Excerpt from Fr. Bob's Anniversary homily, June 11th, 2023.

"Fifty years ago, this weekend, a group of Catholic families began a journey as they formed a procession from their homes where they united themselves as believers in the praise and thanksgiving of God. They placed themselves in the company of friends, neighbors and even strangers, to respond to Gods call. They gathered to form a new parish named Nativity Catholic Church with their pastor, Fr. Frank Ready. They marked themselves with the sign of the cross as that first Mass began, held at Hunt Valley School. Fr. Ready told them, *"the Holy Spirit will guide us."* The Feast that day was Pentecost. Today we have the privilege of celebrating the Eucharist together in thanksgiving to God for all the blessings and graces of the past 50 years. The word Eucharist means," thanksgiving."

The Eucharist has been celebrated faithfully to this moment. It is the source of life and love that unites and strengthens the people of God here at Nativity. Today's feast of Corpus Christi reminds us of the enduring presence of Jesus in every Mass and in the Most Blessed Sacrament. Ordinary bread and wine become extraordinary. By faith and by fact bread and wine are transformed into Christ's Body and Blood. Christ becomes small, he becomes bread. He humbles himself so he might feed us with his divinity and holiness. Not only is the bread and wine changed, but we are changed into the body of Christ. St Augustine said: *"We become what we eat."* We are transformed into Christ's body here on earth. We are living tabernacles. When we greet and love each other, we are loving Christ.

Recently Bishop Burbidge blessed and consecrated this new altar which along with the renovated sanctuary, pulpit and tabernacle reminds us that our worship should be inspiring and beautiful. The Second Vatican Council called for the full and active participation of the faithful in our liturgy and in the life of the parish. It all begins with the Mass. We see this full participation in the women and men who share in our vibrant and varied music ministry, dedicated lectors and extraordinary ministers of the eucharist, greeters, ushers, sacristans and 120 altar servers, boys and girls

At the end of Mass we are sent out to bring the love of Christ made present in the Eucharist to a world so in need of Christ's love. Through the efforts of over 60 ministries headed by dedicated parishioners and dynamic staff, we seek to build up a community of faith.

Our Catholic Blue Ribbon School of Excellence is at full capacity led by our Principal Ms. Kelly and dedicated teachers. Our Religious Education Program directed by the Sisters and 250 catechists help our children grow in their faith. Through their efforts thousands and thousands of children receive their sacraments and are given a foundation from which to build their lives as Christs disciples. The RCIA welcomes many new members into the church each year. Bible studies and prayer groups provide the energy of the Holy Spirit to inspire us and sanctify our souls.

Caring for the poor is a charism of this parish. To serve those most in need of God's love we generously provide substantial support to Catholic Charities and its St. Lucy Food Drive. We build homes in Haiti through Operation Starfish and in Appalachia with the Knights of Columbus. You are always so generous to the Bishop's Lenten Appeal and Catholic Charities Christmas collection. We sacrifice for our weekly offertory that supports the ministry of this parish because we believe in and value what we are doing as worthy of our support.

We are Pro-Life and Pro-Family. Marriage Enrichment provides date nights and events that affirm marriage and encourage spiritual growth. You seek to respond compassionately to the sick and those who experience difficult times. We are a welcoming and joyful community. We live the joy of the Gospel.

God can't love you any more than he does. He became one with us and one of us in the incarnation. His Nativity is a joy... a joy to the world. He is available to you all the time. The Lord's particular love for you is unbelievable. You need to know this. God became a child. You are the children of God. He gives you every gift you need. God is beautiful. He is better than you think. He is amazing. He seeks your love... Those who have trouble believing that God loves you.... Jesus counters that in the Eucharist. Eucharist is the sacrament of divine love. This act of supreme love is prolonged through the Eucharist. Jesus calls us to be His friend's. While we were still sinners, He died for us. We are God's joy. We are not trash, garbage, we are His joy. He says you are my friends. It belongs to friends to want to share life together... to be together. 50 Years, it's a long time. But for people in love, time flies.

Today we celebrate the people of the parish who have faithfully celebrated the Eucharist and strive to live the Gospel. We rejoice in this Jubilee Year. The procession that began 50 years ago ultimately leads us to heaven and the great communion of saints. We remember our beloved who have gone before us in faith. We pray for them and count on their prayers for us. As your pastor, I am beaming with joy of our parish family. I am so proud of you. Nativity, a community of love, compassion, joy, and generosity. Who wouldn't want to be part of that. We go into the future and the next 50 years renewed with the confidence that Fr. Ready expressed at the first Nativity Mass. "The Holy Spirit will guide you." The Blessed Mother will intercede for us. And Jesus is always with us, especially in the Eucharist.

All has been accomplished by God's grace and the inspired works of so many. Everyone's efforts, priest and people, sisters and deacons, and talented staff have brought us to this day. Today we remember, and rejoice and give thanks. Congratulations, Happy Anniversary!"

In this Sunday's Gospel reading, notice how strongly Jesus was moved by the needs of the people. His heart ached for them, because he knew they felt troubled and abandoned. What's surprising, however. is how he Although he responded.

likened them to sheep without a shepherd, and elsewhere he describes himself as the Good Shepherd, instead of taking action as that shepherd, he immediately turned to his disciples and called them to do the work!

Today, there are many who suffer troubles and feel abandoned because not enough is being done to help them. So, when we see a parish lacking a pastor, or a ministry lacking a shepherd, or a need lacking a ministry, we do as Jesus tells us to do: We beg the master of the harvest to send forth more laborers. And Jesus taps us on the shoulder and says, "You do it."

We ask God to increase the number of priest vocations, because there are too few men entering the seminary. And Jesus says, "Don't just pray, get up and do some of the work! You have a vocation, too!"

The reason why many people feel that God hasn't answered their prayers (and has therefore abandoned them) is because Jesus responds to their needs through us — and too few of us are giving him a free hand to use. We don't have enough lay people assisting the priests we do have. We don't have enough Christians standing up against injustices and other



evils, and so of course, to many who suffer, God seems distant and uncaring.

Jesus was one man serving a whole nation, and he accomplished much in only three years because of the apostles who assisted him. The harvest needs collaborators. There are a few things that only a priestshepherd can do; everything else can be done by his assistants, under his guidance, so that all needs are met. This is how the Church is made whole and holy and effective in evangelization.

Reflect & Discuss:

- What has Jesus asked you to do as an extension of himself?
- Which of his gifts are you using to help in the work of his kingdom?
- Which gifts has he given you that you're not using? Why not?
- What would our Church be like if everyone became an extension of Jesus using the gifts and talents that God has given them? How would this change the face of your parish?

¡Gracias, Señor, por este maravilloso regalo de tu amor hacia mí! Reflexiones Eucaristía Solemnidad del Corpus Christi. La Eucaristía es el sacramento por excelencia de la Iglesia, porque brotó del amor redentor de Jesucristo.

Hay, en Tierra Santa, un pueblecito llamado Tabga. Está situado junto a la ribera del lago Tiberíades, en el corazón de la Galilea. Y se halla a los pies del monte de las Bienaventuranzas. La Galilea es una región de una gran belleza natural, con sus verdes colinas, el lago de azul intenso y una fértil vegetación. Este rincón, que es como la puerta de entrada a Cafarnaúm, goza todo el año de un entorno exuberante. Es, precisamente en esta aldea, donde la tradición ubica el hecho histórico de la multiplicación de los panes realizada por Jesús.

Ya desde el siglo IV los cristianos construyeron aquí una iglesia y un santuario, y aun hoy en día se pueden contemplar diversos elementos de esa primera basílica y varios mosaicos que representan la multiplicación de los panes y de los peces.

Pero hay en la Escritura un dato interesante. Además de los relatos de la Pasión, éste es el único milagro que nos refieren unánimemente los cuatro evangelistas, y esto nos habla de la gran importancia que atribuyeron desde el inicio a este hecho. Más aún, Mateo y Marcos nos hablan incluso de dos multiplicaciones de los panes. Y los cuatro se esmeran en relatarnos los gestos empleados por Jesús en aquella ocasión: "Tomando los cinco panes y los dos peces, alzó la mirada al cielo, pronunció la bendición sobre ellos –dio gracias, nos dice san Juan—, los partió y se los dio a los discípulos para que se los repartieran a la gente".

Seguramente, los apóstoles descubrieron en estos gestos un acto simbólico y litúrgico de profunda significación teológica. Esto no lo adviertieron, por supuesto, en esos momentos, sino a la luz de la Última Cena y de la experiencia post-pascual, cuando el Señor resucitado, apareciéndose a sus discípulos, vuelve a repetir esos gestos como memorial de su Pasión, de su muerte y resurrección. Y, por tanto, también como el sacramento supremo de nuestra redención y de la vida de la Iglesia.

Año tras año, el Papa san Juan Pablo II escribió una carta pastoral dirigida a todos los sacerdotes del mundo con ocasión del Jueves Santo, día del sacerdocio y de la Eucaristía por antonomasia.

En la Encíclica Ecclesia de Eucharistia nos dice que "La Iglesia vive de la Eucaristía". Así iniciaba el Papa su meditación. "Esta verdad no expresa solamente una experiencia cotidiana de fe, sino que encierra en síntesis el núcleo del misterio de la Iglesia". Y a continuación tratará de hacernos comprender, valorar y vivir esta afirmación inicial.

En efecto, la Eucaristía es el sacramento por excelencia de la Iglesia –y, por tanto, de cada uno de los bautizados— porque brotó del amor redentor de Jesucristo, la instituyó como sacramento y memorial de su Alianza con los hombres; alianza que es una auténtica redención, liberación de los pecados de cada uno de nosotros para darnos vida eterna, y que llevó a cabo con su santa Pasión y muerte en el Calvario. La sangre y el agua que brotaron del costado traspasado de Cristo sobre la cruz nos hablan de este mismo misterio.

El Sacrificio eucarístico es –recuerda el Papa, tomando las palabras del Vaticano II— "fuente y culmen de toda la vida cristiana". Cristo en persona es nuestra Pascua, convertido en Pan de Vida, que da la vida eterna a los hombres por medio del Espíritu Santo.

San Juan Pablo II nos confiesó que, durante el Gran Jubileo del año 2000, tuvo la grandísima dicha de poder celebrar la Eucaristía en el Cenáculo de Jerusalén, en el mismísimo lugar donde la tradición nos dice que fue realizada por Jesucristo mismo la primera vez en la historia. Y varias veces trajó el Papa a la memoria este momento de gracia tan singular. El Papa sí valoró profundamente lo que es la Eucaristía. En el Cenáculo –nos recuerda el Santo Padre— "Cristo tomó en sus manos el pan, lo partió y lo dio a sus discípulos diciendo: Tomad y comed todos de él, porque esto es mi Cuerpo, que será entregado por vosotros" (Eccl. de Euch., nn. 1-2).

Estos gestos y palabras consacratorias son las mismas que empleó Jesús durante su vida pública, en el milagro de la multiplicación de los panes. Si Cristo tiene un poder absoluto sobre el pan y su naturaleza, entonces también podía convertir el pan en su propio Cuerpo, y el vino en su Sangre.

Y decimos que la Eucaristía es el "memorial" de nuestra redención porque –con palabras del mismo Santo Padre— "en ella está inscrito de forma indeleble el acontecimiento de la pasión y muerte del Señor. No sólo lo evoca, sino que lo hace sacramentalmente presente. Es el sacrificio de la Cruz que se perpetúa por los siglos". Esto, precisamente, significa la palabra "memorial". No es un simple recuerdo histórico, sino un recuerdo que se actualiza, se repite y se hace realmente presente en el momento mismo de su celebración.

Por eso –continuó el Papa— la Eucaristía es "el don por excelencia, porque es el don de sí mismo (de Jesucristo), de su persona en su santa humanidad y, además, de su obra de salvación.

Ésta no queda relegada al pasado, pues todo lo que Cristo es y todo lo que hizo y padeció por los hombres participa de la eternidad divina y domina así todos los tiempos... Cuando la Iglesia celebra la Eucaristía, memorial de la muerte y resurrección de su Señor, se hace realmente presente este acontecimiento central de salvación y se realiza la obra de nuestra redención" (Eccl. de Euch., n. 11).

Ojalá, pues, que en esta fiesta del Corpus Christi, que estamos celebrando hoy, todos valoremos un poco más la grandeza y sublimidad de este augusto sacramento que nos ha dejado nuestro Señor Jesucristo, la Eucaristía, el maravilloso don de su Cuerpo y de su Sangre preciosa para nuestra redención: "Éste es mi Cuerpo. Ésta es mi Sangre, sangre de la alianza nueva y eterna, que será derramada por vosotros y por muchos, para el perdón de los pecados. Haced esto en memoria mía".

Que a partir de hoy vivamos con una fe mucho más profunda e intensa, y con mayor conciencia, amor y veneración cada Eucaristía, cada Santa Misa: ¡Gracias mil, Señor, por este maravilloso regalo de tu amor hacia mí!
