HAVEN of Northern Virginia Workshops

Haven is a nonprofit, nonsectarian community organization of trained volunteers that offers emotional support to the bereaved, the seriously ill, the dying and to their families and friends. Haven also provides education to the community about the needs of those who are grieving. Since September 1976 Haven volunteers have helped individuals work through their grief, offering comfort and support by sharing insights, resources and techniques that encourage recovery and healing.

Grief Support Groups Open Suicide Loss Support Group

This group, open to persons who have had a loved one die by suicide, is held twice monthly. Participants will be offered information and suggestions for handing the complexity of grief that often follows a suicide. To participate, call Haven at 703-941-7000. The group meets on Saturdays.

Four-Week Widow/Widower Bereavement Support Group (formerly six-weeks). The group is open to persons whose spouse or partner has died. This loss can be numbing and devastating. You may have feelings of sadness, loneliness and abandonment. No one can heal your pain, but this group will help you learn ways to cope with this difficult experience. Pre-registration is required and participants must be able to attend all sessions. Check our home page or call Haven for dates.

Parent Loss Support Workshop

This group is open to anyone who has experienced the death of a parent. Coping with a loss like this is often a traumatic and painful experience. This group will provide participants with coping skills and give them an opportunity to share their experience with others who also are struggling to deal with the myriad facets of death. He continued: "Here he appears in his divine wisdom as he listens and raises questions, already effect one 'teaches'. The revelation of his mystery as the Son wholly dedicated to his Father's affairs proclaims the radical nature of the Gospel, in which even the closest of human relationships are challenged the bγ absolute demands of the Kingdom. Mary and

Joseph, fearful and anxious, 'did not understand' his words."

We, too, often fail to understand the words of Jesus. His teachings challenge us to accept a more difficult life, a life of doing good to our enemies, turning the cheek and going the extra mile, a life of courageously standing up for the truth and adhering to high moral standards that are counter-cultural.

Our preference, when living this way is inconvenient or unpleasant, is to rationalize and make excuses for our worldly behavior. But once we truly

understand the demands of the Kingdom of God, we see

their benefits and we obey gladly.

Without this understanding, we have to simply trust that the words of Jesus are right and true. Like Mary and Joseph, we need to ponder in our hearts what we don't understand,

> while moving forward and doing what Jesus wants us to do.

> As challenging as this is, that's when we discover how amazing God is.



El silencio de san José Reflexiones Adviento y Navidad

En estos últimos días del Adviento, la liturgia nos invita a contemplar de modo especial a la Virgen María y a san José, que vivieron con intensidad única el tiempo de la espera y de la preparación del nacimiento de Jesús. Hoy deseo dirigir mi mirada a la figura de san José. (.....)

Desde luego, la función de san José no puede reducirse a un aspecto legal. Es modelo del hombre "justo" (Mt 1, 19), que en perfecta sintonía con su esposa acoge al Hijo de Dios hecho hombre y vela por su crecimiento humano. Por eso, en los días que preceden a la Navidad, es muy oportuno entablar una especie de coloquio espiritual con san José, para que él nos ayude a vivir en plenitud este gran misterio de la fe.

El amado Papa San Juan Pablo II, que era muy devoto de san José, nos ha dejado una admirable meditación dedicada a él en la exhortación apostólica Redemptoris Custos, "Custodio del Redentor". Entre los muchos aspectos que pone de relieve, pondera en especial el silencio de san José. Su silencio estaba impregnado de contemplación del misterio de Dios, con una actitud de total disponibilidad a la voluntad divina. En otras palabras, el silencio de san José no manifiesta un vacío interior, sino, al contrario, la plenitud de fe que lleva en su corazón y que guía todos sus pensamientos y todos sus actos.

Un silencio gracias al cual san José, al unísono con María, guarda la palabra de Dios, conocida a través de las Sagradas Escrituras, confrontándola continuamente con los acontecimientos de la vida de Jesús; un silencio entretejido de oración constante, oración de bendición del Señor, de adoración de su santísima voluntad y de confianza sin reservas en su providencia.






