

What a beautiful metaphor Christ shared in the Upper Room! Jesus was trying to help His disciples understand the gift of Divine Grace and how the lives of Christians must stay joined to the glorified life of Jesus to be nourished, sustained, and grow to fruitfulness.

Like any master gardener of a vineyard, God our Father delights in each of us whom He plants in His garden. He is passionate about our growth, and He wants us to reach the fruitful potential of our souls in this life so that we may fulfill our purpose in His vineyard here on earth.

He fertilizes the soil to help us grow. He waters, weeds, and prunes our vines to help us become all we were meant to be. God knows the beautiful fruitfulness and growth that we can experience in His perfect plan. He watches over each of His vines with loving care.

Our souls are made to be the perfect reflection of Christ. God the Father, with the help of the Holy Spirit, watches over us with loving guidance and protection and wants our souls to grow in love and holiness.

There are times in the garden of our lives when enemies slip in and threaten the beauty and very existence of our spiritual lives. If one isn't careful, bad soil, pests, predators, parasites, dryness, and weeds can be very destructive. We will only bear fruit if we are pruned of everything unhealthy to our souls, and we must be sure to cling fast to the vine of Christ who strengthens us.



Our spiritual lives are dependent on the gift of Divine Grace and our souls are nourished and sustained by the love of Christ. It is vital that we trust Him with our whole hearts to do whatever is needed in our lives for our best growth. We must trust Christ and always stick close to Him.

As much as plants need air, sunshine, and water, a branch is just as reliant upon the vine. Without the vine – Jesus – our souls will shrivel and die. Letting go of our own selfish wills – by fully surrendering to God's Holy Will and trusting His pruning and weeding in our lives – will surely help our souls blossom, bear fruit, and become all we were made to be by our Father.

Encontrarse con Cristo Resucitado desde el corazón de María Reflexiones María

¿Qué sentía María en esos momentos? ¿qué pensaba? ¿qué recuerdos le venían a la memoria? ¿qué le decía a Jesús? ¿cuál era su experiencia interior?

Los seres humanos tenemos capacidad de sintonizar con los sentimientos de otra persona, penetrarlos y hasta cierto punto apropiarlos. Podemos ponernos en el lugar del otro, comprender sus emociones y sentimientos y sentir juntamente con él.

Es posible conectar con el otro y participar de su experiencia interior. Esto abre un mundo maravilloso en la vida de oración. Con la ayuda de la gracia, es un modo de hacer oración contemplativa.

Ciertamente la empatía tiene sus límites, pues la experiencia personal será siempre personal; las vivencias de cada uno serán siempre propias y únicas.

¿En qué consiste esta "oración por empatía"?

Por ejemplo, en este tiempo litúrgico, consiste en centrar nuestra atención en la Virgen María y tratar de sintonizar con los sentimientos de María durante la pasión, muerte y resurrección de Jesús. He empleado esta modalidad de oración durante el triduo pascual y lo sigo aplicando ahora en la pascua. Me está ayudando mucho.

Tratar de meterse al corazón de la Madre de Jesús y Madre nuestra mientras en silencio y soledad acompaña a su Hijo en cada momento de su pasión y en su resurrección. Algunas preguntas que ayudan: ¿qué sentía María en esos momentos? ¿qué pensaba? ¿qué recuerdos le venían a la memoria? ¿qué le decía a Jesús? ¿qué escuchaba? ¿cuáles eran sus actitudes? ¿cuál era su experiencia interior?

Detenerse en cada paso, sin prisa. Un día se puede tomar una escena, otro día otra. O permanecer durante varios días en la que más ayude a cada uno. Este modo de orar supone un fuerte cultivo de la capacidad de escucha.

Se trata de contemplar y sentir profundo

No hacen falta muchos pensamientos, se trata de contemplar y sentir profundo, identificándose con la oración de María: durante la última cena, durante la oración en el huerto, cuando fue apresado, cuando estaba en la cárcel, cuando fue condenado a muerte, cuando subía el Calvario con la cruz a cuestas, cuando fue crucificado, durante su agonía, cuando expiró, cuando resucitó, cuando encontró a María en el huerto, cuando se apareció a los suyos...

Gozar con Cristo Resucitado desde el corazón de María

Desde el Sábado Santo me ha ayudado mucho gozar con Cristo Resucitado desde el corazón de su Madre. En la resurrección de Jesús confluyen:

1. El amor del Padre que lleno de conmoción vio morir a su Hijo diciendo: "Todo está cumplido" (Jn 19,30), "Padre, en tus manos encomiendo mi espíritu" (Lc 23,45). Con la Resurrección, el Padre respondió a la súplica de Jesús en el huerto: ¡Abbá, Padre!; todo es posible para ti; aparta de mi este cáliz (Mc 14,36).

2. El poder del Espíritu de amor que hace nuevas todas las cosas (Ap 21,5)


3. La pasión de amor de Cristo por el hombre que quiere permanecer siempre a su lado: "Yo estaré con vosotros hasta la consumación de los tiempos." (Mt 28,20)

Y María participa en la Resurrección de Cristo con su dolor y su esperanza

Con la muerte de Jesús parecia fracasar la esperanza de cuantos confiaron en Él. Aquella fe nunca dejó de faltar completamente, sobre todo en el corazón de la Virgen María, la Madre de Jesús, la llama quedó encendida con viveza también en la oscuridad de la noche. (Benedicto XVI, 8 de abril de 2012) y a través de la experiencia transformante de la Pascua de su Hijo, se convierte en Madre de la Iglesia, o sea, de cada uno de los creyentes y de toda la comunidad. (Benedicto XVI, Regina Coeli, 9 de abril 2012)
