

<u>Week 3:</u> O God, who sent John The Baptist as a voice crying out in the desert, open our ears to hear his message as we light the pink candle. Shape our lives so that they will become a straight path to you. Make us ready to greet your Son when he comes to us. Through Christ our Lord.

<u>Week 4:</u> O God, who sent your angel Gabriel to announce good news to Mary, make us happy with your word of life. Let our hearts be so filled with love for you that they glow with the lights of these four candles. May we live in a way that will please you. Through Christ our Lord.

In an effort to embrace and welcome the neurodiverse members of our community, Nativity Catholic Church is hosting a monthly Sensory Mass on the second Sunday of every month at the 1:00 pm Mass. All are welcome to attend! A special invitation is extended to any person in need of sensory accommodations.

A Sensory Mass requires a welcoming stigma-free environment and accommodations to help reduce over-stimulation and sensory overload. The Mass will include softer music, dimmer lighting, pictorial resources, and self-regulation tools for those with special needs. Families are encouraged to bring any regulation tool (noise reduction items, quiet fidgets, flexible seating items, weighted objects, etc.) that can support focused attention and provide comfort to a person so they can feel safe in their environment and they can better participate in the Holy Mass.

Not familiar with how Fair Trade benefits the artisans involved? Fair trade began as an alternative form of aid for developing countries where traditional charity was not enough. Fair trade creates self-sufficient, independent organizations that work towards long-term change and positive development. In many ways, fair trade partnerships allow artisans to feel more dignified than if they just received money from a charity organization. Fair trade places a real value on the skills and talents of the artisans, many of whom have been working on their craft for years and learned the skills from their parents or grandparents. Unlike traditional charity, fair trade includes a social premium, on top of a fair wage, which goes to the community as a whole.

Each cooperative then decides how to use the money for projects like clean water wells, new workshop facilities, a daycare facility, and other projects that will benefit the entire community. Another advantage of fair trade over traditional charity is the fact that in working towards long -term development, fair trade provides steady, regular employment so that artisans have money coming in consistently. This regular income makes a big difference in the kind of livelihood the artisans can have for themselves and for their families. As fair trade organizations grow their partnerships, they also are able to provide educational resources like skill training, health care, financial planning, and more.

These are extremely useful resources that traditional charity usually does not provide, but are crucial for the independent development of artisan communities. Thank you for shopping Fair Trade!

El Evangelia de este domingo se ocupa por entero de la figura de Juan el Bautista. Desde el momenta de su nacimiento, Juan el Bautista fue saludado por su padre Zacarias como profeta:Y tu, niflo, seras llamado profeta del Altisimo, pues iras delante del Senor para preparar sus caminos» (Le 1, 76).

l,Que hizo el Precursor para ser definido como un profeta, es mas, «el mayor de los profetas» (Le 7, 28)? Ante todo, tras la estela de los antiguos profetas de Israel, predic6 contra la opresi6n y la injusticia social. En el Evangelia del domingo siguiente le oiremos decir: «El que tenga dos tunicas, que las reparta con el que no tiene; el que tenga para comer, que haga lo mismo». A los publicanos [recaudadores de impuestos. Ndt.], que tan frecuentemente desangraban a los pobres con requerimientos arbitrarios, les dice: «No exijais mas de lo que os esta fijado». A los soldados, inclinados a la violen- cia: «No hagais extorsi6n a nadie, no hagais denuncias falsas» (Le 3, 11-14). Tambien las palabras sabre los montes que hay que rebajar, los barrancos por colmar y los pasos tortuosos por hacer rectos, podriamos hoy entenderlas asi: «Toda injusta diferencia social entre riquisimos (los mantes) y pauperrimos (los barrancos) debe ser eliminada o al menos re- ducida; los caminos tortuosos de la corrupción y del engafio deben ser enderezados».






