A Message from our Pastor Msgr. Bob Cilinski



"But you, pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness" - 1 Timothy 6:11

My dear parishioners,

Three members of Nativity parish have received Papal Honors from Pope Leo for their service to the church. The Benemerenti Medal will be formally confirmed on them by Bishop Burbidge on Sunday, September 28, 2025 at a private Solemn Vespers at 7:00pm at the Cathedral. The ceremony will be livestreamed.

Sr. Donatella and Sr. Mary Attilia have served as the Directors of the Religious Education Program at Nativity Catholic Church in Burke, Virginia for 35 years dedicating their lives to passing on the faith to a thousand children each year.

Sister Donatella Merulla, AR made her profession of vows on November 8, 1970 with the Handmaids of the Reparation of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Sister Mary Attilia Torado, AR made her profession of vows on February 3, 1960 with the Handmaids of the Reparation of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

The sisters give their whole hearts to the Church and make sure that the love of Christ is known to every child who walks through the doors of Nativity. Adults remember their warm welcome when they attended first communion and confirmation classes and now, the sisters greet their children with the same joy. The sisters pray for the parish, and minister to all every day.

When people choose a religious order, they are drawn to two things: the community and its mission. The Sisters' motherhouse may be miles away (Sicily) but they have worked so intentionally to make Burke a true community rooted in prayer, enlivened by their gifts of the consecrated life and their commitment to mission. We may not all have the privilege of being "Handmaids of the Reparation" but we all have shared in the fruit of their work joining our parents in educating our children in faith and love for so many years.

James McDonald has been a Nativity parishioner for 45 years. He was instrumental along with the late Fr. Richard Martin, in starting our parish outreach to Haiti which was named "Operation Starfish." Under Jim's leadership, during the past 26 years we have built over 1600 homes in Haiti working with the organization Food For the Poor.

Jim has provided guidance and organizational support for each of the 14 villages in Haiti that we have rebuilt including schools, clinics, community centers, solar energy, fish ponds and clean water systems. Jim lives his faith and has a great love for the poor "around the world and across the street."

Jim has served as an Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist and in various parish leadership positions. He and his wife Michele raised their two adult children in Nativity parish.

We rejoice with Sr. Mary Attilia, Sr. Donatella and Jim McDaniel for their recognition and faithful witness on September 28, which is also Sr. Donatella's birthday! "If one part is honored, every part rejoices" - 1 Cor. 12:26.

Planned Parenthood defunding will proceed:

As reported by Live Action's Lila Rose in her 9/11/2025 email, Breaking: Planned Parenthood defunding will proceed, "the First Circuit Court of Appeals ruled that Health and Human Services can move forward with cutting off Medicaid funding to Planned Parenthood while the case continues in court. This is a major step forward in the fight to protect preborn children...

Planned Parenthood also runs nearly 600 facilities in 31 states where they do not just end preborn lives but also push dangerous puberty blockers and cross sex hormones, even to minors as young as 16. Taxpayers should never be forced to fund an organization that profits from killing innocent children. This ruling is a victory for life and justice... We must keep fighting until Planned Parenthood is fully and permanently defunded and every child is protected under law."

Four Principles of Catholic Social Teaching*

The central and enduring themes of Catholic social teaching are organized under four principles that provide a moral framework for decisions in public life.

The Dignity of the Human Person

Human life is sacred. The dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society. Direct attacks



on innocent persons are never morally acceptable. In our society, the gravest example is abortion. Euthanasia, assisted suicide, human cloning, in vitro fertilization

and the destruction of embryos for research are others. Protecting the dignity of life also includes overcoming poverty, ending use of the death penalty, and opposing racism, torture, unjust war, human trafficking and all activities that contribute to the "throwaway culture" identified by Pope Francis.

The Common Good

The common good is achieved when social conditions allow people to reach their fulfillment more fully and easily. It



upholds the fundamental right to life, which makes all other rights possible. It asserts the right to food, shelter, education, employment, health care, housing, freedom

of religion and conscience, and family life. It requires an economy that serves people, not the other way around. It calls on employers to uphold the dignity and rights of workers by offering productive work, decent and just wages, adequate security in their old age, the choice of whether to organize and join unions and the opportunity for legal status for immigrant workers. Workers should contribute a fair day's work for a fair day's pay, treat employers and co-workers with respect and contribute to the common good. This principle requires we protect and care for all of God's creation, especially the most vulnerable among us, and the earth, our common home.

Subsidiarity

The human person is social. The family is the fundamental building block of society, based on marriage between a man



and a woman, a sanctuary for creation and nurturing of children. Policies and programs should defend, strengthen and respect this foundational unit and uphold parents'

rights and responsibilities to care for and educate their children. Further, every person and association has a right and duty to actively shape society and promote the well-being of all, especially the poor and vulnerable. Subsidiarity means that society's larger institutions should not overwhelm or interfere with smaller or local ones. These larger institutions are obliged, however, to protect human dignity and meet human needs when smaller institutions cannot adequately do so.

Solidarity

We are one human family, despite our national, racial, ethnic, economic and ideological differences, called to love our neighbor as ourselves. We must work to



eradicate poverty, disease and racism; and welcome immigrants, refugees and asylum seekers who are seeking employment, safety, education and

a better life for their families. Solidarity requires preferential concern for the poor. A basic moral test of any society is how it treats those who are most vulnerable. This preferential option for the poor and vulnerable includes all who are marginalized – unborn children, persons with disabilities, the elderly and terminally ill, victims of injustice and oppression and immigrants.






A Message from the Nativity Creation Care Ministry

Each year from September 1 to October 4, the Christian family comes together for a celebration of prayer and action to protect our common home. During this Season of Creation we celebrate God as Creator. We are part of all that God has made. Our well-being is interwoven with the well-being of the Earth. This year, the theme for the season is "Peace with Creation." Creation is God's sacred gift, entrusted to our care. Christians are called to protect and nurture Creation in peace, working in partnership with others and passing this responsibility on to future generations. Its deep interconnectedness makes peace both essential and fragile. Pope Francis challenged us: "What is the goal of our work? What need does the Earth have of us? Leaving an inhabitable planet to future generations is up to us" (Laudato Si', 160).

Creation Care partnered with the Marriage Ministry at the Heroes Hike recently. Walking around the beautiful natural habitat of Lake Mercer, Creation Care Ministry (CCM) member, Kathy Walters, encouraged participants to focus on gratitude and a commitment to its protection. They observed two very important species in the park, easily visible at this time of year. The first was oak trees. She gave a quick fun biology lesson - plants capture energy from the sun and turn it into sugars and carbohydrates. Most animals don't eat plants directly, they eat insects, mostly caterpillars. Caterpillars transfer more energy from plants to other animals than any other plant eater. Oak trees support the growth and reproduction of the most caterpillars and they are known as a keystone species for this reason. Without caterpillars, we have few baby birds. The acorns are just starting to drop. Most oaks are not planted by squirrels, but by jays. One jay can bury 4500 acorns per fall and only remember where 1 in 4 are. And they help spread oaks because they can carry an acorn more than a mile. The group also observed asters in bloom along the path. They are a critical food resource for fall migrating butterflies and native bees.

Kathy shared that CCM will be celebrating with the parish in November during the week of service. We will be distributing small native seedlings that you can plant in your yard or a friend's to help increase biodiversity in our neighborhoods. We look forward to sharing God's Creation further with you then!










Desde el pecado hacia el amor Dolor y la muerte

Para el cristiano, el pecado es siempre una grave ofensa al amor. El pecado lleva al hombre a ir contra Dios.

El pecado deja huellas profundas y heridas duraderas. Uno de sus mayores daños consiste en hundir al pecador en la tristeza, la amargura, la desesperanza. Otro daño es el de la dejadez: si caigo una y otra vez en lo mismo, ¿para qué luchar por el cambio? Un daño más profundo y sutil consiste en llegar a la idea de que, en el fondo, el pecado no es tan malo, incluso podría ser bueno para uno en su situación actual...

Para el cristiano, el pecado es siempre una grave ofensa al amor. El pecado lleva al hombre a ir contra Dios, al optar por su egoísmo, y contra el prójimo, al preferir el propio bienestar en perjuicio de otros.

Pero si la ofensa es grave, si implica un desorden en el universo, la mano tendida de Dios puede provocar un cambio radical, incluso una situación paradójicamente favorable para el bien.

El pecador que pide misericordia, que se siente perdonado, permite el ingreso en el mundo de una inmensa infusión de bien y de esperanza. La acción de Dios, al ofrecer su perdón, suscita en los corazones una "nueva creación".

"Convertíos y apartaos de todos vuestros crímenes; no haya para vosotros más ocasión de culpa. Descargaos de todos los crímenes que habéis cometido contra mí, y haceos un corazón nuevo y un espíritu nuevo. ¿Por qué habéis de morir, casa de Israel? Yo no me complazco en la muerte de nadie, sea quien fuere, oráculo del Señor Yahvéh. Convertíos y vivid" (Ez 18,30-32).

El corazón que se deja tocar por el perdón de Dios entra en una nueva vida, empieza a existir en el Reino de la misericordia. Si antes sufría bajo las cadenas del pecado, ahora goza en el mundo del amor.

Los que antes éramos "no-pueblo" podemos llegar a ser Pueblo de Dios. Los que vivíamos sin compasión, podemos ahora ser compadecidos (cf. 1P 2,10).

La Encarnación, la Muerte, la Resurrección de Cristo, han abierto las puertas de los cielos, han abierto las puertas de la misericordia. Si el pecado introdujo el misterio del mal en el mundo, la obediencia del Hijo al Padre ha provocado la revolución más profunda en la historia humana: el perdón.

Quien acoge ese perdón, quien se deja tocar por el Amor redentor de Cristo, ya no puede volver a pensar ni a vivir como pecador. Paradójicamente, el pecado "provocó" la llegada de la gracia. Quien ha sido tocado por la misericordia, quien ha abierto su alma a la conversión, empieza a vivir en el mundo del amor.

"¿Qué diremos, pues? ¿Que debemos permanecer en el pecado para que la gracia se multiplique? ¡De ningún modo! Los que hemos muerto al pecado ¿cómo seguir viviendo en él? ¿O es que ignoráis que cuantos fuimos bautizados en Cristo Jesús, fuimos bautizados en su muerte? Fuimos, pues, con él sepultados por el bautismo en la muerte, a fin de que, al igual que Cristo fue resucitado de entre los muertos por medio de la gloria del Padre, así también nosotros vivamos una vida nueva. Porque si nos hemos hecho una misma cosa con él por una muerte semejante a la suya, también lo seremos por una resurrección semejante; sabiendo que nuestro hombre viejo fue crucificado con él, a fin de que fuera destruido este cuerpo de pecado y cesáramos de ser esclavos del pecado" (Rm 6,1-6).

Desde el pecado, borrado por la Cruz del Señor, podemos avanzar hacia el amor. Quien ha recibido tanto amor, sólo puede responder con amor. Quien ha sido perdonado, empieza a comprender que también él necesita perdonar a sus hermanos (cf. Lc 6,37).

Sólo entonces seremos semejantes al Padre de los cielos, que es bueno con todos, también con los ingratos y los perversos (cf. Lc 6,35).

Porque tristemente un día fui pecador. Pero Jesús, en su bondad, me dijo: "Tampoco yo te condeno. Vete, y en adelante no peques más" (Jn 8,11).




