



APPALACHIA HOME BUILDING "THANK YOU NATIVITY"



On behalf of the Knights of Columbus, the Appalachian Construction Crew of Omaha, NE, and the Creekmore family of three, we want to thank the Nativity family for their tremendous outpouring of support that made this home building effort possible. With the combined donations from Nativity, the Knights, and personal donations, our contributions totaled over \$120,000, not including a truck load of household items provided by the Nativity family. With slightly under \$10,000 raised from Omaha, the combined crews were able to again build a home for a very needy family. Good Shepherd Chapel selected the family. The Creekmore family clearly had some challenges. The family had a combined income of around \$16,000 and lived in a trailer with significant mold, leaks, and electrical issues. This was the 25th home where Nativity and the Knights partnered with the Appalachian Construction Crew.

From May 31st to June 12th, the combined crews were able to complete the home with two of those days dedicated to travel. The Nativity crew was composed of 21 knights; Omaha sponsored 9 that included a support crew to help with feeding the Crew. Weather was ideal during the entire build; with the larger crew, we were able to finish the home a day earlier. Local electrical, heating/air conditioning, and plumbing contractors worked at night to ensure the home was ready for critical inspections. Early Tuesday, we completed hanging all the sheetrock and applied the first coat on most of the joints and cleaned up the site for the house blessing. Literally, we completed all this work, exterior construction and interior rough-in, in 5 ½ days. We had the house blessing on Tuesday afternoon led by Father Simpson of Kentucky. Normally we present the keys to the family at a dinner hosted by the crew, but because of Covid sensitivity, we presented the keys to the family at the house blessing and told them of all the household items that we brought from Nativity. The family was overwhelmed with the outpouring of help and the caring from the Nativity family. Bert and Angi, the parents, were in tears when they received the keys and Bert spoke on how their new home would change their lives and that their new home was a gift from God. They also made the effort to personally thank everyone. Throughout the build effort, the family provided refreshments and desserts every day and Bert helped with the roofing.

On Wednesday morning, the first crew departed, and the finishing crew took over. From Wednesday through Sunday, our Nativity finishing crew of eight, with Omaha's three, stayed to do all the finishing. The finishing team completed all the drywall finishing, painting, hanging doors, trimming, and installing kitchen cabinets. The finishing crew left on Monday. All final inspections were completed by June 19th, and appliances and new beds provided by Nativity were delivered soon after. Pending installation of a new power supply for their neighborhood, the family will move in before July 7.





Tell Virginia lawmakers to save lives by adopting the Hyde Amendment in the state budget!

Last December, Governor Youngkin introduced a package of budget amendments. The Governor's package included a provision to adopt the Hyde Amendment in the state budget, and thereby stop the funding of abortion with state taxpayers' money to the fullest extent possible under federal law. In February, the Virginia General Assembly adjourned without completing its work on budget amendments. Months later, state budget issues – including the debate over the Hyde Amendment – remain unresolved.

As budget negotiators continue their work, your voices are needed to push this pro-life policy forward. Please act now to remind lawmakers that it is vitally important to include the life -saving Hyde provision whenever an agreement on the final budget is reached.

The Hyde Amendment has been in place in federal law for nearly half a century. It prohibits federal funding of abortions under Medicaid and various other programs except in cases of danger to the life of the mother, rape and incest. Colonial Day Camaraderie!

Our room parents, Mrs. Fullinwider and Mrs. Volkert, taught the students how to make homemade butter. They shook some whipping cream in a Mason jar until the butter solids separated from the milk. It was delicious on sourdough bread! To end the day, Miss Fetzer taught the students how to use their own profiles to create art. Each student took home a beautiful silhouette drawing. Miss Fetzer is hoping that when the students look at these in the future, it will remind them of all the fun they had on Colonial Day. She knows she did!

In this Sunday's Gospel reading. Jesus emphasizes the importance of keeping our eyes on him and always making him our top priority. Nothing else matters as much as our relationship with God. This means following Jesus wherever leads, doing everything his way, all the way, every day, giving him our 100% (no excuses for being mediocre in

our faith), laying down our lives in service to others like he did.

Laying down our lives means making sacrifices, such as giving our cup of cold water to someone who's thirsty. It means receiving someone into our busy schedules and listening for the prophet in him; for example: What is God saying to us through this person?

When we refuse to lay down our lives for others, we reject the Cross of Christ and his sufferings, which he submitted to for our sake. This does not mean, however, that we can never say no to others. Jesus wants

to lead us away from the harm of abuse or demands that are sinful or the enabling of unhealthy behaviors. Saying no in such cases is yet another Way of the Cross.

When we truly follow Christ, we can receive all that he is and all that he has for us. When we let go of our fears and personal goals, letting Jesus lead us into new places and new ways of handling problems, we discover new life in Christ.



His ways are always far better than what we had feared would happen.

This is the difference between a mediocre faith and a life in Christ that is full of adventures, miracles, surprising solutions, healing, victories, and realizing how very precious and important we are to God.

2R 4,8-11.14-16a; Sal 88,2-19; Rm 6,3-4.8-1; Mt 10,37-42

En aquel tiempo Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: «El que ama a su padre o a su madre más que a mí, no es digno de mí; el que ama a su hijo o a su hija mas que a mí, no es digno de mí. El que no toma su cruz y me sigue no es digno de mí. El que encuentre su vida, la perderá; y el que pierda su vida por mí, la encontrará. Quien a vosotros recibe, a mí me recibe, y quien me recibe a mí, recibe a Aquel que me ha enviado. Quien reciba a un profeta por ser profeta, recompensa de profeta recibirá, y quien reciba a un justo por ser justo, recompensa de justo recibirá».

¿Por qué la cruz?

Jesús, en el Evangelio, nos habla de la necesidad de tomar la propia cruz. Pero ¿cómo hacer comprender esta palabra a una sociedad, como la nuestra, que opone el placer? Partamos de una constatación. En esta vida, placer y dolor se suceden con la misma regularidad con la que a la elevación de una ola en el mar le sigue una depresión y un vacío capaz de succionar a quien intenta alcanzar la orilla. El hombre busca desesperadamente separar a esta especie de hermanos siameses, de aislar el placer del dolor. A veces se hace ilusiones de haberlo logrado, pero por poco tiempo. El dolor está ahí, como una bebida embriagadora que, con el tiempo, se transforma en veneno.

Es el mismo placer desordenado que se retuerce contra nosotros y se transforma en sufrimiento. Y esto, o improvisamente y trágicamente, o un poco cada vez, en cuanto que no dura mucho y genera hartura y hastío. Es una lección que nos viene de la crónica diaria, si la sabemos leer, y que el hombre ha representado en mil formas en su arte y en su literatura. «Un no sé qué de amargo surge de lo íntimo de cada placer y nos angustia incluso en medio de las delicias», escribió el poeta pagano Lucrezio.

El placer en sí mismo es engañoso porque promete lo que no puede dar. Antes de ser saboreado, parece ofrecerte el infinito y la eternidad; pero, una vez que ha pasado, te encuentras con nada en la mano.

La Iglesia dice tener una respuesta a este que es el verdadero drama de la existencia humana. Ha habido, desde el inicio, una elección del hombre, hecha posible por su libertad, que le ha llevado a orientar exclusivamente hacia las cosas visibles ese deseo y esa capacidad de gozo de la que había sido dotado para que aspirara a gozar del bien infinito que es Dios. Al placer, elegido contra la ley de Dios y simbolizado por Adán y Eva que prueban del fruto prohibido, Dios ha permitido que le siguieran el dolor y la muerte, más como remedio que como castigo. Para que no ocurriera que, siguiendo a rienda suelta su egoísmo y su instinto, el hombre se destruyera del todo a sí mismo y a su prójimo. (¡Hoy, con la droga y las consecuencias de ciertos desórdenes sexuales, vemos cómo es posible destruir la propia vida por el placer de un instante!). Así al placer vemos que se le adhiere, como su sombra, el sufrimiento.

Cristo por fin ha roto esta cadena. Él, «en lugar del gozo que se le proponía, soportó la cruz» (Hb 12,2). Hizo, en resumen, lo contrario de lo que hizo Adán y de lo que hace cada hombre. Resurgiendo de la muerte, El inauguró un nuevo tipo de placer: el que no precede al dolor, como su causa, sino que le sigue como su fruto; el que halla en la cruz su fuente y su esperanza de no acabar ni siquiera con la muerte.

Y no sólo el placer puramente espiritual, sino todo placer honesto, también el que el hombre y la mujer experimentan en el don recíproco, en la generación de la vida y al ver crecer a los propios hijos o nietos, el placer del arte y de la creatividad, de la belleza, de la amistad, del trabajo felizmente llevado a término. Todo gozo. La diferencia esencial es que es el placer en este caso, no el sufrimiento, el que tiene la última palabra.

¿Qué hacer entonces? No se trata de ir en busca del sufrimiento, sino de acoger con ánimo nuevo el que hay en la vida. Podemos comportarnos con la cruz como la vela con el viento. Si lo toma por el lado adecuado, el viento la hincha e impulsa la barca por las olas; si en cambio la vela se atraviesa, el viento parte el mástil y vuelca todo. Bien tomada, la cruz nos conduce; mal tomada, nos aplasta.




