. Sólo por este gran regalo que nos trae Jesús, una resurrección para nunca morir, merece la pena intentar una renovación en el aquí y en el ahora. Situar a Dios justo en el lugar que le corresponde y saber que, el Señor, está por encima de la misma muerte. Existen muchos agoreros que, desde distintos vértices -creyentes o no- presagian un final desencantador y de dificil solución para el mundo. Pero, Dios, que puede todo como Dios y que tiene un corazón de Padre, nos hace comprender que, con Jesús, la salvación es posible.

De muchos temores nos libra Jesús. A Marta y María, les recuperó del dramatismo y del colapso que les supuso la muerte de su hermano querido. A Lázaro le desembarazó de una muerte injusta y venida por sorpresa. Y, ¿a sus amigos y vecinos? Pues, tal vez, les sacudió de aquel mar de dudas que, tal vez en aquel momento, se hallaban inmersos sobre Jesús.

¡Pero ojo! El relato de Lázaro tiene un trasfondo que nos debe hacer más reflexivos y llevar a una interiorización: ¡Lázaro! ¡Sal fuera! Y ¿qué hizo Lázaro? Obedecer. El creyente, por si lo hemos olvidado, es alguien que confía en Dios, que se fía de Dios y que obedece al

¡Cuántas personas muertas en vida que viven de espaldas a la novedad del Evangelio! Prefieren quedarse en sus sepulcros fletados por el poder, el bienestar o el dinero.

¡Cuántas personas asfixiadas por las vendas de la seducción, de la apariencia o de la incredulidad! Han optado por lo efimero y, cualquier invitación a dejar todo su "modus vivendi" es poco menos que una injerencia o una falta de respeto a su libertad

¡Cuántas personas rodeadas, no por "Martas ni Marías" (que alertan a despertar a la fe y a la vida ) sino por ambientes hostiles a la fe cuando no indiferentes, apáticos o descaradamente contrarios.

L'I evangelio de hoy nos interpela a todos: ¿Somos vida como creyentes? ¿La anunciamos? ¿Somos portadores de la Buena Noticia de Jesús? ¿Recurrimos a Jesús para hacerle sabedor de aquellos que, tal vez, han muerto un poco o un todo para la fe? ¿Llamamos a Jesús para que nos socorra y nos reanime -aunque sea eventualmente como lo fue en Lázaro- y luego, a continuación, buscarle, creer en El y seguir sus caminos?

Hoy, con el Evangelio de Lázaro, tenemos que reafirmar nuestra fe en Cristo surtidor de vida eterna. Hoy, con el Evangelio en mano, hemos de procurar ser más intrépidos para gritar donde haga falta y a quien más veamos que lo necesite: ¡Sal fuera! Por: P. Cipriano Sánchez LC | Fuente: Catholic.net Podremos hacer muchas cosas o tener grandes posesiones, pero nunca debemos perder de vista que lo importante es el bien que hacemos a los demás. Ésa tiene que acabar siendo nuestra más importante y auténtica riqueza.

Dios ama al que da con alegría, y en el Evangelio escuchábamos una parábola de nuestro Señor sobre este darse. Darse significa que, como el grano de trigo, uno tiene que caer en la tierra y pudrirse para dar fruto. Es imposible darse con comodidad, es imposible darse sin que nos cueste nada. Al contrario, el entregarse verdaderamente a los demás y el ayudar a los demás siempre nos va a costar.

Vivimos en un mundo de muchas comodidades, y no sé si nosotros seríamos capaces de resistir el sufrimiento, cuando cosas tan pequeñas, tan insignificantes, a veces nos resultan tan dolorosas. La fe nos pide ser testigos de Cristo en la vida diaria, en la caridad diaria, en el esfuerzo diario, en la comprensión diaria, en la lucha diaria por ayudar a los demás, por hacer que los demás se sientan más a gusto, más tranquilos, más felices. Ahí es donde está, para todos nosotros, el modo de ser testigos de Cristo.

Tenemos que entregarnos auténticamente, entregarnos con más fidelidad, entregarnos con un corazón muy disponible a los demás. Cada uno tiene que saber cuál es el modo concreto de entregarse a los demás. ¿Cómo puedo yo entregarme a los demás? ¿Qué significa darme los demás?

Ciertamente, para todos nosotros, lo que va a significar es renunciar a nuestro egoísmo, renunciar a nuestras flojeras, renunciar a todas esas situaciones en las que podemos estar buscándonos a nosotros mismos.

Jesucristo nos dice en el Evangelio que todo aquél que se busca a sí mismo, acabará perdiéndose, porque acaba quedándose nada más con el propio egoísmo. La riqueza de la Iglesia es su capacidad de entrega, su capacidad de amor, su capacidad de vivir en caridad. Una Iglesia que viviese nada más para sí misma, para sus intereses, para sus conveniencias sería una Iglesia que estaría viviendo en el egoísmo y que no estaría dando un testimonio de fe. Y un cristiano que nada más viva para sí mismo, para lo que a uno le interesa, para lo que uno busca, sería un cristiano que no está dando fruto.

Dios da la semilla, a nosotros nos toca sembrar. Dios nos ha dado nuestras cualidades, a nosotros nos toca desarrollarlas; Dios nos ha dado el corazón, el interés, la inteligencia, la voluntad, la libertad, la capacidad de amar; pero el amar o el no amar, el entregarnos o no entregarnos, el ser egoístas o ser generosos depende sola y únicamente de nosotros.


Es en la generosidad donde el hombre es feliz, y es en el egoísmo en donde el hombre es auténticamente desgraciado. Aunque a veces la generosidad nos cueste y nos sea dificil; aunque a veces el ser generosos signifique el sacrificarnos, es ahí donde vamos a ser felices, porque sólo da una espiga el grano de trigo que cae en la tierra y se pudre, se sacrifica, mientras que el grano de trigo que se guarda en un arcón acaba estropeándose, se lo acaban comiendo los animales o echándose a perder.

#### Una Cuaresma desde Dios Cuaresma

Si vivimos la Cuaresma desde Dios, se convertirá en la mejor preparación para la gran fiesta de la Pascua.

Podemos recorrer los 40 días de la Cuaresma desde una perspectiva errónea, sin darles su auténtico sentido.

¿Cuándo ocurre eso? Cuando vemos la Cuaresma como una tradición de la Iglesia más o menos comprensible pero sin mucho sentido en el ajetreado tiempo que nos ha tocado vivir; cuando buscamos maneras de hacer (nosotros, según los propios deseos) algunos sacrificios para tranquilizar la conciencia y "cumplir"; cuando soportamos con paciencia 40 días en los que nos esforzamos por ser más austeros para llegar luego a momentos de mayor fiesta y alegría... Entonces es que no hemos comprendido el verdadero sentido de la Cuaresma.

Pero también podemos recorrer los 40 días que nos preparan a la Pascua desde una perspectiva justa. Si los pensamos como un momento para orar, ayunar, servir, dar; si los vivimos como una invitación de Dios a la conversión, al arrepentimiento, al cambio de conducta; si los aprovechamos para dedicar más tiempo a la lectura de la Biblia... Entonces habremos hecho un buen uso de esos días tan particulares en el calendario cristiano.

La Cuaresma es un tiempo en el que Dios nos invita, nos llama, nos ofrece ocasiones maravillosas para redescubrir nuestra identidad cristiana. Es verdad que Dios actúa siempre, que no hay tiempos sin que nos busque y nos ofrezca su gracia. Pero también es verdad que, como seres humanos, necesitamos estímulos y ayudas concretas para afrontar con más intensidad y esfuerzo lo que deberían ser compromisos constantes de quienes hemos sido tocados por Cristo en el Bautismo.


Ya estamos en Cuaresma.
