THE SOLEMNITY OF THE ASCENSION "Then he led them (out) as far as Bethany, raised his hands, and blessed them. As he blessed them he parted from them and was taken up to heaven. In an effort to embrace and welcome the neurodiverse members of our community, Nativity Catholic Church is hosting a monthly Sensory Mass on the second Sunday of every month at the 1:00 pm Mass. All are welcome to attend! A special invitation is extended to any person in need of sensory accommodations.

A Sensory Mass requires a welcoming stigma-free environment and accommodations to help reduce over-stimulation and sensory overload. The Mass will include softer music, dimmer lighting, pictorial resources, and self-regulation tools for those with special needs. Families are encouraged to bring any regulation tool (noise reduction items, quiet fidgets, flexible seating items, weighted objects, etc.) that can support focused attention and provide comfort to a person so they can feel safe in their environment and they can better participate in the Holy Mass.

Help Defund Planned Parenthood, the Nation's Largest Abortion Provider

As reported by liveaction.org: Over the past decade, Planned Parenthood has reported a 20% increase in abortions performed in its facilities, while its legitimate healthcare services have drastically declined. Despite this, taxpayer funding to the organization has skyrocketed to nearly \$800 million annually, reaching the highest levels in history.

Planned Parenthood claims to prioritize healthcare, but its own reports tell a different story:

• Abortions have increased to a record 402,230 children killed annually, while other services like prenatal care, cancer screenings, and contraceptive services have plummeted.

• The organization's client numbers have dropped by 30%, and the number of facilities has decreased by 25% over the past decade.

• Meanwhile, Planned Parenthood has accumulated billions in assets and profited over \$178 million in just one year. Furthermore, the organization has been accused of multiple abuses, including Medicaid fraud, misleading marketing, failure to report child sexual abuse, and discrimination.

If all of this weren't enough, Planned Parenthood has also positioned itself as one of the foremost providers of so-called "gender affirming care," offering cross-sex hormones to minors, as young as 16 years old, with little to no evaluation.

The facts are clear: Planned Parenthood's services are declining, their profits are rising, and their abuses are mounting. It is unjust and unethical for American taxpayers to continue funding this organization at over \$1.9 million every single day.



;LA META? ;EL CIELO! VII Pascua (ASCENSION) Javier Leoz

"Hablen ustedes un poco más del cielo....que no nos dicen nada". Así se expresaba una joven al finalizar una misa por un fallecido. Y es que, queriendo o sin querer, ocultamos verdades como un templo o, por lo menos, se diluyen como el azúcar en el agua. Lo cierto es que, así como es fácil hablar de las cosas de la tierra ante el auditorio, no lo es tanto hablar de aquello que no conocemos pero en lo que sí creemos: LA CIMA QUE NOS AGUARDA. EL CIELO.

1.La Pascua va tocando a su fin. Jesús, que después de donarse generosamente por nosotros, murió y resucitó, en la solemnidad de la Ascensión está llamado a vivir definitivamente en la presencia de Dios.

Con Dios estuvo, unido en la tierra, pero –ahora físicamente y cara a cara- rodeado por la gloria celeste, disfruta de la vida de Dios, con Dios y en Dios. ¡Felicidades, Jesús! ¡Tu fidelidad y tu entrega te hacen digno de este premio, de este buen final!

En ese ascenso de Cristo hacia el cielo, nos deja marcado un surco para que, los que aspiramos a vivir en esa gloria de Dios, no nos desviemos. Jesús, al entrar en el cielo, señala una puerta abierta a todos los que creemos en El y vivimos en El. 


