"Humble yourself the more, the greater you are, and you will find favor with God" - Sir 3:18

My dear parishioners,

The word "humility" comes from the Latin word "humilis" which means literally "on the ground." So when we are advised to be humble, this is an invitation to be "grounded", to be on the same level as all people as the children of God. All persons are given life by God. We are equally loved and esteemed by our Holy God. We also recognize our place in relationship to God. God is God, and we are not. God is the Creator, we are God's creatures made in His image and likeness with dignity and worth. God is the giver of all life and every good gift. We are the stewards of the gifts God gives us.

A Message from the Nativity Creation Care Ministry

The St. Fiacre vegetable garden, adjacent to the school playground, has had another great summer! Members of the Creation Care ministry, along with members of the Laurel Garden Club of West Springfield/Burke maintain the garden and harvest the vegetables. The vegetables are donated to Nativity's ministry "No Hands But Yours", as well as to a special education teacher in a Fairfax County Title 1 school, who provides it to her food-insecure families.

2025 Was not a good year for the tomatoes or peppers but the green beans are prolific, especially now. For the first time, we planted tomatillos. These have a beautiful flower. When pollinated, the fruit grows first like a balloon filled with air. The fruit grows from the inside to fill the balloon. Stop by and take a look, they are planted in the first lower bed closest to the school. But don't squeeze too hard! We have just planted carrots, beets and radishes for a fall harvest. This is easy to do, and we expect to harvest within 60 days.

Our garden is named for St. Fiacre. He was born in Ireland and moved to France to seek solitude for his prayer life. The bishop in France gave him as much land as he could plow in one day. He plowed with the tip of his staff. People heard of him and flocked to learn about the Christian faith. He employed his green thumb by growing food to feed the pilgrims and herbs to heal the sick. He is honored today as the patron saint of gardeners and herbalists.

The "30 Day Eucharistic Revival" is a Fr. Calloway, MIC, retreat focused on enhancing our love in the Blessed Sacrament.



Centreville High School abortion scandal shows why voters must defend parents at the ballot box - In a related article, Victoria Cobb, The Family Foundation of Virginia president, reports, "What should be a sanctuary of learning has instead become a harrowing example of institutional overreach. Recent revelations from Fairfax County — Centreville High School, to be precise — reportedly show school officials secretly and illegally arranging and funding abortions for girls without parental knowledge. In 2021, one student, age 17, was quietly escorted to a clinic, where the procedure was handled and paid for. Another student, five months pregnant and seeking to keep her child, fled the clinic after an alleged school counselor sent her, telling her she]had no other choice.' In both cases, the school purposefully excluded parents from the conversation.'

"These accounts are more than shocking; they are unconscionable. Virginia law mandates parental consent for minors seeking abortions unless judicial approval is granted. The law stands as a recognition of parents' God-given role and a bulwark of accountability in society. Yet in these alleged incidents, the school assumed the role of decision-maker, cutting out the people who love these girls most. This isn't compassion; it's deception. What makes this crisis even more urgent is the political backdrop."

This year, Virginians will choose new statewide elected officials for governor, lieutenant governor and attorney general and will select a member of the House of Delegates to represent them. Every member of the Virginia House of Delegates voted on this issue last session, when they began the process of passing a radical constitutional amendment to write parental rights out of the commonwealth's law and shield schools from liability if they assist minors in obtaining abortions without parental consent. If enacted, this amendment will cement the very practices under investigation as lawful. Parents will lose the right to intervene. High schools will get a legal pass to bypass parents. Girls will be shortchanged of the best love and care they can get in their unplanned pregnancies.

'... [V]oters have a chance to fire the elected officials who believe the Fairfax situation ought to be the statewide norm before the ballot question moves any further. Voters must also provide a reckoning at the ballot box in November. No candidate who will not unequivocally support parental rights should be elected. If someone supports the radical Abortion Amendment, they are not supporting a "right" to abortion; they are supporting teen abortion, facilitated by outside adults without parental involvement. 





XXII Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario, Ciclo C. Lc 14,1.7-14. Observador de apariencias Autor: Mons. Jesús Sanz Montes, ofm

No sólo se fijaba en los lirios del campo, en los pájaros del cielo, sino que también Jesús era un profundo observador de la conducta humana: los niños sencillos y sin doblez, las viudas que dan todo lo que tienen, los pecadores que en el fondo tienen un corazón abierto al perdón y al arrepentimiento... y también se fijará el Señor en los aparentes, en los que van por la vida de reclamo y de etiqueta.

Estaba invitado en casa de uno de los fariseos un sábado, día sagrado. Dice el Evangelio que tanto Él como los demás, todos se observaban mutuamente en aquél convite. ¿Qué vio Jesús? Que la gente se apuntaba a los primeros puestos, para salir en la foto de sociedad del lugar, para ser ad-mirado, para estar en la boca de los otros, para sentirse en la pasarela del influjo y del renombre.

Jesús hablará siempre de la verdad, y por la verdad morirá, y de la verdad se autodefinirá. Jamás de la apariencia. Porque la apariencia es siempre una mentira, más o menos camuflada, más o menos fomentada y querida. Ser lo que en el fondo no se es, dar el pego y el camelo, aparecer tras el truco y la careta, jugar al eterno carnaval. Una persona así, que vive la vida desde su disfraz particular (importa poco que tal disfraz sea ideológico, cultural, económico... o incluso religioso), es una persona vendida a sí mismo, a sus pretensiones; una persona esclava de sus propias cadenas, y por eso inhábil para la libertad y para la sencillez.

"Cuando os inviten a una boda -decía el Maestro-, no busques el primer puesto" (Lc 14,8). No sólo por el soponcio que puede suponer después el que el acomodador te saque de tu podium, y te devuelva a tu cruda realidad, sino porque quien tiene pretensiones indebidas, quien va de "trepa" y de capta-portadas, es difícil que comprenda su dignidad, y la de los demás, cuando tan ocupado anda en su apariencia.

San Francisco lo dirá con su proverbial sencillez: "somos lo que somos ante Dios, y nada más" (Admonición 19). Sólo quien ha experimentado la libertad de ser y de querer ser lo que somos ante los ojos de Dios, sólo ése puede entender a Jesús y a Francisco. Son los ojos del Señor los que nos guían en la senda verdadera, los que nos mueven a reemprender el camino siempre que nos cansamos de andar, los que nos desvían cuando se tuercen nuestros pasos, los que se hacen luz y gracia para caminar. Los ojos de los demás tantas veces ven poco, o ven mal, turbiamente quizás. Los ojos de Dios, no engañan nunca, no humillan nunca, alumbran sin deslumbrar. Feliz el que vive así, sencillamente, porque experimentará lo que es vivir en la paz, en la libertad, sin ansias devoradoras, sin poses hipócritas, sin trucos ficticios... siendo ante uno mismo y ante los otros, lo que somos ante Dios.
