

September 1, 2024: Dt 4:1-2,6-8 | Ps 15:2-5 (1a) | Jas 1:17-18,21b-22,27 | Mk 7:1-8,14-15,21-23

Pray: Jesus, help me grow in holiness with a pure heart and a faithful, charitable life. Amen.

What matters most to Jesus is our inner purity and our love in action.

The Pharisees were a group of pious, lawobservant Jews who tried hard to maintain the purity of Jewish traditions by avoiding contact with impure pagan cultural influences of the time. They practiced strict purification rituals, observed special dietary restrictions, and held themselves and others firmly to their faith's rigid traditions and practices.

They were known for their expectations of personal piety, and their leaders were sticklers for adherence to all 600-plus laws in the Torah. The leaders of this Jewish sect were very devout, and they sincerely believed their devotional customs and traditions honored God.

However, their long list of dos and don'ts was often judgmental of others, and they frequently clashed with how Jesus preferred to do things. Jesus tried to show them many times that they were missing the point of what God desires most of us: love in action and the purity of our hearts.

The center of Christ's teachings revolves around two things: love of God and love of neighbor. Jesus is most interested in the love



and purity of our hearts, our humility and compassion, and our faith in action shown in our sincere love and kindness to others.

When it comes to purification, rather than picking at someone else's flaws, Jesus wants us to look inward to discover our own sins and work to unplug the channels of grace in our relationship with Him. The bottom line is that we must rid our hearts of anything that is not of God, who is love itself.

Reflect & Discuss:

- Is there anything in your life blocking the entire flow of grace God wants to give you to reach the potential that He sees in you?
- + How is God calling you to be a doer of the Word and not a hearer only?
- What traditions and habits can sometimes distract people from true faith, and how?
- + How can we nurture our inner spiritual lives to keep our faith pure and holy against worldly temptations?

DIOS ES ALGO PURO XXII Javier Leoz

Hemos finalizado los domingos del discurso del Pan de la Vida: pan sabroso, pan vivo, pan del cielo, pan que alimenta, pan que fortalece y....vemos que no hay nada como el PAN DE DIOS. Otra cosa, por supuesto, es como sea nuestra disposición interna para recibirlo. La pureza de Dios, en su pan sagrado, ha de encontrar además de manos limpias y paladar fino unas entrañas más limpias que una patena del altar.

1. Las formas, aun siendo importantes, no son esenciales. O, por lo menos, no nos hemos de quedar en las formas.

En cuántas ocasiones, la apariencia de una fina arena, esconde caverna peligrosa. O, en cuantos momentos, una botella que en su etiqueta dice ser buen licor, se convierte en un amargo veneno. ¿Las formas? Sí, por supuesto, siempre y cuando lejos de engañar, sean y tengan por dentro lo que dicen. Abundaban los fariseos entonces y, tal vez, sigan existiendo en medio de nosotros. Pero no es menos cierto que tan malos son los fariseos que no se dan cuenta de su propia realidad como, aquellos otros, que apuntan a los demás y ellos lo son por goleada: no mueven un dedo por nada ni por nadie. Eso si; siempre es más cómodo apuntar al humo que al incendio de mi propia casa.

Jesús quiere poner en el centro de todo al Dios puro y verdadero. Todo aquello que distorsiona esa voluntad, que impide llegar hasta el amor de Dios, no tiene vigencia o deja de tener sentido. La ley de Dios, la suprema, es el amor. ¿Qué ocurría entonces? Ni más ni menos que, el conjunto de normas que indicaban cómo llegar hasta el amor de Dios se habían convertido en objeto de adoración, en el centro de toda reverencia. One Minute Meditations

St. Peter Claver

Born into a farming family in Spain in 1580, St. Peter joined the Jesuits at the age of twenty and was ordained in 1615. While serving in Colombia in 1610, he was horrified by the slave trade. Rushing to meet each arriving slave ship, he brought water, medicine, food, and clothing to the enslaved people on board. He taught them about God and baptized nearly 300,000 individuals. St. Peter lived humbly and penitentially, in solidarity with those he served.

Find true peace

As Catholics, we understand that the key to true happiness and peace lies in proclaiming Christ as our

Lord and following Him faithfully. By knowing Jesus, experiencing His love, keeping His Commandments, and serving Him in others, we will find genuine joy, fulfillment, and peace.

Know Jesus and experience His love: God invites each of us to enter into a deep friendship with Him (John 15:15). This friendship is characterized by mutual respect, intimacy, and cooperation. Jesus reveals His love for us through the Scriptures, the Sacraments of the Church, and especially through the Mass. In prayer, ask God to reveal His personal, everlasting love for

you. That's a prayer He is eager to answer.

> Love Him back: Do you know someone who claims to care but ignores what you say? Jesus, our greatest Friend, asks us to listen to Him. "If you love me, you will keep my commandments" (John 14:15). By living the Ten Commandments and the Eight Beatitudes (see Matthew 5:3-ff), we demonstrate our love for Jesus. Serve Him in our

neighbors: For Mother Teresa, serving the poor was synonymous with serving Jesus

(Matthew 25:40). She prepared their beds and treated their wounds as if He were the next to use them. By performing ordinary tasks with love and intentionality, we can experience true and lasting happiness.



Church's precepts?

Just as families have household rules guiding how each member contributes to supporting the home, the Catholic Church has issued rules, called precepts, that act as the principal obligations of every Catholic. These are: attend Mass every Sunday



and Holy Day of Obligation, receive Communion and attend Confession at least once annually. study Catholic teaching, observe the Church's marriage laws, give children religious training, to strengthen and support the parish community, do penance, and join in the Church's mission.

Mistakes can be blessings

Do you dread making mistakes and feel remorse when you do? Instead, realize that mistakes are simply outcomes we didn't expect and can lead to growth.

Start by admitting your mistake. You can only learn from a mistake if you admit you made one. Acknowledging the error takes the focus away from assigning blame and moves it toward understanding a future course of action.

Enlist help. Talking to someone else about what happened gives you the benefit of another's experience. He or she may have made a similar mistake



In this Gospel passage, the disciples hear about an unfamiliar man who healed in Jesus' name. Their initial

reaction was one of jealousy. They seemed more concerned about losing the spotlight than the healing itself. Jesus put things into perspective. The man shared their goal of building up God's Kingdom. They gained an ally, not an enemy.

Discipleship requires a change of heart, lifestyle, and habits. Jesus was very clear: if we choose to follow Him, we cannot harbor private sins on the side. If our sins lead others into sin, our responsibility is even greater.



Sept. 3 - St. Gregory the Great (604). St. Gregory resigned as chief prefect of Rome to become a monk at the Abbey of St. Andrew. As Pope, he used his political skills to make peace with the invading Lombards, save Rome from famine, and restore order within the Church itself.

Sept. 15 - Our Lady of Sorrows. In Luke 2:35, Simeon predicted Mary's sorrows as "a sword piercing" her soul. Despite her sorrow, Mary stood at the foot of the Cross, dignified and fearless while others ran away.

Mark 9:38–43, 45, 47–48, The demands of discipleship

These are serious words, but the opposite is great news: "Whoever obeys and teaches these commandments will be

called greatest in the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 5:19). God rewards us for the good we do for others. Our example holds powerful influence. Being a faithful disciple isn't easy. Embracing unfamiliar coworkers, rooting out sin, and

setting a good example can be challenging, but we are not alone, nor are we without grace. Whatever God asks us to sacrifice, the reward will be infinitely greater.

Decide on change. Ask, "What will I do better next time?" Real growth and change happen when you see possibilities for improvement.

Benefit from mistakes. If you can learn from the current error, you may be able to avoid a future one. Remember, God is the only one you know who doesn't make mistakes.

One good way to be sure you can explain what you believe is to have solid information at your fingertips.

To start, keep a copy of the Catechism of the Catholic Church handy. It summarizes what we believe and why, with an excellent glossary to help navigate. Your library may have one or you can buy it

about Catholic faith and practices by Church experts. For example, a helpful resource, Catholic Answers to Catholic Questions, by Paul Thigpen, Ph.D., is available at Our Sunday Visitor books (www.osv.com, 800-348-2440). Or, ask your priest for a Church-approved recommendation.

Know the common misconceptions. There are many misunderstandings about the Catholic Faith. Knowing what the Church actually teaches on topics like the Eucharist, Mary, the Saints, and salvation will prepare you to clarify these points.

Don't forget to ask for help from the Holy Spirit. In fact, just let the Spirit do the talking.
