My dear parishioners,



A Message from the Nativity Creation Care Ministry

Creation Care Ministry wishes to thank Youth Minister Rebecca Judge, Handy Knight Bob Colella, this year's teen WorkCampers and their parent volunteers for the opportunity to work together on a service day in preparation for WorkCamp this summer! Seven Creation Care Ministry volunteers worked alongside the workcampers in Nativity's St Kateri Habitats to refurbish the existing spaces with additional plants and leaf mulch. The St. Kateri Habitat program is a certification process for Catholic lands, including homes, that are using sustainable gardening techniques. Their website states, "Anyone can begin to transform their home, school, workplace, or parish church into a healthy habitat for people and wildlife. It can be as simple as planting a tree, cultivating a vegetable garden, or growing wildflowers for bees and butterflies." Our original St. Kateri Habitat space is in the front of the church in the parking lot and five parking lot islands in the back of the church are also now designated in this way. Collectively these spaces offer habitat to expand the biodiversity of Nativity's campus in support of Pope Francis' encyclical, Laudato Si. Perhaps the most entertaining moments of the work camp day were when students took on the role of God, St. Francis and Sister Catherine in a conversation about how "Suburbanites" have replaced his intended biodiver-sity with green triangles of lawn. While the native plants that students planted take time to become established, ultimately they will benefit native pollinators and add beauty to our campus. First they sleep (grow roots), next they creep (present as small plants), and then they leap (see our front garden!) Students also used power tools and hard work to rebuild several of the vegetable gardens and refurbished the others under the careful eyes of Bob Colella, parent volunteers, and Creation Care vegetable garden leaders, Linda Nordstrom and Marilyn Dorner. Come to the base of the parking lot to take a look at their handiwork!

The theme for the day was a quote from Bill Patenaude, board member of the St. Kateri Conservation Center and author of the Catholic Ecology blog. He said, "Perhaps, before we can care our global common home, we must first love and value and nurture our own corners of creation." Our church campus, our homes and the homes that the workcampers will assist with are indeed "our own corners of creation."





Saturday, April 27 Acts 13:44-52 Ps 98:1-4 Jn 14:7-14 As a child, I always loved hearing about Jesus the Good Shepherd and seeing pictures of our Lord holding His staff in one hand, surrounded by a herd of fluffy sheep, and with one wayward sheep always curled around His shoulders. I was comforted by this image of Jesus, who loved all His sheep, even those who lost their way and took off in the wrong direction.

This parable offers a much deeper meaning to me now as an adult. Jesus is the Good Shepherd who laid down His life to help me – a sinner who is so prone to going astray. He suffered, died on the cross, and rose from the dead to lead me and all of God's children (His sheep) on the right path to heaven.

He knows me by name and restores my soul with grace from the Sacraments. He safeguards my steps from the snares of the Evil One through the guidance and wisdom of the Holy Spirit alive in the one, holy, Catholic, and apostolic Church. He sometimes allows me to make wrong turns, but because I know and love Him, I can trust that

He is always right there, ready to bring me back into the fold.

Through the living waters of Baptism and the gift of the Holy Spirit, Christians are called and empowered to become like Jesus and be good shepherds, too. In His image, we must forgive those who are lost and do our part to bring them back into God's embrace. We must live our lives in joy and compassion for others – especially the poor, the downcast, and the lost – who most need God's mercy. Trusting in the wise voice and directions of the Good Shepherd, we



must never be afraid to speak God's truth and wisdom with love and grace to correct those who are astray and having trouble finding their way. As worthy shepherds, we must pray for courage to stay loyal to Christ, the Good Shepherd, in our everyday thoughts, words, and actions, whether alone, with family, at work, at church, in politics, in science, or interacting with media.

Remember that Jesus and the Church have been associated with controversy from the beginning, but He promises victory in the end. We must hold on tightly in faith, help others know and love Christ, and shepherd them into the loving gate of our Savior.

Reflect & Discuss:

- In which areas of your life do you most need shepherding to stay on the right path to heaven?
- How are you being a good shepherd to the poor, downcast, and lost?
- What are some ways we can hear the voice of the Good Shepherd? How can we protect ourselves from being snatched by Satan?
- How do we lay down our lives for others when we are a good shepherd?

Le han matado a su Señor y ella no pudo socorrerle. Sus gritos en medio de la multitud no sirvieron de nada y en seguida los sofocaron con golpes y empujones. ¡No había podido hacer nada por Jesús! Seguirle en silencio y acompañarle de pie junto a la cruz. Y nada más.

Lloraba recordando, en cambio, lo bueno que había sido Jesús con ella aquel día en la casa de Simón, la paz que le había inundado siempre al lado del Maestro, su mirada bondadosa y limpia, aquella seguridad... Pero ya todo había acabado. Sus enemigos habían vencido y se habían desecho de Él y ahora ni siquiera le permitían a ella ungir como era debido el cuerpo del Señor.

Ella había creído que ya nunca podría llorar más. Que, después de la muerte de Jesús, quedaría insensible a cualquier otro dolor. Pero sí, aquello era demasiado. ¡Ya no tenía a Cristo! ¡Ni siquiera su cuerpo! Se lo habían quitado. Sintió rabia, amargura, odio, nostalgia. Todo a la vez.

Se le aparecen de pronto unos ángeles, pero ella ni se inmuta. ¿Qué le importa todo si ha perdido a Cristo? Jesús en persona se le acerca. No le oye llegar. Él se insinúa. Nada: está tan inmersa en su desesperación que no distingue la voz de Cristo hasta que Él mismo se le revela.

Ella se arroja sin dudarlo un instante a los pies de Cristo, los abraza llorando de alegría y en un instante cree entender todo lo que había pasado. Nosotros, mientras tanto, observémosla.

Ahí está María, de la que Jesús había expulsado siete demonios. Cristo le había perdonado sus muchos pecados porque ella había amado mucho. Y porque Jesús le había perdonado demasiado pensó que, en adelante, jamás podría decir que ella le amaba ya bastante.

Es una mujer y le ama como ella es: con sencillez, con naturalidad, con esos pequeños detalles que dejan la impronta de una alma delicada. No se le habían presentado oportunidades especiales, pero tampoco había perdido ninguna ocasión para demostrar a Jesús su cariño y su eterno agradecimiento por haberla salvado.

Con fina intuición esta mujer había experimentado que nada era comparable con la posesión de Cristo, con su amistad, con la paz que Él irradia. Y que, por ello, no existe peor tragedia que perderle o disgustarle.

Sólo se había equivocado en un detalle: creía que había perdido a Cristo, que se lo habían quitado. Y nadie pierde a Cristo "sin querer", como extraviamos un llavero o un reloj. María, en realidad lo llevaba muy, pero que muy vivo en su alma. Por eso se había levantado de madrugada. Por eso lloraba.

Quien se sienta triste porque le parece encontrarse lejos de Cristo, tenga esperanza. Si estuviese tan lejos como el demonio le sugiere, ninguna pena le daría. Una de dos: o ya tiene a Cristo o lo está tocando ya. Bastará, como hizo María, darse la vuelta, actuar como si ya lo hubiese hallado y descubrir la presencia de Cristo que le dice: "No me buscarías, si no me hubieses encontrado ya".

¿CÓMO PODÍA USARSE una piedra angular después de que los maestros habían decidido que no funcionaría? Un amigo que se dedica a la construcción me ayudó a encontrar la respuesta: el constructor dedidió qué piedrasfuncionarían en términos de tamaño, color y ubicación. Pero incluso si el constructor había rechazado una determinada piedra, el cantero podía ayudar al constructor a revaluar esa decisión. La decisión de usar algo antes rechazado puede surgir por el tamaño o el color determinado que le daría el edificio una fortaleza o belleza única más allá de lo típico.

Jesús, carismático y poderoso, representó una nueva manera de relacionarse con Dios y con los demás más allá de lo que gente habí visto. Jesú, rechazado por la religión de los fariseos y maestros de "acá no pasó nada", fue "revaluado" por todo el que buscaba la vida hermosa que él prometió: la cercanía personal a Dios y el amor compasivo por los demás. 1.Seguimos en este tiempo de la Pascua atónitos y deslumbrados por los fulgores de la Resurrección de Cristo. Con la oración, Jesús, nos señala la vía que hemos de escoger para no perdernos en las noches oscuras de la vida. Con la oración sentimos la necesidad de entrar en diálogo con Aquel que nos ama, que nos comprende y que nos quiere tal y como somos.




