A Message from our Pastor Msgr. Bob Cilinski



"Anyone of you who does not renounce his possessions cannot be my disciple" - Luke 14-25-33

My dear parishioners,

Today is the canonization of St. Carlo Acutis, the first millennial Saint and first canonization of Pope Leo's pontificate. Carlo Acutis was a young Italian boy who died at the age of fifteen from leukemia. He was born May 1,1991 and was skilled in all things to do with information technology, computers and the internet. He shared with a friend that he thought his life would be short. He said "Everyone is born as an original, but many people end up dying as photocopies. Don't let that happen to you". We are reminded to be the person God made us to be. He is a model of how to use technology for good without being manipulated or controlled by it.

For Carlos the highest good was God, "Happiness is looking toward God." Carlo showed the love of God in how he lived. He helped immigrants and beggars, the disabled and the elderly. He was a friend to those his own age whose parents had separated. Another distinct feature of young Carlos was his love for the Eucharist. When many of his friends did not go to Mass, Carlo found something beautiful in it that attracted him, something divine that he experienced. He famously said, "the Eucharist is my motorway to heaven" and that with each Communion we come closer to the goal of sanctity. Carlo said of his time in adoration as being close to Jesus like St. John the beloved disciple at the last supper.

Carlo Acutis died after a short illness caused by acute leukemia. He faced his death with great courage as did his suffering parents. His parents prayed for a miracle but came to realize that God does not save us "from" death but saves us "in" death. Carlos died October 12, 2006.

Our dear friend in heaven Francisco Fredrickson, a Nativity parishioner, found great inspiration from Carlo Acutis as he embraced his own terminal illness at a young age. Like Carlo, Francisco had a deep love of the Eucharist and became an altar server to be close to Jesus at Mass. He also loved soccer just like Carlo. He prayed, asking Blessed Carlo to help him and his parents. They were buddies and now together in heaven.

As the first millennial Saint, may Carlo's witness inspire many young people to walk the same path of holiness and greatness as he did.

Participants in Promoting the Common Good September 2025

As Virginia voters, this fall we will elect our next Governor, Lieutenant Governor and Attorney General. We will also decide who will occupy all 100 Virginia House of Delegates seats. Election Day is November 4. Early voting begins September 19.

As the Catechism reminds us, "It is necessary that all participate, each according to his position and role, in promoting the common good.... As far as possible, citizens should take an active part in public life" (nos. 1913-1915).

To promote the common good, we must form our consciences and vote, recognizing that:

- Many issues are important.
- · Not all issues have equal moral weight.
- · Protecting life is paramount.

Above all else, addressing the tragedy of abortion is the "preeminent priority because it directly attacks our most vulnerable and voiceless brothers and sisters and destroys more than a million lives per year in our country alone" (Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, Introductory Note, U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, 2023).

The Virginia Catholic Conference (VCC) has prepared an array of voter education resources to help form consciences and provide timely information. Visit vacatholic.org/Election2025 or scan the QR code to view these materials.

We encourage parishes to distribute each of the VCC resources, especially:

- The VCC's Candidate Comparisons in the races for Governor, Lieutenant Governor and Attorney General, which provide the candidates' positions on key issues; and
- The Proposed Constitutional Amendments: Be Vigilant! resource, which explains three proposed amendments to Virginia's constitution. These proposals have already moved part of the way through the General Assembly process. One of them would allow virtually unlimited abortion at any stage of pregnancy. The legislators we elect in the House races this November will decide whether these proposed constitutional amendments advance any further.

With so much at stake, we must prepare to engage in this year's critical voting decisions – through conscience formation, prayer and fasting. United in the Eucharist, let us pray for one another and join together as active participants in promoting the common

A Message from the Nativity Creation Care Ministry

In today's Gospel Jesus told his disciples they had to let go of a lot of things they were attached to so they would be willing to carry their cross and go forward with him. He wanted them to understand the cost of discipleship. Today's reading from the book of Wisdom reminds us that we tend to be "unsure of our plans." In fact, we often are too comfortable with the way things are, and just watch things happen - without doing anything that involves lifting our cross, e.g. expressing our Christian beliefs. However, through the scriptures and enlightened by the Holy Spirit, our Creator shows us how to walk the straight paths on earth. God intends us to travel with him along such paths and calls us to volunteer and get on with Jesus' mission. But there is a cost to being his disciple. For example – we might be accused of "being too political" rather than simply following the teaching of Jesus. Are we willing to pay the price? What cross are we asked to bear as we follow Jesus? These teachings have special meaning during the September weeks when, again this year, Pope Leo XIV has asked us to observe a "Season of Creation" from September 1 – October 4. Just as the Church observes other special periods of time - e.g. Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter time, Pope Leo XIV is calling us to focus on God's creation. Mother Earth, our planet, our common home is sinking into bad shape and needs the kind of healing Jesus did on his journey to Jerusalem. As today's Gospel puts it at the end, we must "lift our cross" among other things by "renouncing all our possessions" that are contributing to earth's health problems. They're making us sick and killing a lot of earth's vitality. Future generations are going to be hurt the most. During this Season of Creation, we can think--What might "renouncing our possessions" look like in our own family? (excerpted from Catholic Climate Covenant)







Proposed Constitutional Amendments: Be Vigilant!



Proposed Amendments to Virginia's Constitution would:



Create a radical "fundamental right" to abortion (Opposed by VCC)



Restore voting rights (Supported by VCC)



Remove Virginia's "union between one man and one woman" definition of marriage (Opposed by VCC)

These three proposals were **initially approved** by the General Assembly earlier this year. If they pass the legislature again in 2026 – and are then approved by Virginia voters on a ballot – they would become law.

The legislators we elect this November will decide whether the proposed amendments are advanced or stopped.

Extreme, Radical and Deadly Abortion Amendment

This proposed amendment would enshrine virtually unlimited abortion at any stage of pregnancy as a "fundamental right" in Virginia's constitution.

In addition to the paramount problem of not recognizing the child's life, the amendment:

- Does not include any age restriction
- Does not include any safety standards
- Jeopardizes Virginia's parental consent law
- Jeopardizes Virginia's conscience protections for healthcare providers
- Expands Virginia's already permissive abortion laws
- · And has numerous other problems!

Abortion is a fundamental tragedy, not a "fundamental right".

Ending a life is not a right and does not belong in the constitution.

Proposed Constitutional Amendments:





Amendment Rejecting the Truth about Marriage

This proposed amendment would remove Virginia's constitutional definition of marriage as the "union between one man and one woman." It would add language recognizing "any lawful marriage between two adult persons" instead.

Marriage was created by God as the union of a man and a woman. God's design and purpose for marriage existed before any nation, religion or law.

The family - based on marriage between a man and a woman - is the fundamental unit of society and is integral to the common good.

Marriage – as created by God – is essential to the common good. Each of us is called to preserve God's design.



Amendment Restoring Voting Rights

This proposed amendment would restore voting rights to all people who have completed their prison sentences.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us, "It is necessary that all participate...in promoting the common good. This obligation is inherent in the dignity of the human person.... As far as possible, citizens should take an active part in public life" (nos. 1913-1915).

Enabling individuals, upon release, to resume taking an active part in voting decisions affirms their dignity and provides them a second chance to fulfill their duty to participate in promoting the common good. It enables them to have a say in decisions that affect them, their families and their communities.


As the U.S. Catholic Bishops have noted, restoring voting rights is an important aspect of reintegration:

"[W]e must welcome ex-offenders back into society as full participating members, to the extent feasible, and support their right to vote."



Creer en Jesús es seguirle con valentía y perseverancia por el camino de la cruz – que es, a la vez, el camino de la resurrección - . La fe es algo más que acompañar circunstancialmente a Jesús o que sentir admiración por Él. La fe exige la identificación del discípulo con el Maestro y comporta el dinamismo de caminar tras sus huellas. No se puede creer en Jesús sin vivir como Él, sin seguirle. Y este proceso de seguimiento supone estar dispuestos a un cambio continuo, a una verdadera conversión.

Jesús pide una entrega radical, que solamente puede pedir Dios. Explicando las condiciones que se requieren para seguirle, el Señor, indirectamente, revela su identidad divina. Él es más que un profeta. Siguiéndole a Él se hace concreta la observancia del primer mandamiento de la ley de Dios: "Amarás al Señor tu Dios con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma y con todas tus fuerzas". Seguir a Jesús es responder, con la propia vida, al amor de Dios.

Esta primacía de Dios, esta renuncia a divinizar lo que no es divino, que Jesús pone como condición para ser discípulo suyo, la recoge San Benito al indicar la finalidad de su regla: "No anteponer absolutamente nada al amor de Cristo". Ni los lazos familiares, ni los bienes, ni el amor a uno mismo pueden tener la precedencia. El primer lugar le corresponde a Dios, que ha salido a nuestro encuentro en la Persona de Cristo.

El Señor, caminando delante de nosotros, nos indica cómo hacer real este programa exigente. Pide renuncia aquel que se anonadó a sí mismo; pide pobreza el que por nosotros se hizo pobre; pide llevar tras Él la cruz aquel que se hizo obediente hasta la muerte. Conformando nuestros pensamientos, nuestras palabras y nuestras acciones con los del Señor responderemos a la primera vocación del cristiano, que no es otra que seguir a Jesús (cf *Catecismo* 2232).

La capacidad para construir el edificio de la propia vida y la fuerza para salir airosos del combate no provienen de nosotros mismos, sino de Dios. El seguimiento de Cristo no es una escalada en solitario reservada a unos pocos héroes, sino una ascensión que realizamos unidos a Él. San Juan es el evangelista que pone de relieve este aspecto con mayor claridad: no se trata sólo de escuchar a Jesús o de caminar detrás de Él, se trata de vivir en comunión con Él, permaneciendo en Él, como los sarmientos permanecen unidos a la vid (cf *Jn* 15,4).

Mediante los sacramentos y la oración recibimos la gracia de Cristo y los dones del Espíritu Santo que hacen posible esta comunión. Como el Salmista, también nosotros nos acogemos a la memoria de la fe para no tener miedo, para no flaquear en este camino del seguimiento, que es el camino de la auténtica felicidad: "Señor, tú has sido nuestro refugio de generación en generación" (Sal 89). Apelamos a la misericordia de Dios, a su compasiva bondad, para que "haga prósperas las obras de nuestras manos".

Es gratis y...; nadie lo pide! Reflexiones dolor y la muerte

Pues bien, hay por ahí arrumbado en las sacristías un Sacramento que se llama el "Sacramento del Perdón". Y se da gratis, no cuesta nada, pero la gente ya casi no lo pide. Yo quisiera decir que la confesión es un encuentro con Dios. Un encuentro auténtico con Él, no deja igual, ¡transforma!.

Así como los encuentros de la Samaritana, de Zaqueo, de Pablo, etc., en esos encuentros hay un algo que hacer saltar la chispa de sentir a Dios como la medicina adecuada, la solución, el sentido de la vida, el que andaba buscando, lo que más necesitaba. La medicina toca en la llaga abierta, pero no para abrirla más, sino para curarla.

El pecador ante Dios no se siente descubierto, sino perdonado. Ante Cristo Crucificado el pecador no debe sentir vergüenza sino amor. La confesión es un encuentro peculiar: la miseria choca con la misericordia, el pecador y el redentor se abrazan, el hijo pródigo y el padre se vuelven a encontrar. Pero; ¡qué manía de confesarse con el hombre y no con Dios!

Porque las sogas que me atan son de esta estopa: ¿Qué va a pensar el Padre?, el hombre? El Padre no piensa nada, no debe de pensar nada. ¿Cómo le digo esto sin descomponerme? No me atrevo, mañana me confieso, para lo mismo responder mañana.

Y, ¡qué manía de confesarse consigo mismo!: "He fallado, he caído muy bajo, muy hondo, ¡qué vergüenza!", ¿Para qué me confieso otra vez si voy a volver a fallar? Te confiesas tu mismo ante tu orgullo herido, que supura rabia, desesperanza, porque no acepta ser un pecador más, de los que tienen que llorar y arrepentirse como todos.

Confesarse con Dios es mejor que confesarse con el hombre o consigo mismo. Duele, ¡sí!, pero ese dolor es de otra clase, duele haber herido un amor, haber ofendido a un Padre, haber roto una amistad. Dolor redentor y humilde que cura, que trae la paz de Dios.

¡Confiésate con Él!, dile tus pecados. Llórale a Dios tu arrepentimiento. Prométele que vas a cambiar, que vas a levantarte de nuevo.

Cuando te confiesas sube la cuesta del Calvario y plántate delante de ese gran Cristo Crucificado, sangrante, que está muriendo por ti. Ahí, ante ese Cristo ¡confiésate!. Cuéntale, llórale tus pecados y a Él pídele perdón.

El encuentro con el hombre provoca vergüenza, el encuentro con uno mismo provoca orgullo herido y la desesperación, el encuentro con Cristo Crucificado produce la paz del perdón. Hoy haz una cita con el Redentor. Soy el hijo pródigo, me siento pecador, no necesito inventar pecados, ahí están, son muchos, llevan mi nombre, pero el perdón de Dios es infinitamente mayor.

Cristo perdona siempre y con mucho gusto. Ahí encontrarás siempre al mismo Dios con el perdón en la mano y en el corazón, un perdón siempre del tamaño del pecado.

A Cristo le gusta, le fascina perdonar. Con terminología humana podríamos decir, que se siente realizado perdonando, perdonándote a ti y a mi. Se trata de un encuentro con Dios muy especial. El médico que va con el enfermo sabe muy bien qué medicina recetarle, tiene medicina para todos los males; las hay pequeñas, las hay grandes, hay medicinas para todos los males.

La verdad es que cuando uno se confiesa bien, se siente curado. És el encuentro del hombre cansado y triste con Dios Omnipotente que restaura sus fuerzas. Hay en la penitencia vitaminas para la tristeza y el cansancio, males de quien diariamente debe recorrer un largo camino.

La verdad es que la confesión restaura esas fuerzas y nos brinda paz, es el encuentro del amigo que ha fallado a la amistad con el Amigo, con Cristo, con Dios, con ese Padre misericordioso que siempre trae en las manos algo para ti.

La confesión frecuente reafirma mi amistad con Dios, con el Cristo de mis días felices y mis grandes momentos. Por eso, si al confesarme me asiste un poco de fe como un grano de mostaza, debería ser un encuentro regocijante y un gran acontecimiento cada vez.

La forma mejor de confesarse es hacerlo a la puerta del infierno para llenarnos de susto o frente a un crucifijo para llenarnos de amor.
