Voting as Faithful Citizens September 2024

Election Day is November 5. Early voting begins September 20. As Americans, we will decide who our next President will be. As Virginians, we will also decide who will represent our Commonwealth in the U.S. Senate and U.S. House of Representatives. As faithful citizens, it is our sacred duty to form our consciences and vote.

World and national events are ever-changing and often tragically alarming. In Ukraine and the Middle East, war, violence, and immense suffering are daily realities. Across our country, extreme and dangerous proposals to expand access to abortion will appear on many states' ballots this November. Seemingly everywhere we look, a "throwaway culture" runs rampant, disregarding dignity and embracing indifference, selfishness, abandonment, and greed.

Yet, we must see beyond all the destruction and despair. The Church's timeless teachings show us how. They shine light in the darkness, providing an anchor for our enduring hope and a sure guide for the formation of our consciences.

As we have stated in previous pre-election letters, these teachings tell us that three principles must guide how we vote:

- * Many issues are important.
- * Not all issues have equal moral weight.
- * Protecting life is paramount.

Addressing the tragedy of abortion is the "pre-eminent priority because it directly attacks our most vulnerable and voiceless brothers and sisters and destroys more than a million lives per year in our country alone" (U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, Introductory Letter).

As the November Elections approach, it is a good time to review our policies regarding political activities on Church property. You can find additional information at:

A few principals to keep in mind:

- Distribution of partisan campaign literature (i.e. leaflets, bumper stickers, etc. that tend to support or oppose a candidate) on church property is not permitted. The same is true for any voter guides or other election-related materials (other than those prepared by Bishop Burbidge, the Virginia Catholic Conference or the USCCB). If you discover someone distributing such materials, politely ask them to stop and escort them off the property.
- Candidates for political office may not be endorsed or opposed, either at Mass or through any official Church channel.
- Voter guides or election-related materials other than those prepared by Bishop Burbidge, the Virginia Catholic Conference or the USCCB, may not be distributed.



OCTOBER IS RESPECT LIFE MONTH



U.S. Bishops Affirm that Ending Abortion Remains our Pre-eminent Priority - Bishop Burbidge's Respect Life Month Statement states: Jesus calls each of us to respect that gift of life in every human person. While we live in a society that often rejects those who are weak, fragile, or vulnerable, they are the most in need of our care and protection. The law and millions of our brothers and sisters have yet to recognize this reality... But what we now see is that fifty years of virtually unlimited abortion has tragically created a national mindset where many Americans have become comfortable with some amount of abortion. This allows the abortion industry to continue to provide any amount of abortion... "abortion remains our pre-eminent priority as it directly attacks our most vulnerable brothers and sisters, destroying more than a million lives each year in our country alone." ... 

Pro-Life Corner

Profile: Jason Evert - This is My Body: A Catholic Approach to Gender Dysphoria (As noted by Evert in his talk at the Eucharistic Congress.)

Sexuality is something we are vs. something you do. Gender theory is a set of ideologies claiming that gender is just a social construct, whereas gender dysphoria is something individuals experience. As Catholics, we know that we cannot lie to those with gender dysphoria with false compassion because they deserve the truth and also they shouldn't be rejected because every person has infinite value. Evert points to Pope Francis' better option of accompaniment where we walk with these individuals in truth and love. Listen to what Pope Francis said: "The removal of sexual difference in fact creates a problem not a solution."

When a child experiences gender dysphoria the studies are clear: 80 to 95% of the time as they go through puberty they will naturally come to identify with their biological sex. So about 90% of the time it resolves itself unless "gender affirmative care" intervenes. This has four stages. Social transitioning leads to administering puberty blocker drugs to children as young as eight years old pausing bone development and neurological development and can cause crying, irritability, impatience, aggression and suicidal ideation and attempt. (The UK just banned these drugs for minors and closed the biggest gender clinic.) This treatment fast forwards to the third stage, injecting cross-sex hormones, which sterilizes the child and also quadruples her risk of heart disease, and to keep up the look s/he will need to be a lifelong pharmaceutical patient. The fourth step is surgery, which advocates call a "gender affirmative procedure." A common surgery is a bilateral mastectomy. Children's hospitals in Oakland and LA are now doing double mastectomies for 12- and 13-year-old girls, respectively and in Oregon it's 15 without parental permission.

About 10 years after the procedure, the suicide rate of these individuals climbs to 19 times higher than the general population. Isolate out the female-to-male transitioners and the suicide rate is 40 times higher. 90% of people who commit suicide have a diagnosable mental health condition, such as autism, OCD, depression, anxiety, and trauma. Hormones and surgery are making their bodies a false target of intervention, contributing to mental illness instead of actually treating it.

The truth is that we can't add the word 'trans' to another word and create a new reality. As expert Ryan Anderson has said, biology is not bigotry. Every single cell of the human body that has a nucleus is sex specific, so you could never change your sex. Jason gives suggestions for how to handle various potentially tense situations with compassion and truth. Because although our culture here from politics to pharmaceuticals to sports to the media is currently out to sea pushing transgenderism, there is about to hit an absolute tsunami of de-transitioners. These are individuals realizing it was a mistake, saying, "why did you adults let me do this to my body??" Now they're turning around and fighting back and winning lawsuits, like Keira Bell.

The church predicted this when Vatican II said that when God is forgotten, the creature itself grows unintelligible. Evert says the church's answer to this disintegration of man is John Paul II's integrated vision of man in his Theology of the Body.

The Dignity of the Human Person

Human life is sacred. The dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society. Direct attacks



on innocent persons are never morally acceptable. In our society, the gravest example is abortion. Euthanasia, assisted suicide, human cloning, in vitro fertilization

and the destruction of embryos for research are others. Protecting the dignity of life also includes overcoming poverty, ending use of the death penalty, and opposing racism, torture, unjust war, human trafficking and all activities that contribute to the "throwaway culture" identified by Pope Francis.

The Common Good

The common good is achieved when social conditions allow people to reach their fulfillment more fully and easily. It



upholds the fundamental right to life, which makes all other rights possible. It asserts the right to food, shelter, education, employment, health care, housing, freedom

of religion and conscience, and family life. It requires an economy that serves people, not the other way around. It calls on employers to uphold the dignity and rights of workers by offering productive work, decent and just wages, adequate security in their old age, the choice of whether to organize and join unions and the opportunity for legal status for immigrant workers. Workers should contribute a fair day's work for a fair day's pay, treat employers and co-workers with respect and contribute to the common good. This principle requires we protect and care for all of God's creation, especially the most vulnerable among us, and the earth, our common home.

Subsidiarity

The human person is social. The family is the fundamental building block of society, based on marriage between a man



and a woman, a sanctuary for creation and nurturing of children. Policies and programs should defend, strengthen and respect this foundational unit and uphold parents'

rights and responsibilities to care for and educate their children. Further, every person and association has a right and duty to actively shape society and promote the well-being of all, especially the poor and vulnerable. Subsidiarity means that society's larger institutions should not overwhelm or interfere with smaller or local ones. These larger institutions are obliged, however, to protect human dignity and meet human needs when smaller institutions cannot adequately do so.

Solidarity

We are one human family, despite our national, racial, ethnic, economic and ideological differences, called to love our neighbor as ourselves. We must work to



eradicate poverty, disease and racism; and welcome immigrants, refugees and asylum seekers who are seeking employment, safety, education and

a better life for their families. Solidarity requires preferential concern for the poor. A basic moral test of any society is how it treats those who are most vulnerable. This preferential option for the poor and vulnerable includes all who are marginalized – unborn children, persons with disabilities, the elderly and terminally ill, victims of injustice and oppression and immigrants.

Please consider volunteering for the diocesan Gabriel Project parish-based pregnancy help outreach, a model of the national USCCB "Walking with Moms" initiative, The ministry offers a Gabriel "Angel" to accompany an expectant mother with emotional, spiritual and material support. 

Sharing God's Riches

Jesus asks the rich young man, "Why do you call me good? Only God is good." What's he trying to achieve?

First, if the young man truly believes that Jesus is good and that his teachings are good, and if he has observed his miracles and behavior, then it should be obvious to him that all this goodness is proof that Jesus is God.

Also, Christ's question offers the young man an opportunity to become more humble. If he truly believes what Jesus says, then he should realize that since only God is good, no one else, including himself, obeys the commandments perfectly. Such a realization should have opened his heart to the truth that Jesus explains next:

"There's only one thing keeping you from being holy like God: earthly attachments. To gain freedom from this world and possess only what belongs to the kingdom of God share your treasures."

He's saying this to all of us, but he's not telling us to become destitute. To "give up" everything we possess means being willing to give it away. If it's a good thing for us to have because it blesses us, God does want us to enjoy it, but true joy comes from being God's partner as a distributer of his wealth. It's the fullest way to live! And we are all called to live this way.

If we remain attached to earthly stuff, we distance ourselves from God and hurt those who would benefit from our generosity. However, to achieve



complete freedom from attachments, we cannot rely only on our own efforts. It's often very difficult to let go and become willing to share everything.

The good news is that Jesus made it possible by taking our sins to the cross and sharing with us his own Holy Spirit, who empowers us to do whatever he asks of us. Our lives on earth become more fulfilling when we dare to share. The more we give to others in a spirit of love, the more we receive the treasures of heaven. Indeed, we become one of heaven's treasures!

La dignidad de la persona

La vida de una persona es sagrada. La dignidad de la persona es lo fundamental para haber una visión moral para la sociedad.



Los ataques directos hacia personas que son inocentes nunca son moralmente aceptables. En nuestra sociedad, el ejemplo más grave es el aborto. Eutanasia, suicidio asistido, clonación,

educación, empleo, salud, libertad de religión y conciencia, y vida familiar. Este requiere una economía que atiende a personas, no al revés. Pide a los empleadores a respetar la dignidad y los derechos de los trabajadores ofreciendo trabajo productivo, salarios justos, seguridad adecuada en la edad avanzada, la opción de poder organizar y unirse a los sindicatos y la oportunidad para obtener el estatus legal para los trabajadores inmigrantes. Los trabajadores deben contribuir con un día de trabajo para la paga de un día justo, tratando a los empleadores y compañeros de trabajo con respeto y contribuir al bien común.
