

A Message from our Pastor Fr. Bob Cilinski



"Moved with compassion the master of that servant let him go and forgave him." - Matt 18:27

My dear parishioners,

It's all about forgiveness isn't it? That is the prevailing theme in our scripture readings today. We are urged to forgive so we will be granted forgiveness ourselves. In the gospel God forgives a large sum and wipes the slate clean. The man receiving this generosity of God then goes and slams in jail another man asking for time to pay back a very small amount. He is hard and unforgiving. Forgiveness of God is not earned ... it is freely given as a gift of love.

The need to forgive is daunting. We know that it is easier said than done. We can become imprisoned by our anger and it can begin to rule our lives. Jesus is the GOOD NEWS and the theme of mercy and forgiveness leaps through all of Jesus' life.

Last Monday was the anniversary of the terrorist attack on the World Trade Center, the Pentagon, and Pennsylvania. We reflect on that horrible day in American history and the grief that we felt. There was also great heroism and support of people of good will. Only prayer and dependence on God could heal the hurt and anger felt by so many people. The words of Jesus about forgiveness came close to home on that day. Forgiveness takes time. It is a process. I find the words of Jesus to be consoling and hopeful. We don't have to remain burdened by the chains of an unforgiving heart. Forgiveness is a way to be transformed by the love of God so that we can show that love to others. It is the only path to follow.

Many thanks to all who participated in our parish Ministry Fair last Sunday. The staff did a great job setting up the Fr. Martin Center and we all enjoyed celebrating and strengthening our work together of building up the Kingdom of God. We rejoice in all who signed up to share their gifts in ministry. Thank you so much.

Speaking of Fairs and Festivals, our Parish Festival is coming up in just a few weeks. Mark Saturday, September 30 on your calendar to celebrate together. The theme this year is our 50th Anniversary and will feature a Food Court with games and entertainment. Can't wait!







The central and enduring themes of Catholic social teaching are organized under four principles that provide a moral framework for decisions in public life.

The Dignity of the Human Person

Human life is sacred. The dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society. Direct attacks



on innocent persons are never morally acceptable. In our society, the gravest example is abortion. Euthanasia, assisted suicide, human cloning, in vitro fertilization

and the destruction of embryos for research are others. Protecting the dignity of life also includes overcoming poverty, ending use of the death penalty, and opposing racism, torture, unjust war, human trafficking and all activities that contribute to the "throwaway culture" identified by Pope Francis.

The Common Good

The common good is achieved when social conditions allow people to reach their fulfillment more fully and easily. It



upholds the fundamental right to life, which makes all other rights possible. It asserts the right to food, shelter, education, employment, health care, housing, freedom

of religion and conscience, and family life. It requires an economy that serves people, not the other way around. It calls on employers to uphold the dignity and rights of workers by offering productive work, decent and just wages, adequate security in their old age, the choice of whether to organize and join unions and the opportunity for legal status for immigrant workers. Workers should contribute a fair day's work for a fair day's pay, treat employers and co-workers with respect and contribute to the common good. This principle requires we protect and care for all of God's creation, especially the most vulnerable among us, and the earth, our common home.

Subsidiarity

The human person is social. The family is the fundamental building block of society, based on marriage between a man



and a woman, a sanctuary for creation and nurturing of children. Policies and programs should defend, strengthen and respect this foundational unit and uphold parents'

rights and responsibilities to care for and educate their children. Further, every person and association has a right and duty to actively shape society and promote the well-being of all, especially the poor and vulnerable. Subsidiarity means that society's larger institutions should not overwhelm or interfere with smaller or local ones. These larger institutions are obliged, however, to protect human dignity and meet human needs when smaller institutions cannot adequately do so.

Solidarity

We are one human family, despite our national, racial, ethnic, economic and ideological differences, called to love our neighbor as ourselves. We must work to



eradicate poverty, disease and racism; and welcome immigrants, refugees and asylum seekers who are seeking employment, safety, education and

a better life for their families. Solidarity requires preferential concern for the poor. A basic moral test of any society is how it treats those who are most vulnerable. This preferential option for the poor and vulnerable includes all who are marginalized – unborn children, persons with disabilities, the elderly and terminally ill, victims of injustice and oppression and immigrants.



had taught earlier (Matthew 6:12): "Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us."

The strongest word here is "AS" – the same as, just like, in equal measure.

If there is anyone we have not forgiven, if there is anyone we

cannot pray for with love, we'd better keep our mouths shut during this part of the prayer to our Father, who is the Father of all.

Sometimes, it's difficult to forgive because we think "forgiving" means "forgetting". Jesus never said that we must forget what the debtor owes. Forgiveness means remembering – and learning from the memory – without demanding repayment or retribution.

Unforgiveness is a form of

punishment: it's payback time. For example, if we remain angry, we hope that our anger or coldness will somehow punish the sinner into repentance. Well, guess what. That never works.

Here's something else we do that never works: holding a



grudge to protect ourselves from getting hurt again. Grudges do not free us from the pain of bad

memories. It chains us to them.

When we free others from the debts they owe us for hurting us (whether they seek it or not, whether they're still alive or not), we free ourselves and our healing begins – our healing!

It's the most loving gift that we can give to ourselves, as it's a gift of love to others.

Even when they don't recognize our gift, God does.

Reflect & Discuss:

- Who angers you because they don't deserve your forgiveness?
- What are you gaining from unforgiveness and resentment? What will you lose if you forgive?
- What is the most difficult part of forgiveness?
- What steps do you take for pushing yourself into truly letting go of unforgiveness so you can find healing? Sharing this with others will spread good ideas that could change someone's life!

PAPA FRANCISCO:

"¡Eso que le dice a Pedro, te lo dice a ti, y a ti, y a ti, a mí, y a todos: 'Yo he rezado por ti, yo rezo por ti, yo ahora estoy rezando por ti', y cuando viene al altar, Él viene a interceder, a rezar por nosotros. Como en la cruz. Y esto nos da una gran seguridad.".

El Papa concluyó su homilía destacando lo importante que es confiar en que Jesús está siempre intercediendo por nosotros y acompañándonos.

RESUMEN DE LA HOMILÍA DEL PAPA

"La piedra angular, partiendo de San Pablo es el mismo Jesús. Sin Jesús no hay Iglesia".

"Jesús se fue al monte a rezar y pasó toda la noche orando a Dios'. Y después viene todo lo demás: la gente, la elección de los discípulos, las curaciones, la liberación de los demonios... La piedra angular es Jesús, sí: pero Jesús que reza. Jesús reza. Ha orado y sigue orando por la Iglesia. La piedra angular de la Iglesia es el Señor ante el Padre, que intercede por nosotros, que reza por nosotros. Nosotros le rezamos a Él, pero el fundamento es Él que reza por nosotros".

"Jesús siempre ha rezado por los suyos, incluso en la Última Cena. Jesús antes de hacer algún milagro, reza. Pensemos en la resurrección de Lázaro: reza al Padre".

"En el Monte de los Olivos Jesús reza; en la cruz, termina rezando: su vida terminó en oración. Y ésta es nuestra seguridad, éste es nuestro fundamento, ésta es nuestra piedra angular: ¡Jesús que reza por nosotros! ¡Jesús reza por mí! 

Enfasis Sugerido

Perspectiva Salesiana

¿Alguna vez han estado disgustados? ¿Alguna vez han estado furiosos? ¿Alguna vez han estado enojados? ¡Por supuesto que sí! El enojo (con sus múltiples facetas) inevitablemente hace parte de la vida…algunas veces; de hecho constituye una parte muy volátil de la vida. Como cualquier otra emoción, no se puede negar ni reprimir.

En lo que a las emociones se refiere, el enfado no es un pecado, como no se consideraría pecado la dicha, el miedo o la felicidad. Sin embargo, la manera en que manejamos nuestro enfado – o nuestro fracaso a la hora de manejarlo – determinará si este ha de transformarse en una virtud, o en un vicio: si ultimadamente desembocará en algo constructivo, o en algo destructivo.

Muy pocas personas planean enojarse. El enojo es una respuesta, o una reacción intensa que se desata ante una injusticia o una herida, bien sea real o percibida; es por esto que la mayoría de las veces nos toma por sorpresa. He aquí la dificultad que genera esa emoción tan "molesta": es precisamente debido a su espontaneidad e intensidad, que el enfado muchas veces nos lleva la ventaja... y con mucha más rapidez puede salirse de nuestro control. El enojo, por así decirlo, puede llegar a convertirse en el inquilino a quien no hemos invitado y que de repente se convierte en el amo de la casa. Francisco de Sales hace la siguiente observación: "Una vez admitimos el enojo es muy difícil volver a expulsarlo. Este empieza como una pequeña rama, y en tiempo record se convierte en una viga". Francisco de Sales nos da el siguiente consejo: "Es mejor que intentemos encontrar formas de vivir sin el enojo, que fingir que podemos manejarlo de manera discreta y moderada. En la medida en que reine la razón, y que expongamos nuestros reproches y correctivos con calma, las personas los aprobarán y los aceptarán. Pero si hacemos esto con rabia e ira, nuestros reproches, nuestras sanciones, serán recibidas con miedo en lugar de amor". Juana de Chantal por su parte sugiere lo siguiente: "Traten de apaciguar sus pasiones y vivan de acuerdo a la razón y la sagrada voluntad de Dios". Es mejor darle un respiro a nuestro enojo antes de tomar decisiones importantes o de embarcarnos en un curso de acción determinado.

Por encima de todo, no debemos alimentar ni nutrir nuestro enfado. Consentir repetidamente el enojo puede tener resultados desastrosos para nosotros. Cuando nos obsesionamos con nuestras heridas, cuando repasamos dolores pasados, cuando nos aferramos al resentimiento, dejamos de ser personas que se ocasionalmente se enfurecen, para gradualmente convertimos en personas amargadas. Ser adictos a la furia es como beber veneno, pero esperar que sean los demás quienes perezcan. Aunque puede que, por fuera, nuestro enojo realmente haga daño a los demás, el veneno que produce eventualmente nos mata desde adentro.

Atiendan las palabras del Libro de Sirach: "La ira y la rabia son cosas odiosas, y aun así el pecador se aferra a ellas con fuerza. ¿Es correcto que una persona alimente la ira en contra de los demás, y al mismo tiempo espere ser sanada por el Señor? Del mismo modo en que una piedra lanzada hacia arriba va a caer sobre quien la ha lanzado, el golpe dado con rabia va a herir a más de uno. Perdonen las injusticias cometidas por sus semejantes; y así cuando ustedes oren sus propios pecados serán perdonados" (Sir 27: 25; 28: 2-3)

Eviten sustentar y regodearse en la ira; recuerden que esta es una emoción, y que no debe convertirse en una forma de vida.


