Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In just a few weeks, the Church throughout the world will celebrate the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, whom we in the United States especially honor as Patroness of our nation, on Monday, December 9, 2024. This great feast day, as the prayers of the Mass for the Solemnity remind us, celebrates the singular privilege that our Blessed Mother was preserved from all stain of original sin so as to be "a worthy dwelling" for our Incarnate Lord.

The Solemnity this year falls on the Second Sunday of Advent which, liturgically, outranks the celebration of the Solemnity itself. It is for this reason and because of its importance in our lives as Catholics that the observance of the Solemnity is transferred to the next day, December 9.

When the transfer of certain Holy Days of Obligation occurs, the obligation for the faithful to attend Mass is usually dispensed. In the United States, however, the obligation of attending Mass on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception remained, even if the liturgical celebration took place on another day. The Dicastery for Legislative Texts of the Holy See has confirmed that attendance at Mass for the holy day is obligatory. For the faithful in the Diocese of Arlington, attending Mass for the Solemnity on December 9 still remains as such.

While the obligation to attend Mass varies from diocese to diocese, it is a beautiful time to celebrate and honor Mary as the patroness of our country as we seek her powerful intercession asking that her Son bless our nation and the world, especially at this time, with his peace. Those who are unable to participate at Mass because of health or hardship are dispensed by that very fact and are encouraged to join the universal Church in honoring Mary in some way during the day, for example through their personal prayer or acts of charity and piety.

It is my hope that all of us, priests and lay faithful, will see this celebration as a privilege and an opportunity to come together and fittingly honor the Blessed Virgin Mary. May our coming celebration of Advent and the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception confirm in our hearts the great love that God has for the world by sending his Only Begotten Son, born of the Virgin, and of the tremendous motherly affection that Mary has for all of us, her children.







This group, open to persons who have had a loved one die by suicide, is held twice monthly. Participants will be offered information and suggestions for handing the complexity of grief that often follows a suicide. To participate, call Haven at 703-941-7000. *The group meets on Saturdays*.

Four-Week Widow/Widower Bereavement Support Group (formerly six-weeks). The group is open to persons whose spouse or partner has died. This loss can be numbing and devastating. You may have feelings of sadness, loneliness and abandonment. No one can heal your pain, but this group will help you learn ways to cope with this difficult experience. Parent Loss Support Workshop

This group is open to anyone who has experienced the death of a parent. Coping with a loss like this is often a traumatic and painful experience. 

Solemnidad de Cristo Rey, Ciclo B. Le veréis venir entre las nubes del cielo... Autor: P. Raniero Cantalamessa, ofmcap Sitio Web: P. Raniero Cantalamessa, ofmcap Daniel 7, 13-14; Apocalipsis 1, 5-8; Juan 18, 33b-37

En el Evangelio de este domingo, Pilato pregunta a Jesús: «¿Eres tú el Rey de los judíos?», y Jesús responde: «Sí, como dices, soy Rey». Poco antes, Caifás le había dirigido la misma pregunta de otra forma: «¿Eres tú el Hijo de Dios bendito?», y también esta vez Jesús respondió afirmativamente: «Sí, yo soy». Es más: según el Evangelio de Marcos [Mc, 14, 62. Ndt.], Jesús reforzó esta respuesta, citando y aplicándose aquello que el profeta Daniel había dicho del Hijo del hombre que viene entre las nubes del cielo y recibe el reino que nunca pasará (primera lectura). Una visión grandiosa en la que Cristo aparece dentro de la historia y por encima de ella, temporal y eterno.

Junto a esta imagen gloriosa de Cristo hallamos, en las lecturas de la solemnidad, la del Jesús humilde y sufriente, más preocupado de hacer de sus discípulos reyes que de reinar sobre ellos. En el pasaje del Apocalipsis Él es definido como quien «nos ama y nos ha lavado con su sangre de nuestros pecados y ha hecho de nosotros un Reino de Sacerdotes para su Dios y Padre».

Ha sido siempre dificil mantener unidas estas dos prerrogativas de Cristo –majestad y humildad-, derivadas de sus dos naturalezas, divina y humana. El hombre de hoy no tiene dificultad para reconocer en Jesús al amigo y al hermano universal, pero encuentra dificil proclamarle también Señor y reconocerle un poder real sobre él.

En las películas sobre Jesús, esta dificultad salta a la vista. En general, el cine ha optado por el Jesús humilde, perseguido, incomprendido, tan cercano al hombre como para compartir sus luchas, sus rebeliones, su deseo de una vida normal. En esta línea se sitúan Jesucristo Superstar y, de manera más cruda y desacralizadora, La última tentación de Cristo —de Martin Scorsese-. También Pier Paolo Pasolini, en el Evangelio según Mateo, nos presenta a este Jesús amigo de los apóstoles y de los hombres, a nuestro alcance, si bien no carente de cierta dimensión de misterio, expresada con mucha poesía, sobre todo a través de algunos eficacísimos silencios. Sólo Franco Zeffirelli, en su Jesús de Nazaret, se esforzó por mantener juntos los dos rasgos de Él. Ahí se ve a Jesús como hombre entre los hombres, afable y a la mano, pero a la vez como alguien que, con sus milagros y su resurrección, nos sitúa ante el misterio de su persona que trasciende lo humano.

No se trata de descalificar los intentos de reproponer en términos accesibles y populares el acontecimiento de Jesús. En su tiempo Jesús no se ofendía si «la gente» le consideraba uno de los profetas. Pero preguntaba a los apóstoles: «¿Y vosotros quién decís que soy yo?», dando a entender que las respuestas de la gente no eran suficientes.

El Jesús que la Iglesia nos presenta en la solemnidad de Cristo Rey es el Jesús completo, humanísimo y trascendente. En París se conserva, bajo custodia especial, la barra que sirve para establecer la longitud exacta del metro, a fin de que esta unidad de medida, introducida por la Revolución Francesa, no se altere con el paso del tiempo. De forma similar, en la comunidad de creyentes que es la Iglesia, se custodia la verdadera imagen de Jesús de Nazaret que debe servir como criterio para medir la legitimidad de toda representación suya en la literatura, en el cine, en el arte.

No se trata de una imagen fija e inerte, que hay que conservar al vacío, como el metro, sino de un Cristo vivo que crece en la comprensión misma de la Iglesia, también a raíz de las cuestiones y de las provocaciones siempre nuevas planteadas por la cultura y por el progreso humano.

XXXIV Domingo Ordinario - B Evangelio de la Misa: Jn 18,33-37 Fiesta de Cristo Rey

El año litúrgico culmina este domingo con la celebración de la fiesta de Jesucristo, Rey del Universo. Esta fiesta fue instaurada por el Papa Pío XI, el 11- III-1925, en un contexto histórico que la hacían especialmente oportuna y evangelizadora..

El evangelio recuerda el encuentro de Jesús con Pilatos, máxima autoridad romana entre los judíos. Estos acusaban a Jesús ante la máxima autoridad política de hacerse, o por lo menos creerse El, el rey de los judíos. Es el momento de aclarar las ideas para quien quiera escuchar y admitir la verdad.

Señor, cómo me gusta tu encuentro con Pilatos. Por tu parte, elegante, prudente, dueño de la situación, respetuoso a pesar de las falsas acusaciones, que contra Ti hacían. Además tus palabras tan profundas como claras y explícitas:

"El que es de la verdad, escucha mi voz". Ayúdame, Señor, a imitarte cuando me vea en parecidas circunstancias. Que sepa ser prudente, comprensivo, sincero, valiente; y que pueda mantener la paz y la alegría, la serenidad y la moderación. Pero sobre todo quiero acoger siempre la verdad, vivir en ella, defenderla y propagarla aunque me cueste críticas, desprecios, malentendidos o persecuciones.

Comprendo, Señor, que desde estos presupuestos doctrinales y teológicos, y desde las buenas actitudes humanas que generan, me resulte fácil verte y acogerte como Rev mío y de todas mis cosas; es más, me parece conveniente, y del todo necesario, que seas el Rey de cielos y tierras. Por tanto, reina, Señor, en mi corazón, para que desde este reinado tuyo en mi persona, contribuya a que se cumpla tu santa voluntad en el mundo, reinando en el corazón de muchas personas y por tanto en todos los ambientes y circunstancias de la vida y de la sociedad. Por supuesto, Señor, tu reinado no es de este mundo, es decir no es un reinado político, material y económico. Pero desde la Verdad que enseñas a tener y practicar, entiendo mejor tu reinado espiritual, eterno y universal: reino de la verdad y de la vida, reino de la santidad y de la gracia, reino de justicia, de amor y de paz. Hazme, Señor, fiel súbdito tuyo en este reinado, que sienta la alegría de ser tuyo y de servirte. En esta fiesta, tan importante, mira mi corazón con los mejores sentimientos y acoge mi oración y mis propósitos. Sagrado Corazón de Jesús, en vos confío. Reina en mi corazón, en mi familia, en toda la sociedad.






