#### We need Cookies for the next Prison Kairos Weekend April 17-21

<u>Please drop off Cookies in the kitchen at the Nativity Office by</u> <u>Tuesday, April 16 at the latest</u>. The types of cookies that are generally acceptable are: Oatmeal, Peanut Butter, Molasses, Chocolate Chip, Ginger & Sugar. Cookies should be between 2" and 2-1/2" in diameter and not more than 1/2" thick. It is very important not to use icing, sugar or any other type of coating on the outside of the cookie. Do not add any kind of fruit or nuts to the cookies.

<u>The Key Ingredient:</u> Pray individually or as a family. Ask God to use your cookies as a source of His love to shine on the prisoners and staff on the Kairos weekend.



Fairfax County recently celebrated the beauty of natural darkness with Lights Out Fairfax. DarkSky International (DSI) likewise celebrated International Dark Sky Week from April 2-8. DSI defines light pollution as "the inappropriate or excessive use of artificial light which can have serious environmental consequences for humans, wildlife, and our climate. It's caused by the excessive and inefficient use of artificial light at night." Fairfax County notes that, " Dark skies are the historic and natural state of nature. Over time humans have increased the amount of light shining into the sky all night long. This disruption of excessive light has robbed us of our stars and endangered the nature around us. We can have dark skies again if we can learn to control light pollution with responsible outdoor lighting practices." To learn more about the effects of light pollution as well as the economic, safety, human and wildlife benefits of dark sky conservation, check out the webpages of DarkSky International and Fairfax County--Dark Skies. 

Jesus knew his apostles well. He knew some felt shame and remorse for having denied and abandoned him. However, His sign of peace let them know that they were forgiven and that He still loved them. Our Divine Savior continues to offer Himself

in peace and forgiveness to us all.

How can we find this peace in Christ? What if you have doubts? What if you're angry? What if life has been challenging, and things don't seem fair? What if you feel abandoned and God doesn't seem to be answering your prayers? What if you feel guilty because of sin and mistakes? Christ's peace and unconditional love are offered to all, especially to you.

First, ask the Holy Spirit to open your heart and tell him in your own words that you need Jesus and want Him to help. "Apart from me, you can't do anything," says the Lord (Jn. 15:5). Then, read the Bible, go to Confession, and nourish your soul with Holy Communion.

Prayer is another crucial element in reaching interior peace, as it raises your mind and heart to God in a relationship of love, trust, and peace. God wants to hear from you! He wants to hear about your praise, thankfulness, frustrations, anger, worries, needs, and repentance.

Many people begin with standard memorized prayers and then move into more honest, intimate conversations. Meditative prayer can be fruitful as well, like praying with Scripture,



spiritual books, or the Rosary.

To hear back from God, we must listen. Begin by letting go of all the busy conversation and spiritual reading and just sit silently in love and total surrender with our Lord. The goal is to bask

in His glory, trusting His holy will in all things.

Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta once said, "The fruit of silence is prayer. The fruit of prayer is faith. The fruit of faith is love. The fruit of love is service. The fruit of service is peace." May the peace of our Lord be with you always.

#### Reflect & Discuss:

- + What matters are troubling you that you can bring to prayer?
- As Christ displayed patience with the disciples' lack of understanding and unbelief, how has he been patient with you? How are you patient with others?
- How does the virtue of forgiveness lead to peace?
- How has Christ's resurrection made a difference in your life? Since Jesus calls us to do so, how can we share the literal truth of the Resurrection, and how can we witness this in our lives?

### ¿QUÉ HEMOS HECHO DEL DOMINGO? 3º Pascua (B) Javier Leoz

¿Tenéis algo qué comer?

A los de Emaús, y a los discípulos, atormentados, temerosos o llenos de dudas, Jesús se les apareció para fortalecerles y abrirles los ojos en aquello que tanto insistió antes de su pasión y muerte: la resurrección.



Sus visiones posteriores, especialmente en la fracción del pan, no pretendieron otra cosa sino darles muestras de que El era en persona. Que todo lo anunciado se cumplía. Que, aquel Señor que había compartido confidencias y paseos, sufrimientos y alegrías, se presentaba en medio ofreciéndoles lo que el mundo no da: paz.

Desde entonces, cada domingo, para los cristianos -no solamente es el Día del Señor- es el momento en el que ponemos en paz todas las cosas: las de cada uno, las de los demás y las de todos con Dios. ¿Qué hemos hecho del domingo? Es una interpelación que debiera de marcar la conciencia de todo católico. De los que venimos a la Eucaristía y de aquellos que, por diversas razones, la han dejado. ¿Qué hemos hecho con el Día del Señor?

2. Recientemente, en las más altas capas de decisiones políticas de Europa, se hablaba de la necesidad de recuperar el Domingo como algo constitutivo y genuino del viejo continente. Entre otras cosas porque, el domingo, corre el riesgo de quedarse en un día ordinario. En una jornada que ya no está marcada por el descanso, la familia o el realizar algo extraordinario. Muchos, y con razón, comienzan la semana diciendo: "estoy más cansado que el viernes". Y es que, desde diversas vertientes, se nos insta -consciente o inconscientemente- a ensalzar aspectos deportivos, de ocio o de simple holganza, en detrimento del valor sagrado.

¿A qué se debe? Ni más ni menos que hemos olvidado lo que ha sido motivación y algo sagrado de este séptimo día: además del descanso, el glorificar a Dios.

Sorprendía, no hace muchos días, una campaña lanzada por la Iglesia de Norte-América: "Es hora de volver". Con ello, a través de la televisión, invitaban a los católicos alejados de la práctica dominical, a volver a la casa del Señor. A la Eucaristía. A la escucha de la Palabra.

Tal vez estamos en un momento, muy apropiado, para insistir en los nuestros, en nuestras familias, a nuestros hijos o vecinos sobre una realidad: para que el Señor aparezca en nuestra vida cotidiana, tenemos que sentarnos de nuevo a escuchar su Palabra. Reconquistar el sentido cristiano del Domingo. Dejar a un lado (o combinarlas con la fe) ciertas actividades que entorpecen o ensombrecen lo más genuino de este día: la referencia a Dios.

El Domingo, bien vivido y celebrado, es una posibilidad para encontrarnos frente a frente con el resucitado. Es un cauce para hallar la paz interior y exterior. Es motivo de fiesta y de alegría. De cantar y expresar lo que la Pascua fluye por sus cuatro costados: la presencia de Jesucristo muerto y resucitado.

Paz a vosotros!
