# A Message from our Pastor Rev. Msgr. Bob Cilinski



"Jesus was left alone with the woman. He said to her, 'Has no one condemned you?' She replied, 'No one, Sir.' He said, 'Neither do I condemn you'" - John 8:11

My dear parishioners,

She was defenseless standing there with her life on the line because of her sin. The law said she should be stoned and people already had rocks in their hands and hatred in their hearts. Jesus found a way through this terrible situation where there didn't seem much hope. One minute she is as good as dead. The next minute she is clothed in the compassion of Jesus. How could this be?

So it is with us. One minute all we have is our shame and guilt of our past sins. And then we come before Jesus and his light surrounds us, and suddenly there is a way, there are many ways, and the road ahead is full of new life. This happens at every Mass, in every confession, in every visit to the Blessed Sacrament. Come to Jesus this week! The sacraments, especially confession, can be our encounter with the compassionate Lord. What a difference Jesus makes in our lives!

The following is a reflection you can use each day this week. If you find it difficult to pray, you might simply imagine God speaking to you. His words might sound something like this:

You don't have to be clever to please Me; all you have to do is want to love Me. Just speak to Me as you would to anyone of whom you are very fond.

Are there people you want to pray for? Tell me their names, and ask as much as you like. Trust Me to do what I know best.

Is there anything you want for your soul? Tell Me if you feel guilty about anything. I will forgive you, but you have to accept My forgiveness.

Tell Me about your self-centeredness, and your laziness. I love you in spite of your faults. Do not hesitate to ask Me for blessings for mind and body. I can give everything you need for a happier, holier life.

Are you afraid of anything? Trust yourself to Me. I am here. I see everything. I will never leave you.

Have you any joys to share with me? What has happened recently to cheer and comfort you?

Are temptations bearing heavily upon you? Yielding to them always disturbs the peace of your soul. Ask Me, and I will help you to overcome them.

Well, go along now. Come back to me soon. Tomorrow I shall have more blessings for you.



# Nativity at Virginia Pro-Life Day

Virginia Pro-Life Day was an opportunity for Nativity parishioners and other pro-life constituents from across Virginia to join together in Richmond to meet with our respective legislators to advocate for LIFE—from the moment of fertilization to Natural death and all stages in between. Our Nativity contingent included Msgr. Bob, Virginia District Co-Captains Rick and Linda Loffredo, Nativity Social Media Director, Mary Castellano, Christine Birden, Anne Bowden and Darren Randall.

Many legislative topics were addressed by our district group. For example, Msgr. Bob pointed out that the Hyde Amendment (which only funds abortion for danger to the life of the mother, rape and incest) has been in place in federal law for 47 years and Virginia should likewise do so like in most other states. In particular, this would strike out the current Virginia provision that discriminates unjustly the targeting for abortion unborn children who "might" be born with disabilities.

Rick Loffredo voiced our opposition to the Extreme Abortion Amendment to the Virginia Constitution co-sponsored by Sen. Foy (D) that would add abortion on-demand with virtually no limits to Virginia's constitution; severely jeopardize the ban on partial-birth abortion and the law requiring parental consent; and force taxpayers to pay for abortion under any circumstance under state-funded programs; lack assurances that abortions be performed by physicians; and potentially allow for sterilization and so-called "sex-change" operations for minors. Darren Randall indicated our opposition to the Senator Foy (D)-sponsored Mandated Coverage of Abortion-Inducing Drugs—health plans should not be forced to cover life-ending drugs. In conclusion, Msgr. Bob suggested that the senator at least consider some middle of the road alternative to the extreme abortion amendment and Rick concluded by advocating for the Delegates Freitas (R) and Griffin (R)-sponsored Protection of Babies Born Alive bill that would save these born children from potential cruel deaths by starvation and exposure that is tragically allowed in Virginia. Separately, Christine Birden discussed at the office of Kathy Tran (D) the increased mental health issues for moms associated with abortion and recommended switching resources from abortion-promoting programs to programs supporting moms and babies.

# Knights of Columbus Frenchy Cyr Memorial Scholarships

Last year, Nativity's Knights of Columbus Council 7992 awarded six Cyr Memorial scholarships for Catholic secondary school tuition (grades 9-12), totaling \$6000.

Scholarships were awarded to: Hannah Ly attending Saint John Paul the Great High School, Cayleigh Marzluff, Abigail Hoenle, Jennifer Dee and Sophia Cassidy attending Bishop Ireton High School, and Will Moorhouse attending Gonzaga College High School for their exemplary academic performance, sustained school and community involvement, and outstanding Church and religious activity participation.

Again, this year six \$1000 scholarships will be awarded with at least one scholarship awarded to a Nativity eighth-grade student. All other entrants, including eighth-grade students, will compete for the remaining five scholarships. Entrants must be registered parishioners at Nativity, or a son, daughter, or grandchild, of an active member of Council 7992.

# **Nativity Students: Steering Along the Path to Success**



Congratulations to our Nativity Seaperch teams who did a fantastic job at the recent regional competition, and especially to the team of Julia, Lucy, Nolan, and Yokie (Yokie was absent as she's still recovering from the flu), who advanced to the second round at the United States Naval Academy (USNA).



There were 84 teams competing; only eight teams were selected to go on to the second round. While they didn't get a high enough score to receive an invitation to nationals, they continued the Nativity tradition of earning a spot in the second round at USNA for the third year in a row! Next year – Nationals!

SeaPerch is an integrated STEM-education program that focuses on hands-on learning by building and operating underwater Remotely Operated Vehicles (ROVs). Students, often in teams, build their own ROVs using a kit of low-cost parts, and then participate in competitions where they navigate their robots through obstacle courses and complete real-world inspired tasks.

The students have lots of fun while putting their STEM knowledge to the test. With activities like this, it's no surprise that Nativity has recently been recognized as an ITEEA STEM School of Excellence.



saías 43, 16-21; Filipenses 3, 8-14; Juan 8, 1-11.

El Evangelio del V domingo de Cuaresma es el episodio de la mujer sorprendida en adulterio a la que Jesús salva de la lapidación. Jesús no pretende con ello decir que el adulterio no es pecado o que es cosa de poco. Existe una condena explícita de ello, si bien delicadísima, en las palabras dirigidas al final a la mujer: «No peques más». Jesús no busca por lo tanto aprobar la acción de la mujer; intenta más bien condenar la actitud de quien siempre está dispuesto a descubrir y denunciar el pecado ajeno. Lo vimos la vez pasada, analizando la actitud de Jesús hacia los pecadores en general.

Pero ahora, como de costumbre, partiendo de este episodio, ampliemos nuestro horizontes examinando la actitud de Jesús hacia el matrimonio y la familia en todo el Evangelio. Entre las muchas tesis extrañas apuntadas sobre Jesús en años recientes, también está la de un Jesús que habría repudiado la familia natural y todos los vínculos parentales en nombre de la pertenencia a una comunidad distinta, en la que Dios es el padre y los discípulos son todos hermanos y hermanas, y habría propuesto a los suyos una vida errante, como hacían en aquel tiempo, fuera de Israel, los filósofos cínicos.

Efectivamente hay en los evangelios palabras de Cristo sobre los vínculos familiares que a primera vista suscitan desconcierto. Jesús dice: «Si alguno viene donde mí y no odia a su padre, a su madre, a su mujer, a sus hijos, a sus hermanos, a sus hermanas y hasta su propia vida, no puede ser discípulo mío» (Lc 14, 26). Palabras duras, ciertamente, pero el evangelista Mateo se apresura a explicar el sentido de la palabra «odiar» en este caso: «El que ama a su padre o a su madre... a su hijo o a su hija más que a mí, no es digno de mí» (Mt 10, 37). Jesús no pide por lo tanto odiar a los padres o a los hijos, sino no amarles hasta el punto de renunciar, por ellos, a seguirle.

Otro episodio que suscita desconcierto. Un día Jesús dijo a uno: « "Sígueme". Aquél respondió: "Déjame ir primero a enterrar a mi padre". Jesús le respondió: "Deja que los muertos entierren a sus muertos; tú vete a anunciar el Reino de Dios"» (Lc 9, 59 s.). iOh, cielos! Ciertos críticos aquí se desatan. iÉsta es una petición escandalosa, una desobediencia a Dios, quien ordena atender a los padres; una clara violación de los deberes filiales!

El escándalo de estos críticos constituye para nosotros una prueba preciosa. Ciertas palabras de Cristo no se explican mientras se le considere un simple hombre, por más que sea excepcional. Sólo Dios puede pedir que se le ame más que al padre y que, para seguirle, se renuncie hasta a acudir a su sepultura. Por lo demás, desde una perspectiva de fe como la de Cristo, ¿qué aprovechaba más al padre del difunto: que su hijo estuviera en casa en aquel momento para sepultar su cuerpo o que siguiera al enviado de ese Dios a quien su alma debía ahora presentarse?

Pero tal vez la explicación en este caso es más sencilla aún. Se sabe que la expresión «Déjame ir primero a enterrar a mi padre» se usaba a veces (como se hace también hoy) para decir: «déjame ir a atender a mi padre mientras esté vivo; cuando muera, lo sepultaré y después te seguiré». Jesús pediría por lo tanto sólo no posponer por tiempo indeterminado la respuesta a su llamada. Muchos de nosotros, religiosos, sacerdotes y religiosas, hemos tenido que hacer la misma elección y a menudo los padres han sido los más felices por esta obediencia nuestra.


El desconcierto ante estas peticiones de Jesús nace en gran parte de no tener en cuenta la diferencia entre lo que Él pedía a todos indistintamente y lo que pedía sólo a algunos llamados a compartir su vida enteramente dedicada al reino, como sucede hoy en la Iglesia.


Hay otros dichos de Jesús que se podrían examinar. Alguno hasta podría acusar a Jesús de ser el responsable de la proverbial dificultad entre suegra y nuera para ponerse de acuerdo, porque dijo: «He venido a enfrentar al hombre con su padre, a la hija con su madre, a la nuera con su suegra» (Mt 10, 35). Pero no es Él quien separará; será la actitud diferente que cada uno adoptará en la familia respecto a Él lo que determinará esta división. Un hecho que se verifica dolorosamente también hoy en muchas familias.

Todas las dudas sobre la actitud de Jesús hacia la familia y el matrimonio caen si tenemos en cuenta todo el Evangelio, y no sólo los pasajes que convienen. Jesús es más riguroso que nadie acerca de la indisolubilidad del matrimonio, subraya con fuerza el mandamiento de honrar al padre y a la madre, hasta condenar la práctica de sustraerse, con pretextos religiosos, al deber de asistirles (Mc 7, 11-13). Cuántos milagros realiza Jesús precisamente para salir al encuentro del dolor de padres (Jairo, el padre del epiléptico), de madres (la cananea, o la viuda de Naím), o de parientes (las hermanas de Lázaro), por lo tanto, para honrar los vínculos de parentesco. Él incluso en más de una ocasión comparte el dolor de parientes hasta llorar con ellos.

En un momento como el actual, en que todo parece conspirar para debilitar los vínculos y los valores de la familia, iya sólo faltaría que pusiéramos contra ella también a Jesús y el Evangelio! Pero ésta es una de las muchas extrañezas sobre Cristo que debemos conocer para no dejarnos impresionar cuando oigamos hablar de nuevos descubrimientos sobre los evangelios. Jesús ha venido a devolver al matrimonio a su belleza originaria (Mt 19, 4-9), para reforzarlo, no para debilitarlo.









Isn't it a challenge, living in the midst of our "throwaway culture," for those who are "full of years" to understand our place in the world — and in our Church? Join Fr. 


