POLITICAL ACTIVITY GUIDELINES

As the November Elections approach, it is a good time to review our policies regarding political activities on Church property. You can find additional information at: https://vacatholic.org/election2024/

A few principals to keep in mind:

- Distribution of partisan campaign literature (i.e. leaflets, bumper stickers, etc. that tend to support or oppose a candidate) on church property is not permitted. The same is true for any voter guides or other election-related materials (other than those prepared by Bishop Burbidge, the Virginia Catholic Conference or the USCCB). If you discover someone distributing such materials, politely ask them to stop and escort them off the property.
- Candidates for political office may not be endorsed or opposed, either at Mass or through any official Church channel.
- Voter guides or election-related materials other than those prepared by Bishop Burbidge, the Virginia Catholic Conference or the USCCB, may not be distributed.

ECHO's Food Room continues to break records. We collected 948 lbs on the week of September 7/8.



U.S. Bishops Affirm that Ending Abortion Remains our Pre-eminent Priority - Bishop Burbidge's Respect Life Month Statement states: Jesus calls each of us to respect that gift of life in every human person. While we live in a society that often rejects those who are weak, fragile, or vulnerable, they are the most in need of our care and protection. The law and millions of our brothers and sisters have yet to recognize this reality... But what we now see is that fifty years of virtually unlimited abortion has tragically created a national mindset where many Americans have become comfortable with some amount of abortion. This allows the abortion industry to continue to provide any amount of abortion... "abortion remains our pre-eminent priority as it directly attacks our most vulnerable brothers and sisters, destroying more than a million lives each year in our country alone." ... We see many politicians celebrating the destruction of preborn children, and protecting access to abortion, even up until the moment of

birth. Pope St. John Paul II's words resonate today: "we are facing an enormous and dramatic clash between good and evil, death and life, ... we are all involved and we all share in it, with the inescapable responsibility of choosing to be unconditionally pro-life."

We must renew our commitment to work for the legal protection of every human life, from conception to natural death, and to vote for candidates who will defend the life and dignity of the human person... We must call for policies that assist women and their children in need, while also continuing to help mothers... through local pregnancy help centers... and to all who are suffering from participation in abortion... This fall, voters will select candidates for the office of President, U.S. Senator, U.S. Representative and – in some areas – "down-ballot" offices. The deadline to register is **Tues.**, **Oct. 15**.



Who is eligible to register?

- Must be a U.S. citizen.
- Must be a resident of Virginia.
- Must be 18 on or before the next election (e.g., 17-yearolds born on or before Nov. 5, 2006 can register today).
- Not be registered and plan to vote in another state.



Supernatural Love in Marriage

Do you love someone who isn't loving you back? Have you experienced God's supernatural love helping you love those who are difficult to love?

Those of us who are married expect to be loved by our spouses as much as we need to be loved. And we assume that it's always going to be mutual: We will always be loved with the same passion as we love them

However, most marriages enter difficulties that require supernatural love as well as supernatural persistence. That's why we need the Sacrament of Matrimony instead of just a civil ceremony at the courthouse or beach. Marriages need divine grace to endure with the permanence that God provides.

Jesus explained that the law of Moses permitted divorce because of the hardness of people's hearts. This is not an approval of divorce. He wants us to have hearts like his own, which never stops loving anyone.

In the days of Moses, when a marriage became difficult or unsatisfying, many men abandoned their wives. Although marriage was, from the beginning (Genesis Chapter 1), supposed to be a permanent covenant that united one man with one woman, a bill of divorce would allow an abandoned or rejected woman to remarry for her protection. It was never intended to be an approval of divorce.



Marriage is a reflection of God's faithful union with us. Permanence in marriage is a divine gift from God so that we can reflect him well. If we don't believe in the permanence of love within marriage, how can we believe that God is always in love with us – including when we don't deserve it? And how can children who watch us believe?

Remember, sometimes the lover goes to the Cross for the beloved. The vocation of marriage ordains the spouses to be a reflection of Christ's passion for all.

God never forces us to stay "married" to him. He loves us even when we turn away from him. Likewise, an unloved spouse is called by God to continue loving the one who abandons the marriage, even if only from afar. This is also true in any God-ordained friendships, and between priests and the laity they serve, and parents with their children.

- † How is the way you handled it like or unlike the heart of Christ?
- † How has God helped you love someone who quit loving you? How did you open yourself to receive his divine help?

Como un niño en las manos de Dios Quizá, con nuestros miedos, hemos hecho de Dios un extranjero

Un niño se siente seguro cuando, a su lado, están sus papás. Puede correr, gritar, pelearse, caer al suelo. Tal vez un golpe abre una pequeña herida y la sangre se pasea por la rodilla. El niño se asusta, llora, corre a ver a su madre. Pronto un beso y un pequeño masaje, acompañado por las palabras "mi rey, no es nada", hacen desaparecen las lágrimas, y el niño vuelve a sus aventuras y su sueños.

Así es el niño: un continuo sucederse de estados de ánimos, de risas y de lágrimas, de miedos y de seguridades. La brújula se mantiene con un norte constante si cerca hay alguien que le quiere, le sigue, le endereza y le ayuda cuando las cosas empiezan a ponerse mal. El niño juega tranquilo si sabe que mamá está a su lado. Las madres tienen un sexto sentido para detectar los peligros y para descubrir las enfermedades cuando empiezan los primeros síntomas. El niño se da cuenta de esto, casi sin decirlo, y por eso vive con una paz envidiable.

Los mayores vivimos a veces muy seguros de nosotros mismos. Hacemos nuestros programas, vamos al trabajo, pensamos en el verano y controlamos que quede un ahorrito en el banco. Nos sentimos tranquilos cuando todo está bajo control, y la posibilidad de una bancarrota, una crisis laboral, la expulsión de la fábrica o el susto de un accidente nos angustian, nos paralizan, quizá incluso nos llevan a la desesperación.

¿Por qué somos tan distintos de los niños? Porque creemos que la madurez coincide con la autosuficiencia, y porque pensamos que vivir siempre arropados por los padres es señal de infantilismo. Además, buscamos la seguridad en cosas que no son para nada estables. Incluso, si somos honestos, nosotros mismos no podemos garantizar nuestra salud ni siquiera para las próximas 24 horas...

En el Evangelio se nos pide que volvamos a ser como niños si queremos entrar en el Reino de los cielos. Es decir, hay que dejarle las riendas a Dios, para que nos conduzca y nos lleve a donde quiera con su cariño de Padre bueno. Hay que levantar los ojos llorosos al cielo para pedir perdón cuando hemos pecado o para pedir ayuda cuando las cosas en la familia o el trabajo no van bien. Hay que saber cerrar los ojos cada noche con la seguridad de que mañana Dios seguirá allí, fiel, dispuesto a ayudarnos si nos dejamos ayudar, a levantarnos si caemos, a consolarnos si las heridas de la vida son profundas.

Dios es como una madre, nos dice la Biblia. Lo que pasa es que a veces nos sentimos demasiado grandes y no le dejamos cogernos de la mano para ir al médico, para cambiarnos de ropa o para pedirnos que dejemos a los demás un poco de nuestro tiempo, cualidades o incluso de nuestro dinero.


