"Christ Jesus emptied himself, taking the form of a slave. He humbled himself becoming obedient even unto death on a cross. Because of this, God highly exalted Him." - Philippians 2:6-8

My dear parishioners:

Holy Week begins with the commemoration of the entry into Jerusalem and the reading of the Passion according to St. Luke. This week we move from the palm branches of praise to the shouts of "crucify Him." Jesus teaches us how to live the paschal mystery each day of our lives. There are moments of triumph and joy, but also times of difficulty and failure. Through it all, God is with us offering redemption and new life. In Luke's version of the crucifixion and death, we find Jesus' memorable expression of forgiveness: "Father, forgive them, they don't know what they do." May Jesus' prayer bring us comfort in our sins and provide a helpful option to all His followers who find love of enemies difficult.

Above all, this is a week of tremendous love. We are reminded of how loved we are by God who gave his only Son to be our Savior. Let us pray for one another, and especially for our "Elect" who lead us to the risen Lord we encounter in the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. May this truly be a Holy Week.

<u>Palm Sunday:</u> They couldn't kill him for blasphemy, a religious crime Rome didn't recognize. But they could put him to death for a political crime like treason. So Jesus died under the accusation, "King of the Jews." He had no throne, no army, no power to threaten governments. But he threatened a lot of people with the power to change hearts.

Monday: Brave Mary of Bethany. Was Mary a prophet? She forecast Jesus' death by preparing him for burial. Was she a minister of a sacramental, anointing his body with soothing oil? Was she a disciple, a friend, a woman in love? Unconcerned with others' judgments, she did what her heart commanded.

<u>Tuesday:</u> *Passionate Peter*, too, followed his heart. He spoke and acted impulsively, and often came to regret his behavior. He swears he will die for Jesus, and within hours he denies him. But in fact, Peter will die for Jesus one day. He, like us, just needs to get the bugs out of his witness.

<u>Wednesday:</u> *God's Suffering Servant Isaiah* wrote poems about the Lord's servant, who suffers innocently for justice. The Gospel writers recognized Jesus in those poems. Innocent suffering may repel us, but it also emboldens our hearts. "The blood of the martyrs is the seed of the Church." Such love finds its response in our courage.

<u>Holy Thursday:</u> *Foot Washers.* Mothers of small children, caregivers for the elderly, nurses in sickrooms, take heart: washing the feet of those who need us is an activity particularly blessed by God. Humble acts of service give glory to the Lord who once washed feet to show us how far our love should go.

Good Friday: Carrying the Cross. The cross is the symbol of human suffering and death. No one wants to carry the cross, but each of us will be forced underneath it someday, like Simon of Cyrene, when we least expect it. How we carry it will depend on how well we've understood the sign of the cross, every time we've used it in blessing.

Easter Vigil: Standing at the Tomb. Many visit the tomb in the early hours of Easter. The holy women. Angels. The disciples. We come to the tomb as well, to stand and peer in to the very hollow where our faith lives. Is it empty? What do we see? Is he risen, or is it a trick? If we say Alleluia, we accept the challenge to say it with our whole lives.

Every year on Good Friday, a collection is taken up in Catholic Churches to support the work of the Franciscans working in the Holy Land. Christians there rely heavily on the help that comes to them from this worldwide collection.

The Franciscans of the Custody of the Holy Land have the unique responsibility to care for the Holy Places as well for the "Living Stones," the Christians living there. It is vital that we support Christians living in the Holy Land, in order to maintain a Christian presence in the very land made holy by the life, death and Resurrection of Jesus.

Faith, Memory & Culture – The Holy Places: Holy Land Franciscans and staff maintain the holy places and shrines. This enables those who live in the Holy Land and those who visit to deepen their faith and their spiritual and cultural connection to salvation history.

The Mosaic Panels of the Seven Corporal Works of Mercy



Below is a description of each panel from left to right:

Feed the Hungry - Wheat and grapes, simple foods but also the physical signs of the Eucharist.

Give Drink to the Thirsty - A drink of flowing water and the waters of Baptism.

Shelter the Homeless - A door Jesus said, "I AM the door, I stand at the door and knock."

Clothe the Naked - A robe, a ring, and sandals are physical clothing, but also the symbolic items the father gave the prodigal son.

Visit the Sick - A red cross and oil representing physical visiting, keeping vigil, and spiritual anointing.

Visit the Imprisoned - Chains and bars are physical restraints that can also represent the prison of sin.

Bury the Dead - A funeral pall draped over coffin, the Easter Candle, and prayers for the dead.

On This Date in Nativity History 13 June 1959

Aerial photographs show that the land Fr. Frank Ready bought for Nativity's new church was occupied by a working farm until sometime in the early 1950s. Yet, by 1974 the land was abandoned and had not been used for farming for many years. What happened to the land in the interim? After World War II, the Civil Aeronautics Administration appointed a commission to study possible sites for a second Washington-area airport, and the area around Burke was selected in 1951. The government then began to buy up land in the Burke area on which the airport would be built. The people of Burke lobbied against the choice, and in 1958 President Dwight Eisenhower recommended that the new airport, now known as Dulles International, be built near Chantilly. The defeat of the proposed Burke airport left untouched the land on which the parish would eventually be established. When the Federal government decided to shift the airport to the Chantilly area, it had to divest itself of the large tracts of land it had acquired – some in Burke would say "confiscated" – on which the Burke airport would have been built. About 900 acres of the land were given to the Fairfax County Park Authority and became Burke Lake Park. Another 600 acres were sold to a land developer and eventually ended up as Burke Centre. The remaining land was sold at auction in June 1959, including the specific parcel of land on which Nativity's church and school would be built. This flyer announcing the sale of government land at public auction on June 13, 1959, tells us what happened to the property. The map shows that the parcel that would someday be the site of Nativity Church and School (red arrow) was among those that had been bought by the government for the airport site, and would be auctioned off to private owners. The parcel may have passed through several more hands before 1974, but it was never used for farming again. Instead, it was simply held by land speculators awaiting the day when it could be sold for a higher price.





Nativity Students See Success at SeaPerch Competition



Last weekend, seventy student teams assembled at the United States Naval Academy for the regional SeaPerch competition. Nativity's six SeaPerch Teams were among them.

The MIT Sea Grant College Program created the SeaPerch Initiative in 2003, and is sponsored by the Office of Naval Research. Since December, twentyfive Nativity students have teamed up to build underwater remote-operated vehicles (ROVs) to compete in this regional SeaPerch competition.





To prepare for the event, the club used three Saturday build sessions to cut PVC pipe, solder terminals, and assemble ROVs, and spent many hours at the pool navigating an obstacle course and retrieving objects. In this recent regional competition, the Nativity teams did an awesome

job navigating three challenges and demonstrating their knowledge in the interview session during the preliminary round. One of the sixth grade Nativity teams placed in the final round, nearly earning a trip to Nationals in May.

Theologically, we use it to describe the suffering love that Jesus endured for each of us when he was beaten, mocked and crucified as he willingly took onto himself the punishment and destructive forces of our sins.

The world counterfeits the word "passion" by applying it to strong feelings of romantic, even lustful, attraction.

We also use this word to refer to a strong motivation to do something that we enjoy or care about, and thus we can say that Jesus cared "passionately" about us while enduring The Passion.

The strong love that Jesus exhibited in his ministry and on Good Friday is a lesson on what it means to have "compassion" for others. We walk with them in their sufferings; we "suffer with" them. This is passionate love in its holiest form.

Read the scriptures for Passion Sunday with an eye on how they reveal Jesus' passionate love for you.

See yourself in the passion of the people who enthusiastically welcomed Jesus as well as in those who rejected and denied him.

Consider how much compassion Jesus must have felt for you when he subjected himself to the excruciating pains of his final hours. He did this for you despite how much you've hurt him through any lack of compassion for others. Rejoice in his passionate love for you! This will empower you to repent and grow stronger in holy love for others.



Reflect & Discuss:

- Looking at the reading from Isaiah, what are some of the ways that good Christians sometimes beat on Jesus, pluck his beard, and spit on him?
- † How does your answer to #1 explain why Jesus emptied himself for you, as the reading from Philippians describes?
- † In what ways does the Passion of Jesus minister to us in our sufferings today?

Lenten Activity:

Bring to mind the most painful way you are suffering compassionately with or for someone else. Connect this to what Jesus did. How does this help you feel more intimately involved with God's salvation plan? How does it make your life a modern Gospel?






