A Message from The Nativity Creation Care Ministry





Second Grade Thanksgiving Parade

Mrs. Basselgia, our second grade teacher, has recently begun a unit near Thanksgiving, involving art, design, critical thinking, math, reading comprehension – and imagination! It's second grade's 'Balloons Over Broadway Celebration,' and each year it gets even better!







First, Basselgia shares the illustrated biography of Tony Sarg, an immigrant who started working with his own marionettes on the streets of New York City, until he was asked by Macy's Department Store to develop window exhibits of his puppets. Later, Macy's asked Sarg to help build the costumes and floats celebrating the cultural street festivals that so many of Macy's employees missed since they, too, were immigrants.

Each year the parade got bigger, but when the live animals started to scare the children, Macy's asked Sarg to come up with something to replace the animals. 'Balloons Over Broadway: The True Story of the Puppeteer of Macy's Parade,' by Melissa Sweet, introduces the reader to a 6-year-old Sarg and his marionettes, takes us through many evolutions of his work at Macy's and, ultimately, ends with the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade as we know it today.

Following Sarg's creative process, the second graders are each given their own balloon, which is filled with Helium. Each student must decide on its design, it's decoration; using math skills to measure, plot, and cut.

Mrs. Basselgia says the students really enjoyed working through the process, especially sharing their masterpieces in the parade at the end. "Next year," "she says," "I will make it even better!"





We know that Jesus is the Light of Truth shining in the darkness to draw us to eternal life. And we know that his Spirit enlightens us in the truth so that we can be saved from the destructive forces of our sins and

follow our Savior to heaven. But what was the testimony of John? How did he testify to the light? And how does this affect our lives today?

John's testimony was: "I am not the Christ. I am a voice. A voice in the desert." His testimony brings us to the Light of

Christ by challenging us with: "Where is your life arid and dry? Listen! Christ is coming to meet you there! Stop wandering around! Repent, change, do whatever is necessary to look for Jesus so that you can find him. He is coming to you!"

We've all experienced times when Jesus seems unavailable when we need him. What has opened your

eyes to his presence? Whose voice has turned you back to God? It's time to do the same for others, to bring glad tidings to the poor, to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to those who are held captive in their sins, and to announce how to be blessed by a close friendship with the Lord.

We all have the same testimony and the same calling as John had: We are all supposed to be voices crying out loud enough to be heard above the din of the world. Many souls are lost in the wilderness of confusion, hopelessness, pain, heartache, and despair, not to mention sin.

What kind of a voice do you have? Because we have Christ within us, our very lives are the voice.

Even if our vocal chords do not utter a single word, the way we live in the

light is how we speak the truth of the light. The better we live the truth, the louder and clearer is our message.

What people choose to do with our message is up to them, but it's up to us to speak it so that they're given that choice.



Reflect & Discuss:

- † How has your life been changed by your faith in Jesus? What evil has been conquered, what darkness has been overcome?
- + How has the Spirit of the Lord anointed you?
- † What gifts do you have that enable you to give to the poor (the financially poor or the emotionally starving or the spiritually hungry) or to heal broken hearts?
- + How has God used you to provide liberty to captives and release to prisoners?
- † How are these a testimony that teach others about Jesus?



III de Adviento, Ciclo B. iEstad siempre alegres en el Señor! Autor: P. Raniero Cantalamessa, ofmcap Sitio Web: P. Raniero Cantalamessa, ofmcap Is 61,1-2a.10-11; 1 Ts 5,16-24; Jn, 1,6-8.19-28).

iEstad siempre alegres en el Señor!

El tercer domingo de Adviento se llama domingo «de la alegría» y marca el paso de la primera parte, prevalecientemente austera y penitencial, del Adviento a la segunda parte dominada por la espera de la salvación cercana. El título le viene de las palabras «Estad siempre alegres» (gaudete) que se escuchan al inicio de la Misa: «Estad siempre alegres en el Señor; os lo repito, estad alegres. El Señor está cerca» (Filipenses, 4,4-5). Pero el tema de la alegría invade también el resto de la liturgia de la Palabra. En la primera lectura oímos el grito del profeta: «Desbordo de gozo con el Señor, y me alegro con mi Dios». El Salmo responsorial es el Magnificat de María, intercalado del estribillo: «Me alegro con mi Dios». La segunda lectura, finalmente, comienza con las palabras de Pablo: «Hermanos: Estad siempre alegres».

Ser felices es tal vez el deseo humano más universal. Todos quieren ser felices. El poeta alemán Schiller cantó este anhelo universal al gozo en una poesía que después Beethoven inmortalizó, haciendo el famoso Himno a la Alegría que concluye la Novena Sinfonía. También el Evangelio es, a su modo, un largo himno a la alegría. El nombre mismo «evangelio» significa, como sabemos, feliz noticia, anuncio de alegría. Pero el discurso de la Biblia sobre la alegría es un discurso realista, no idealista ni veleidoso. Con la comparación de la mujer que da a luz (Juan 16,20-22), Jesús nos ha dicho muchas cosas. El embarazo no es en general un período fácil para la mujer. Es más bien un tiempo de molestias, de limitaciones de todo tipo: no se puede hacer, comer ni llevar puesto lo que se desea, ni ir adonde se quiera. Sin embargo, cuando se trata de un embarazo deseado, vivido en un clima sereno, no es un tiempo de tristeza, sino de alegría. El porqué es sencillo: se mira adelante, se pregusta el momento en que se podrá tener en brazos a la propia criatura. He oído a varias madres decir que ninguna otra experiencia humana se puede comparar a la felicidad que se experimenta al convertirse en madre.

Todo esto nos dice algo muy preciso: las alegrías verdaderas y duraderas maduran siempre desde el sacrificio. iNo hay rosa sin espinas! En el mundo, placer y dolor (lo hemos observado ya en una ocasión) se siguen el uno al otro con la misma regularidad con la que al elevarse una ola que impulsa al nadador hacia la playa le sigue un hundimiento y un vacío que le succiona hacia atrás. El hombre busca desesperadamente separar a estos dos «hermanos siameses», de aislar el placer del dolor. Pero no se consigue, porque es el propio placer desordenado el que se transforma en amargura. O de improviso y trágicamente, como nos dicen las crónicas diarias, o un poco a la vez, a causa de su incapacidad de durar y del tedio que genera. Basta pensar, por poner un

ejemplo más evidente, qué queda de la excitación de la droga un minuto después de que haya cesado su efecto, o a dónde lleva, también desde el punto de vista de la salud, el abuso desenfrenado del sexo. El poeta pagano Lucrezio tiene dos poderosos versos al respecto: «Un no sé qué de amargo surge de lo íntimo de cada placer nuestro y nos angustia incluso en medio de nuestras delicias».

Al no poder, por lo tanto, separar placer y dolor, se trata de elegir: o un placer pasajero que lleva a un dolor duradero, o un dolor pasajero que lleva a un placer duradero. Esto no vale sólo para el placer espiritual, sino para toda alegría humana honesta: la de un nacimiento, una familia unida, una fiesta, el trabajo llevado felizmente a término, el gozo de un amor bendecido, la amistad, una buena cosecha para el agricultor, la creación artística para el artista, una victoria para el atleta.

Alguno podría objetar: ¿pero entonces para el creyente la alegría, en esta vida, será siempre y sólo objeto de espera, sólo un gozo «de lo que está por venir»? No; existe una alegría secreta y profunda que consiste precisamente en la espera. Es más, es tal vez ésta, en el mundo, la forma más pura de la alegría; la alegría que se tiene en esperar. El poeta Leopardi lo dijo maravillosamente en la poesía Il sabato del villaggio. La alegría más intensa no es la del domingo, sino la del sábado; no es la de la fiesta, sino la de su espera. La diferencia es que la fiesta que el creyente espera no durará sólo algunas horas, para después ceder de nuevo el puesto a «tristeza y tedio», sino que durará para siempre.

El Adviento tiene un rostro: la alegría

Una vez, un joven de 15 años de edad estaba en su escuela, jugando con sus compañeros, visitando la biblioteca de esa escuela, de pronto el encargado de la biblioteca le pregunta: "Oye, ¿tu madre no se llama María Rosa? El joven contest: claro, ¿y por qué preguntas eso? Escuché por la radio que tu madre se acaba de sacar un premio por un poema que tú enviaste por el día de la madre, contestó el señor encargado de aquella biblioteca. No se imaginan el grito de alegría que lanzó este joven de 15 años, una alegría que fue tan contagiante que sus demás compañeros de escuela también danzaron con él.

¿Todas las noticias que ves, que escuchas, que sabes, que te cuentan son siempre motivo de gozo o de tristeza?, ¿de fastidio o de desesperanza?, ¿de indignación de o de incertidumbre?... Para Isaías, ¿cómo es el Mesías que viene? (cf.Is.61,1-2ª.10-11). Aquel sobre quien el Espíritu Santo le asiste y le unge, con un fin: "dar buena noticia a los que sufren".

Si estamos con Dios, ¿cmo no alegrarnos con él? Por eso es que debo "desbordar de gozo con el Seor". Y todo esto ¿por qué?: "Porque me ha vestido con traje de salvacin".

Hoy Dios nos quiere vestir de gozo, porque pronto vendrá y eso sí que es buena noticia en un mundo donde las malas noticias son el pan de cada día. ¿Saben cuál es el querer de Dios según el Apóstol San Pablo? (cf.1Tes.5,16-24): que estemos alegres, que oremos constantemente, QUE NO APAGUEMOS EL FUEGO DEL ESPÍRITU. Adviento es un tiempo para el gozo y para la apertura al Espíritu Santo. Pero, ¿cuántas veces he ido apagando el Espíritu de Dios en mí o en los demás?

Juan el Bautista, un nuevo personaje del Adviento, que aparece en el evangelio de hoy (Jn.1,6-8.19-28), nos trae una buena noticia que nos llena de gozo: "Yo bautizo con agua, pero medio de ustedes hay uno que no conocen, que viene detrás de mí, y al que no soy digno de desatar la correa de su sandalia".

Él (por San Juan Bautista), vino con la misión depresentarnos al que nos da la paz y el gozo, la esperanza y las ganas de vivir...ese es Jesús.
