A Message from our Pastor Msgr. Bob Cilinski



"I come to gather nations of every language"
- Isaiah 66:18

My dear parishioners,

There is a lot of rhetoric being spread getting our attention of categories to which we assign those around us. We can easily translate categories into modern ones: outsiders and insiders, people we hold in contempt or see as inferior, and those who are powerless vs. those who are in control of others' lives.

As soon as we establish these categories, St. Paul tells us we're asked to suspend all judgement about them because if Christ is all—everything—then our deep unity in Christ is more important than anything that might cause divisions. Our identity in Christ surpasses all our other affiliations.

As pastor of the parish, the code of canon law says that I am responsible for the spiritual and pastoral care of every person living in the parish boundaries. This means every person regardless of their religion, race, language or culture. The church is home to everyone. In the church everyone has a status. It is precisely because we are Catholics (universal) that we extend our love and care to everyone out of respect for human dignity. God's love is offered to everyone.

This love was shown in the early Christian community who practiced love of neighbor and applied it concretely. So thought provoking was this love of neighbor among the early Christians that the pagans were scandalized. From the Emperor Julian the Apostate comes the saying, "Those Galileans feed not only their own poor, but ours as well."

In the course of the centuries men and women have kept and lived this heritage entrusted by the Lord. They are the ones whom we call saints. They were not born with a halo over their heads. They gave of themselves to the very end of their lives in a selfless love of neighbor.

Now it is our turn. How will we as Catholics relate to those in our midst who live on the fringe of society, many who are fellow Catholics and parishioners. Love of God and love of neighbor form a unity as a double sided commandment that unites us in Christ.

I wish to thank and encourage each one of you to persevere in spreading the love of Christ. May Mary, Mother of the Nativity pray for us.

Pro-Life Corner:

Defending Life – U.S. pro-life leaders gather in Arlington as Virginia prepares for battle over constitutional amendment:

As mentioned in the August 14-27 Catholic Herald by Jim Hale, "As Virginia takes center stage in the national



abortion debate, pro-life leaders from across the country met in Arlington for a two-day conference... 'Dear pro-life leaders and brothers and sisters in Christ, you see daily the wounds of those you serve, the wounds of those who participated in abortion,' said Bishop Burbidge... '(You see) the wounds of those who are unable any longer to see themselves as God's beloved son and daughter, the wounds of those who feel lost, forgotten and abandoned, and what confidence the Lord has in them, for he sends you to them to be messengers and hope and instruments of his healing and saving love.""

"[Judy] Haag, who has been a pro-life activist for more than 50 years, agreed that the political battles seem overwhelming at times. "People don't understand what they're voting for," she said. "They don't understand what really is happening and I just think we really need to get on our knees...

"'The abortion industry is on the move waging war on state constitutions,' said Amy McInerny, diocesan director of the Respect Life office. 'We are in the crosshairs because bordering states to the South have passed protective laws for women and children, and the abortion industry wants Virginia to be the abortion destination of the South.""

"With all 100 seats in the House of Delegates up for reelection Nov. 4, the stakes are high. 'The legislators that Virginia voters elect this November will decide whether an extreme and deadly proposal to allow virtually unlimited abortion at any stage of pregnancy will become a November 2026 ballot question,' said Jeff Caruso, executive director of the Virginia Catholic Conference. 'Through conscience formation, prayer and fasting, we must prepare our minds and hearts to engage in this year's critical voting decisions'...

"When it comes to voting, McInerny emphasized that the candidate's position on abortion should be viewed through Catholic teaching... According to the USCCB, abortion remains the "preeminent" political priority for Catholics. A Message from the Creation Care Ministry

The Season of Creation is an ecumenical initiative, celebrated from September 1-October 4. The theme of the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, September 1, was chosen by Pope Francis-- "Seeds of Peace and Hope". In his message for this day, Pope Leo writes, "...we seem incapable of recognizing that the destruction of nature does not affect everyone in the same way. When justice and peace are trampled underfoot, those who are most hurt are the poor, the marginalized and the excluded. The suffering of indigenous communities is emblematic in this regard.

Environmental justice – implicitly proclaimed by the prophets – can no longer be regarded as an abstract concept or a distant goal. It is an urgent need that involves much more than simply protecting the environment. For it is a matter of justice – social, economic and human. For believers it is also a duty born of faith, since the universe reflects the face of Jesus Christ, in whom all things were created and redeemed. In a world where the most vulnerable of our brothers and sisters are the first to suffer the devastating effects of climate change, deforestation and pollution, care for creation becomes an expression of our faith and humanity.

Now is the time to follow words with deeds. 'Living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of virtue; it is not an optional or a secondary aspect of our Christian experience' (Laudato Si', 217). By working with love and perseverance, we can sow many seeds of justice and thus contribute to the growth of peace and the renewal of hope... The Encyclical Laudato Si' has now guided the Catholic Church and many people of good will for ten years. May it continue to inspire us and may integral ecology be increasingly accepted as the right path to follow. In this way, seeds of hope will multiply, to be 'tilled and kept' by the grace of our great and unfailing Hope, who is the risen Christ."





Isaías 66, 18-21; Hebreos 12, 5-7.11-13; Lucas 13, 22-30

Entrar por la puerta estrecha

Existe un interrogante que siempre ha agobiado a los creyentes: ¿son muchos o pocos los que se salvan? En ciertas épocas, este problema se hizo tan agudo que sumergió a algunas personas en una angustia terrible. El Evangelio de este domingo nos informa de que un día se planteó a Jesús este problema: «Mientras caminaba hacia Jerusalén, uno le dijo: "Señor, ¿son pocos los que se salvan?"». La pregunta, como se ve, trata sobre el número, sobre cuántos se salvan: ¿muchos o pocos? Jesús, en su respuesta, traslada el centro de atención de cuántos se salvan a cómo salvarse, esto es, entrando «por la puerta estrecha».

Es la misma actitud que observamos respecto al retorno final de Cristo. Los discípulos preguntan cuándo sucederá el regreso del Hijo del hombre, y Jesús responde indicando cómo prepararse para esa venida, qué hacer en la espera (Mt 24, 3-4). Esta forma de actuar de Jesús no es extraña o descortés. Sencillamente es la manera de obrar de alguien que quiere educar a sus discípulos para que pasen del plano de la curiosidad al de la verdadera sabiduría; de las cuestiones ociosas que apasionan a la gente a los verdaderos problemas que importan en la vida.

En este punto ya podemos entender lo absurdo de aquellos que, como los Testigos de Jehová, creen saber hasta el número preciso de los salvados: ciento cuarenta y cuatro mil. Este número, que recurre en el Apocalipsis, tiene un valor puramente simbólico (12 al cuadrado, el número de las tribus de Israel, multiplicado por mil) y se explica inmediatamente con la expresión que le sigue: «una muchedumbre inmensa que nadie podría contar» (Ap 7, 4.9).

Además, si ese fuera de verdad el número de los salvados, entonces ya podemos cerrar la tienda, nosotros y ellos. En la puerta del paraíso debe estar colgado, desde hace tiempo, como en la entrada de los aparcamientos, el cartel de «Completo».

Por lo tanto, si a Jesús no le interesa tanto revelarnos el número de los salvados como el modo de salvarse, veamos qué nos dice al respecto. Dos cosas sustancialmente: una negativa, una positiva; primero, lo que no es necesario, después lo que sí lo es para salvarse. No es necesario, o en cualquier caso no basta, el hecho de pertenecer a un determinado pueblo, a una determinada raza, tradición o institución, aunque fuera el pueblo elegido del que proviene el Salvador. Lo que sitúa en el

camino de La salvación no es un cierto título de propiedad («Hemos comido y bebido en tu presencia...»), sino una decisión personal seguida de una coherente conducta de vida. Esto está más claro aún en el texto de Mateo, que contrapone dos caminos y dos entradas, una estrecha y otra ancha (Mateo 7, 13-14).

¿Por qué a estos dos caminos se les llama respectivamente el camino «ancho» y el «estrecho»? ¿Es tal vez el camino del mal siempre fácil y agradable de recorrer y el camino del bien siempre duro y fatigoso? Aquí hay que estar atentos para no caer en la frecuente tentación de creer que todo les va magníficamente bien, aquí abajo, a los malvados, y sin embargo todo les va siempre mal a los buenos. El camino de los impíos es ancho, sí, pero sólo al principio; a medida que se adentran en él, se hace estrecho y amargo. Y en todo caso es estrechísimo al final, porque se llega a un callejón sin salida. El disfrute que en este camino se experimenta tiene como característica que disminuye a medida que se prueba, hasta generar náusea y tristeza. Ello se ve en ciertos tipos de ebriedades, como la droga, el alcohol, el sexo. Se necesita una dosis o un estímulo cada vez mayor para lograr un placer de la misma intensidad. Hasta que el organismo ya no responde y llega la ruina, frecuentemente también física. El camino de los justos en cambio es estrecho al comienzo, cuando se emprende, pero después se transforma en una vía espaciosa, porque en ella se encuentra esperanza, alegría y paz en el corazón.


