





# The Mosaic Panels of the Seven Corporal Works of Mercy



#### Below is a description of each panel from left to right:

*Feed the Hungry* - Wheat and grapes, simple foods but also the physical signs of the Eucharist.

Give Drink to the Thirsty - A drink of flowing water and the waters of Baptism.

Shelter the Homeless - A door Jesus said, "I AM the door, I stand at the door and knock."

*Clothe the Naked* - A robe, a ring, and sandals are physical clothing, but also the symbolic items the father gave the prodigal son.

*Visit the Sick* - A red cross and oil representing physical visiting, keeping vigil, and spiritual anointing.

*Visit the Imprisoned* - Chains and bars are physical restraints that can also represent the prison of sin.

**Bury the Dead** - A funeral pall draped over coffin, the Easter Candle, and prayers for the dead.

#### On This Date in Nativity History 29 March 1982

Nativity Council of the Knights of Columbus was officially instituted on March 29, 1982, the Centennial Founders' Day of the Order. The officers were installed a week later on April 6, following a Mass by the Council's first Chaplain, Father Frank Ready. Brother Clarence "Frenchy" Cyr was the first Grand Knight. The Nativity Council began with 57 charter Knights, of whom 32 were new members. The new Council set two goals: increase the Council's membership by involving more men from Nativity Parish, and charity. The Council's first charitable endeavor was to raise funds for the Knights of Virginia Assisting the Intellectually Disabled, or KOVAR. That first year's drive collected \$2,348. (The recent photo below shows Knights Bill Canavan and Carlos Perez raising money for KOVAR.)

Efforts to support Pro-Life work (particularly the annual March for Life in Washington, D.C.) and the Northern Virginia Training Center (a State facility for the developmentally challenged) followed soon after. Other highlights of that first year included the Parish Picnic, a Columbus Day Dinner Dance, and an Open House membership drive, which brought in 19 new members. In November, Brothers built a specially designed playground for the 200 physically limited children at the Key School on Franconia Road. In December, the Council hosted the first CCD Teacher Breakfast for the 150 CCD teachers and their spouses to show their appreciation for the men and women who give so much of their time for the children of Nativity Parish.

#### **Knights of Columbus Frenchy Cyr Memorial Scholarships**





#### Step 1: Paperwork

- 1. Copy of child's Birth Certificate

- 3. Completed Baptism Application. Scheduling the date of the Baptism will take place ONLY after these items are received.

- Nativity requires at least six months of marriage preparation prior to the wedding, beginning with your initial contact with your parish priest.
- Most couples will be asked to take the FOCCUS premarital inventory. It is a tool designed to help engaged couples learn more about themselves and their relationship.
- ♦ Each couple marrying in the Diocese of Arlington is required to attend a marriage preparation conference such as Engaged Encounter or Conference for the Engaged.
- Nativity strongly encourages couples to attend Natural Family Planning (NFP) classes. This method of fertility respects the integrity of your marriage and the dignity of the spouses.
- The preparing priest or deacon can assist you in preparing the liturgy, readings, music, and other elements for your wedding.



Do you hesitate because you don't yet understand how the deaths in your life (the sacrifices, the lost hope, the broken relationships, etc.) have been resurrected into new life?

Such hesitation was the mental state of the disciples on the first Easter morning, as depicted in the Gospel of John.


The attitude of Peter in the reading from Acts is quite a contrast! The disciples now know their calling: They were empowered and commissioned to testify that Jesus is the Savior, and they fully embraced this vocation.

Do you understand how Jesus is turning your tragedies and other difficulties into triumphs and great blessings?

To "testify" means to share the truth based on your own experiences. Peter specifically proclaimed that everyone who believes in Jesus receives forgiveness of sins. Of course he did! Peter knew first-hand what it's like to need and then receive Christ's forgiveness.

We will not understand much about how our sufferings have led us to a new and blessed life until we start talking about it. The first inklings of insight awaken when we discuss it within our close, holy friendships, like Mary of Magdala did when she ran to Peter and John after discovering the empty tomb. They, in turn, told the other disciples.

It was while they were together - in community - that Jesus appeared and revealed his resurrection to them. Later, after having lots of time to talk about it with friends, the Holy Spirit



empowered them to go out and evangelize the world by sharing their experiences with anyone willing to listen.

#### Reflect & Discuss:

- † The empty tomb doesn't immediately make sense. What has been confusing to you during your faith journey? What has caused you to feel empty and frightened? Where might Jesus be in this?
- + How have your own experiences of being forgiven enabled you to feel more compassionate toward others? Does that change the way you talk to them about God and church and other spiritual or moral issues?
- † What is the biggest change that Jesus has brought into your life? What were you like before this change? How did God intervene? What were the results? This is your testimony. Practice sharing it by telling the story to your community of friends.







Hermanos, seguimos celebrando la alegría y el gozo inmenso de la Vigilia Pascual: ¡Ha resucitado el Señor! ¡Aleluya! ¡Feliz Pascua 2008! ¡El Señor ha pasado de la muerte a la vida! ¡Aleluya! Hoy, amigos, con la Resurrección de Cristo, esta mañana nos trae una gran alegría: el día eterno que estamos llamados a disfrutar todos. Estamos alegres porque, la victoria de Cristo, nos trae una forma nueva a la hora de entender y comprender el mundo, las personas, la vida, el amor, la justicia, etc. Para vivir esta realidad, como el discípulo, hemos de aventurarnos y asomarnos al sepulcro. Es decir;

si tenemos ojos para tantas cosas del mundo, ¡cómo no los vamos a tener para asombrarnos ante el acontecimiento de la Pascua de Resu-

rrección!

¿Qué existe el dolor? ¿Qué nos sacuden sucesos que enturbian nuestra felicidad? ¿Qué no todo marcha bien? ¡Por supuesto! Pero, la Resurrección de Cristo, nos da la fuerza necesaria para dar luz a esas situaciones. La Resurrección de Cristo no nos resuelve de un plumazo todo aquello que atenta a nuestro bienestar, pero nos sitúa por encima para que seamos capaces de enfrentarnos y darle solución.

En este día de Pascua damos gracias a Dios por tres cosas fundamentalmente:
