



A Message from our Pastor Fr. Bob Cilinski



"The Lord says: The man who eats my flesh and drinks my blood will live forever; l shall raise him to life on the last day." - John 6:55

Meditation by Mother Teresa of Calcutta Communion with the Word of Life

How tenderly Jesus speaks when he gives himself to his own in Holy Communion. "My flesh is meat indeed and my blood is drink indeed. He that eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me and I in him." Oh, what could my Jesus do more than give me his flesh for my food? No, not even God could do more nor show a greater love for me.

Holy Communion, as the word implies, is the intimate union of Jesus and our soul and body. If we want to have life and have it more abundantly, we must live on the flesh of our Lord. The saints understood so well that they could spend hours in preparation and still more in thanksgiving. This needs no explanation, for who can explain "the depth of the riches of the wisdom and knowledge of God?" "How incomprehensible are his judgments!" cried St. Paul, "And how unsearchable his ways, for who has known the mind of the Lord?"

When communicating with Christ in your heart after partaking of the Living Bread, remember what our Lady must have felt when the Holy Spirit empowered her, and she who was full of grace became full with the body of Christ. The spirit in her was so strong that immediately she "rose in haste" to go and serve.

In the scripture we read of the tenderness of God for the world, and we read that God loved the world so much that he gave his Son Jesus to come to be like us and to bring us the good news that God is love, that God loves you and loves me. God wants us to love each other as he loves each one of us. When we look at the Eucharist we know how he loves us now. That's why he made himself the bread of life to satisfy our hunger for his love, and then, as if this was not enough for him, he made himself the hungry one, the naked one, the homeless one, so that you and I can satisfy his hunger for our human love. For we have been created for that. We have been created to love and be loved.






A message from the Creation Care Ministry in preparation for the Season of Creation

Families are encouraged to bring any regulation tools (noise reduction items, quiet fidgets, flexible seating items, weighted objects, etc) that can support focused attention and provide comfort to a person so they can feel safe in their environment.

The Marriage Enrichment Ministry strengthens marriages in the Church and supports and accompanies engaged and married couples called to the holy vocation of marriage.




- Providing couples with effective and thorough preparation for sacramental marriage,



Good News INSPIRATION FOR DAILY LIFE

21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

August 25, 2024: Jos 24:1-2a,15-18b | Ps 34:2-3,16-21| Eph 5:21-32 or Eph 5:2a,25-32 | Jn 6:60-69

Pray: My Lord and my God, thank you for your gift of bread from heaven, your Body and Blood. Amen.

Eat My Body, Drink My Blood, Have Eternal Life.

Being a Christian has always been a challenge, both in the and present. Two past thousand years ago, in a shocking revelation, Jesus told His disciples, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you have no life in you; he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life. and I will raise him up at the last day."

This was a hard teaching, and many of His disciples couldn't accept it, so they chose to walk away. Yet Jesus remained

steadfast in His message, refusing to water it down or change it. Only those who were convinced that Jesus was who He said He was stayed with Him.

People then started disputing His claim, crying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Did those who walked away realize that Jesus was not a mere man? Yes, He was fully man like they were, but He was (and is) also fully God and capable of anything! Didn't they already see His miracles? This should have revealed His divinity. They knew Jesus as a kind, humble, compassionate, and wise teacher, so what happened? Did they think He went crazy?

They needed to open their minds and hearts to listen, trust, and believe. What Jesus proclaimed about eating His body and drinking His blood was beyond human reason. He assured them His words were "in spirit and life," but they refused to

be open to the working of the Spirit to enlighten their hearts. They needed to lean on the assistance of the Holy Spirit to unlock and embrace this mystery of faith.

Belief in the profound supernatural nature of the Eucharist is a pure gift of grace from God the Father. Jesus offers Himself – Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity – as the way to eternal life, but He gives us free will to accept or reject this gift. True Catholic teaching delights in and celebrates the gift of the Real Presence.
