Bishop Michael F. Burbidge's Statement on the Assassination of Charlie Kirk

September 10, 2025

As Americans, we are witnesses in just the past few weeks to a vicious pattern of political and social disorder. At Annunciation Catholic Parish in Minneapolis, the killings of Harper Moyski and Fletcher Merkel, two innocent children. In Charlotte, the murder of Ukrainian refugee Iryna Zarutska. And now the political assassination of Charlie Kirk, known for his commitment to civil and rational discourse. We entrust each of these victims to God, our Heavenly Father and author of every human life, and his son Jesus Christ, the reason for our supernatural hope.

What we see unfolding in our nation is a vicious pattern of hatreds rooted in the rejection of God, of the dignity of the human person, and the sanctity of the family. We can eradicate these ills only through a firm reliance on God, through a deeper devotion to Christ and the Gospel, through a sincere love for persons reflected in law, and through a renewed commitment to justice and public order.

We are living through a perilous moment. Our challenge is not only one of partisan disagreement, law, and policy, but in a deeper way our challenge is to uphold the central goods of American political life: of faith, of families, and of a national commitment to live together in harmony as brothers and sisters.






HOLY LAND OLIVEWOOD CHRISTIAN DISPLAYS

Pro-Life Corner

Nativity All-Day Prayer Vigil for Life: Friday, October 24th - Join fellow Nativity parishioners for one hour between 7am-7pm as we peacefully pray the pro-life Rosary on the sidewalk in front of abortion facility at 900 S. Washington St. Falls Church. When someone prays in front of an abortion facility. the no-show rate for appointments can go to as high as 75%! (40 DFL) Be that someone with us! https://bit.ly/4pdRUn8 Abortion is never medically necessary, 'even in an emergency,' experts say - As reported by Katie Yoder in OSV News, September 3, 2025, "Abortion—an act performed with the sole or primary intent of ending human life in the womb—is never medically necessary, according to medical doctors and Catholic experts on the issue... Instead, these experts said, doctors must endeavor to care for the two patients involved in every pregnancy: the woman and her unborn baby... [S]ituations can exist where a pregnant woman may receive life-saving treatment for herself even if it threatens or indirectly leads to her baby's death [such as an ectopic pregnancy]. The intent, here, is to save her life, not end her baby's life... Addressing church teaching, Bishop Daniel E. Thomas said that abortion is "never the right moral decision" and that '(w)e must make a clear moral and legal distinction between tragically losing a child and intentionally taking the life of a child"

"The Catechism of the Catholic Church, which summarizes church teaching, recognizes the inherent dignity of the human person beginning at conception and condemns any "crime against human life," such as abortion. 'Since the first century the Church has affirmed the moral evil of every procured abortion,'...'Both the preborn child and mother are human beings with rights...and have equal dignity,' [Meaney] said."

"These experts shared their guidance for pregnant women who are feeling overwhelmed or scared by their situation. [Dr. Christina Francis, a board-certified OB-GYN,] wanted them to know that no state law prevents excellent obstetric care and that they have access to additional support through pregnancy centers and other programs. Raviele added that, if a woman has been told to abort her baby, she should seek a second opinion. She recommended women turn to the Catholic Medical Association. Bishop Thomas addressed how the church, including everyday Catholics, can accompany pregnant women facing lifethreatening situations. 'First, to accompany with love and pastoral care pregnant women who find themselves in these frightening situations,' he said. He called on pastors and pro-life family and friends to be aware of the nuances to better help women."

Proposed Constitutional Amendments: Be Vigilant!



Proposed Amendments to Virginia's Constitution would:



Create a radical "fundamental right" to abortion

(Opposed by VCC)



Restore voting rights (Supported by VCC)



Remove Virginia's "union between one man and one woman" definition of marriage (Opposed by VCC)

These three proposals were **initially approved** by the General Assembly earlier this year. If they pass the legislature again in 2026 – and are then approved by Virginia voters on a ballot – they would become law.

The legislators we elect this November will decide whether the proposed amendments are advanced or stopped.

Extreme, Radical and Deadly Abortion Amendment

This proposed amendment would enshrine virtually unlimited abortion at any stage of pregnancy as a "fundamental right" in Virginia's constitution.

In addition to the paramount problem of not recognizing the child's life, the amendment:

- Does not include any age restriction
- Does not include any safety standards
- · Jeopardizes Virginia's parental consent law
- · Jeopardizes Virginia's conscience protections for healthcare providers
- Expands Virginia's already permissive abortion laws
- · And has numerous other problems!

Abortion is a fundamental tragedy, not a "fundamental right".

Ending a life is not a right and does not belong in the constitution.

Proposed Constitutional Amendments:





Amendment Rejecting the Truth about Marriage

This proposed amendment would remove Virginia's constitutional definition of marriage as the "union between one man and one woman." It would add language recognizing "any lawful marriage between two adult persons" instead.

Marriage was created by God as the union of a man and a woman. God's design and purpose for marriage existed before any nation, religion or law.

The family – based on marriage between a man and a woman – is the fundamental unit of society and is integral to the common good.

Marriage – as created by God – is essential to the common good. Each of us is called to preserve God's design.



Amendment Restoring Voting Rights

This proposed amendment would restore voting rights to all people who have completed their prison sentences.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us, "It is necessary that all participate...in promoting the common good. This obligation is inherent in the dignity of the human person.... As far as possible, citizens should take an active part in public life" (nos. 1913-1915).

Enabling individuals, upon release, to resume taking an active part in voting decisions affirms their dignity and provides them a second chance to fulfill their duty to participate in promoting the common good. It enables them to have a say in decisions that affect them, their families and their communities.

As the U.S. Catholic Bishops have noted, restoring voting rights is an important aspect of reintegration:

"[W]e must welcome ex-offenders back into society as full participating members, to the extent feasible, and support their right to vote."

Dios sale al encuentro

Reflexiones Dios

No es sino en lo más profundo de nuestro ser que podemos encontrar a Dios.

Una de las más hermosas descripciones de Dios en pos de la persona es la de Francis Thompson en el poema The Hound of Heaven. *Yo huía de Él, durante las noches y durante los días*;

yo huía de Él en el transcurso de los años;

yo huía de Él por las laberínticas sendas de mi propia mente;

y en medio de las lágrimas me escondía de El, lo mismo que entre la risa pasajera...

Dios sale al encuentro, y nosotros huimos, Dios está presente en todos los momentos de nuestra vida. Dios se encuentra siempre disponible para nosotros. No tenemos más que hablarle. Ahora. Hoy. Esta noche. El comprende nuestro lenguaje, nuestros temores, nuestros secretos, nuestra amargura. El no te considerará como un sentimental si le hablas afectuosamente del pasado, si eres ya viejo. No se apartará de ti aunque seas un mentiroso, un ladrón, un asesino, un hipócrita, un traidor.

Dios siempre sale al encuentro del ser humano, de la oveja perdida, del hijo que se marchó de casa. En esta historia de búsqueda y encuentro, la iniciativa y la parte más importante la lleva Él. Dios es el principal agente y el principal amante. Porque ama, se da y se entrega totalmente. Si buscamos a Dios, más nos busca Dios a nosotros. Y el místico Abu Azid confesó: *Yo busqué a Dios durante treinta años; yo creía que era yo quien lo deseaba, pero no, era él quien me deseaba a mí*. El buscar a Dios lleva consigo el esforzarse por cambiar el corazón, por desear y perseguir toda clase de bondad.

El ser humano busca, a veces sin saberlo, a Dios. La razón es bien sencilla, pues cada persona es imagen de Dios, espejo del amor, de la felicidad y de la vida. Unas personas lo descubren en la niñez, otros ya en la edad adulta. Cuando san Agustín cayó en la cuenta de lo que era, dijo: ¡Tarde te amé! ¡Oh hermosura tan antigua y siempre nueva! ¡Tarde te amé! (...)

El ser humano, en muchas ocasiones, busca a Dios donde no le puede encontrar o pasa de Dios y huye de él y vive como si no existiese, como si él estuviese lejos. Y no se da cuenta el hombre que Dios es un Dios escondido porque se encuentra en la intimidad de nuestro corazón. Dios nos llama a no escondernos de su mirada, a descubrir su presencia en lo cotidiano, en lo oculto de nuestra vida e historia.

A Dios, pues, lo podemos encontrar a través de una fe impulsada por el amor. Él vive dentro de cada uno. «Ésa es vuestra tragedia. ¡Olvidáis! ¡Olvidáis al Dios que hay en vosotros! ¡Queréis olvidar! ¡El recuerdo implicará el alto deber de vivir como un hijo de Dios…¡Es más fácil olvidar, convertirse solamente en un hombre…¡Vivir negando la vida!» (Eugene O Neill).

El Dios que está con nosotros, aparece muchas veces débil e impotente, sin poder hacer nada. Dios nos da a conocer que tenemos que vivir como seres humanos que resuelven su vida sin Dios. El Dios que está con nosotros es el Dios que nos abandona... Ante Dios y con Dios, vivimos sin Dios. Dios se deja arrojar del mundo para ir a parar a la cruz; Dios es impotente y débil en el mundo, y precisamente así y únicamente así es como está junto a nosotros y como nos ayuda (D. Bonhoeffer).

Dios está en nosotros, ha entrado en nosotros. Todas las noches, Leónidas, padre de Orígenes, acostumbraba besar el pecho de su hijo dormido por reverencia al Dios que estaba realmente presente en el tabernáculo vivo del corazón de su hijo. Dios está presente realmente en el tabernáculo de cada corazón humano; aquí podremos encontrarlo, pues, aquí habla, escucha, mora, vive y da vida.

Dios está muy presente en nuestra vida y nos invita a transformarnos en él y vivir con él. Con él podemos hablar, está al alcance de la mano, él es nuestro Padre. Dios se nos revela como un Dios cercano, quiere ser amigo. Dios está presente en el ser humano, en cada acontecimiento y en cada cosa.

Dios está en la fuente y en el río, en el mar y en el aire, pero sobre todo está, en lo más profundo de la persona. El centro del alma es Dios, al cual cuando el alma hubiere llegado según toda la capacidad de su ser, y según la fuerza de su operación e inclinación, habrá llegado al último y más profundo centro suyo en Dios, que será cuando con todas sus fuerzas entienda y ame y goce a Dios....

El ser humano es un ser inacabado, con capacidad para conocer y amar a su Creador que está en su corazón. Este Dios vive en lo más profundo del ser humano y vive escondido, *le está al alma escondido, y le conviene siempre al alma... tenerle por escondido.*

Por la fe podemos ver a Dios que está dentro. Esto mismo es lo que afirma Pablo VI: En el punto de encuentro esencial con el misterio religioso, con Dios, está dentro de nosotros mismos; está en la celda interior de nuestro espíritu, en aquella actividad personal que llamamos oración.

Una de nuestras grandes tragedias del ser humano es el no haber descubierto la interioridad, las riquezas que llevamos escondidas dentro. Gran parte del sufrimiento que padece mucha gente puede ser atribuido, en no pequeña medida, al hecho de que vivimos exiliados de nuestra tierra natal... del mundo interior (A. Maslow). Lágrimas de sangre derramó Agustín cuando descubrió el sin sentido de la vida que llevaba: Te buscaba fuera y tú estabas dentro.

Es importante encontrar el camino que conduce al interior, tener hambre de luz y de verdad. El peligro no está en el mundo, en lo exterior, sino en centrarse en lo que nos da vida. *Lo importante no es abandonar materialmente el mundo, pues el mundo está en uno mismo y la reforma del ego es más rigurosa que el retiro en una región solitaria, un ashram o un monasterio* (M.M. Daby). La oración tiene que ser un espacio abierto donde entren los otros y Dios, donde se avance en conocimiento propio.

Así como el sol madruga para entrar en tu casa, si le abres la ventana, así Dios te despierta cada mañana para que lo adores en tu interior, para que hables con él, para que vivas plenamente. El amor y la fe son los ojos que Dios nos ha dado para descubrirle y habitar en él. Si alguno me ama, guardará mi palabra y mi Padre le amará y vendremos a él, y haremos morada en él (Jn 14,13). Para hablar con él, tenemos que abrirnos a él y dejarle entrar en nuestro ser.

En toda búsqueda la persona debe confiar en Dios. Confía en Yavé con todo tu corazón, y no te apoyes sobre tu propia prudencia. En todos tus caminos piensa en El, y El allanará tus senderos (Pr 3,5-6).
