In an effort to embrace and welcome the neurodiverse members of our community, Nativity Catholic Church is hosting a monthly Sensory Mass on the second Sunday of every month at the 1:00 pm Mass. All are welcome to attend! A special invitation is extended to any person in need of sensory accommodations.

A Sensory Mass requires a welcoming stigma-free environment and accommodations to help reduce overstimulation and sensory overload. The Mass will include softer music, dimmer lighting, pictorial resources, and self-regulation tools for those with special needs. Families are encouraged to bring any regulation tool (noise reduction items, quiet fidgets, flexible seating items, weighted objects, etc.) that can support focused attention and provide comfort to a person so they can feel safe in their environment and they can better participate in the Holy Mass.

Join the Bishops in Nationwide Prayer to Stop Taxpayer Funding of Abortion "Recently, Planned Parenthood and other big abortion businesses were banned from receiving federal Medicaid dollars for a period of one year. However, Planned Parenthood sued, and a preliminary injunction was granted by the court that requires

taxpayer funding to continue. Natural Family Planning Awareness:

Bishop Burbidge asked us to "reflect deeply on the hope that springs forth from God's beautiful design for marriage, love, and life.

This year [is] the 57th anniversary of Humanae Vitae, Saint Paul VI's prophetic vision of marital love. Saint Paul VI affirms that authentic love is always open to the gift of life and ordered to the good of spouses. Humanae Vitae remains one of the Church's greatest teaching treasures and is perhaps more relevant today than ever before.

In giving themselves to each other in the covenant of marriage, husbands and wives are called to cooperate with God in his plan for human love and life. Unlike contraception or in vitro fertilization, Natural Family Planning does not separate the procreative aspect of human sexuality from its unitive aspect. Very simply, this means a couple who practices NFP knows that God intends life and love to go together and the couple wants to keep these dimensions always together in their marital relationship. At the same time, NFP promotes open communication between spouses not only in living the truth and meaning of human sexuality but also in making virtuous decisions concerning parenthood, whether this involves welcoming God's gift of a first child or welcoming other children into the family home.

Natural Family Planning also brings hope to couples, especially those who experience infertility. NFP empowers couples to understand their fertility, address underlying health issues, and grow in communication and trust. Many couples have been blessed with children through NFP after being told they were infertile, discovering that attentive care may reveal treatable conditions and new possibilities... Each of us is called to pray and work for a society where love is rightly ordered—where the sanctity of marriage is upheld, where the dignity of every human life is protected, and where families flourish."

A Message from the Nativity Creation Care Ministry

Fairfax County will be the first locality in the Commonwealth to begin construction of a solar array on the grounds of a closed landfill.

The solar array covers 37 acres of closed landfill, converting previously unusable space into a project that benefits all county residents. The energy produced from the project will be credited virtually to other county energy accounts, which will be selected to maximize the cost savings to the county. The project could save the county \$12 million dollars over the 30-year partnership and reduce carbon dioxide emissions by 136,000 metric tons over the same period.

In addition to this solar array project at the I-95 Landfill in Lorton, in 2024, Department of Public Works and Environmental Services unveiled a rooftop solar system at the Newington Solid Waste Facility in Lorton, just completed installing another one on the roof at the I-66 Transfer Station and is currently constructing a solar array on the I-95 Landfill Complex administrative building.

In 2019, Nativity installed solar panels and energy efficiency equipment in partnership with Catholic Energies. The 25 year agreement will generate 91,000 kWH of clean solar power, while avoiding usage of a further 251,000 kWh on the school and 77,000 on the Church annually via efficiency measures effectively reducing the Church and Schools carbon footprint by nearly 7,700 metric tons of CO2 over the term of the agreement. Savings to the Church and School over projected utility rates was estimated to be \$200,000 over 25 years. Msgr. Bob celebrated, "We are doing this as a prophetic witness to the Care of our Common Home, our Earth, as asked by Pope Francis in his encyclical "Laudato Si" to reduce carbon footprint and shift to clean renewable energy."

Nativity First Graders are Cleaning up with Kindness

Mrs. Colella, our first grade teacher, had a brilliant idea! After hearing Nativity student Rebecca Villa-Padilla talk about her Kind Leaders foundation and its ongoing project with Operation Starfish at Mass, she thought it would be a great idea to team up with Kind Leaders for first grade's April service project.



After that March Mass, Rebecca and her mother ran a workshop in the school's Art room, inviting people to help make soap for her foundation. Rebecca's brother, Benjamin, is a first grade student and Mrs. Colella thought it would be an ideal service project for her first grade.

Mrs. Colella approached Rebecca and her mother about the idea of the class helping to raise money for Kind Leaders. Rebecca and her mom had been thinking the same idea. First Grade became the foundation's pilot class.

The first grade spent a full-day making soap with Rebecca and her mom. They mixed colors and fragrances, used test tubes and beakers, and heated soap and poured it into starfish molds. It was a GREAT STEM project!

After developing a slide presentation to show others about the cooperation between Kind Leaders and Operation Starfish, the students took it home over Easter Break to show Easter guests, hopefully collecting donations. Rebecca's goal for Kind Leaders was to raise \$5,000; Mrs. Colella and her first graders helped Rebecca reach that goal by collecting \$1,200.



Kind Leaders was able to donate \$5,000 to Operation Starfish in May with first grade's help. That is enough money to build a house! And that, dear friends, is for another story. Stay Tuned!

Tenemos un día o una semana por delante. Pensamos y deseamos hacer muchas cosas. Pasa el tiempo. Constatamos que no hemos realizado muchos proyectos planeados. ¿Por qué? El motivo es sencillo: porque no siempre hacemos lo que queremos. Parece extraño, pero la voluntad "decide" una cosa, y al final hacemos otra...

Así, habíamos planeado ir un día al mercado para comprar más barato, pero al final nos quedamos en casa para terminar un crucigrama. O decidimos levantarnos temprano el domingo para visitar a un familiar enfermo, y no lo hicimos porque nos venció el peso de las mantas.
